Supporting Church music in the Tendring area

The Deanery choir will be singing at St Georges Church, Great Bromley CO7 7TS at the I am communion service. The anthem that they will sing will be 'Lead me Lord' by Fred Bock.

Fred Bock was an influential American church musician, composer, and publisher. Renowned for his imaginative keyboard arrangements, he notably directed music at prominent Southern California churches, composed for film and TV, and founded the Fred Bock Publishing Group, which shapes modern sacred music.

Along with his entrepreneurship, Fred Bock was more than a businessman. Bock was also an avid lover of music, active member of church communities and an accomplished composer. He served as the Minister of Music at Hollywood Presbyterian Church for 18 years, and at the Bel Air Presbyterian Church, Los Angeles for 14 years.

In 1976, he became the Editor of Hymns for the revolutionary collection Family of God, a passion project he had begun developing 15 years prior. Since its release, the hymnal has sold over 3 million copies across North America and beyond.

On Sunday 31st May members of the congregation of fifteen parishes were invited to a Praise in the Garden service at the home of Christopher and Virginia Palmer-Tomkinson.

The house and surroundings situated in a peaceful wooded area was the ideal place for an afternoon of praise and thanksgiving to God, which was to be followed by tea in the gardens and a tour of the beautiful scenic water gardens.

As the swallows wheeled overhead, returning to their nests in the eaves of the house, Christopher welcomed us all and introduced Bishop Guli, who together with the Rev John Saxon would be taking the service.

The first hymn *"Praise to the Lord the Almighty"* sounded out across the garden, joyfully sung by us all, as the Salvation Army Band led us in a hymn of thanks and praise.



Bishop Guli's address echoed the sentiments of the hymn as she enabled us to think about the wonders of life about us and to give thanks and praise to God for all we are given.

"We enjoy the fruits of the harvest but sometimes forget you have given them to us. We belong to a people who are full and satisfied but ignore the cries of the hungry". Father in your mercy forgive us and help us was our confession.

The Bible reading taken from Matthew 28 v16-20. was used to explore the theme of discipleship by Bishop Guli, for just as the early apostles were sent out by our Risen Lord- *"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations,"* so were we the congregation, invited to explore our own discipleship within the fifteen parishes; encouraging and supporting each other as we seek to spread God's word.



The hymn *"I the Lord of Sea and sky"* further echoed these words, as did the rousing final hymn *"Now thank we all our God,"* encouraging us to understand that the Holy Spirit is with us all, guiding and helping us as we journey through life.

Our grateful thanks go to our hosts, to the Salvation Army Band and to all those who worked so hard behind the scenes, particularly providing the wonderful refreshments for us all.

Thank you everyone for such a memorable afternoon spent in such beautiful gardens.

THE DUCHY BARN CHILDREN'S CINEMA

The Duchy Barn Cinema was set up in September 2025 as an initiative sponsored by St Mary's Church Dedham.

Our aim is to screen a selection of some of the best films ever produced to the local community. Showings usually take place on the 4th Wednesday of every month from October to April with some additional films for children being shown during the school holidays. Entrance is free and refreshments and cake are served during the interval!

So far, The Duchy Barn Cinema has shown a total of 8 films - the last of which, screened in May 2026, was aimed specifically at children and at anyone "young at heart".

Bethany Place, Korban's main house

Many of you will have heard of Colchester Korban Project which provides supported accommodation for young homeless people, aged 16-25. As you can see from residents' comments above, Korban has made a significant impact on their lives. Korban provides a happy and nurturing environment for young people who have found themselves without a place to call home often through no fault of their own.

Often young homeless people are called the “hidden homeless” as they end up sleeping on a friend's floor or “sofa surfing”, moving from place to place.

Korban has two homes which provide different levels of support. Bethany Place, the hub house is rented, whereas Bethel House is owned by Korban, and for residents who still need some support to make the transition to independence.

The hub house has 5 rooms and residents there have access to a tailored support plan that addresses a variety of issues to help them develop the character, skills and confidence to live independently.

Korban is facing a big challenge because the hub house, which is currently rented, is due to be sold in November 2027 and it is raising money to purchase it. This will prevent upheaval for the existing residents and help to secure the future of the charity.

Korban needs to raise £500,000 before November 2027 when the house is due to be sold. The charity has already raised over £51,000 so far but needs help to buy Bethany Place so that it has a secure base to grow its work and continue to break the cycle of homelessness for young people in Colchester.

DEDHAM PARISH COUNCIL MEETING REPORT – MONDAY, 1ST JUNE 2026.

The Parish Council meeting attracted a large public attendance, with many residents attending to discuss concerns relating to the Bank Holiday period and use of the river area.

Impact of Langham Housing Plans

Representatives from Langham Parish Council gave a presentation on the potential impact of proposed housing developments in Langham. Particular concern was expressed regarding the potential increase in water and sewage discharges into the Black Brook, which flows through Dedham. Councillors noted the significant implications this could have for the local environment and water quality.

Poor Mobile Phone Coverage

The Council discussed concerns about worsening mobile phone coverage in the village following the removal of a telecommunications mast on the edge of Dedham. Residents experiencing difficulties were encouraged to raise

complaints directly with their mobile service providers.

Bank Holiday Weekend by the River

A number of residents spoke about the impact of the large numbers of visitors to the river area during the Bank Holiday weekend. Concerns included anti-social behaviour, illegal parking, littering, pressure on local amenities and a perceived lack of visible presence from relevant public bodies.

Councillor Bourn updated the meeting on a series of discussions he has held with Babergh District Council, Essex Police and other organisations. As a result, an action plan has been developed, including a number of task groups responsible for monitoring and reporting issues relating to parking, use of the meadows, anti-social behaviour and litter.

District and County Councillor Reports

District Councillor Thomas Rowe reported on plans for the future introduction of wheelie bins. He advised that the scheme is not expected to be introduced in Dedham until 2027 and

that some areas may qualify for exemptions.

County Councillor Naylor provided an update on recent political changes within Essex and noted that tackling potholes remains a key priority.

Image of Dedham

The Council discussed concerns regarding the village's public image and how Dedham is portrayed on social media and in the press. It was agreed that a dedicated group should be established to develop a long-term communications strategy aimed at promoting a positive image of the village while addressing ongoing challenges.

Padel Tennis Proposal

The Council considered a request to explore the possibility of introducing padel tennis facilities in Dedham. It was agreed that a feasibility study should be undertaken to assess the proposal.

Grant Application

A grant of £1,348 was approved for Dedham Cricket Club to assist with the purchase of new scoreboards.

Administrative Support

The Council agreed in principle to consider options for providing additional administrative support to assist with its growing workload.

Infrastructure

Following discussion of the agreed street trading bay area in Royal Square, councillors agreed that further consideration should be given to the proposed hours of operation before any final decisions are made.

Water Problems on Castle Hill

An update was received regarding the longstanding drainage issues at Castle Hill. Investigations have suggested that

blockages and historic alterations to drainage routes may be contributing to the problem. Discussions with landowners will continue in an effort to identify a long-term solution.

Sports Club

A meeting between the Parish Council and the Sports Club has been arranged for 9th June to discuss future plans and areas of cooperation.

Communications

The Council noted the ongoing improvements being made to the parish website. Further updates on progress are expected to be presented at the next meeting.

ONGOING CONCERNS REGARDING THE USAGE OF THE WATER MEADOWS AND THE RIVER

The end of May Bank Holiday weekend was a very challenging one for the residents of Dedham and local businesses. The large number of visitors to the river area resulted in major problems in terms of illegal parking, anti-social behaviour and abuse of the local environment. The Police were called a number of times to address the behaviour issue. On the Suffolk side we know at least 25 parking fines were given.

A teenager who jumped off the bridge was badly injured. Ambulances found it very difficult to get through the village in an emergency.

As the Council have mentioned several times before the river at Dedham is heavily polluted and not suitable for bathing.

We are also aware of major problems with thieving from shops, poor behaviour and abuse to local residents.

The sheer volume of litter on the Bank holiday Monday resulted in Babergh having to bring out special vehicles to remove the rubbish on the Tuesday which took them most of the day. The usage of the meadows for trading is under constant monitoring.

As chair of the Council, I have had regular meetings with relevant agencies during the week and as a result a series of ongoing monitoring groups have been established including on anti-social behaviour, parking, litter and trading

Residents are reminded to report any incidents to the police or relevant local councils. We will keep residents informed of updates through the magazine and also our website.

BRINGING KITTY TO LIFE



The story of Kitty Canham is legendary in Thorpe le Soken. Born in Beaumont to a family of yeoman farmers, she was, by all accounts, beautiful, intelligent, and restless — a woman constrained by the expectations placed upon her in the eighteenth century. She married the Rector of Thorpe-le-Soken, but after only two years she vanished, leaving behind a mystery that has echoed through the centuries.

During the long walks so many of us took through the Covid lockdowns, I found myself wandering the backwaters from Kirby-le-Soken to Beaumont Quay. It was on those walks that I began to imagine Kitty treading the same paths some three hundred years before. Slowly, she began to get under my skin. By the time the lockdowns dragged on, there was only one thing for it — I knew I had to write her story.

That novel became *Kitty Canham*, a fictional story woven around the real events of Kitty's life. There are, inevitably conflicting accounts of her life, and particularly about her death. Some believe she threw herself from the church tower, others that her body was brought home from Europe in a barrel of rum! And then, of course, there are those who believe Kitty never left at all — that she still walks the passageways of the Bell Inn in Thorpe in ghostly form.

Since writing the novel, I have worked with a small team to adapt the novel for stage — and what a journey that has been. A novel can hold hundreds of characters and endless worlds; a play must find its power in something more immediate.

We have worked on keeping Kitty's story true to both the spirit of the novel and to the woman at its heart. Inevitably, the piece has transformed into something new — shaped not only by the adaptation itself, but by the wonderful cast who have brought their own insight, emotion, and interpretation to the story.

ANOTHER YEAR DONE, ANOTHER YEAR TO COME

Summer's here! Though everything's been feeling a little like a game of two halves this June.

As I write this in the second week of June, we've followed up the late May heatwave with temperatures barely hitting 15C and prospects for our members' coffee morning looking a bit soggy to say the least! The very dry soil in the garden and the allotment is loving it though. Everything, including the weeds (inevitably), is looking wonderfully lush.

If any of you are having a go at growing dahlias and planning to exhibit a few (and maybe win our new trophy) in the Autumn Show on 5 September, then they should be putting on a good amount of growth now. It's still a bit early for flowers, especially since I pinched a lot of them when they reached 30cm tall to encourage more flowers, but a few of my plants are now showing small buds. Pinching just means cutting out the top of the lead shoot to encourage side shoots to develop, each of which will carry a flower.

Make sure to keep them well-watered (no problem there, given the thundering downpour outside as I write) and – when you start to see those buds – feed them every 7-10 days with liquid

tomato feed. You'll need to support them with canes or netting as a lot of varieties can reach more than a metre high and the weight of larger-flowers can easily snap stems.

When you're ready to exhibit at the show, cut your flowers early in the morning a day or so before the show, plunging the stems into deep water immediately. Store them in cool, dark conditions to keep them as fresh as possible and take care transporting them to avoid damage.

Our judges are pretty forgiving given it's a village show, but they'll be looking for freshness, uniform petal shapes and symmetry between flowers if you're exhibiting in the 'three of a kind' classes. Blemishes, holes in petals caused by insects or fading colours as the flowers 'go over' will also get you marked down. But in the end, it's great to see everyone having a go – there's no need to stress about it.

Dedham is very lucky to have brilliant events like flower shows, as well as its film club and art society and sports from tennis and football to cricket and more. But organising them depends on often-shrinking committees and the willingness of 'fresh blood' to chip in.

The Horticultural Society's programme of events of speaker evenings, shows, plant sale, coffee morning, day trip, and Christmas supper takes some organisation as you'll appreciate. This is obviously easier with nine of us, but with six it's starting to prove more difficult.

We'd love a few more people to join us on the committee – it really is true that many hands make light work. We aim to meet no more than six times a year with each meeting taking around 60-90 minutes (coffee, biscuits and a bit of catching up included!). We've been doing this for a while now so can rattle through the jobs that need doing for each of our events and how we can fit them in among our other non-horticultural commitments.

Having said that, if you'd like volunteer to help us out but don't think you've time to join the committee, there are a few jobs that might suit more: If anyone feels like popping into some of Dedham's businesses and putting up posters eight times a year, this is a job that need only take 30 minutes. It could be done by more than one person.

If you have access to a computer, we'd welcome someone taking on the job of booking our events on the Assembly Rooms booking website. We can provide all the dates at the same, so this takes less than an hour and then it's done.

If you've ever wondered what judges are looking for in the different sections of our shows, it's fascinating to accompany them as they go round the exhibition tables. If you're free on a Saturday morning (usually 11am-12noon) in September and in late March, we need stewards to go round with the judges and record their decisions. This was one of the first jobs I helped with, and it gave me loads of insight into exhibiting.

Finally, we also need someone who will take care of the trophies for our shows: collecting them in, getting them engraved, before redistributing them to new winners.

the ways in which we are using technology to enhance teaching and learning, so this month, we wanted to share examples of our children working away from devices and developing other essential academic and personal skills.

With our fantastic Class 6 children about to move on to the next stage of their education, we know that they not only leave us with the necessary knowledge and skills, but also the confidence, curiosity and resilience required to be both happy and successful in their new schools.

In June, Class 5 had the opportunity to go crabbing in Brightlingsea and to go aboard the Pioneer, a 70ft sailing vessel originally used for dredging oysters.

U - UTI – suspected

If you suspect you have a urine infection, firstly please check if you can be seen by Pharmacy First- Female only and age 16 to 64. If you do not fit this criteria please submit an Anima request to be reviewed.

V - Verruca

Verruca Treatment Steps:

1. Self-care and over-the-counter treatments like salicylic acid.
2. Stronger pharmacy treatments or cryotherapy.
3. Referral to podiatrist or dermatologist for persistent cases.
4. Private clinics such as Colchester Foot Clinic offer advanced treatments.

Avoid walking barefoot in communal areas and do not pick or scratch the verruca.

W - Weight loss medication

At present, GPs cannot prescribe weight loss drugs purely for weight loss. They can be prescribed for diabetes management.

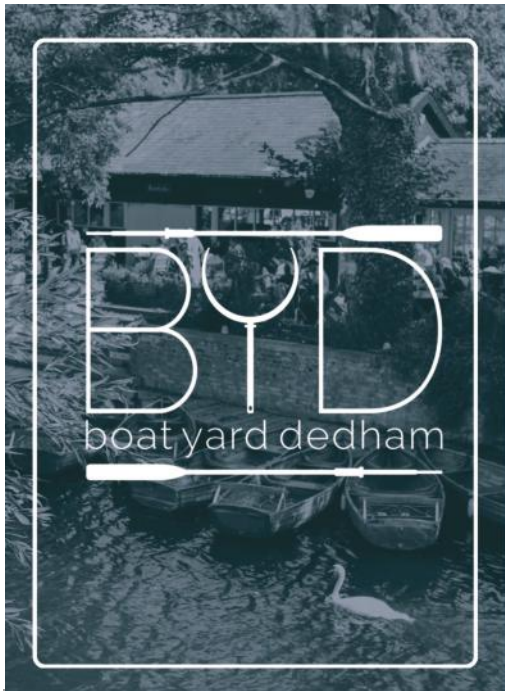
