While watching the 2019 Women's U.S. Open earlier this school year, I witnessed an outstanding display of sportsmanship by 21-year-old Naomi Osaka, who hugged and consoled her 15-year-old opponent, Cori Gauff, after defeating her in the third round of the event. She hugged her and then went one step further by inviting her to do the post-match interview with her. I turned the channel after witnessing this emotional exchange between the two competitors only to watch story after story about countless individuals preparing to come to the aid of communities caught in the path of Hurricane Dorian.

In our own home state of New Mexico, I have seen signs in yards across our communities that read, "El Paso Strong" and have witnessed young kids throughout the state raising money for those struck by the tragedy that befell our neighbor to the South. It warms my heart to know that so many members of the New Mexico baseball community supported El Paso by volunteering their time and resources to facilitate a baseball clinic in the area. I have seen Boy Scouts and Girls Scouts of New Mexico performing various acts of community service. I recently pulled up to a stop light and saw a young adult handing a homeless person a bag full of toiletries and food. I saw a teenager mowing an elderly person's yard just because

it is the right thing to do. All of these beautiful acts of kindness occurred within a two-day period and those were only the ones I personally saw.

Every day, we witness humanity at its finest. Even though there are times when the negative headlines seem overwhelming, we still see displays of compassion and kindness all around us. We know there is so much goodness in our schools and our communities and we feel our faith restored when these acts hit close to home.

So, it makes me wonder - why do we allow "winning and losing" to become the focal point in athletics? Why does a "win at all costs" attitude seem so prevalent? Why do acts of poor sportsmanship sometimes overshadow all of the good that we know exists in interscholastic athletics? For every one bad event, we know there are hundreds, or even thousands, of great things going on with our student-athletes. Why can't we look past the scoreboard to see and remember the true meaning of sports?

Don't get me wrong. I am the most competitive person there is. Even at my "old" age, I refuse to lose. But, as we get older, we see that there are such bigger and more important things that we gain from competition and that we gain through participation in interscholastic activities. We realize that truly "winning" is not about the score. For educators, it is about teaching our students that they are playing a game and that, at the end of the day, the end result of learning the traits of responsibility, integrity, respect, teamwork, dedication, perseverance and commitment are far more important than a blue trophy.

The importance of interscholastic athletics is really about winning in the game of life. It is about producing citizens who are capable of being compassionate to those in need, who understand that life is bigger than a game and who truly know that true winners are those who care about others and who live a life of being trustworthy, honest and respectful.

There are so many daily lessons that are learned through participating in sports and activities and we see these lessons being lived out around us every day. It goes back to role models in professional sports. It goes back to volunteerism and kindness to communities suffering tragedies and disasters. It goes back to being service-oriented within our communities. It goes back to doing the right thing, even when no one is looking. In the words of football coach, Lou Holtz, "I follow three rules: Do the right thing, do the best you can, and always show people you care." This is the true recipe for being winners in the game of life.

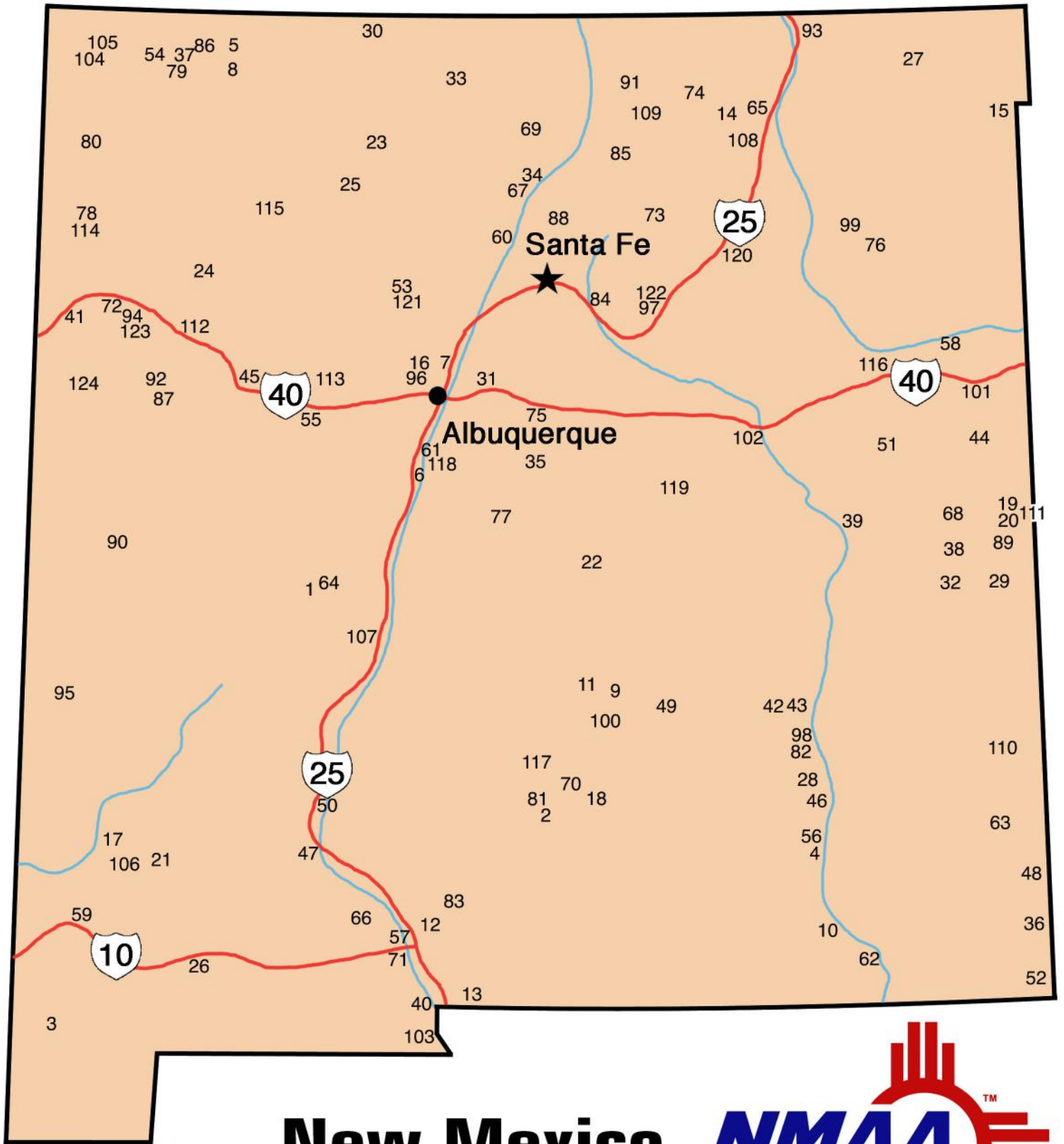

Scott Owen, Legend of the Mat

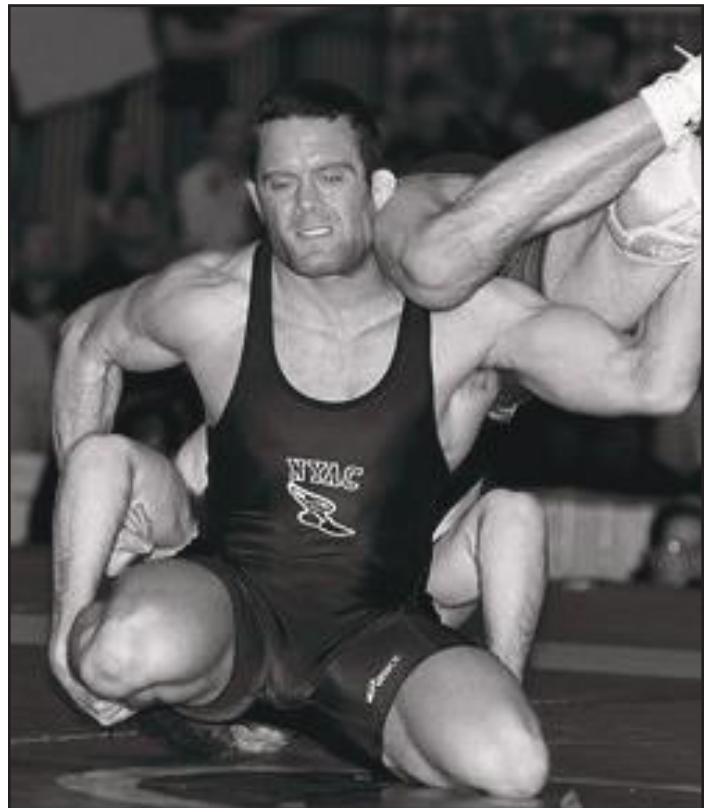


You can't tell the story of New Mexico wrestling without including the name Scott Owen. His resume includes multiple state titles, All-American status and a top-10 national ranking. It is a list of accomplishments very few in this state have achieved. This is why Scott Owen is considered one of the "Legends of the Sport."

Born in Farmington in 1979, Scott had the sport of wrestling in his blood. His father, Ron, and his uncle, Don, both wrestled for Carlsbad High School and the brothers went on to compete collegiately. Between Scott, his brother Aaron, and his cousins Troy and Scott (Don's son), the Owens racked up 14 state titles in the state of New Mexico. "We went everywhere together, traveled together, competed together" said Scott. "My cousins Scott and Troy won everything. Growing up, I had a lot more work to do. I strived to be able to equal those guys and that helped propel me to what I became."

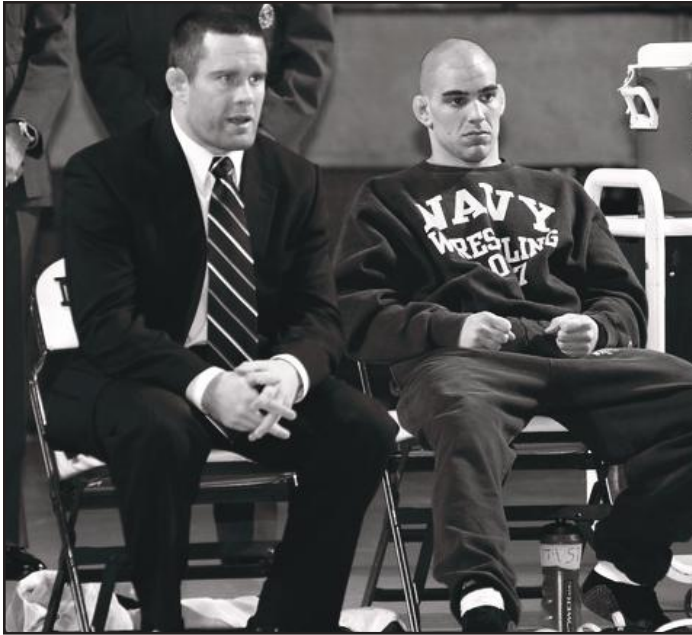
It is that drive that led Scott to become such a successful wrestler. He was a three-time state champion in high school. Scott won his first state title at Eldorado High School in 1995 in the 106-pound weight class. He would later move to Carlsbad and continue his wrestling roots with the Cavemen. In 1996, Scott won the 119-pound weight division at state and he capped off his high school career with a third state title in 1997 at 130 pounds. He compiled a record of 109-5 over those four years.

Following high school, Scott attended Northern Illinois University, where he compiled an overall record of 117-22 and became a two-time All-American (2002, 2003) at 157 pounds. Scott was named the Mid-American Conference Tournament outstanding wrestler twice and in 2002, was the Conference Wrestler of the Year. On top of his accomplishments on the mat, Scott was a two-time Academic All-American. With dreams of making the Olympic team, Scott was ranked as



high as third on the Olympic ladder, wrestling at 74 kilos in freestyle wrestling. "In 2007, I won the SunKist International, placed fifth at the Ivan Yarygin in Russia and was fifth at the world team trials." In 2008, he was ranked in the top-5, but a torn ACL at the Olympic Training Center prevented him from competing again.

After a successful collegiate career, Scott went on to become



a collegiate coach. He spent a couple of seasons on staff at Northern Illinois and then became an assistant at the United States Naval Academy. "That was an experience of a lifetime," said Scott. "The quality of kids I got to coach and be around was amazing. At a lot of universities, it's all about athletics but these kids were aspiring to something bigger than winning a national title. They were going to defend our country."

Eventually, Scott landed as the head assistant at Bloomsburg University in Pennsylvania. In four years with the Huskies, Scott helped coach multiple NCAA Division I qualifiers. Scott returned to the Land of Enchantment in the fall of 2012. He has been with the New Mexico Activities Association for the past eight years.

What did you enjoy most about wrestling?

I think it's the one-on-one nature of the sport I like so much. I like that when it comes to training and preparations, there's nobody else to put the load on, it's just you. I enjoy the idea that I control my own destiny, how far I can go, and how successful I can be.

What is your greatest moment as a coach?

The last year at Navy, we had three All-Americans and we were coming from a service academy without a lot of blue chip recruits. Taking these kids and working with them to become All-Americans was pretty big.

As an aside, I worked with a kid named Frank Hickman. He only placed third in North Carolina as a senior. I worked with him for 3-4 years at Bloomsburg and he was such a driven kid who wanted to excel. He became a three-time NCAA qualifier, losing in the blood round as a junior. He went from finishing third in state to ranked top eight in the nation collegiately. I prided myself in taking those middle of the road wrestlers and elevating them to a nationally competitive level.

Who were your mentors?

My dad was the one with me every step of the way. I'm find-

ing, as a father myself, it takes a lot of time and energy. My parents were both in it together. Dave Grant, the guy who recruited me at Northern Illinois, was my father away from home. Bruce Burnett at Navy taught me a lot. Being able to be around a mind like that was special. He coached a kid to be prepared for everything they can throw at you.

With a family lineage of wrestling, was it predetermined what you would compete in?

We all started around the age of 4 or 5. I remember in the second or third grade, I wrote a letter to John Smith, arguably the best wrestler in American history. I told him I was rooting for him and wrote about my wrestling accomplishments up to that point. He wrote me back and I still have that letter to this day. At that point, I had the bug to be successful. I thought it was significant because a wrestler of that stature took the time to talk to a second grader from New Mexico.

What would you like to say to coaches and young student athletes today?

To coaches, I would say make sure you understand how much of presence you have in an athlete's life. What you preach and what you practice, those kids will follow. I see so many coaches that yell and scream and I would remind them you need to be the professional and model the behavior that you expect.

To the wrestlers, wrestling is such a difficult and demanding sport that you have to have a natural enjoyment for it. Have fun, enjoy it, don't worry about the wins and losses. Worry about competing to the best of your ability. What you put in, you get out. It doesn't always take a ton of natural athletic ability, but it takes a lot of hard work.

What personal athletic accomplishments are you most proud of?

I'm proud of being a two-time All-American from New Mexico. I fell short of a lot of my goals, but I can still hold my head high and say I did everything I could to reach them. I'm also very proud to call myself a native New Mexican.

2019 State Championship Recap

Rio Rancho Takes Home 2019 Team Title



Rio Rancho hoisted the blue trophy for the second year in a row, earning the school's 13th overall wrestling title with a team score of 170. Cleveland earned second-place with 163 points, followed by Carlsbad, who finished third with 150 points.

The Storm and Cavemen saw three wrestlers atop the medal stand, while Volcano Vista and Santa Fe captured two individual titles during the final round of the 2019 New Mexico National Guard State Wrestling Championships.

Moses Santiago of Volcano Vista defeated Joshua Robinson of Sandia in the 106-pound weight class, 5-3, as Tristan Mascarenas of Cleveland beat Tim Lopez of Rio Rancho at 113. Mascarenas won 113-pound weight class in 2018.

Adam Pena of Santa Fe captured the title at 120 pounds over Avery Atma of Las Cruces, 11-7. Miguel Padilla of Santa defeated Santiago Marquez of Cleveland, 5-4, at 126-pounds.

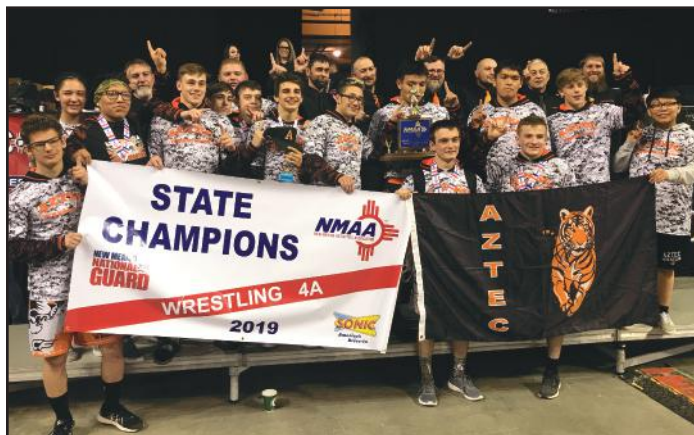
Alejandro Gutierrez of Rio Grande earned his first state title with a 3-0 win over Thomas Carrillo of Rio Rancho in the 132-pound match. Carrillo beat Gutierrez in the 2018 championship match. At 138, James Emmer of Rio Rancho defeated Sandia's Gestic Marquez, 7-3.

In the 145-pound weight class, Manuel Robles of Volcano Vista took home his first individual title, 11-2 over Jesse Daniel Perez of Deming. At 152 pounds, Carlsbad's Mason Box capped off a stellar 2019 campaign beating Sammy Martinez of Santa Fe, 2-1. Justin Wood of Carlsbad defeated Cody Glenn of Rio Rancho to take home the 160-pound title in 2019, 4-2.

At 170 pounds, Fabian Padilla of Carlsbad beat Bronson Deatherage of Volcano Vista, 12-4, while Marco Rodriguez of Centennial captured the 182-pound championship, 6-3, over Ethan Sanchez-Maxwell of Volcano Vista. At 195, Barrett Haemker of La Cueva handled Gabe Garcia of Cleveland with a 5-3 decision.

Dion Hunter of Cleveland captured his first title by pinning Jacob Telles of Sandia in the 220-pound title match. In the heavyweight division, Austin Roman of Cleveland pinned Dante Norberto of Farmington and was crowned the 2019 champion.

Aztec Earns 2019 Blue Trophy



Aztec High School remained on top of the wrestling world after claiming their second straight New Mexico National Guard Wrestling State Championship. The Tigers finished the 2019 state meet with 225 points. Silver was second with 183 and Los Lunas finished third with 171.

The Tigers sent six wrestlers to the finals and finished with three individual state champs. Christian Robison won the 126-pound weight class beating Damian Gonzales of Los Alamos with a fall at the 5:17 mark. Robison wrapped up his high school career with two state titles, just like his father. Aztec's Cody Candelaria also claimed victory in the 138-pound bracket. He took a major decision over Jordan Gallegos of Los Lunas 24-13. Aztec's Hunter Medina took home the 145-pound championship with a 15-2 major decision over Belen's Martin Ammons.

A couple four-time state champs were crowned in 2019. Pojoaque senior Javier Tapia (34-1) claimed his fourth individual state title after beating Silver's Nathaniel Lucero 8-0 in the final. Silver's Zeke Marquez also claimed his fourth title after the senior edged out Aztec's Garrett Birzer 8-6 in the championship match of the 132-pound weight class.

Valencia senior Robbie Jaramillo capped off the perfect 42-0 season with a finals victory by pin over Santiago Salas of Los Lunas. All four of his weekend matches were won by pin. Silver's Brenden Olsen also won all four of his matches by pin in the 106-pound division, including a victory over Aztec's Jaren McBride in the final. Michael Aguirre of Silver also won four matches by pin. Aguirre beat Moriarty's Colton Zeisloft in a mere :40 of the 160-pound final.

Jaramillo wasn't the only Class 4A wrestler who finished the season unbeaten. Estevan Valerio of Taos finished the year with a 32-0 record after finishing off Cody Gardner of Valencia with a fall at the 3:24 mark of the 182-pound championship.

Steven Sanchez of St. Pius X won by a tiebreaker score of 3-2 over Silver's Vince Marin in the 113-pound championship. Miyamura's Drake Guerrero took an 8-4 decision over Matthew Sanchez of St. Pius X in the 120-pound championship. Bloomfield's Luke Whitley edged out Aztec's Bode Wooley by a 6-4 decision in the 152-pound championship match. The 220-pound title went to Kirtland Central's Jarryd Pollard who beat Coleton Radford of Del Norte in the final 5-3. The 285-pound championship went to Angelo Maestas of Valley after he pinned Dominic Lopez of Taos just 1:15 into the final match.



2019 State Championship Recap

Cobre Indians Win A/3A State Title



Cobre hoisted the blue trophy overhead at the 2019 New Mexico National Guard State Wrestling Championships, as the Indians led the championships from start to finish. The Cobre tallied 240 points for the championships, followed by Robertson (142) and Socorro (132). Cobre won five individual titles, while Robertson and Socorro earned took home two.

In the 106-pound finals, Kaleb Medina of Robertson Gavin Placen-

cio of Cobre by decision, 11-6. Isaiah Marquez of Cobre won the 113-pound division by decision over Tristian Martinez of West Las Vegas, 7-2.

Esteban Molina of Cobre took the 120-pound title in 2019, by pin over Estevan Atilano of Pecos. Joel Partridge of Socorro defeated Ishya Delatorre of Cobre to win the 126-pound title by a 9-2 margin.

At 132 pounds, Andrew Trujillo captured his third state title, this time at 132-pounds, defeating Zeke Soliz of Cobre by a score of 9-2. Irven Delatorre of Cobre capped off a solid season by beating Andres Grano of Robertson, 12-2, in the 138-pound finals. Alex Gutierrez of Foothill captured the school's first individual title in wrestling at 145-pounds, beating Rod Dunlap of Tucumcari, 5-1.

Alex Holhuin of Cobre earned the 152 crown over Joe Martinez of Tucumcari, 16-1.

In the 160-pound finals, Orion Rottman of Socorro took down Thomas Vigil of Pecos, by the narrowest of margins, 9-8. Austin Abeyta of West Las Vegas defeated Jaden Mifsud of St. Michael's in the 170-pound match, by pin. Marley Gutierrez of Cobre handled Wingate's Kieran James, 3-1, to win the 182-pound title

Leon Vigil of Cobre defeated Eric Duran of West Las Vegas by a 10-6 decision of the 195-pound crown, while Tucumcari's Kaleb Hayes beat Javier Mares of Robertson, 3-1, in the 220-pound finals, finishing off his 2019 campaign at 21-6. Tayo Regenold of St. Michael's would defeat Nathaen Urioste of West Las Veags to capture the heavyweight division, finishing 27-2 on the year.

2019 NMAA Girls Wrestling Exhibition Recap

At the 2019 New Mexico National Guard State Wrestling Championships, the New Mexico Activities Association held the second-ever Girls' State Wrestling Exhibition.

The exhibition was a huge success, as 78 girls competed in 10 separate brackets. Dozens of girls competed on the biggest stage for a high school wrestler.

The NMAA created the exhibition event in 2018 to help drive interest and participation in girls wrestling while continuing to evaluate the future sanctioning of girls wrestling in New Mexico.

Individual winners of the exhibition included, Jennisis Martinez of Manzano (101 lbs.), Yalixza Gonzalez of Atrisco Heritage (106 lbs.),

Neveah Young of Gallup (113 lbs.), Melinda Modisette of ABQ. Academy (121 lbs.), Yele Aycock of Miyamura (126 lbs.), Amanda Smith of Cleveland (131 lbs.), Aylin Mijares of Bernalillo (143 lbs.), Nancy Rodriguez of Miyamura (160 lbs.), Rayana Vigil of Atrisco Heritage (185 lbs.) and Alura Sandoval of Atrisco Heritage (235 lbs.).

Jennisis Martinez, Yele Aycock, Nancy Rodriguez and Rayana Vigil were all repeat winners from 2018.
