






The award has culminated in a major international exhibition, touring from the Jockey Club Museum of Climate Change (Hong Kong), and to the exhibition, you see before you.

In its entirety, the inaugural Decade of Change award unites artistic voices from around the world in an urgent and masterful exploration of the climate crisis — celebrating all that we have to protect, and cautioning all that we have to lose.
