Meeting Emerging Needs throughout Adversity

As you know, our Y isn't a building. It's people - people from all backgrounds and walks of life who come together to improve their lives, nurture their families and strengthen their community. For over 50 years, YMCA of Southwest Florida has met our communities' emerging needs and continues to serve others.

When the devastating effects of COVID-19 swept across the country and landed on our doorsteps, we quickly mobilized to provide our community with essential services. While others began to close their doors, our YMCA opened our doors wider. By providing emergency childcare, virtual learning centers, senior and member outreach and expanding food programs, our Y was able to continue serving kids and families in their greatest time of need.

YMCA of Southwest Florida's ability to meet the ever-changing needs of our communities is made possible through the support of partners, donors and members.

SERVING OUR COMMUNITY LIKE NEVER BEFORE

As this timeline shows, we have worked relentlessly and creatively to be a vital community resource for our families during the COVID-19 health crisis. For more than 50 years, we have been there for communities during times of need. And it is this commitment that will guide our work for years to come.

March

- Florida announces an official stay-at home order due to COVID-19.
- All Y wellness centers close operations and programming quickly shifts to support families, communities and Y staff.
- The Y opens its doors to provide emergency childcare for first responders and essential employees, so that they are able to play their imperative roles in fighting COVID-19.
- The Y launches Grab and Go Meal Sites to ensure all children and families have access to healthy meals.
- 465 SKY Academy middle school students transition to remote learning.
- Y Staff begin to make senior connection calls to ensure their needs are met and connect them to available resources.

April May

- Virtual YMCA and family engagement programming is offered to keep individuals healthy and connected.
- The Y continues to provide quality, safe emergency childcare to families in our community.
- Children are provided with academic support so that they are able to participate in remote learning while in YMCA care.
- Essential Grab and Go Meal Sites and food programs continue to provide meals to struggling families.
- The Y hosts life-saving blood drives to assist with hospital shortages and aid community members.
- Y wellness centers reopen under a careful phased-in approach that includes capacity restrictions and COVID-19 precautions for fitness and lap swimming.

June July

- The Y welcomes children to Summer Camp in limited numbers.
- YMCA of Southwest Florida enters Phase II of its reopening plan. This phase includes reintroducing early morning hours, access to locker rooms, reopening Kid Zone with limited hours and offering personal training. During this time, YMCA of Southwest Florida also reintroduces competitive teams. All reopening plans observe CDC guidelines and recommendations.
- SKY Academies and Early Learning Centers host "socially-distant" promotion ceremonies for our middle school students and early learners.

August September

- In-person and virtual learning commence at SKY Academies for the 2020-2021 School Year.
- Early Learning Centers begin the 2020-2021 School Year while continuing to observe CDC guidelines and recommendations.
- The Y begins a new academic year for Before and After School Enrichment (BASE) programming where children receive educational support to help reduce COVID-19 learning loss.
- The Y provides critical in-person remote learning support for families of remote learners.

October November December

- YMCA of Southwest Florida enters Phase III of its reopening plan. This phase includes reintroducing the availability of showers and lockers, lap swimming, open swim and gymnasium, indoor group and water group exercise classes and racquetball.
- Adult and youth sports resume under COVID-19 Sport Safety Guidelines.
- Winter Break Camps offer care for families throughout the holiday season while adhering to safety guidelines.
- The Y hosts its first Holiday Meal and Toy Drive brightening the spirits of 269 children in our communities that have been impacted by the pandemic.

EXPANDING OUR REACH

As part of our Strategic Plan and its initiatives, YMCA of Southwest Florida is committed to developing the potential of every child through partnerships and expanding YMCA Youth Development programs throughout Southwest Florida.



CAMP ESTERO

In June 2020, as part of our outreach efforts our Y began to operate Camp Estero. This 5-acre nature facility allows us to serve an additional 40 children daily through summer camp. Camp Estero serves as a location to participate in environmental education, family activities, corporate retreats, yoga, kayaking adventures and other wellness programs for adults.



THE SUWYN EARLY LEARNING CENTER

In August 2020, YMCA of Southwest Florida expanded its early learning program with the addition of The Suwyn Early Learning Center at the Bonita Springs YMCA. Through this expansion, the capacity to serve was increased by 152 children daily. This allows the Y to prepare more early learners for kindergarten and provide achievement support for school age children.



VENICE YMCA EARLY LEARNING CENTER

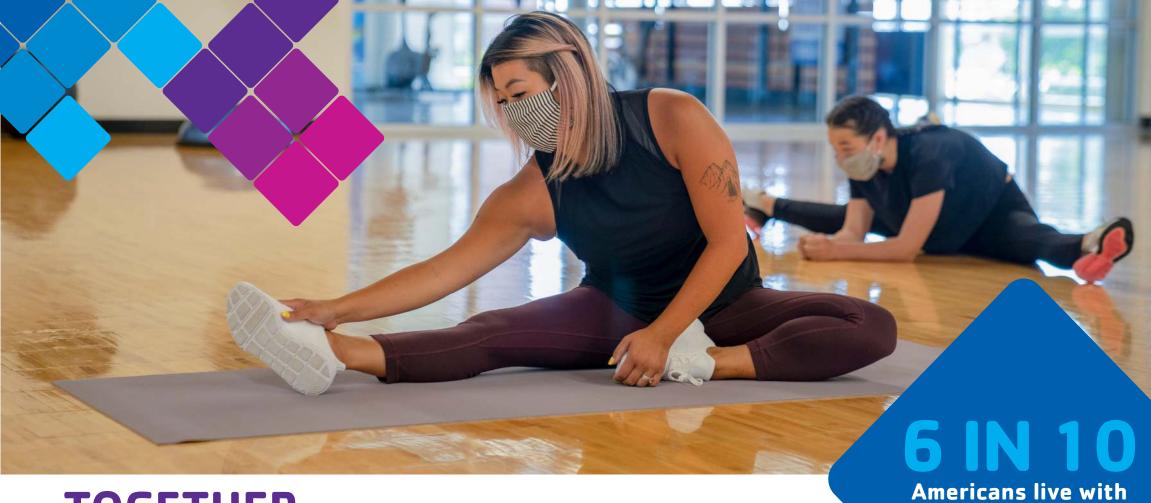
In November 2020, YMCA of Southwest Florida was awarded a grant from Impact 100™ SRQ to renovate the old preschool building on the Venice YMCA campus. Through this partnership, the Y is able to increase our capacity at the Venice YMCA Early Learning Center by 150 children daily.

"The Y is the first place I felt like I belonged. As a single mother, finding quality

childcare has not always been easy until I found the Y. The early learning services offered at YMCA of Southwest Florida provide a place for my children where I know they are safe and loved. The Y provides my family with healthy, strong relationships.

"Like many others, last year I saw big changes in my life.

The daily social and physical activities at the Y were on hold and I was faced with a closet full of clothes that didn't fit and snacks in the pantry and a big sense of wider social isolation. I was so grateful for the virtual sessions at the Y in yoga, Pilates, strength, cardio and stretching which gave my days some structure and new friends, on top of great exercise options. I have tried diets and bought too many books on how to eat healthy which all worked for a few weeks and then left a library of books and unopened, unappetizing food products on my shelves. I have avoided group programs due to time and cost. Then I heard about the Y's virtual weight management classes and was able to join. By the end of the sessions, I was so surprised and pleased that I had met my goal.

But the best realization was that this group had empowered and motivated me to use the lessons learned as life tools.

Giving back and providing support to our neighbors is the heartbeat of the Y.

Now more than ever, we need places and programs that are open to people of all generations, backgrounds and perspectives. At the Y, we welcome everyone, because we believe our

communities are stronger when we come together.

"My 6-year-old son was born with a neuromuscular disorder. Since he was 3 months old, he has been in physical and occupational therapy. During COVID-19, he started losing muscle development from being unable to participate in therapy. We spent more time outdoors and I became concerned that he didn't know how to swim as we live on a canal.

I learned about the Safety Around Water Program at the YMCA. Not only did my son learn how to float, kick, blow bubbles, jump off the wall, and swim in six weeks, he built his confidence in and around water and gained his loss of muscle strength back.

I am not sure I would know what to do without the Y,

they have helped both of us so much that I am enrolling him in the Y Afterschool program as well.

I love the staff at the Y, they have all opened their arms to us and never blinked an eye at his disability.

SCHOLARSHIP ASSISTANCE

Each year, through the children and families scholarship fund, YMCA of Southwest Florida provides over \$1,500,000 in scholarship assistance so that all have access to YMCA programs. By providing financial support, we are able to break down barriers and lift others up. This is possible through the support of our partners, donors and members.



SAFETY AROUND WATER

Throughout the pandemic, childhood drownings have significantly increased and access to water safety programs and swim lessons are needed more than ever. At the Y, we believe that all children should have the knowledge and confidence to be safe around water.

Safety Around Water programming helps children develop life-saving skills that reduce the potential of drowning. Through partnerships, the Y is able to teach more children water safety and how to swim year after year.



LITERACY INITIATIVES

YMCA of Southwest Florida operates three YREADS! sites, an after-school reading remediation and mentoring program, where at-risk and low-income children in Kindergarten through fourth-grade develop the reading skills they need to succeed in school. The Y also partners with Suncoast Campaign for Grade Level Reading to increase literacy support for kids in our community to reduce learning loss.

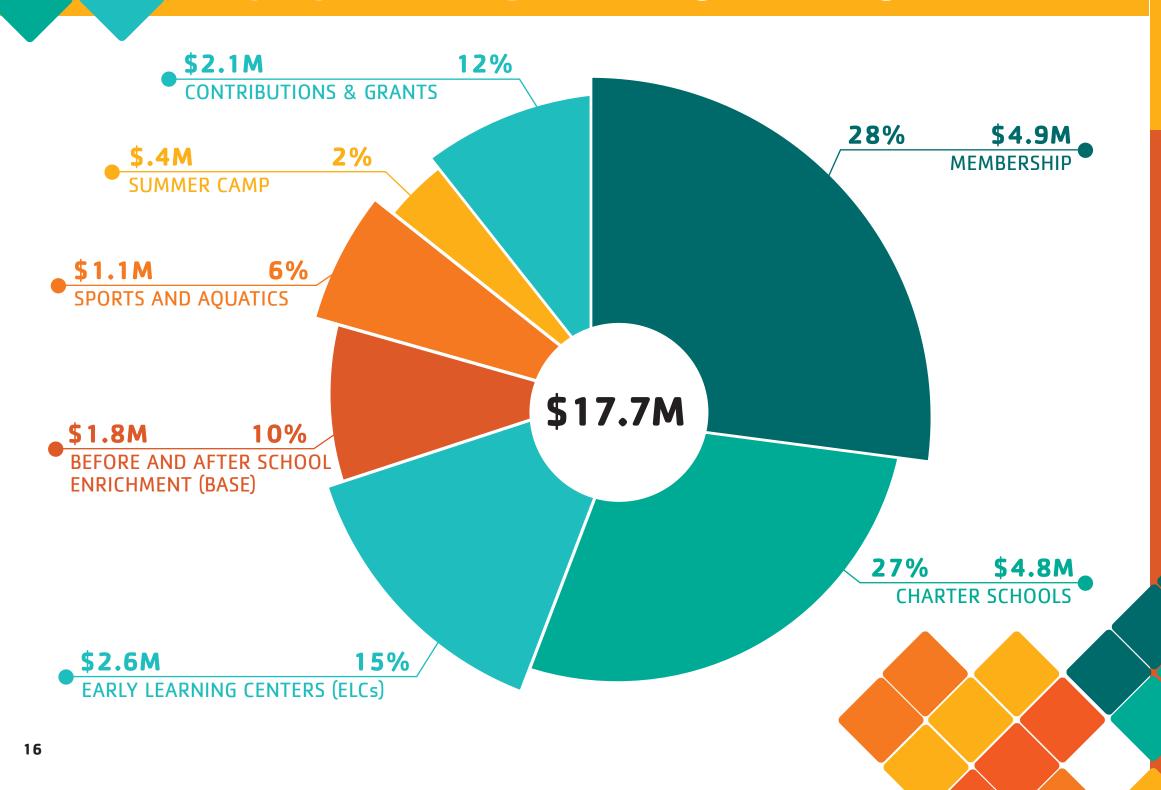
