# The IHMDO Mega Service

Leadership is best proven through action, friendship is strengthened through shared purpose, and service finds its highest meaning when it reaches those most in need. These are not just guiding principles of Alpha Phi Omega. They are lived experiences, expressed in moments when brothers and sisters come together to create meaningful impact. Even before the National General Assembly officially begins, these values are already set into motion through one of the organization's most meaningful traditions.

Each year, on the day prior to the NGA, Alpha Phi Omega Philippines conducts the International Humanitarian Medical Dental Optical Outreach or IHMDO Mega Service. More than a pre-event activity, it is a collective expression of the fraternity and sorority's commitment to serve. Through this initiative, communities are provided with essential services such as free medical consultations, dental care, circumcision, blood typing, optical services with free eyeglasses, legal consultations, haircut services, and gift-giving.

Set in the globally renowned Boracay Island, this year's outreach reflects both opportunity and responsibility. Despite being celebrated as a white beach paradise, the island continues to face limitations in healthcare access. The available medical facilities are not always sufficient to meet the needs of its residents and the steady influx of tourists. Beyond this, indigenous groups such as the Ati community remain among those with limited access to consistent healthcare services. These realities highlight the importance of bringing care directly to the community.

At the forefront of this initiative is the Alpha Phi Omega Alumni Council of North America or ACNA. Its formation traces back to 1988, when leaders from different regional alumni associations began discussions on creating a unified body that could better coordinate efforts and extend service beyond their local chapters. This vision materialized in 1990 during the Inter-State Conference hosted in Northern California, where ACNA was formally established with six charter member associations. Guided by the presence of Dr. Librado I. Ureta, Philippine Organizer and President Emeritus, the founding of ACNA marked a significant step in strengthening global collaboration within Alpha Phi Omega.

Since then, ACNA has grown into a strong and consistent partner in humanitarian work, particularly in the Philippines. Through initiatives such as the IHMDO, as well as fundraising projects led by each presidency, the council has supported medical missions, disaster relief operations, and community-based programs like Adopt a Barangay. These efforts have enabled the organization to reach thousands of beneficiaries and sustain long-term service initiatives.

## and the Continuing Legacy of Service

Working alongside ACNA is Alpha Phi Omega Philippines Incorporated, supported by the Committee on National Service for Health. This committee was formally established in 2009 under the leadership of then National President Bro Marcelino "Tratang" Ferry, with the goal of organizing and strengthening healthcare-related services within the organization. It brought together medical and dental missions into a more structured national program aligned with APO's service agenda.

In recent years, the program was further strengthened and revitalized under the leadership of then National President Sis Norma Singson-De Leon, who expanded its scope by integrating allied health professionals and promoting a more comprehensive approach to healthcare delivery. Now known as the Committee on National Service for Health, it continues to lead medical and dental outreach initiatives while also promoting health education among members through webinars and collaborative activities.

In line with this enduring tradition, the IHMDO Mega Service will take place on May 14, 2026 at Balabag Elementary School, one day before the 37th National General Assembly hosted by the APO Boracay Alumni Association. The event is expected to gather volunteers and professionals from various fields, all united by a shared commitment to serve.

The activity will be led by ACNA President Bro. Art Rivera, together with APO National Service for Health Chairwoman Sis. Edna Corpuz-Navallo, MD, APO Trustee-in-Charge Bro. Edward Flores, MD, and Mega Service Committee Chairman Bro. John Clyde S. Tejada, RN. Their leadership, along with the support of partner organizations and regional sectors, ensures the effective delivery of services to the community.

An estimated 1,000 beneficiaries—including local residents, indigenous groups such as the Ati community, and visiting tourists—are expected to benefit from the outreach.

In a place known for its breathtaking beauty, the IHMDO Mega Service reveals a deeper and more lasting impact. It is where leadership takes initiative, friendship builds collaboration, and service transforms lives. Through this tradition, Alpha Phi Omega continues to demonstrate that its principles are not only upheld but lived, reaching far beyond gatherings and into the heart of communities.

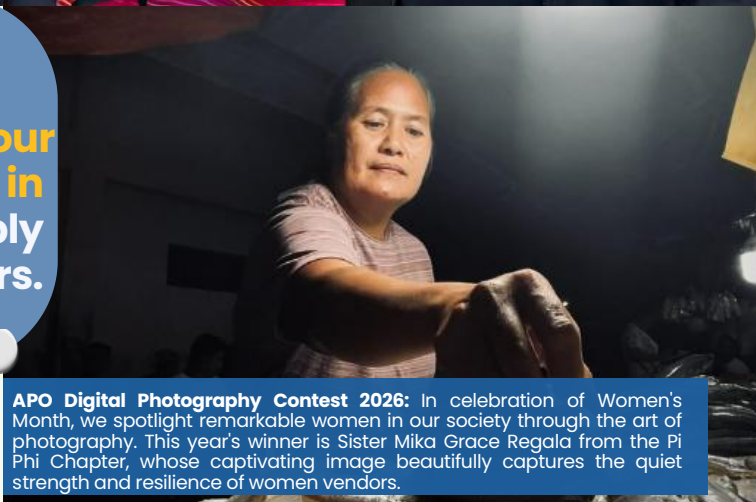

# When Kappa Gamma

## Turned the Stage into a Voice for the Nation

A different kind of silence has begun to settle—not the absence of sound, but the fading of what once was ours. Familiar melodies are replaced, AI-generated music grows normalized, and local voices are pushed to the margins. Somewhere between trends and algorithms, Original Pinoy Music risks losing its place—not for lack of brilliance, but because it is no longer heard. Yet on some stages, it is still fought for.

On March 1, the **Alpha Phi Omega – Kappa Gamma Chapter** transformed the university into a space where Filipino artistry refused to be background noise. Through a university-wide literary musical competition anchored on both Original Pinoy Music and the spirit of Women's Month, students were not merely given a platform—they were given a reason to be heard.

Academic organizations competed in categories such as a cappella, vocal duet, poetry in motion, and creative modern dance. But what unfolded was more than competition; it was a collision of voices, stories, and identities. Each performance carried something deeply personal, yet undeniably collective.

There was something raw in the way the students performed. It was not polished for perfection, but driven by the urgency to express. Songs were not just sung—they were claimed. In mounting this event, they moved beyond coordination and logistics; they engaged in the deeper work of cultivating a space where artistry becomes a shared responsibility, and where students are empowered to see themselves not just as participants, but as contributors to a larger national narrative.

In this sense, the initiative transcended the bounds of a single event. It became a form of cultural work—one that affirmed that the survival of Filipino artistry depends not only on those who create it, but also on those willing to protect, amplify, and pass it on.

And perhaps that was the most striking part of it all: not the winners, not the applause, but the realization that as long as there are students who continue to create, to perform, and to take up space, Filipino artistry will never truly be drowned out—**something the Kappa Gamma Chapter is proud to have sparked into motion.**

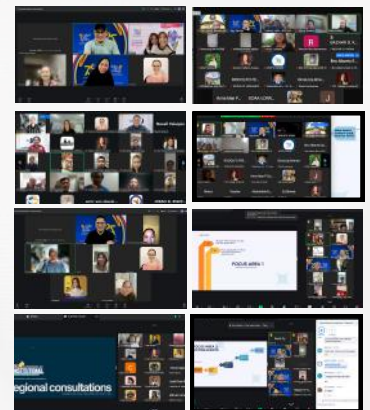
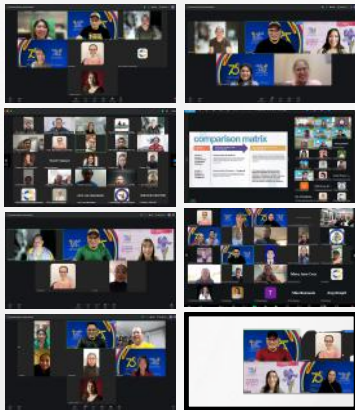

### January 2026 - February 2026 : Regional Consultations

- Regional Consultations were conducted across all Philippine-based and Foreign-based Administrative Regions to solicit stakeholder input on the proposed Bylaws.

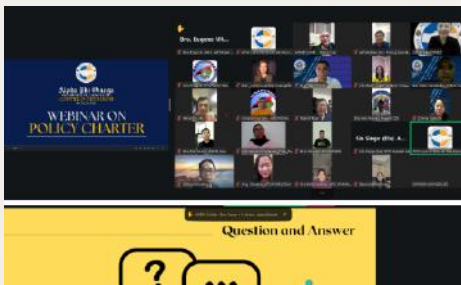

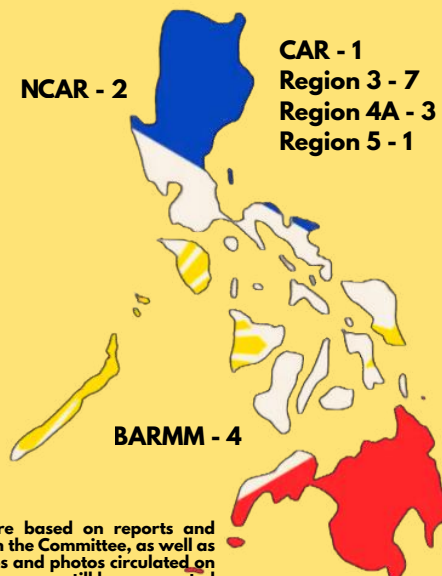

# ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT

January to March 2026

## Policies & Standards

In accordance with the Alpha Phi Omega Rules of Procedure in Dispute Resolution (ARPDR), the National Grievance and Adjudicatory Authority (NGAA) has developed a dedicated Module on Conciliation as a foundational component of the dispute resolution framework. Recognizing conciliation as a primary and essential mechanism under the ARPDR, the module is designed to guide Section Chairs and concerned officers in the proper conduct of initial dispute resolution proceedings.

The development of this module is anchored on NGAA Resolution No. 002, Series of 2025-2027, which recommends its adoption as an official training and reference material for dispute resolution within Alpha Phi Omega Philippines, Inc., and its subsequent endorsement to the Board of Trustees for approval and institutional implementation. It comprehensively covers core concepts, legal and procedural bases, roles and responsibilities, conciliation processes, and the drafting of compromise agreements, while integrating the organization's core values of Leadership, Friendship, and Service.

Upon approval, the module shall be institutionalized across all chapters, sections, and regions, and incorporated into official trainings, workshops, and leadership development programs. Its implementation will strengthen internal dispute resolution mechanisms, promote amicable settlements, and foster organizational unity.

## Capacitation

Building on the outcomes of the consultative meeting with the Chairpersons of the Regional Grievance and Adjudicatory Committees (RGACs) held on August 23, 2025, and in furtherance of the principles of fairness, transparency, and effectiveness in the dispute resolution process, the National Grievance and Adjudicatory Authority (NGAA) successfully conducted a capacitation on the Alpha Phi Omega Rules of Procedure in Dispute Resolution (ARPDR) on April 18, 2026. The activity was attended by Regional Directors, RGAC Chairpersons and members, as well as Section Chairs.

The capacitation reinforced a shared and consistent understanding of the proper procedures for filing and handling disputes, conducting investigations, and imposing appropriate sanctions. It likewise emphasized the importance of adhering to due process and maintaining uniformity in the application of the ARPDR across all regions and sections, thereby strengthening the fraternity's internal mechanisms for accountability and unity.

In addition, the activity promoted the continued use and institutionalization of the simplified version of the ARPDR as a practical and accessible reference for RGACs and Section Chairs in the discharge of their functions. The session also introduced and highlighted the Module on Conciliation developed by the NGAA, pursuant to NGAA Resolution No. 002, Series of 2025-2027, as a key training and reference tool to strengthen conciliation as the initial step in dispute resolution.

Through this capacitation, the NGAA further enhanced the capability of its officers and reinforced its commitment to fostering a culture of fairness, accountability, and amicable settlement of disputes. In doing so, it strengthened internal mechanisms for conflict resolution across all levels of the organization, ensuring that the values of Leadership, Friendship, and Service remain at the core of every process.

Some were locals by birth, while others traced their roots to nearby chapters and provinces. Today, the APO-Boracay Alumni Association has grown into a network of around 25 active members, connecting brothers and sisters across the island—be they tourists, local residents, or job seekers—and transforming chance encounters into lasting bonds of fraternity and fellowship.

From its early years, APO-BORACAY became known for its signature warmth and genuine support. Visiting APOrs were warmly welcomed, guided, and entertained, while new members were assisted in settling in and connecting with opportunities on the island. These efforts laid the foundation for APO-BORACAY's reputation as a dependable, service-oriented community. Although challenges emerged over time due to work reassignments and seasonal employment shifts, the spirit of APO-BORACAY remained resilient. Members continued to stay connected through informal gatherings and mutual support, especially for brothers and sisters seeking opportunities or exploring life on the island.

A key symbol of this enduring unity is their shared "tambayan," which serves as a welcoming space for fellowship, coordination, and assistance.

True to its mission of advancing Leadership, Friendship, and Service, APO-BORACAY has led and supported various impactful initiatives, including beachfront activities, medical missions, community outreach programs, and collaborations with local authorities. Through these efforts, the association continues to uphold its commitment to uplifting humanity while safeguarding Boracay's beauty and vibrancy.

This year's 37th National General Assembly (NGA) in Boracay carries special significance, marking only the second time the island has hosted this national gathering. The first was the 25th NGA held on May 28-31, 2009 at the Boracay Ecovillage Convention Center, themed "Great Leap Forward: Towards Excellence," under the leadership of Sis. Nobella "Belle" Tumbokon of Psi '70 Chapter, who served as Chairwoman of the event. In one of her speeches during the 25th NGA, she shared:

"The APO 25th National Biennial Convention is envisioned to be one of the most remembered conventions in history. The APO 25th NBC will once again bring together a meeting of minds of our organization's thinkers and doers as we redefine our three cardinal principles of Leadership, Friendship and Service to Humanity and acknowledge their relevance in a changing world."

Building on this legacy, the 37th NGA aspires to replicate this historic milestone and be remembered as one of the most remarkable National General Assemblies in the organization's history. It continues to inspire participants to reach greater heights, reflecting the enduring commitment to growth, collaboration, and excellence. This continuity further reinforces Boracay's standing as a trusted and proven venue for the National General Assembly.

The NGA was made even more successful through the strong support of the local government, private institutions, and the Boracay community, ensuring smooth coordination, safety, and active participation throughout all activities. This strong partnership highlighted the credibility, trust, and goodwill that APO-BORACAY has built over the years.

Leading the event were Bro. Marben Michael Madrones, current President of APO-BORACAY AA, and Bro. Jelper Saturnino, Vice President for Internal Affairs of APO-BORACAY AA, who both served as NGA Chairmen, alongside Bro. Jas Segismundo as Vice Chairman. Bro. Marben provided strategic direction, mentorship, and overall leadership, ensuring that every aspect of the program reflected the association's standards of excellence. Bro. Jelper ensured the NGA was carried out with distinction, further solidifying APO-BORACAY's reputation as a capable and reliable host.

While Boracay provides a stunning backdrop, it is ultimately the members of APO-BORACAY AA and its NGA leadership who bring the event to life. Their dedication, expertise, and commitment to service ensure that every participant experiences not only the beauty of the island, but also the warmth, organization, and meaningful fellowship that define APO-BORACAY. ■

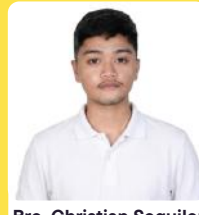

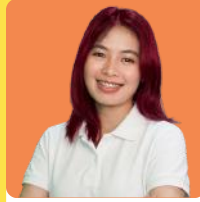

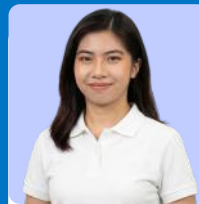
