Psalm 23 (KJV)

“The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters. He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name’s sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me. Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.”

When I read Psalm 23, I do not just see Scripture, I see my life. I see long nights overseas serving in the United States Navy, deployed throughout Southwest Asia and Africa. During my eight years of service, five were spent in the sandbox in places like Iraq, Afghanistan, Pakistan, Djibouti, Bahrain, and Qatar. There were moments filled with uncertainty, exhaustion, and fear, but through every deployment, God reminded me that He was always present.

Psalm 23:4 says, “Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me.” Those words became real in combat zones where tomorrow was never guaranteed. In those difficult moments, I learned that God is not only with us during peaceful seasons, he walks with us through the valleys too.

Looking back now, I realize the military was preparing me for more than service. God was teaching me leadership, discipline, resilience, and perseverance. At the time, I did not fully understand why I was walking those difficult roads, but God was building the foundation for my future.

When my military career ended, another challenge began. At 29 years old, I stepped onto the LSU campus as a college student pursuing a degree. It was humbling being older than many of my classmates, but that season taught me the value of persistence and faith. God showed me that sometimes growth requires us to step outside of our comfort zone and trust His direction.

During my time in football and college athletics, I started noticing how many young athletes were falling through the cracks. Talented kids lacked exposure, mentorship, and opportunity. That burden eventually became the vision for Gridiron Football.

Gridiron Football was built on more than sports. It was built on faith, leadership, and the belief that helping one child can impact an entire community. The lessons I learned in the military, in college, and through life’s struggles all became part of the mission we live out today.

Psalm 23:5 says, “Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies.” There were people who doubted the vision, questioned the mission, and did not understand the purpose behind Gridiron Football. But God has a way of opening doors no one can shut. Through His grace, we have helped thousands of athletes gain exposure and opportunities they may never have had otherwise.

Today, when I look back on my journey from military deployments to LSU and now leading Gridiron Football, I can honestly say that God’s goodness and mercy have followed me every step of the way. And if He did it for me, He can do it for you too.

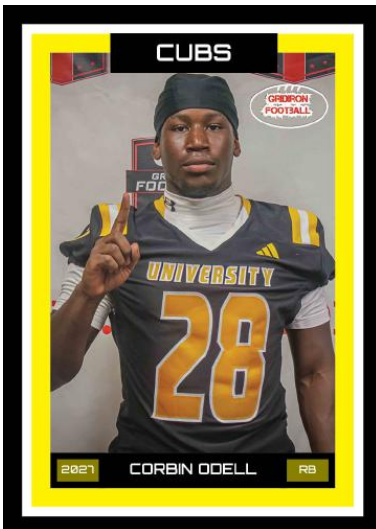

Future Looks Bright

Heading into the first summer under LSU head coach Lane Kiffin, high school recruiting has picked up over the last couple of weeks.

Over a 48 hour period, the Tigers grabbed four commitments from 5 star DE KJ Green, 3 star RB Brennan Lacey, 3 star ATH Markez Davis, and 4 star WR Cade Cooper.

KJ Green is the headliner of the four as he is the number eight overall prospect in the country and the number two EDGE rusher in the 2027 recruiting class. At 6'4, 230 pounds, Green has been a nightmare off the edge playing at Stephenson High School in Stone Mountain, Georgia finishing his junior campaign with 129 tackles, 18 sacks, 40 TFLs, 4 FFs, and 1 FR. Green chose the Tigers over other big time programs including Oregon, Texas, and Alabama.

Also that day, LSU picked up a commitment from running back Brennan Lacey, who is from Frisco High School in Frisco, Texas. This is the first running back commitment in this year's class for running backs coach Kevin Smith as Lacey chose LSU over schools like Notre Dame, Miami, TCU, Texas Tech, Florida, and other programs. At 6'0, 190 pounds, he is the ranked the 31st best running back in the nation and has been clocked with an impressive 10.91 second 100 meter dash.



The next day, the Tigers added three star ATH Markez Davis out of Northwest High School in Opelousas, Louisiana. Projected to play cornerback for Corey Raymond, he fits the mold of long, athletic defensive backs that have come through Baton Rouge as Davis is listed at 6'3 tall. The number 15 overall prospect in the state of Louisiana has really picked up his recruitment over the last couple of weeks picking up offers

from Alabama, Mississippi State, Houston, and West Virginia.

The final commitment of the weekend is Malvern Prep 4 star wide receiver Cade Cooper who chose LSU after taking his official visit in Baton Rouge visiting with wide receivers coach George McDonald. The top 10 recruit from the state of Pennsylvania has many offers including from Penn State, Ole Miss, Auburn, Georgia Tech, Miami, Cincinnati, Wake Forest, West Virginia, Pittsburgh, and others.

The four 2027 commitments join four other commitments that currently make up the class including Evangel Christian Academy 4 star QB Peyton Houston, Ruston 5 star TE Ahmad Hudson, Cecilia 4 star ATH Braylon Calais, and Hollywood (FL) 4 star WR Ah'Mari Stevens.

“The relationship has been there with Coach Kiffin and he is going to be exciting to play for,” Cecilia ATH and LSU commit Braylon Calais

There are some big targets that LSU would still like to flip or commit such as Franklin Parish 4 star RB Trey Martin, Brother Martin 5 star WR Easton Royal, who is currently committed to Texas, and Cedar Hill (TX) 5 star DT Jalen Brewster, who is currently committed to Texas Tech, but the class is trending in the right direction as the summer progresses.

While LSU tries to secure the current class, their attention is also on the 2028-2030 classes. At LSU’s camp series, they have offered multiple prospects from the high school classes. Former Gridiron Football Elite Camp Top Performer Andrew Shofstahl, who got offered by the Tigers after his camp performance in the OL/DL camp.

“Obviously being a Louisiana boy, this offer means a ton. Everyone in the state bleeds pur-

ple and gold. I grew up watching them Saturday nights. It’s crazy to think I can be on that screen one day,” St. Paul’s 2028 OL Andrew Shofstahl

Along with Shofstahl, the Tigers offered other in-state prospects including Evangel Christian Academy 2028 DB Seth Collins, Abbeville 2028 WR Jacolby Campbell, St. Augustine 2028 OT Jayden Taylor, Archbishop Shaw 2028 WR Nasir Parker, Jeanerette 2029 OL Blair Lewis, North DeSoto 2030 QB Mason Smith, and John Curtis DE Broderick Sanders III.

Perhaps, the biggest pickup for LSU in recruiting is adding former Tigers head coach Ed Orgeron as he joins Lane Kiffin’s staff. He out of all people understands what the talent in the state has to offer and how important it is to still recruit at the high school ranks.



Tulane Gains Commitment From St. Charles Catholic and Gridiron Football Camp Star James Tyson

A few days ago, the Tulane Green Wave gained a commitment from St. Charles Catholic High School (Laplace, LA) 2027 defensive back James Tyson. At 6'0, 180 pounds, the rising recruit recently picked up an offer from the Green Wave and decided to announce that he was staying close to home.

"I believe in what Tulane is building and the potential this 2027 Tulane class has. It felt like home the moment I was offered and committing felt like the right choice." St. Charles Catholic 2027 DB James Tyson

Tyson has risen up the recruiting ranks and is emerging as one of the top upcoming prospects to watch out for in Louisiana with offers already from the likes of Arkansas State, Louisiana Tech, Cornell, and Nicholls. Still, there is no other team that he has built a relationship more than with the Green Wave.

"The conversations I've had with the coaches are very real. It doesn't feel fake or like they're just talking to recruit me. It feels like a genuine connection. I believe Tulane sees me as a cornerback who can play the inside or outside at a very high level, especially in the man schemes that they run a lot in their defense." "Coach Hall has decades of coaching experience and it has shown. I believe in what Coach Hall is doing and building this 2027 class and I'm beyond blessed to be a part of it." St. Charles Catholic 2027 DB James Tyson

Tyson has emerged on the scene late since he has only taken sports seriously since his sophomore year, but he has quickly showed what kind of athlete he truly is. In fact, it was at our Gridiron Football Elite Camp last offseason at Lamar Dixon Expo Center that he put on one of the more impressive athletic displays that our camp series has ever had. There, he posted a 4.45/40, a 4.12 shuttle, and a camp record 10'7 broad jump. It was at the camp where Tyson admitted has gained his confidence as a football player.

Wayne Stein including last year. Along with being super athletic, Tyson has also gained other valuable attributes that he can help bring championships to other teams.

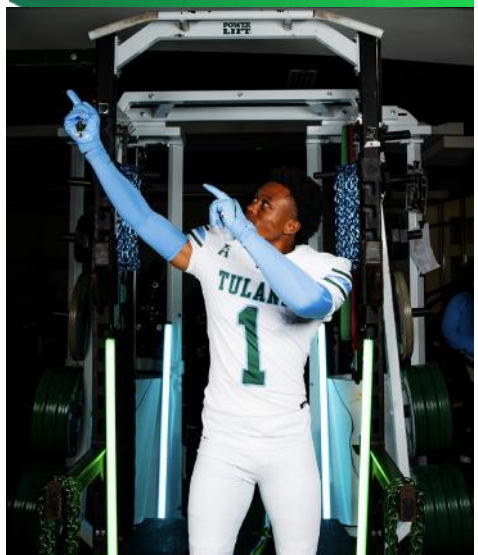
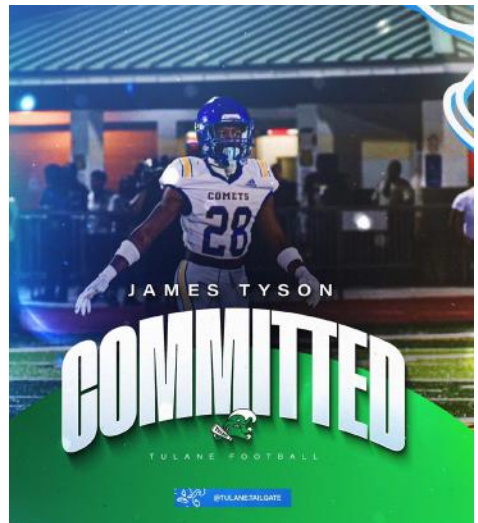

Jamyrie Lambert: Two Way Difference Maker For Livonia

Under head coach Khalil Thomas, the Livonia Wildcats are one of the candidates this year to have a breakout campaign. This past spring, there have been numerous standouts at our Gridiron Football Elite Camps including WR CJ Aguillard, WR Bo Stewart, DL Jacorryan Franklin, and WR/DB Jamyrie Lambert. All have been top camp performers this year including Lambert, who is a versatile piece that can make a difference not only on one side of the field, but both sides.

“Playing both running back and safety last year gave me an advantage. When I play running back, I can look at the safety and tell what coverage they are in. When I am on defense, I can see how the receivers line up and tell what routes they are going to run or if they are going to throw the ball or run the ball.”

Those advantages allowed Lambert to have a Travis Hunter esque season in which he was making plays everywhere on the field. Earning 2nd Team All-District honors at Flex, Lambert had 98 tackles and 4 INTs as a safety on defense and 380 yards and 4 TDs on offense.

I learned a lot and picked up on things that can help my technique.”

Jamyrie Lambert is looking for his first offer, but his versatility, track speed, and also a 3.1 GPA in the classroom should tell coaches that he is ready to play for just about anybody.

“The reason colleges should look at me is because I am a hard working player and I like to lead the team. I always try to lead the guys in the right direction. I always study the playbook, look at the film, and see what the other team is trying to do in order to take advantage of us.”



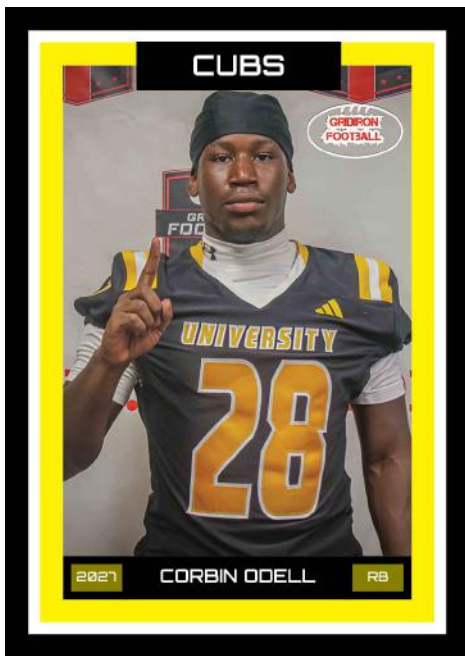
Corbin Odell: Time To Shine As Featured Back

The last couple of years, the U-High Cubs featured one of the best 1-2 punches at running back in the state of Louisiana in Sage Ingram and Corbin Odell. The duo nicknamed “Fire and Ice” combined to rush for 1,814 yards and 25 touchdowns last season. Now that Ingram has graduated, it is now time for Odell to be the bellcow for the Cubs’ rushing attack.

After a breakout sophomore campaign in which he earned 1st Team All-District honors with 733 rushing yards and eight touchdowns. He followed that up posting even better numbers last season. player. I am always working on getting better no matter if I did good or if I messed up. I am always going to look back and see what I performed well at and make sure to replicate it or I am going to ask around and see what I did wrong. I am always looking forward to getting better.”

The Galvez Middle School product received his invitation to play in this year’s prestigious Gridiron Football All-American Bowl Game after his top camp performance at Elite Training Academy. Having another opportunity to represent the Cubs and showcase his talent in front of college coaches on December 30th at Louisiana Christian University in Pineville, Louisiana means a lot to him.

“I know a lot of my friends played in it and it’s a huge deal to be playing in this bowl game. I am going to be out there with some people I grew up with and it is going to be a very fun experience.”

Gridiron Football is not the only one impressed with the Cubs’ leading back as Grambling State and Nicholls State have already offered Odell heading into his senior season.

“Coaches should be recruiting me because I am a hard worker and I am going to give it my very best. I am going to try and get everything down that you want me to get down. I am going to work that hard. That’s how hard I am willing to work for.”

Just showing what he can do with half the carries over his prep career as a two time All-District selection, two DI collegiate offers, and being a Gridiron Football All-American, it is sure going to be exciting to see what #28 will bring this fall.

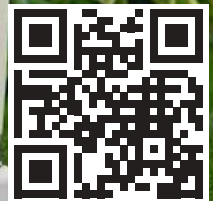
