# A Big Blob

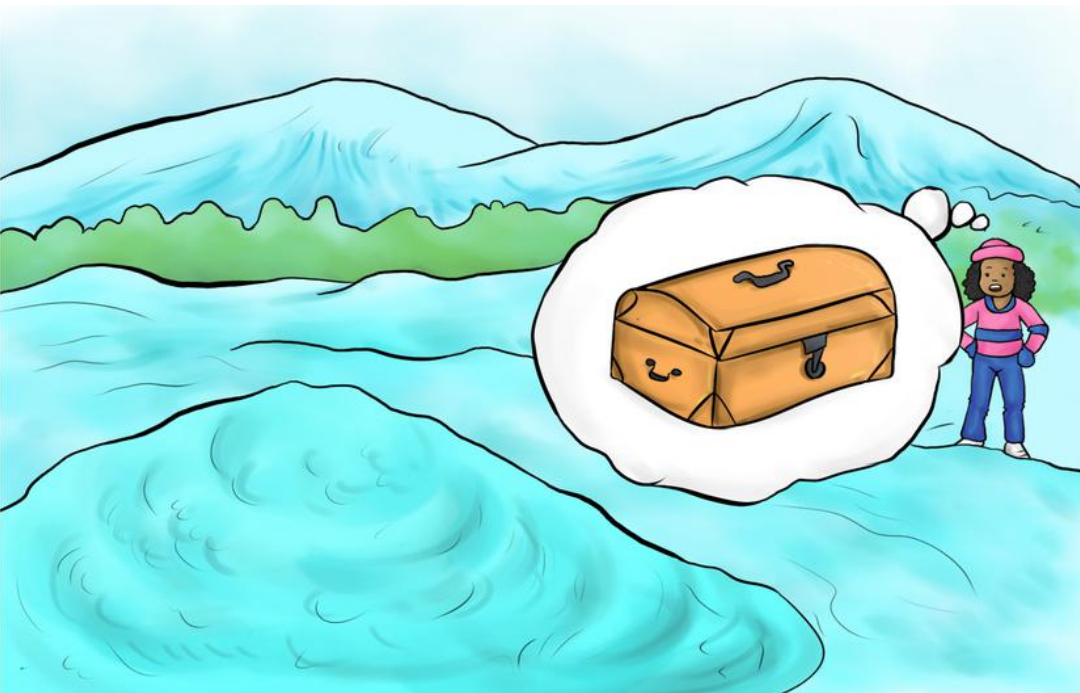


That is a big blob.

I want to look at it.

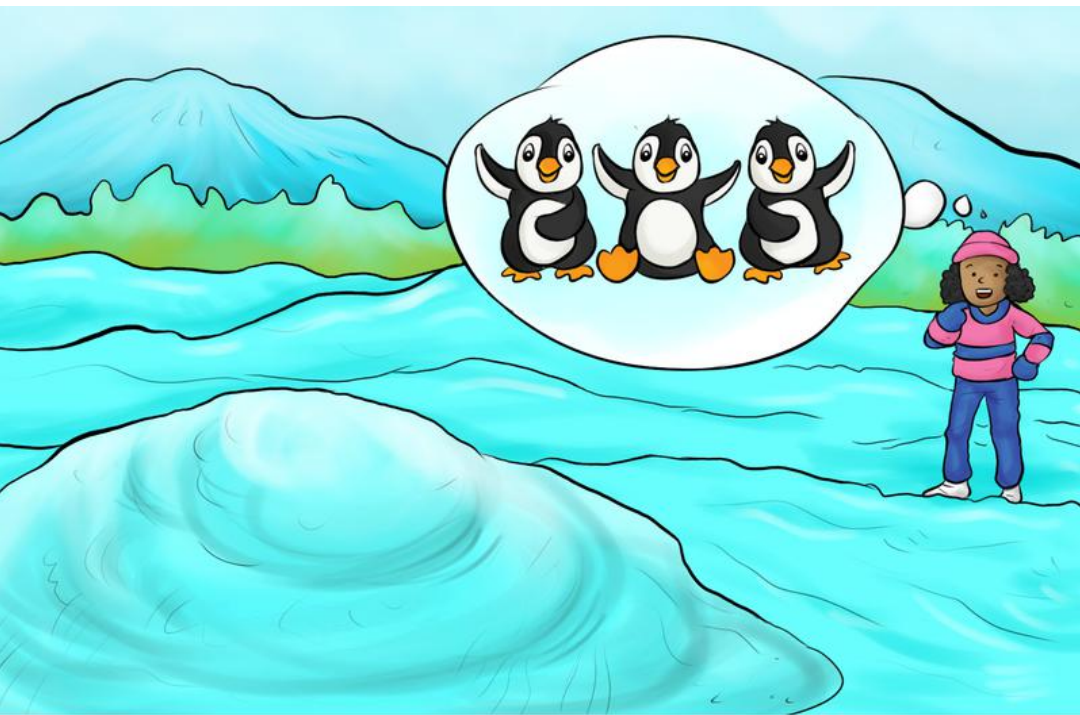


Is it a box that was
