Artist Statement:

I chose a variation of the quilt pattern “Hovering Hawks” by Anita Hallock from the book “Fast Patch A Treasury of Strip Quilt Projects” as I wanted to challenge myself with some triangles. Most of this quilt was made during lockdown periods and was a pleasant change from schoolwork. I picked out the fabrics, cut the fabrics with guidance from my Grandma, and then I sewed the pieces using a domestic sewing machine. I put the quilt layers together and tacked the quilt, before quilting it myself on a domestic sewing machine. Grandma assisted me with sewing the binding onto the quilt and I used hand sewing to sew the binding down myself.

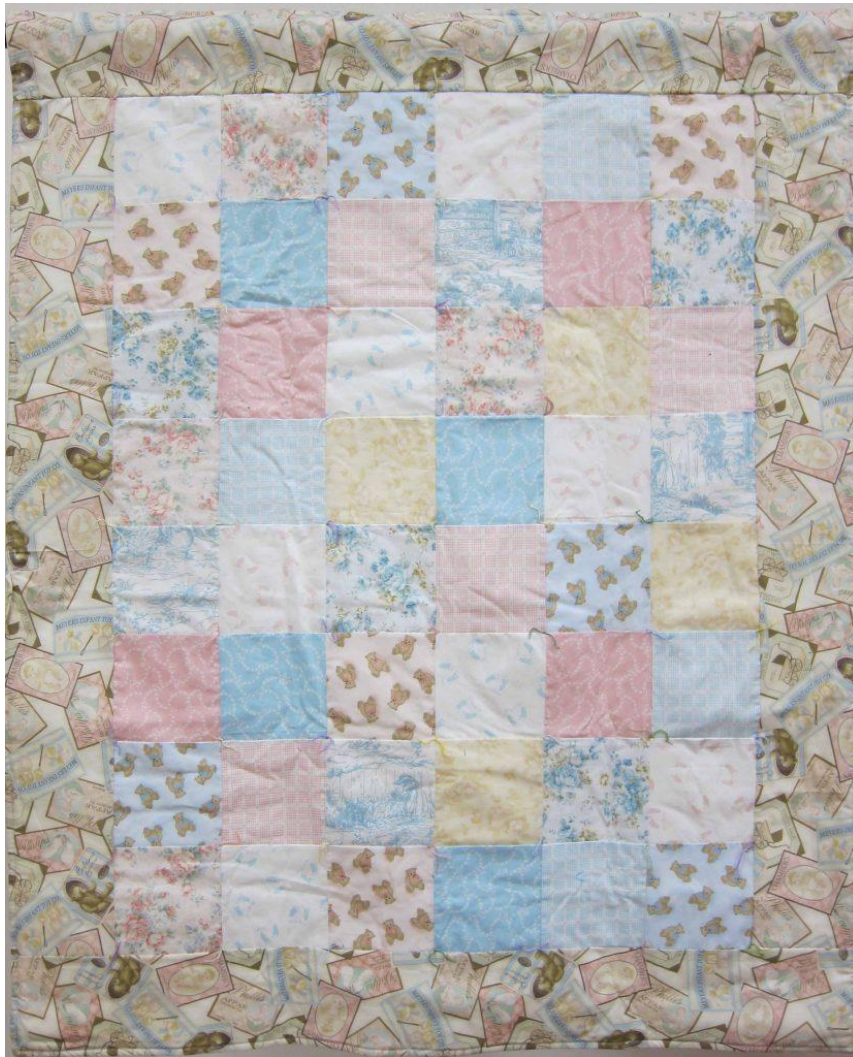

Mum helped with the measurements for the borders. I sewed all the raw edging and piecing on my machine and chose the designs for each section to be custom quilted. Artist Statement:

I made the Super-Fast Pencil Quilt by Irene from Sugaridoo. I followed this pattern but made my own fabric choices that were based of the fabrics I had available to me at home. I also pieced together the tips of the pencils differently to the instructions and used black fabric for the tips instead of the coloured tips in the pattern. I received no help when making this quilt. This quilt consists of 4 coloured pencils and each pencil is made up of 3 strips of fabric. The 2 strips on the outside are the same plain cotton while the strip in the middle is has a pattern that is roughly the same colour as the outer two strips.
