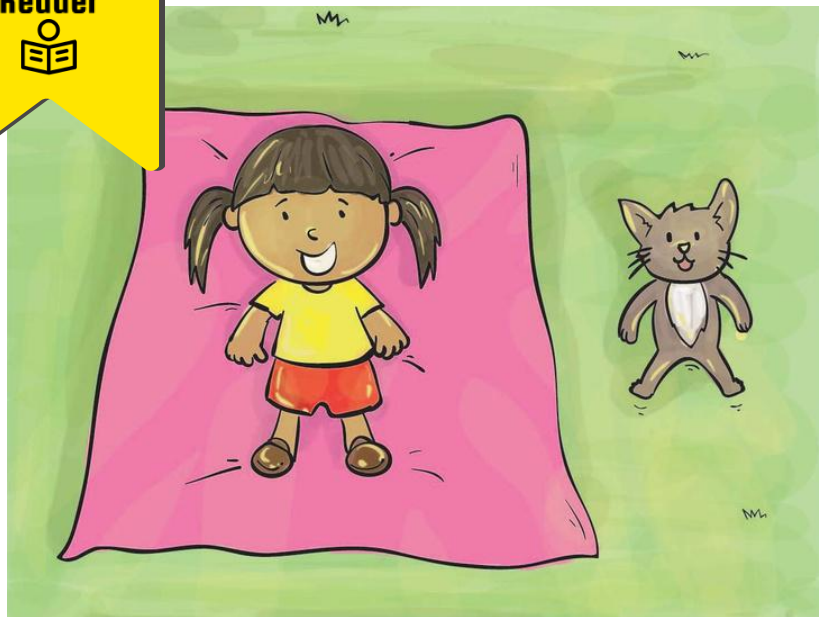

Time for Silent e! Add the Silent e to the end of a word and the prior vowel becomes long. Look for the a_e pattern like in /c/ /ā / /k/ e.

Final e Fun

- When words end with a Silent e, the previous vowel becomes long and the final e is silent. These words typically follow a CVCe pattern.
- Practice adding the Silent e to make the long vowel sound.

can + Silent e = cane

tap + Silent e = tape



Decodable Words

base	plane
game	same
gaze	shake
lane	



High-Frequency Words

eat	out
fly	their
good	were

Decodable Words can be sounded out based on the letter-sound relationships.

High-Frequency Words are the most commonly used words. Your reader will begin to recognize them.

Final e Long Vowel Words contain a vowel and a final e, separated by a consonant. The first vowel is long and the final e is silent, like in cake.
