
MAIN FLOOR:


SECOND FLOOR:

SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM (Child) *

Catholic parents have a primary role in forming their children in Christian discipleship. New parents must register to attend a Baptism Preparation Session prior to scheduling their child's baptism. *The session need only be attended once.* Baptisms are not celebrated during the Lenten season.

FIRST RECONCILIATION (Child)*

Sacramental prep for First Reconciliation occurs during 2nd grade. All disciples enrolled in the 2nd grade Faith Formation program or in 2nd grade at St. Robert Catholic School will automatically receive sacramental prep. In addition to weekly catechesis, Communicants are expected to attend a retreat in the fall with at least one parent or guardian. First Reconciliation is celebrated during Advent.

FIRST COMMUNION (Child)*

Sacramental prep for First Communion occurs during 2nd grade. All disciples enrolled in the 2nd grade Faith Formation program or in 2nd grade at St. Robert Catholic School will automatically receive sacramental prep. In addition to weekly catechesis, Communicants are expected to attend a retreat in early spring with at least one parent or guardian. The First Communion Mass is scheduled yearly on the first Sunday of May.

CONFIRMATION (Youth)*

Sacramental prep for Confirmation occurs during 8th grade. All students enrolled in 8th grade formation will automatically receive sacramental prep. In addition to weekly catechesis, Confirmandi are expected to attend a day-long Confirmation Retreat and participate in service opportunities.

CHRISTIAN INITIATION (Adult)

Adults who have never been baptized or Confirmed in the Church or are interested in becoming Catholic should participate in the preparation for the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (O.C.I.A.).

Cantors/Psalms

This semi-professional ensemble is audition-based and serves at liturgies 1-2 times per month throughout the choir season. A strong musical background and fluency in reading music are required. Chamber Choir

The Chamber Choir is an excellent ensemble of experienced singers with varying levels of ability to read music. It serves the Mass and presents a great variety of choral literature during the season. The choir rehearses weekly and sings most Sunday mornings at various Mass times from the Second Sunday in October through Corpus Christi. Come join our musical family!

Resurrection Choir

Our Resurrection Choir is an extremely essential ensemble to assist with funeral liturgies. The choir will arrive the day of and participate in the singing of the hymns, responses, and Mass parts. There will be no practice beforehand except for the 45 minutes before Mass which will consist of making sure everyone has the run-down for the Mass. Youth Choirs (Grades K through High School)

The mission of this choral program is to encourage and support our youth in their spiritual and musical education in order to serve the worship experience of our community.

The Cherub Choir is open to all students in grades K-2 and sings preludes for Masses. Singers will learn to produce a healthy choral tone, how to read notes and rhythms, and experience the joy of making music. This choir sings for Masses four or five times per year. Rehearsals begin late fall until the spring.

The St. Cecilia Choir is open to students in grades 3-8. The choir rehearses weekly and sings for parish liturgies every three weeks. We hold membership in the *American Federation Pueri Cantores* and participate in local, national, and international choral festivals. A modest fee is requested for participation in the season, covering the costs of binders, choral music, and festival registrations.

NEW! The Vox Lumen (Voice of Light) Choir is open to all middle school (by audition only), high school and college-aged singers, and is comprised mainly of St. Cecilia Choir alums who wish to continue to sing in a parish choir. This choir sings for various liturgies and combines with Chamber Choir for High Feasts and Solemnities. The choir rehearses weekly and sings for parish liturgies every three weeks from September to May.


