HEALTHY LIVING







he ability to reproduce is something that is innate not only in people, but also in animals. If you are a PAWrent or someone who wishes to be one, it would be wise to familiarize yourself with the different aspects of being a dog owner, including understanding the physiology and behavior of your four-legged friend.

Most animals are unconsciously driven to propagate their species, and for dogs, the urge to mate usually begins at puberty or early adulthood. Around this time you may start noticing your dog mounting or humping his toys or siblings. Initially, puppies don't really understand what they're doing and think that it's all fun and games. However, as they mature, they begin to realize that these actions feel good, they may practice it more often and seek out other dogs to do it with.

Depending on the sex of your dog, s/he will manifest his/her sexual behavior in different ways. Females usually experience heat during the first six to 12 months of their lives. This usually happens earlier for smaller breeds, as larger ones tend to take longer to mature physically. Occurring about twice a year, the phase begins with some swelling of the vulva, accompanied by some bleeding.

During this time, a female dog will more often than not growl at any suitors or rebuke their efforts. Once the dog reaches the climax of her heat cycle, she will begin to show interest in male dogs, and may even resort to flirtation, such as backing into the object of her affection and moving her tail in a suggestive way if he does not reciprocate at once.

Male dogs, on the other hand, hit their sexual peak at around five months of age. Manifestations of this stage include frequent mounting and thrusting, sometimes even on anything. Once they reach seven months, they will start actively seeking out a mate. They are attracted by the pheromones secreted by female dogs, which is present in the urine or vaginal secretions. Sexual contact will usually occur when the male dog is one year old and is usually preceded by licking, pawing etcetera.

👺 Impact of Environment

Regardless of their natural physical urges, the environment in which a dog is raised may have a bearing on his/her sexual conduct. When a male

dog is raised away from other dogs, he may display excessive mounting/thrusting for a longer period than those dogs who are exposed socially to other canines. This is because he is not familiar with the norm. This type of dog will need more time catching up and interacting with a mate.

Similarly, a dog who lives in fear or is considered a subordinate in his pack, may exhibit a lower sexual drive than other dogs. This demonstrates that a canine's surroundings play an important role in his/her growth and maturity.

📽 Neutering and Spaying

Sexual behavior is very normal for dogs, however, males tend to have continuous urges, while adult females will have the need to mate during their heat cycles. The incessant sexual need of male dogs may lead them to wander looking for mates and this will eventually become dangerous and unhealthy for them. It may also lead to unwanted puppies. To safeguard the health of your pet, neutering and spaying are viable options.

Neutering for male dogs can help curb their mating impulses. In addition, once they are castrated, they will cease feeling the need to wander in search for a mate. Furthermore, they tend to become less aggressive to their fellow males and their urine marking will also significantly be lowered. Since neutering will lead to a reduction in their testosterone levels, they will exhibit less sexual conduct such as mounting and thrusting, which you as a PAWrent will surely appreciate.

Spaying for females means that they will no longer come into heat and their interest in male dogs will cease to exist. In the same manner, because she will no longer have the pheromones which male dogs find attractive, your female dog will not draw possible mates and/or strays anymore.

Neutering and spaying will definitely serve to control the sexual behavior of dogs, however, some canines may still resort to mounting and other actions even after the procedure. It may take a significant amount of time for your dog's inappropriate behavior to decrease or stop altogether. Just be patient and care for them the best way you can. What's for sure is that by neutering or spaying your pet, you will be helping your furry one to have a happy, balanced and healthy life in the long run.

ALTHOUGH THEY CAN'T SPEAK, OUR PETS WANT TO COMMUNICATE WITH US IN THEIR OWN WAYS. WANT TO KNOW WHAT YOUR PET'S BEHAVIOR MEANS? READ ON BELOW TO GET SOME INSIGHT INTO WHAT YOUR PET IS ACTUALLY TRYING TO SAY.

ven though we raise our pets indoors and they are properly domesticated, our dogs and cats are still animals by nature, and they have inherent traits and behaviors. However, it is important to know the difference between normal and abnormal behavior. In this article, we will try to differentiate between the two.


NORMAL DOG BEHAVIOR

DIGGING – Digging is innate in dogs. Whether your canine digs soil in your backyard or acts likes he's digging into your sofa, it is an act that is written in his/her DNA.

PANTING – Dogs, unlike humans, only sweat through their foot pads. Because of this, they expel their body heat and regulate their body temperature through panting.



3 STRETCHING – How often do you see your dog stretching? Fido only does this with people s/he's comfortable with. Apart from stretching his/her muscles, it's also a way for your dog to say hello.



SHRINKING – It's easy to tell when your pet is uncomfortable. S/he may shrink away from a stranger, or cower behind you. Similarly, your dog's ears may be backward or flat against his/her head.

5 BARKING – Barking is doggy language, and your canine's way of communicating with you. It can be a means for your furball to signal danger. However, excessive barking may become a nuisance. You can talk with a reputable dog trainer to help you, if ever this becomes an issue.



6 HOWLING – This act may also be deeply embedded in your furball's genetic code. But when it becomes chronic, you may need to seek help from a dog trainer to help with the problem.

PLAY BOW – An action that means let's play, is inherent in all dogs. When your dog does this and his/her body language is loose and relaxed, s/he is inviting you to play. Canines also exhibit this with other dogs.




PREY BOW – Slightly different from the play bow, this action is not followed by a pause and the dog's elbows remain off the ground. This can be a sign of tension or may show that playtime has turned to something a bit more aggressive.

HEALTHY LIVING

ABNORMAL DOG BEHAVIOR

URINATING - If your dog is housetrained, then s/he should not be urinating anywhere s/he pleases. When you see signs of urination throughout the house, your fluffy friend may be telling you something. The dog may have a urinary tract infection, or a bladder/kidney problem.




SCOOTING - When you see Fido dragging his/her bum across the floor, it could be a sign of an irritation. This is not normal and when seen in your dog, should be an indication that s/he should make a visit to the vet.

HEAD PRESSING - This is One action that should be considered an emergency. A dog does not normally press his head on a wall; it could be a symptom of toxic poisoning or possible brain disease.

lent because their teeth are still coming in. However, biting in adult dogs, especially those who have undergone training is something out of the ordinary.





JUMPING - People jump and dogs do too. But there's a big difference. Jumping for people is usually a sign of happiness or excitement; for dogs it may be their way of trying to exert their dominance over you. Therefore, this behavior should not be tolerated, and must be curbed before it becomes a problem.

YAWNING - Yawning may seem like your puppy is sleepy but it may also be triggered by a new person which your pet is not comfortable with. The yawning may be indicative of fear or stress, hence, do not force the introduction.

7 SHAKING - Even in humans, shaking is not normal. For dogs, shaking is usually associated with fear.



NORMAL CAT BEHAVIOR



SCRATCHING – Cats are natural scratchers, it's in their blood, and a way for them to maintain their claws. In addition, it's also a way for kitties to mark their territory. So it would be advisable to provide your feline friend with a scratching post, lest s/he choose your sofa or curtains for scratching.

2 GROOMING – It's natural for cats to groom themselves, and they may not take well to bathing.

3 GIVING GIFTS – Because felines are hunters, sometimes they may like to offer you a portion of their prey. This is normal. Just don't forget to get rid of the dead rat (that your kitty presented you) later on.

MEOWING – This may be a way for your cat to get your attention. But meowing non-stop may mean something else. It may be a sign of illness.

ABNORMAL CAT BEHAVIOR

1 MISSING THE LITTER BOX – Cats usually find it easy to relieve themselves in their litter box. However, if your kitty is peeing elsewhere, there may be a number of reasons behind it. S/he may have a urinary tract infection which prevents him/her from making it to the box in time. Or, your cat may not like the litter you have provided.

2 NO APPETITE – Inappetence in cats may be due to pain or other factors. Stress, changes in routine, a different cat food or environment could also cause this.

3 LETHARGY – Cats may seem less energetic than dogs, however, they normally exhibit some sort of activity throughout the day. If you notice that your furry one is not moving for more than a day, then it could mean s/he may be sick.




VOMITING — Your feline friend may expel hairballs, but vomiting frequently or gagging may be due to more than just fur. If your cat stops his/her normal routine such as eating, drinking and going to the litter box, then you should take your little one to the vet right away.



Like people, our pets also have feelings. They may get depressed, or may be stressed because of a recent move, or a change in the household. Being observant and keeping track of your pet's behavior will duly inform you of what's normal or not. Anything outside of your dog or cat's usual antics can be a cause for concern. To be on the safe side, you may visit the vet if you notice any changes in your pet's behavior.

ne of the biggest steps you can take into adulthood is to care for another living being. Prioritizing the well-being of something (or someone) other than yourself will be key in helping you grow in maturity. Yes, there's no doubt loving another thing (or person) will challenge you, however, it will also develop your personality and enrich your life for the better.

As a PAWrent, you will be responsible for the life of either a cute puppy or kitty. This will require you to ensure that your pet eats well, has suitable living conditions and is protected from danger or injury. Safety is very important in a home with pets, therefore every PAWrent must take every effort to keep the pet/s out of harm's way. Here we provide you with some crucial points which you can choose to use or do with your pet.

AT HOME

KEEP TOXIC SUBSTANCES AWAY

One of the vital things you can do to ensure the safety of your pet is to store medicines, cleaning substances, poisons and other harmful items away from areas accessed by your furry one. This means keeping them on high cupboards or a separate pantry that is locked at all times.

COVER ELECTRIC SOCKETS

Animals are naturally curious, especially young pets. Just like when dealing with toddlers, covering your electric sockets is a vital part of pet-proofing (child-proofing) your home.

SECURE YOUR GARBAGE

Your pet, when left unsupervised, may forage through your garbage and play or eat things that s/he should not. To prevent this from happening, keep your garbage tied and secure, or take them out as soon as possible.

KEEP YOUR VALUABLES

Keeping things under lock and key doesn't involve just toxic substances. Anything of value, that can easily break or you wouldn't want damaged, should be properly stored in a place that your pet cannot reach. This includes your shoes.

SECURE HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES

Pets love to explore and sometimes, they find themselves in the kitchen.



Don't leave any sharp items, such as knives, out on the counter and be sure to anchor heavy appliances to prevent them from falling on your pet, on the offhand chance that s/he decides to reach for them. This also means not leaving appliance cords dangling over the kitchen counter.

For cats, it would be best to place them in a closed room while you're out of the house. You can provide your cat with mental and physical stimulation with a cat tree, as well as food puzzles, to keep him/her occupied. You can also do this with your dog, to keep him/her busy. This will give your baby a challenge, which is similar to hunting

for food, while also curbing food intake to prevent obesity.

INVEST IN PET GADGETS

Dog activity trackers, webcams and other modern gadgets can give you a glimpse of what your dog or cat does all day while you're at work or when you're on vacation. Similarly, these tools will also clue you in on an emergency if it occurs.

ALWAYS HAVE A HUMAN ON STANDBY

If you need to go away for business or vacation for an extended period of time, it would be wise to either hire a dog sitter or ask a friend/relative to check in on your pet/s. Having human contact will benefit your pooch or kitty, and your designated person could also check on your house for you and make sure that everything is a-okay. Having someone drop by your house every now and then could also help in discouraging prowlers or burglars in targeting your home.

IN THE BACKYARD

Putting up a fence around your property will hinder your pet from escaping. This will also hamper the efforts of any wild animal from coming into your backyard. If you have a cat, it would be best to provide an enclosure with a net covering and/or roofing to prevent kitty from escaping and getting lost.

REGULARLY CHECK THE BACKYARD

As a vigilant PAWrent, you must periodically peruse your backyard to remove sharp objects, trash that your pet can ingest and other such items. Additionally, check for any signs of disrepair in your fence. If this is the case, you must reinforce your fence.

RID YOUR BACKYARD OF TOXIC PLANTS

Before letting your pet out to play in the backyard, you must first give it a proper inspection. You must pull out and remove any plants that can be toxic for your dog or cat. This includes oleander, lantana, lilies (for cats), and azaleas, to name a few. It will also be advisable not to use pesticides or insecticides in your garden. If ever you really need to, then choose not to let your pet spend time in the garden for a period of time.

INSTALL A CCTV SYSTEM IN YOUR BACKYARD

One of the ways you can heighten your



home security while also providing your pet with protection is to invest in a CCTV system. With this in place, you can easily see what your pet is doing outside, and you will also be aware of what is happening in your garden at any given time.

TRAIN YOUR PET TO RIDE A CAR

Though it may take a while, it is important to teach your pet how to ride a car. Start training him/her at a young age so s/he will get used to riding a car before long.

KEEP HIM/HER IN A CRATE

One of the easiest ways to transport your pet is to use a crate. This involves training your dog or cat to be comfortable in a crate. Choose one that is a suitable size for your pet and will provide him/her with ample space to move around.

PURCHASE CANINE SAFETY RESTRAINTS

If you choose not to crate your pet, then you can instead get him/her to wear canine safety restraints or a seatbelt while in the car. This will prevent your pet from being thrown around on the offhand chance that the car suddenly jerks forward or you are forced to suddenly hit the brakes.

DO NOT LEAVE YOUR WINDOWS OPEN

Leaving a window open may be dangerous especially for pets who are not trained to ride a car. S/he may jump out if s/he sees something interesting or another dog outside of the vehicle.

DO NOT ALLOW YOUR DOG TO HANG ITS HEAD OUTSIDE THE WINDOW

There are many videos of dogs with their heads out of car windows on

social media, however, these should not be your guide on what to practice with your dog. Dust, bugs and other debris can get into your dog's eyes, ears and/or nose. Therefore, keeping its head inside would be advisable, unless you can get your furry one to wear a helmet and goggles.

AT THE PARK/OTHER PUBLIC AREAS

NEVER LEAVE YOUR PET IN THE CAR

Leaving your pet in a locked car is inhumane, especially on very hot days. Your dog may expire while you are happily perusing the grocery aisles. Therefore, if you know you are going to a mall or any similar establishment which does not allow pets, please leave your furry one at home instead. There is no excuse for animal abuse or PAWrent ignorance.

NEVER LEAVE YOUR PET OUTSIDE ESTABLISHMENTS

Similarly, you must refrain from tying your pet to a post when you are dining inside a restaurant or going on an errand indoors. Surely you can manage your time so your dog's walk will not coincide with paying your bills and/or catching up with a friend.

PUT YOUR PET ON A LEASH

Of course, you must put your canine baby on a leash when you take him/her out. This is a cardinal rule, and in some places, it is illegal to bring a dog out without a leash or unleash him/her while you're out for a walk. Remember, this is for your pet's own safety, as well as the protection of other dogs and people in your community.

CONSIDER GETTING A CHIP FOR HIM/HER

With modern technology now within our reach, it can be a wise decision to have a microchip implanted into the skin of your pet. This will allow easy identification of your pet, which will be especially useful when s/he gets lost.

BE OBSERVANT

Keep an eye out on what your dog may be stepping on or eating when you are outside, more so in public areas.

Remember that your pet wholly relies on you for its existence, therefore your devotion and love will go a long way. Your vigilance as a PAWrent is vital as it not only contributes to the overall health and well-being of your pet, it also guarantees your beloved baby's safety at all times. Keep the tips mentioned above in mind and choose the ones that work for you. In no time, these pointers will help you to become the best PAWrent you can possibly hope to be.

Barrie in his play, "Peter Pan", which featured Nana, a **Newfoundland** dog which acted as the nanny of the Darling children. Strong and blessed with an easy temperament, **Newfoundland** dogs make good household companions.

SIZE AND WEIGHT (FORM)

The average height of males is 28 inches while females usually reach about 26 inches. The males can weigh up to 130-150 pounds, whereas females weigh about 100-120 pounds. This breed requires regular exercise and mental stimulation.

IDEAL ENVIRONMENT

Due to its large size, Newfoundland dogs will fare better in spacious residences, or properties with ample outdoor spaces to run and frolic in. This breed thrives in cool climate, but can adapt well to warmer weather. You will need air conditioning and fans situated nearby to cool the dog when the temperature gets really hot.

HAIR AND GROOMING

Though it has a proud maiestic head, a Newfoundland or Newf, has a soft, soulful expression. This, combined with its flat and coarse outer coat, makes the dog irresistibly cuddly, especially for kids. However, because it has a thick coat, regular grooming is imperative to its overall health and well-being. The dog also sheds a lot. This should be an important consideration when thinking of acquiring a Newfoundland for a pet. One should be prepared to vacuum all the time to get rid of the excessive hair.



ADDITIONAL INFO

Newfs drool a lot. This is an innate trait, therefore prospective owners should take this into account.

The breed hails from Newfoundland in Canada and used to work with fishermen in the area.

Newfoundland dogs are prone to have Addison's Disease, Hip Dysplasia, and Cataracts, to name a few. Prospective owners can secure health clearances to ensure the dog/s is cleared of these conditions.





f you own a dog or new puppy, then you must train him/her in order for your dog to understand what you want him/her to do. Dogs can understand you by your voice, words (not sentences), your hand signals, your tone, your actions, and sometimes, even your mood. In dog training, what's commonly used are voice commands (sit, stay, stand, heel, stop, etc.), reinforced by voice tones, and actions or tools needed for corrections (using a leash, collar, ball or toy).

Your dog or puppy must know the commands and tones for instructions, otherwise s/he will not understand and may even get confused. To avoid any confusion and ensure that the pet is trained the right way, it is advisable for dog owners to personally train their own dog or puppy. And because of this, the dog owner must also learn how to train his/her pet. When you enroll your dog in a training class, remember that not only the dog or puppy will learn the instructions, you as an owner or your handler (if any) will also need to learn the instructions or commands, so you can readily do them with your dog.

Basically, a dog needs command, praise, reward and correction. If this is done repeatedly, and in the same way, then the dog will understand how it should be. There are plenty of ways a PAWrent can learn to train his/her dog or new puppy; there are plenty of books, videos, and even articles written about the topic or you can join a dog training class. But you will also need to practice and practice some more with your dog. By far, the most effective way to train your dog/puppy is by attending a dog training class, which is not only for your dog to learn, but also for you as a dog owner, to do the same.

One common mistake of many dog owners is in thinking that his/ her dog can become a good dog by sending the canine to the class or boarding for a week or a month. What happens is that the dog will be good only with the instructor but not with the owner or the handler. The reason for this is that the commands may be inconsistent or different, and any difference in tone will confuse the dog or puppy.

he most important component of holistic pet care is what I will term as TLC, which is the acronym for tender, loving care. When a pet animal is sick, the thing that it desires most is to be with someone it loves. The healing power of touch cannot be over-emphasized. If your pet dog is sick, the greatest thing that you can do is to pat it lovingly.

I am a firm believer in TLC and the practice that we adopt at The Animal Recovery Centre reflects this belief. While we have the capacity to hospitalize about 50 to 60 animals at any one time, you will discover that the number of sick animals lodging with us usually does not exceed about 15.

Animals that are sick need to be with their owners more.

THE CONNECTION BETWEEN PETS AND THEIR OWNERS

Pets share an invisible energy connection with their owners and after being a vet for 35 years, I have discovered that there are really no coincidences. The clearest evidence of this connection is reflected by the diseases these animals "adopt" from their caregivers.

It is not uncommon to find that dogs with heart diseases actually have owners who have heart diseases; correspondingly, dogs with diabetes actually have owners who have diabetes.

Of course, one can always argue that the diseases that these animals have only serve to reflect the lifestyles and diets that their owners have "imposed" on them. This is a logical explanation and I shall not attempt to dispute that.

It is only difficult to explain how the female dog I once treated actually had inguinal hernia on both the left and the right; and how incidentally, the two daughters of the owner also had inguinal hernia, one of them having it on the left, and the other having it on the right.

How's that for synchronicity?

RESPECTING ANIMALS

I am of the belief that you should respect and love the animals that you keep. For that reason, neither my vets nor I myself will carry out procedures that are deemed harmful to the animals.

Nature has given animals their body parts for a reason. As such, The Animal Recovery Centre does not conduct procedures such as debarking or the docking of tails, even if such procedures promise good money to the Centre.

A dog that barks incessantly can be trained to behave; ears should not be cropped no matter what.

Sterilization should only be carried out for good reasons — it should only be allowed where there is possibility of unwanted litter, where there is a likelihood that the animal would escape and mate with another, or when your

pet is sexually charged or aggressive. It should never be taken in the name of disease prevention – doing so is not only a reflection of one's inability to understand the nature of disease, it is also an indication of how little credit we give Mother Nature in her creation.

UNCONDITIONAL LOVE

Throughout this article, I have been using cats and dogs as examples, since they are the most common pets that people will keep. But that does not preclude other types of pets like fish or hamsters.

If humans are indeed the most evolved among all the species that populate the earth, we are unusually primitive in the way we treat one another, and how we treat animals. Your pet functions on the premise of unconditional love; even your humble tortoise will not call you a jerk if you do something stupid. And it is this love that can really be disarming.

You can beat and kick your dog, but at the end of the day, your dog will die for you if necessary. Perhaps it is time for us to learn something from our friends.

FINALLY

A pet is a lifetime commitment. And caring for your pet starts and ends with love. I hope you understand what I am driving at. With that, I sign off.

owadays, people don't often come across modern day good Samaritans. However, Hening Hartopo can certainly be considered as one. The mother of 100 rescue cats, she is definitely making a difference in the lives of the furry and lovable animals she has taken off the streets.

Someone who gives not only her time and energy, but also shares her home with her growing feline family, Hening is a certified animal lover. Her love for cats has been prevalent since the tender age of seven or eight, "I've loved cats ever since. However, I didn't own a cat then. I just doted on stray cats." Her mom was instrumental in further encouraging her affection for kitties when she gave Hening her own cat in 2006, "I bought a second cat in 2011 and started rescuing cats afterwards. I became active as a rescuer in 2014."

Hening has rescued cats from trash cans, the street, and even in Pondok Indah Plaza, where she saw a malnourished Himalayan cat near a food truck stall, "It just weighed about one to one and a half kilos and it was starving. Himalayan cats cannot survive on the streets because they are especially bred and are usually domesticated." Unfortunately, plenty of felines have suffered this fate. But thanks to Hening, some of them now have a place to call home, "I really love cats and don't like seeing animals being abused, so I have taken it upon myself to provide them a home, give them love and provide them with protection so they won't be run over by cars or perish because they don't have anything to eat."

Right now, Hening is personally caring for 100 cats, with no helper or outside assistance, "I keep the cats within the grounds of our residence. They live in the servants' quarters and I let them go out into the garden. However, I keep a close eye on them and don't let them out of the gate." Every day, Hening cleans the food and water dishes of her pets as well as their litter boxes. She then gives them fresh water and food, "I brush their cages twice a week and clean up after them as best as I can. What's important is to feed them and to change their water every day. I give them mostly dry cat food, but sometimes I mix these with water to keep them hydrated. Some of the cats don't drink a lot of water, so it's my way of preventing them from being dehydrated," she further elaborates by saying, "I also like to give them bread, cheese or eggs every now and then as a treat."

And because she has so many little furballs running around, Hening takes account of all her cats. She notes the date and place where each cat is rescued, writes the details in a book and proceeds to give each kitty a suitable name. With about 80 or 90% of her cats named, the record is a convenient way for her to keep track of them, "But since I am the one who gives them their names and takes care of them, it's easy for me to remember them. I call them every day and this practice helps me maintain a good memory," Hening adds with a laugh.

Despite being the sole 'mother' of her large litter, Hening still leads a normal life. She even finds time to travel, but when she does go for trips, she asks her groomer to look in on her babies, "My groomer is very familiar already with my cats since he grooms them every Sunday. And because he knows them already, he is the one I trust to check up on them when I go travelling."

It's obvious that Hening doesn't trust just anybody when it comes to her feline friends. However, she is open to other people adopting them, "If people want to adopt any of my cats, they can, but I will be picky about choosing just the right PAWrents. In fact, two cats have already been adopted by a Groovy client, one Persian and one Himalayan," she relays, stressing that she will not be giving any cat to anybody who she isn't sure about, "Some people like specific cat breeds because of how beautiful they look, but once they get old or sick, they just abandon the cat."

It is this very sentiment that Hening wants to avoid and change, "Cats, or animals in general for that matter, also have feelings. They're just like humans. The difference is that we humans can use our brains and choose to do good things. For those who don't like cats, you don't have to abuse them because you don't like them. You can just ignore them and they will leave you alone. And for those who have pets, please make sure to take care of them. Don't just feed them, give them your love and attention too, because they deserve that much."



UNDERSTANDING WHAT WILL GO ON AND WHAT YOU CAN DO, WILL HELP YOU AND YOUR PET GO THROUGH THE PROCESS CALMLY. By Yosefin Lingga, DVM and Francisca Juwita, DVM

Indergoing a surgical procedure is something that many pets and owners dread. Whether it is a simple spay/neuter or a tumor removal, every procedure has its own risks. Below are some things to consider before your pet goes under the knife.

THINGS TO PONDER

1 Ask questions

Dog owners should know as much as possible about the surgery ahead of time. It is important to make sure that you understand the procedure that will be done, whether it is routine or not. Ask your veterinarian what the expected surgery time is, the significant risks with surgery and what the expected recovery time is.

You should have a sense of how much risk your dog might undergo with anesthesia. Young, healthy animals have a lower anesthetic risk than animals with significant health problems (such as diabetes, heart disease or obesity). If the anesthetic risk is high enough, elective procedures may be delayed until the condition is addressed.

Pre-operation

If your dog's surgery is routine, you will have instructions on medications and meal restrictions during the period before surgery. Always follow your veterinarian's instructions for preoperative care.

Most patients will not be allowed play periods prior to anesthesia and most won't want to play immediately following surgery — so play items are best left at home. If the patient has a favorite blanket or soft toy that they sleep with, get your veterinarian's go-ahead before bringing these items.

During the surgery

Department of the surgeon manage your dog's pain during surgery? Most veterinary surgeons employ preoperative pain relievers, which also have sedative effects, prior to the induction of anesthesia. By giving these medications prior to surgery, the individual's pain response is reduced, therefore lowering the amount of anesthetic used to keep a patient from feeling pain during surgery. This also helps reduce the anxiety a dog may feel while being in unfamiliar surroundings.





GENERAL OVERVIEW OF SURGERY

After going over these things, below are other ways to prepare as well as a summary of what usually happens before, during, and after surgery.

PRE-SURGERY

Fasting

In healthy dogs and cats, fasting needs to be done eight hours before the anesthesia is administered (time range might differ between different vets). The drugs used will affect the swallowing reflex. A full stomach may cause the already groggy pet under sedation to become even more nauseous. Vomiting might also occur. Aside from being messy, the vomitus might get inhaled into the lungs, which may cause breathing problems during and after surgery.

Fasting time in puppies and kittens might be shortened since they have faster metabolisms. Animals with certain conditions, such as diabetes, or those that are under medication, might have different fasting procedures.

General examination

Before anything can be done, a thor-

ough general examination should be completed. The vet will check if there is anything wrong with the body. Heart disease and other conditions can increase the risks of going under anesthesia.

Blood test

Depending on the standard procedures of your vet clinic, surgery might also include a blood test to determine the condition of the liver and the kidneys, also if the pet has any infection or is suffering from anemia. A blood test is highly recommended before surgery because many times, organ failure does not show any symptoms when it has just begun. The substances used to sedate your pet will be processed by the internal organs and so it is very important to make sure that the organs are healthy prior to the procedure.

Cleanliness

Keep your pet clean before surgery. The surgical site needs to be cleaned and sterilized. This step is done when the pet is already under anesthesia. If the animal is dirty, it will take longer to clean the surgical site thus extending the overall time your dog or cat is placed under anesthesia.

DURING SURGERY

If An IV catheter and fluids will be placed in your animal right before the surgery. So expect that some of their hair will be shaved for the placement.

Hair around the surgical site will also be shaved so don't be surprised if a lot of hair will be gone. Sterility must be maintained during the surgery and the surgeon can't risk having hairs getting into the surgical site.

Depending on the procedure, an endotracheal tube (ET tube) may be placed on the pet's airways to administer oxygen and anesthetic gas. The gas can be controlled to maintain the depth of anesthesia of the pet.

Aside from the surgeon(s), another vet or a veterinary nurse would usually be present during the surgery to monitor the condition of the pet under anesthesia. This person will check heart rate, respiratory rate, oxygen saturation in the blood, blood pressure, body temperature, and other vital signs.

The length of time for the surgery depends on the complexity of the procedure and experience of the surgeon. The longer the pet is put under anesthesia, the greater the risk/s will be.

During anesthesia, other procedures such as dental cleaning, microchip implantation, nail cutting, wart removal, etcetera, that need to be done under anesthesia can be performed as well. This, of course, needs to be discussed with the vet before the surgery starts.

POST-SURGERY

Once the anesthetic gas flow is stopped, the pet will wake up within minutes. Antibiotics, anti-inflammatory medication and painkillers are given right after the completion of the surgery. This practice may differ from one vet to another. The amount given also depends on the condition of the pet and the type of procedure done. The time it takes to make a full recovery from being under anesthesia may vary from a few minutes to an hour. Although painkillers may already be administered, pain response can vary among different animals. Some pets might wake up and act like nothing just happened to them; others might curl up and whimper for a few hours. Pain and the pet's general condition

are still monitored during this period. If it is necessary, additional and stronger painkillers can be given.

When you take your pet home after surgery, the vet may advise you to limit the physical activity of your furry baby or even put him/her on cage rest. There also might be take home medication that you will need to continue giving at home.

Documents and legalities

Before your pet goes under anesthesia, your vet will most likely ask you to sign some documents to make sure that you understand the risks involved with the surgery and that everyone is on the same page. Depending on the clinic, you might also have to sign a document regarding the surgery fee.



Read these things very carefully. Before the documents are presented to you, you must have had a thorough discussion with your vet, but in case you still have some questions regarding the documents, don't hesitate to ask about further details. You can also ask them to guide you and your pet through the entire process. Don't worry about offending your vet when you ask questions. Your vet is in a position wherein s/he will understand that you have the right to ask about anything regarding the surgery procedure for your beloved pet.

HOW TO HELP YOUR PET RECOVER AFTER SURGERY

Once your dog is given the green light to go home, he or she will still have a period of recovery ahead. Your veterinarian will give you care and medication instructions, which you should follow carefully. The first night home, splitting a normal-sized meal into two small ones is recommended, to prevent a patient from eating too much and too fast — which can sometimes lead to regurgitation. The pet may not feel very thirsty that first day/evening home since s/he received fluids during surgery.

If your furry one underwent abdominal surgery, s/he should do no jumping or leaping and leash walking even when eliminating in the yard. An Elizabethan collar (also known as the "cone of shame") may be worn to prevent self-trauma to the healing surgical site.

Warning signs of a potential problem include refusing food or water, lethargy, change in pain or tenderness, swelling, ripped stitches, oozing from the incision, skin temperature differences at the surgical site or inability to have a bowel movement. Consult your veterinarian if your pet manifests any of these signs.

What should you do if your pet licks or chews the stitches?

If your pet has stitches s/he may chew or lick them causing harm and in some cases infection. If your pet shows an interest in the wound, the use of an Elizabethan collar (a bucket-like device that is worn around the neck) is recommended.

Caring for your pet's wound


During the post-operative period (approx. 10-14 days after surgery), check the wound twice a day to ensure it is clean and dry. Also check for any signs of swelling, heat, odor, discharge, skin irritation, gaping or self-inflicted damage.

WHEN A BELOVED PET DIES, IT IS NORMAL FOR A PAWRENT TO GRIEVE AND WISH FOR HIS/HER PET TO BE ALIVE ONCE AGAIN. BUT SHOULD A PET OWNER CONSIDER CLONING AN ANIMAL?

loning is a procedure to create genetically identical cells, tissues, or organisms. Although the research and development of cloning technology is very progressive, the topic remains a controversial one until present day. It can be said that the debate about cloning developed strength in 1996, with the "birth" of Dolly the sheep. Dolly was the first mammal successfully cloned from an adult cell. Many years later, the religious and ethical issues surrounding cloning still continue to pervade our society. But with the widespread news of Barbra Streisand cloning her deceased dog, Sammie, the subject has now become an even more popular one amongst dog owners.

According to one research company that has successfully engaged in cloning pet dogs for a number of years, there are two requirements to having your canine cloned. First, you must provide living tissue of the dog you want to clone. This process has to be done by a vet. Secondly, you will need USD 100,000. It seems guite simple if you have the funds, right? You will then be asked to send the requirements to the company and if everything goes well, they will send you back the cloned puppy. For grieving owners who just lost their pet or for PAWrents who know that they will soon be losing their pet, cloning seems like a very tempting offer to get their beloved pet back. However, it's just not as simple as that. There are many considerations that surround cloning. Below are some of the pros and cons of cloning that has been discussed over the years:

PROS

- The cloned animal will look very similar in appearance to the original animal. Their temperament should be pretty much the same too. The clone can provide the bereaved with comfort and can replace the deceased pet.
- Cloning can be used to save a certain endangered species from extinction. The procedure will effectively contribute to the increase in number of the shrinking population. If used correctly,

it can someday help eradicate extinction in both humans and animals.

Animals with certain traits that humans would like to preserve, such as high milk production in dairy cattle for example, can be cloned to achieve continuous high milk production. This can be beneficial for cattle farmers, as well as communities who require a steady supply of milk.

CONS

- The cloning process is very expensive, obviously. It can only be afforded by the very affluent few.
- Although the cloned animal will look very similar to the original

one, personality and behaviors are shaped by environment and events that happen to the animal; these experiences cannot be cloned. This can lead to a significant difference between individuals, even though they may have identical genetic material. If owners are hoping for the exact animal, with the same personality and traits, then it's simply not possible, and it's never going to happen. Cloned animals are different from the original. This concept is similar to twin siblings; both have identical genes but they are still different individuals.

For the cloned animals to be born, they need surrogates to provide an ovum (egg) and a womb to grow in. Productive females are needed for this procedure. One strong aspect of the current cloning debate is if it is okay to use the surrogate animals as a "factory"? That can be used over and over again to carry the cloned animals? This may require the surrogates to undergo several Caesarean sections to make sure all the cloned animals survive. And then the question remains: what will happen to them when their productive stage is over? Is there a guarantee that they will be taken care of until the end of their lives?

Just like in normal pregnancies, the cloned offspring may still manifest some defects and some may even die within a short time of their birth. Those that survive with defects will need to be taken care of. In production animals, they are most likely to be eliminated. But what about pets? Will their supposed loving owners take care of them, knowing that they are less than they had hoped for? Is it worth it to add unnecessary suffering to the animals?

The technology of cloning itself is opening doors to other medical advancements. In the future, surely there will be other useful technology derived from this. However, the fact remains that cloning is a divisive issue. It may take some time before the majority of the human populace can accept this controversial method, along with its ethical and social considerations. In the meantime, the cloning debate ensues and will no doubt continue until further developments and/or breakthroughs are achieved or it suddenly becomes ethical for the dead to be revived back into the living. &
