Time for Silent e! Add the Silent e to the end of a word and the prior vowel becomes long. Look for the a\_e pattern like in  $\frac{c}{\bar{a}} / \frac{k}{e}$ .

Shake, shake, shake!




"Next, I will take out the eggs," said Kat.

to add," said Kat.


"This will melt and make

Kat was safe as she placed the cake in the hot oven.




Kat wasn't late taking the cake from the oven.

### Final e Fun

- When words end with a Silent e, the previous vowel becomes long and the final e is silent. These words typically follow a CVCe pattern.
- Practice adding the Silent e to make the long vowel sound.

can + Silent e = cane tap + Silent e = tape





**Decodable Words** can be sounded out based on the letter-sound relationships.

**High-Frequency Words** are the most commonly used words. Your reader will begin to recognize them.

Final e Long Vowel Words contain a vowel and a final e, separated by a consonant. The first vowel is long and the final e is silent, like in cake.
