INTERNATIONAL LITERACY DAY

Classes XI-XII

Classes VI-VIII

- ❖ Class discussions were organized, wherein, the students talked about their favourite books and authors. Through this activity the students got an opportunity to share their valuable insights.

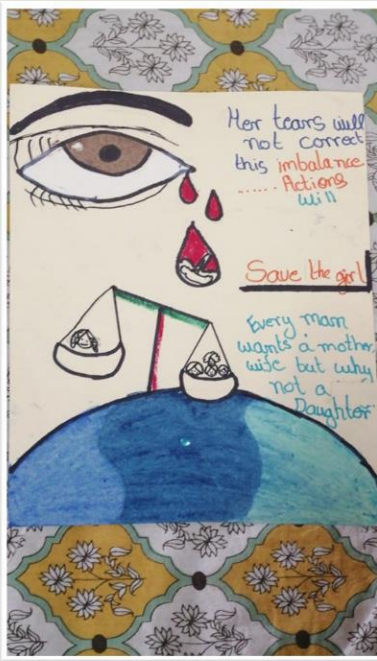
Inspired by the yogic exercises, the students of classes XI and XII too shared videos of their yoga routines and fitness schedules with their respective teachers.

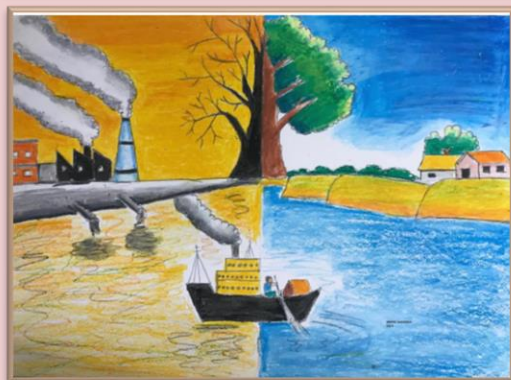
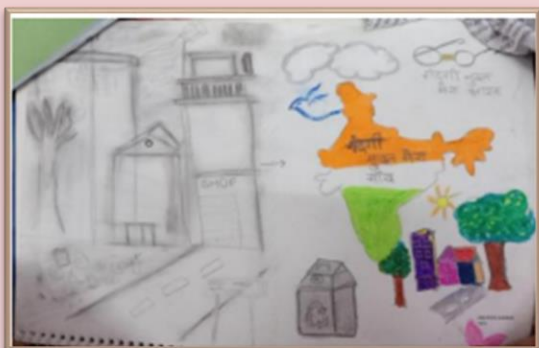
TREE PLANTATION

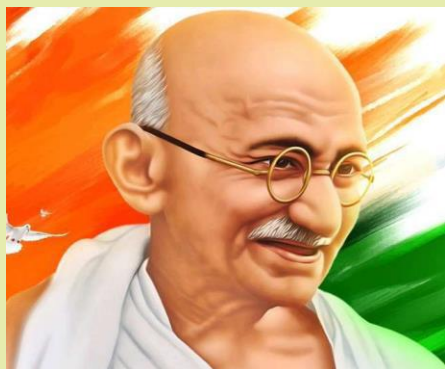


GANDAGI MUKT BHARAT (8TH AUGUST TO 15TH AUGUST 2020)

c. **Relevance of Meditation in Modern Times**

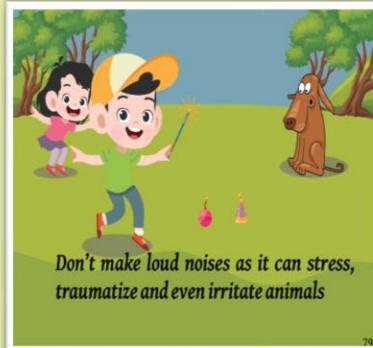
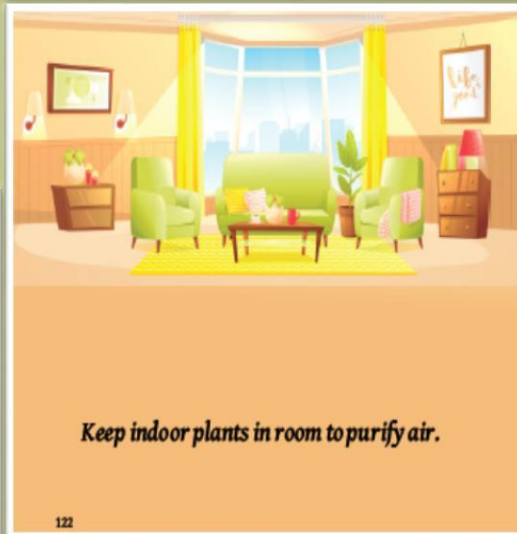

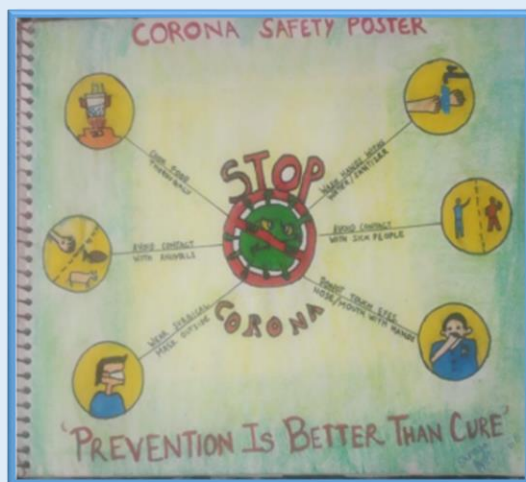
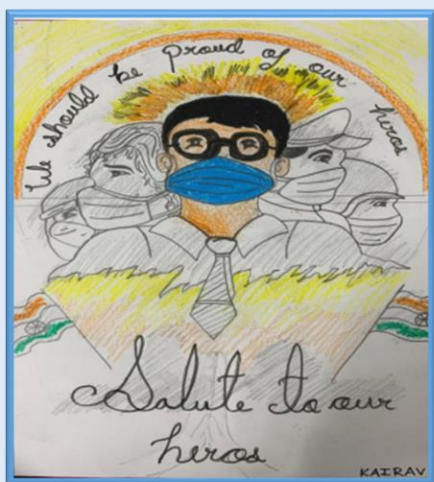
❖ Doctor's Talk

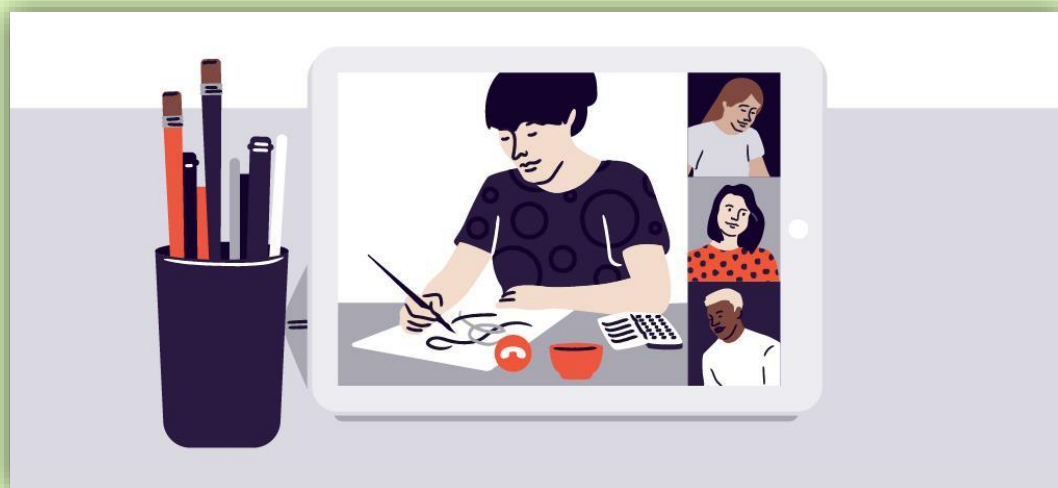

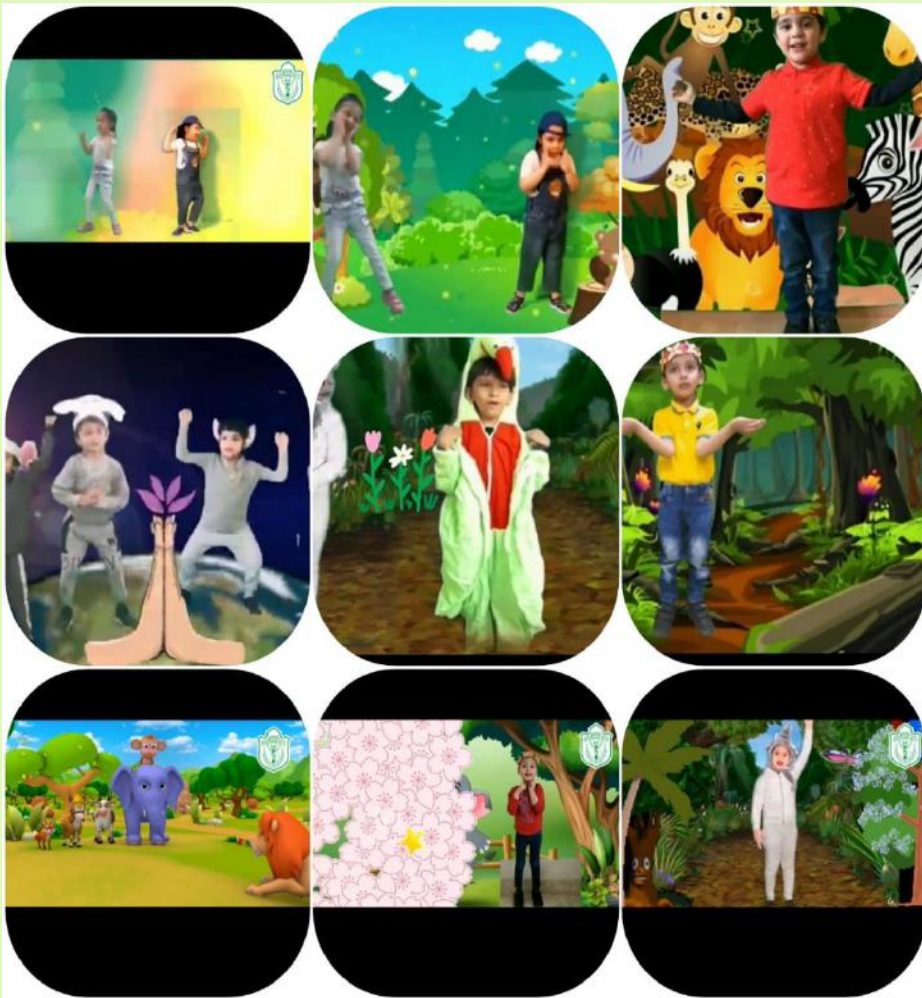
The ceremony came to a close with the rendering of the national anthem.

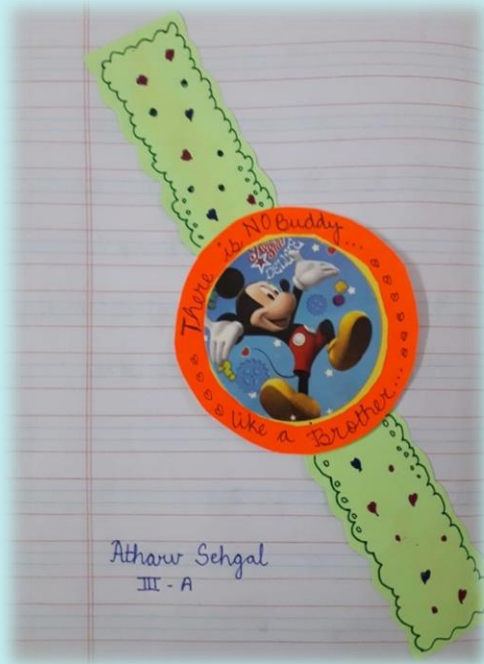
The icing on the cake was when the little models walked the ramp confidently in their winter clothing and won the hearts of everyone.

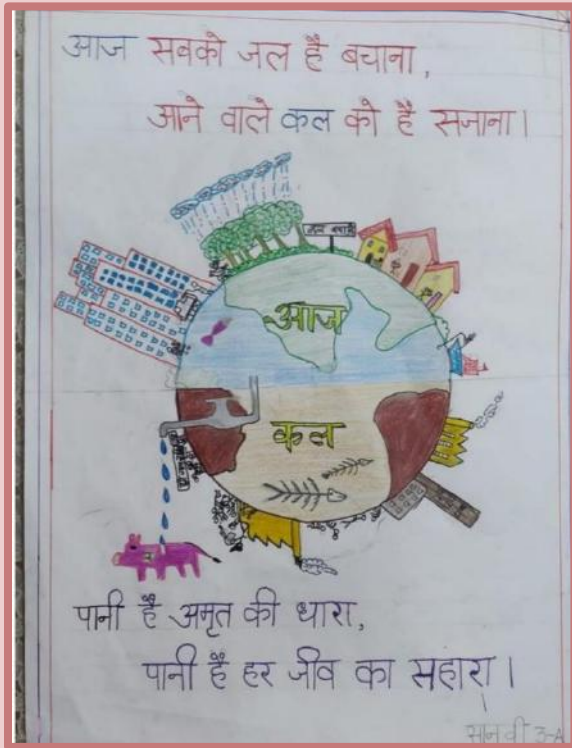
SUBJECT WEEKS

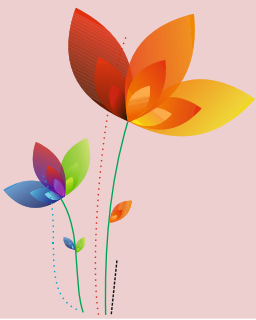
Hindi Language Week

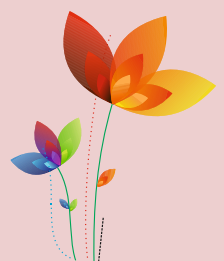

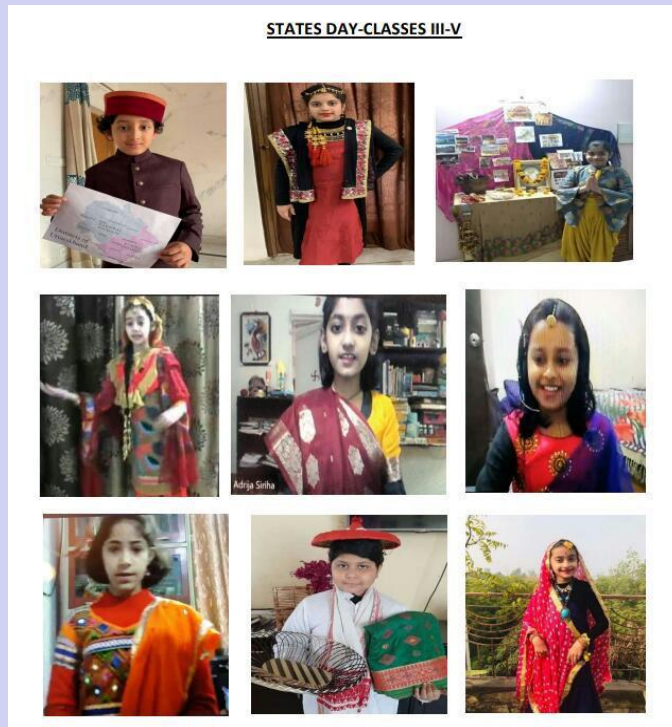

Go-Geen Week

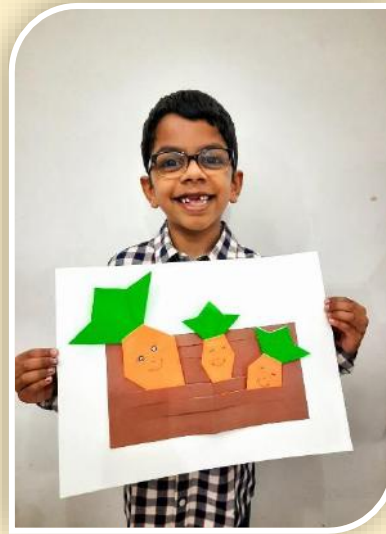

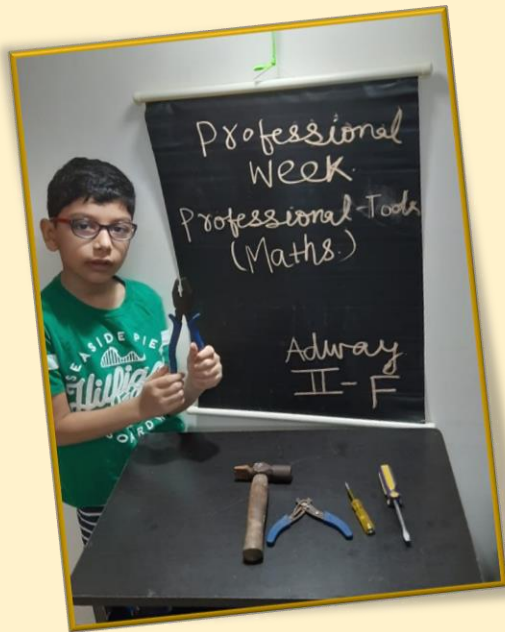
Health and Hygiene Week

Different Professions Week

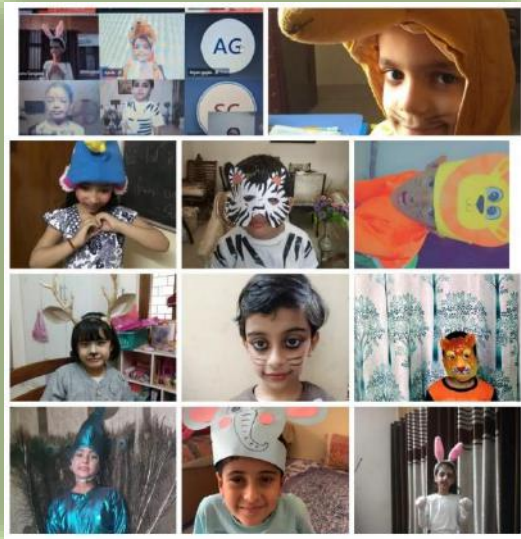

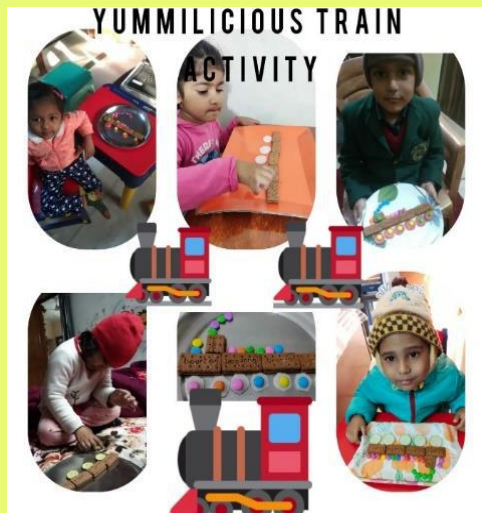
Festival Week



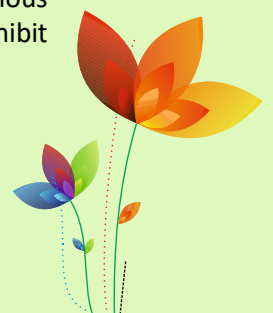

Transport Week

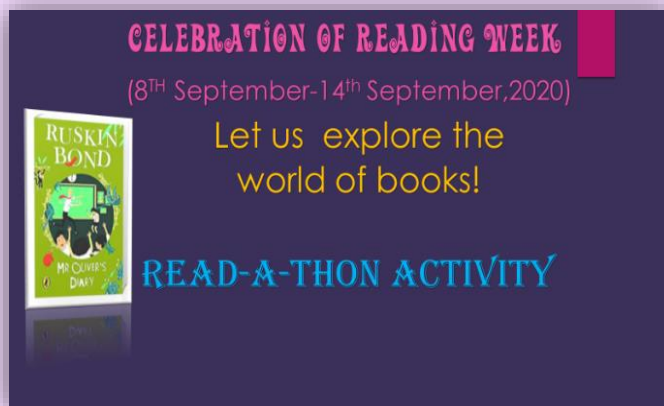

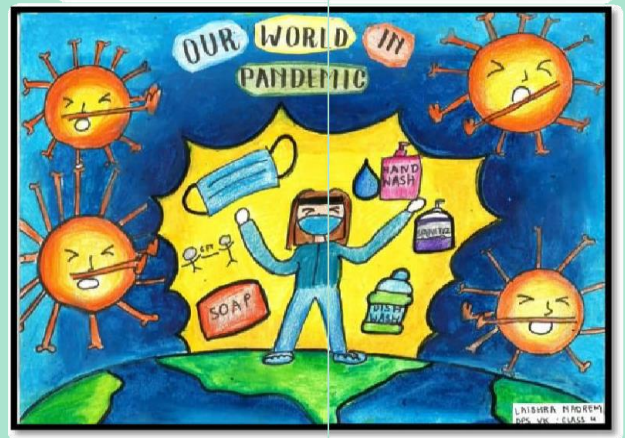
Online Painting Competition

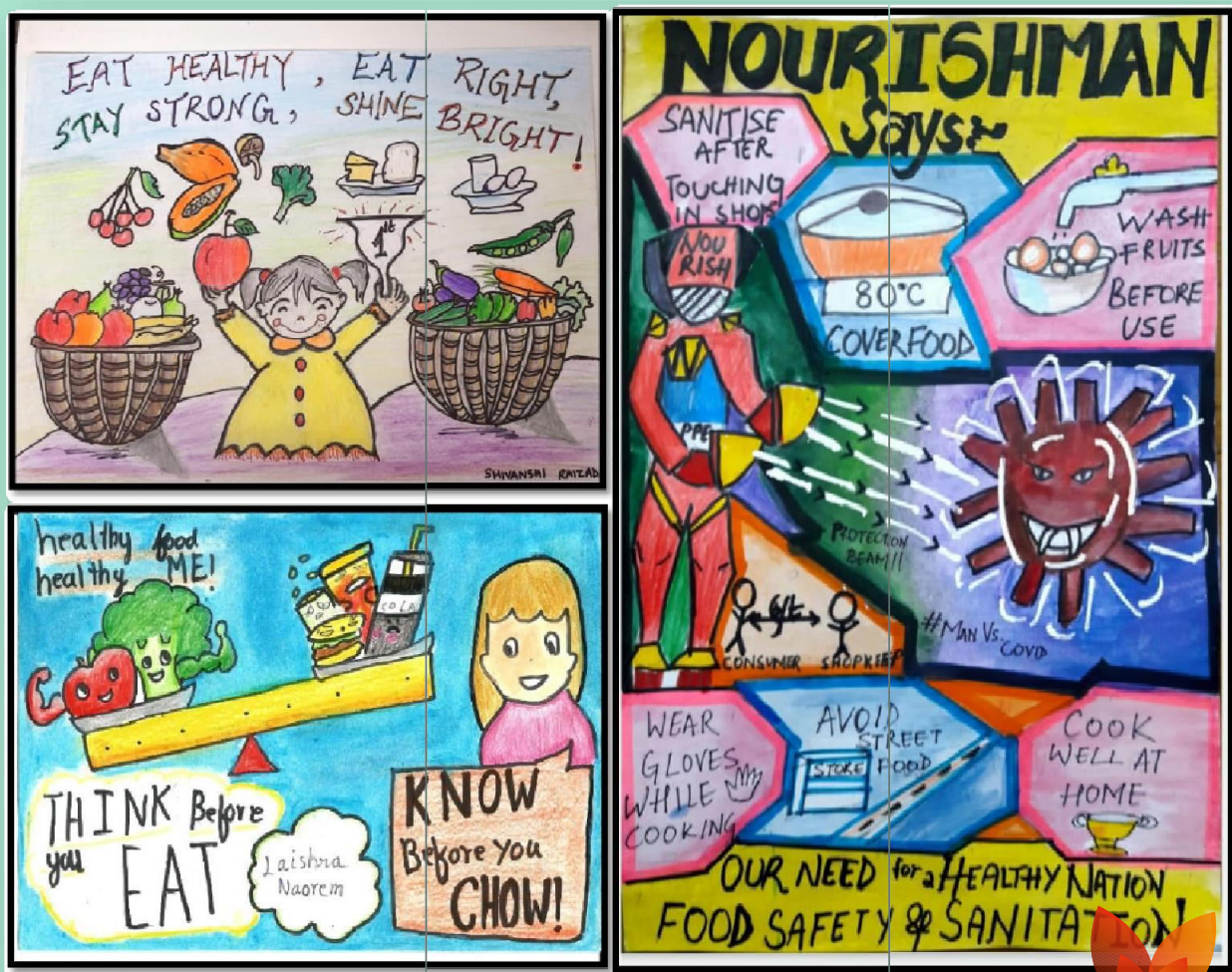

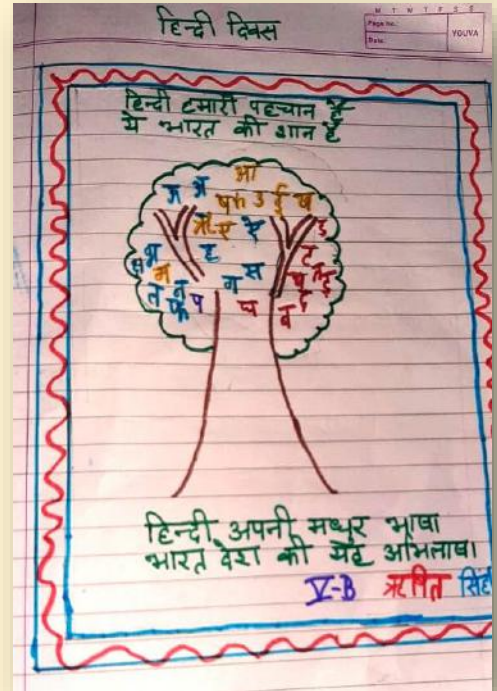
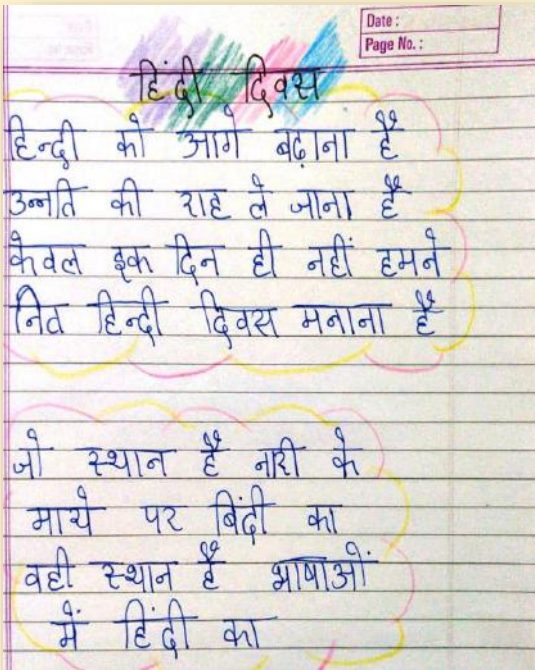
From that day onwards, every single day children of Amoni started attending Shekhar's school. Neither Covid nor lockdown could hamper their journey for the pursuit of education.

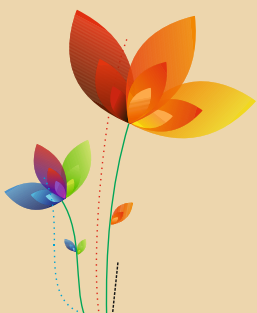

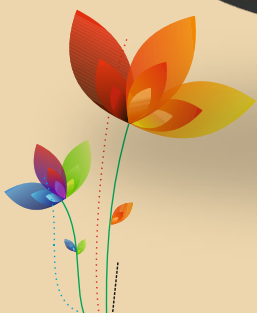
Talent Fiesta- Classes Nursery and Prep

- ❖ **Rishi Saigal** of Class V-E won the **Third Position** in "Hasya Ki Phuhar" (Kavita Vaachan).

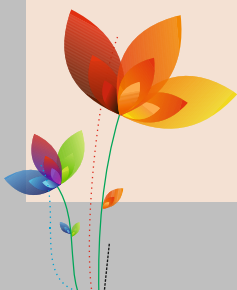


- **Hanmookwan International Taekwondo Championship**
