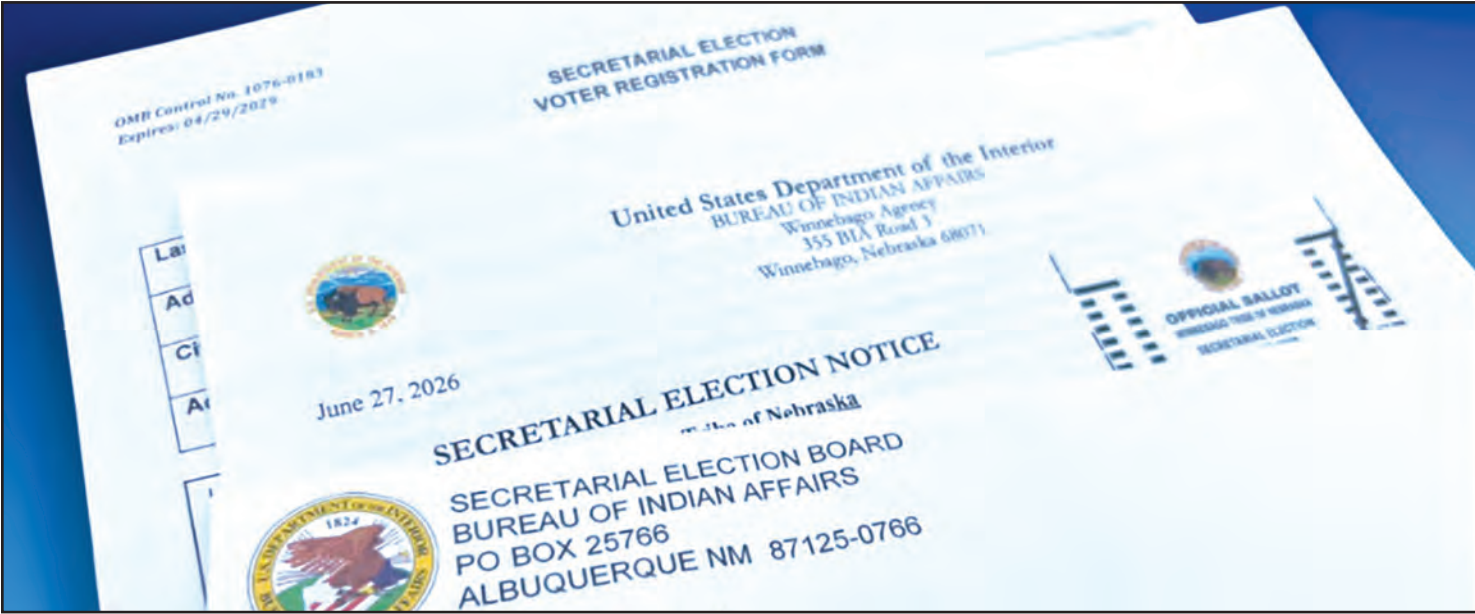

The Winnebago Tribe has initiated a Secretarial Election to amend the Winnebago Tribal Constitution. Beginning June 29, all adult tribal members began receiving voter registration packets from the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) by mail. Tribal members should carefully read the packet, complete the voter registration form, and return it in the prepaid envelope right away in order to participate in the Secretarial Election. Do not throw the packet away.

Key Information

- Who should register: All adult Winnebago tribal members who want to vote in this Secretarial Election.
- How to register: Complete the voter registration form mailed by the BIA and return it in the prepaid envelope.
- Mail-by date: Mail the voter registration form no later than July 7,

- 2026, to help ensure timely delivery.
- Registration deadline: Forms must be received by the BIA no later than 12:00 p.m. MT on July 17, 2026.
- Voting method: This election is conducted by mail only.
- Ballot deadline: Ballots must be received by the BIA no later than August 26, 2026.
- Need a voter registration form? Contact Delores Springer, Winnebago Secretarial Election Board Chairperson, at (402) 878-2502. Voter registration forms must be received by the BIA in Albuquerque, New Mexico, no later than 12:00 p.m. MT on July 17, 2026. To allow for regular mail processing and possible delays, tribal members should mail their forms no later than July 7, 2026.
- If you have not received a voter registration form by mail, please

contact Delores Springer, Winnebago Secretarial Election Board Chairperson, immediately at (402) 878-2502.

Proposed Amendment

The proposed amendment would add the following language as Article II, Section 4 of the Winnebago Tribal Constitution:

“Beginning on the date this amendment is approved by the Secretary of the Interior, no person aged twenty-five (25) or older may apply for enrollment with the Winnebago Tribe if that person was previously enrolled in another federally recognized Indian Tribe.”

If adopted, this amendment would prohibit any person who is (1) age 25 or older and (2) previously enrolled in

A FIVE-YEAR JOURNEY COMPLETE

[Winnebago, NE] The Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska Human Services recently celebrated the highly anticipated grand opening of its new 30,000-square-foot facility, Nĩkjač Wakaçak Anaga Wagijire (Child Care and Social Services), on June

24, 2026. This project represents a monumental five-year journey from initial design to final construction. It stands as a powerful symbol of community resilience, healing, and cultural preservation.

Above all else, this new facility is built on a deep foundation of prayer. From the very first design meetings to the final dedication, every step of this journey was intentionally

guided by spiritual reflection. The community recognized that while the building itself is beautiful, it is the spirit within it that brings true healing.

During the grand opening, the blessing was offered by Winnebago Tribal Council Chairman Coly

another federally recognized Tribe from enrolling in the Winnebago Tribe. The change would take effect on the date the Secretary of the Interior approves the election results and would apply to enrollment applications submitted from that date forward.

This proposed amendment would not change the tribal enrollment blood quantum requirement. There are no other constitutional amendments being voted on in this Secretarial Election.

Secretarial Election Process

The Secretarial Election is conducted by **mail only** and has two steps: (1) completing a voter registration form and (2) submitting a ballot. The voter registration packet, which has already been mailed, includes the Secretarial Election Notice, Rules of Secretarial Election, Secretarial Election Voter Registration Form, and a copy of the proposed amendment.

Voter Registration

Adult tribal members must register to vote in this specific Secretarial Election. To register, adult tribal members must complete the form and mail it to the BIA so it arrives at the designated address

in Albuquerque, New Mexico, no later than **12:00 p.m. MT on July 17, 2026**. A prepaid envelope is provided in the packet to return the form.

Tribal members are encouraged to mail the form in the prepaid envelope no later than **July 7, 2026** to help ensure it is received on time. The form may also be sent by express mail no later than July 14, 2026; however, any express mail cost is the sender's responsibility.

If you do not return the Voter Registration Form by the deadline, you will not be allowed to vote in this Secretarial Election.

Secretarial Election Vote

After the Registered Voters List is finalized in late July, the BIA will mail ballots and voting instructions to tribal members who registered to vote. Ballots must be completed and returned by mail. Ballots must be **received by the BIA** no later than **August 26, 2026**.

Take action today: Read your BIA packet, return your voter registration form on time, and watch for your ballot. Your participation matters!

ROOTED IN TRADITION

[Winnebago, NE] The 2026 Winnebago Culture Camp successfully concluded its five-day event at the Winnebago Powwow Grounds. Held from June 22 to 26, the annual event provided an intensive cultural immersion experience for community youth in grades K-12. The initiative was jointly organized and facilitated by the Ho-Chunk Renaissance Language Preservation Program and the Boys and Girls Club of the Hocak Nisoc Haci. The camp served as an educational platform dedicated to teaching foundational Hocak Woska principles, aimed at strengthening cultural identity, community wellbeing, and self-determination among younger generations.

Throughout the week, participants engaged in structured educational tracks designed to preserve tribal heritage and connect youth with historical traditions. Cultural leaders, veterans, and elders attended daily to lead instructions and ensure historical continuity. The curriculum featured a wide range of interactive cultural components, including ribbon skirt making, necklace making, language bingo, Kasu, and the moccasin game. Other activities included practice in archery, traditional singing, hoop dancing, and powwow dancing. A highlight for older participants in grades 7-12 involved a specialized architectural and ceremonial seminar led by Mr. Tom and Pete Snowball. Students actively assisted in constructing a traditional ciporoke

(lodge) and were instructed in the strict protocols governing a traditional communal meal.

In addition to daily daytime instructions, the camp also incorporates a major community gathering. On the evening of June 24, a public round dance was hosted at the big screen in downtown Winnebago from 5:30-8:30 PM. The event engaged local families in traditional and social dances, including the two-step and potato dance, along with a spot dance, and featured contests for the best ribbon shirt and ribbon skirt. The camp culminated on the final afternoon with a dance exhibition where all K-12 youth participated in the Swan Dance, Fish Dance, Two-Step, and Snake Dance. For many attendees, the ceremony marked their inaugural entry into the dance arena, which organizers noted successfully inspired multiple youth to commit to future arena dancing at upcoming powwows.

Meal operations were managed by Jaime Moore and a specialized volunteer team, adhering strictly to public health handwashing and safety protocols. Daily breakfasts were funded by the Winnebago Education Department, while daily lunches were supplied through partnerships with Wazoki, Nikjak Wakacak Anaga Wigijire, and WTN Administration. The Ho-Chunk Community Development Corporation (HCCDC) provided necessary funding for both the off-site field trip and round dance meal.

Brown. Groundbreaking prayers were previously offered by Winnebago Tribal Member Isaac Smith, anchoring the project in sacred intentions from day one. Human Services Director Miskoo Petite shared one of his teachings from his elders, "when anything in our environment is approached with prayer, it transforms into medicine."Through these collective blessings, the building has become true medicine for our people, a sacred space designed to bring up children around good things, help them understand their responsibilities as Ho-Chunks, and support older community members that are working their way back into the clan system. This spirit of unity was felt throughout the celebration. The event had a warm, family-oriented atmosphere, featuring healthy indigenous catering with buffalo organized by Sinai Carrillo and Kumiko Masquat. Showing their collective pride, the entire staff dressed in beautiful, matching custom ribbon shirts and dresses.

The architecture itself tells a story of heritage and strength. To ensure the design honored the Tribe's history, the team at LEO A DALY visited the Angel De Cora Museum, collaborated with the Renaissance Language Center, and listened to the late, longtime Tribal Councilmember and Winnebago Elder Louis LaRose share stories about the land and the ancestral buffalo field upon which the structure stands. Every major element of the building's design carries deep cultural meaning. The building's massing represents the form of a Thunderhawk's outstretched wings, conveying a sense of strength and protection to the community. Supported by twelve columns, the central rotunda represents the twelve clans of the Winnebago Tribe. Its shape was inspired by the tribe's ciporoke (traditional lodge). The intricate brick patterns on the building exterior pay tribute to the Tribe's traditional weaving patterns; the inside features curved walls throughout the facility, inspired by the winding rivers of Wisconsin, where the Winnebago Tribe once lived.

The facility significantly expands the Tribe's capacity to support working families. Childcare Program Manager Sinai Carrillo shared that the program would transition from its current 12-child space at the Neola Walker Building to a sprawling seven-classroom environment capable of hosting up to 80 children. Two dedicated classrooms will operate in partnership with Ho-Chunk Renaissance, offering strict immersion in the Ho-Chunk language and culture. Three infant classrooms (serving ages six weeks to 18 months) and three toddler-to-pre-K classrooms with direct access to outdoor play spaces designed

for exploration and learning. One classroom has been custom designed to function as a certified storm shelter, providing an added layer of safety for the children. While the core center serves children up to age 5, the childcare assistant program supports older youth up to age 12 through summer camps and after-school programming. A flexible training room accommodates up to 70 participants for GED preparation, parenting classes, workforce training, and other community-strengthening educational opportunities. The building houses key programs to protect and strengthen families, including the Preserving Native Families Program managed by Angie Walker and the Child Welfare Program managed by Lauren Buchanan.

To ensure student and family safety during ongoing local infrastructure improvements, specifically the construction of the nearby roundabout, the center will open in two phases starting between late July and early August. Phase one will transition the two active classrooms from the Neola Walker site. Phase two will open enrollment to additional community families once road construction subsides. Beyond childcare, Social Services Program Manager Kumiko Masquat's wing is already fully open to the public at the new location, actively accepting applications for social services and emergency assistance. For community members unable to travel out to the new building, a dedicated intake trailer remains operational across from the school at the Wazoki Hoci (blue building across from the public school), where Robert Redhorn is available to assist clients with paperwork.

A project on this scale required an immense team effort. Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska – Childcare - Grand opening

June 24, 2026

Good morning,

On behalf of the architects, engineers, and designers at LEO A DALY, thank you for allowing us to be part of this very special day. It has been an honor to work alongside the Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska, Ho-Chunk Construction, VIREO Landscape Architects, and so many dedicated community members to bring this vision to life.

Today we celebrate the opening of this 30,000-square-foot facility that is much more than a building. It is an investment in the future of the Tribe—a place where children will learn and grow, where adults will gain new skills and opportunities, and where the history, culture, and traditions of the Ho-Chunk people will be shared with future generations.

One of the greatest privileges of this project was the opportunity to learn about the history, culture, and traditions of the Ho-Chunk people. We visited the Angel De Cora Museum, worked with the Renaissance Language Center, and spent time listening to Elder Louis LaRose share stories about the Tribe, the land, and the buffalo field this building is built upon. Those experiences helped us understand that this building needed to do more than function well—it needed to tell a story.

As a result, many elements of the building’s design carry deeper meaning. The building’s massing suggests the form of a Thunderhawk’s outstretched wings, conveying senses of strength and protection to the community. The rotunda is supported by twelve columns, representing the twelve clans of the Winnebago Tribe. The rotunda’s shape was inspired by the tribe’s dome-shaped ciiporoke dwellings of the past made of bent green wood branches tied together and covered with animal skins. The curved walls throughout the building are inspired by the rivers of Wisconsin, where the Ho-Chunk people once lived, and the intricate brick patterns on the exterior pay tribute to the Tribe’s weaving traditions. Integrated throughout the building are opportunities for learning, reflection, and cultural connection.

Beyond symbolism, the building was designed to support everyday life and future success. The childcare wing provides classrooms for children from infancy through 5 years old, with direct access to outdoor play spaces designed for exploration and learning. One classroom has also been designed as a storm shelter, providing an added layer of safety and resilience. On the workforce development side, a flexible training room accommodates up to 70 participants for programs such as GED preparation, parenting classes, workforce training, and other educational opportunities that strengthen the community.

Most importantly, this building is the result of collaboration. Working closely with Tribal leadership, staff, building users, Ho-Chunk Construction, and many others, we were able to create a facility that reflects the values, aspirations, and identity of the Winnebago Tribe.

As designers, there is no greater reward than seeing a building come alive with the people it was created to serve. We are grateful for the trust you placed in our team and proud to have played a small role in creating a place where culture is celebrated, opportunities are created, and future generations will thrive. Congratulations on this milestone. Thank you.

‘Am I in the place of God?’

We have all experienced life altering events - things that occur that impact us for the rest of our lives. One such event took place when Jacob, the father of 12 sons, died. Upon his death, ten of his sons - older brothers of Joseph feared that he would pay them back.

Pay them back for what exactly? First, some of his older brothers - (not including Rueben or his younger brother Benjamin) same father different mothers - wanted to kill Joseph. Instead Joseph’s brothers sold him into slavery. Then they took Joseph’s coat of many colors, dipped it in the blood of goat and allowed their father to fear the worst happened to his beloved son.

So upon the death of their father the brothers sent word to Joseph, saying, “Your father left these instructions before he died: ‘This is what you are to say to Joseph: I ask you to forgive your brothers the sins and the wrongs they committed in treating you so badly.’ Now please forgive the sins of the servants of the God of your father.”

Joseph said to them, “Don’t be afraid. Am I in the place of God? You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives.” [Genesis 50:16-20 (NIV84)].

Joseph, who had developed a good and mature relationship with his heavenly Father, was more than willing to forgive the sins of his brothers. Christians are called to do the same. Has your life, your Christian life developed and matured to the point that you can see and say that you are not in the place of God and that you indeed can forgive and will forget - at least to the point of not reminding or allowing your relationship to be fractured by others?

Now can you compare the life of Joseph with the life of Jesus? Jesus was also favored by his heavenly Father - ‘This is my beloved son, in whom I am well pleased!’ Do these words make you jealous?

Some of Jesus’ blood relatives were so jealous of Jesus that they falsely accused him. Their actions were intended to do evil. However, God intended it for good.

Yes, for good? How good? So good, so good, so good! As good as it gets through the suffering and death of Jesus. The evil wishes and plans of his tribal blood brothers brought the saving of many lives! That is, all the lives of those who believe in Jesus.

Now I would like to repeat that Jesus’ saving action is so good, so good, so good! So good especially for me and for you who place our faith, our trust in Jesus as one’s Lord and Savior!

For many years I have noticed the coming generations seem to just pick a clan they claim to be a member of. Evidently their parents don’t know our clan system or maybe even our Hocak culture. They seem to be focusing on “choosing” the Thunder Clan.

If your father is a Winnebago Indian and he has a clan, then that is the clan you belong to. You do not belong to your mother’s clan. You cannot just claim any clan you want. Just ask any older and knowledgeable Winnebago Indian in your family. If they don’t know, they can probably tell you who to ask. But you need to know your family tree.

So far I have seen individuals claim the Thunder Clan when their father is a white man, some other race, and even a Sioux Indian. There are probably other persons who really don’t know who they are.

Reclaiming ancestral language and social traditions establishes a psychological anchor for Winnebago youth, reinforcing mental health, enhancing self-esteem, and building vital resilience. By equipping youth with a healthy sense of belonging, the community ensures that its future leaders are well-prepared to successfully navigate a complex and diverse world.

Program facilitation and organizational sponsorships were provided by Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska, Ho-Chunk Inc., Wazoki, HCCDC, WTN Wildlife & Parks, Winnebago Comprehensive Healthcare System, Little Priest Tribal College Extension, Higher Education, and Nikjak Wakacak Anaga Wigijire. Operational personnel and logistics were further reinforced by volunteers from the HCI Interns, WCHS Staff, Onipaa Productions, and the Summer Youth Program.

“With this issue falling on the July 4th holiday, share your best and worst fourth of July memory with us.”

GARAN:Hands down the bottle rocket wars held in the ghetto when I was 12 years old. It's all fun and games until i got stung by a black cat shell.

KEVIN: One of my favorite Fourth of July was actually a couple days after Fourth of July. We was all out to my brother's house and people start pulling fireworks out of the truck of their cars. They had left over from Fourth of July and we blew them up and there was about eight or 10 of us guys and we would like them three or four a time so it put on a good show.

CHRISTINA: My best memory is taking my kids down to Omaha one year to watch a fireworks show, I think it has been the best fireworks show I've ever seen. The worst memory, I was maybe 7 or 8 years old, me and Alan Walker was lighting the short wick firecrackers and I had one blow up in my hand and his mom ran me in the house to run cold water on my hand, very traumatic.

BETHANI: I would say my best memory is from two years ago, we had a cookout at my moms and that’s where we lit off all our fireworks, it was the best one so far because I had my boys and my brothers were there with their families, and my mom got to have all of us under her roof for the day. My worst memory is from when I was a kid. My family would get together at my Caca & Choka’s house, which is out in the country, and we would all light off our fireworks together. Every year, one of the artillery shells would somehow get knocked over, and that’s exactly what happened. I just remember all the chaos broke loose, everyone running everywhere. My nephew, DJ Grandson, was just a baby then and I was holding him at the time the explosions occurred. We had taken cover behind a big tree and thankfully, no one was seriously injured. To this day, huge artillery shells scare me; I will happily watch from afar. Way, way, wayyyy afar!

TYLER: My best memory of the 4th is when all the fam would gather at my Caca Cheryl and Choka Joby’s house as a kid. Holidays were so much fun as a kid, especially with family members who have passed. Great memories to cherish! As for my worst memory, I'd have to say when a smoke bomb blew up in my hand as I was writing my name lol. After that I was pretty much done lighting fireworks forever haha.

GAYLA: Best memory was gathering at my Kaka Chubb's house in the ghetto with my Redhorn family, pooling all our fireworks together and having a big cookout every summer in the 90s-00s! The worst memory was when my older sister and I made a "genie" (basically just a pile of gunpowder/flashpowder with a wick) and it exploded in our faces, burnt our nose hairs, eyelashes and eyebrows off, haha. Our faces were pitch black with soot like a Looney Tunes character. We learned a valuable lesson that day!

QUINCE: Best 4th was in Flandreau SD at their Pow Wow. At sundown they shut the lights off and had a round dance during the fireworks. I was round dancing with my wife Jessika and my baby girl Jessique. It was a firework display I'll remember forever. Worst one was when a pocket full of bottle rockets accidentally went off in my cousin Chuck's pocket. He was scarred for life and it was a memorable time, even though it was bad.

AYDEN:Best memory is shooting roman candles at my cousins and worst is getting my thumb almost blown off.

Community Pool Reopens After Significant Repairs

After identifying consistent issues with water leaking impacting the foundational structure of not only the pool, but the building as a whole, WCHS teams worked together to identify the problem, explore solutions, source the funding, and coordinate the project to ensure Winnebago community members have a clean, safe place to enjoy swimming all year round.

“Based on Master Facilities Plan feedback, WCHS was able to discern the community’s wishes to see these funds invested into maintaining the existing pool structure in the current location,”

explains WCHS Chief Administrative Officer, Sharon Frenchman. “We are grateful to everyone who participated in our various feedback surveys and focus groups to identify our community’s wants and needs.”

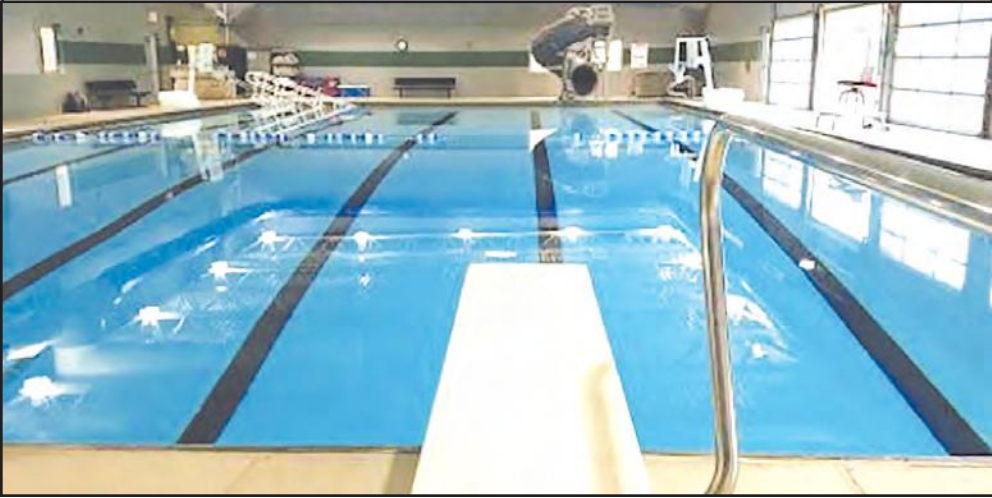
For the past two months, the pool has been closed while undergoing these significant repairs. The completed repairs included: patching cracks in the pool’s structural walls, replacing the Pool Pak, which is the HVAC ventilation and dehumidification system for indoor swimming pool environments, and installing other filtration equipment that is essential to overall operation. This project represented a substantial investment totaling over \$800,000 from the Winnebago Comprehensive Healthcare System.

Swimming provides a full-body, low-impact workout that helps improve cardiovascular endurance, build strength, support weight management, and reduce stress. It can also promote both physical and mental well-being, making it a great activity for people of all ages.

“If you haven’t been swimming yet this summer, we want to encourage you to come check it out and take advantage of our extended hours,” said Pilar Aldrich, Director of Whirling Thunder Wellness Center. “We’re excited to share this investment in preventive health with our community.”

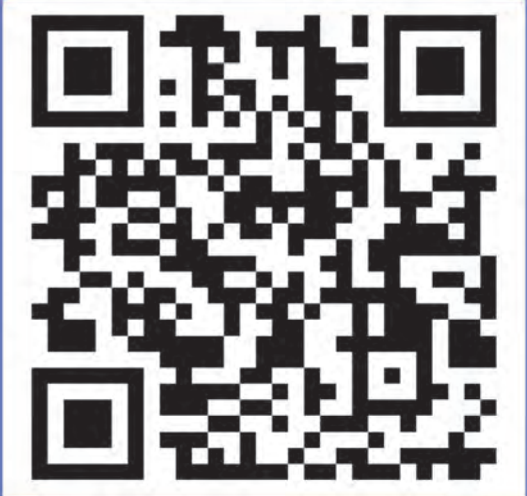
