FMU is proudly achieving the goals that are bringing the university into the future. By integrating into the community, programs and partnerships are forming to create unparalleled opportunities for students. FMU is currently offering degrees in high-demand fields like aviation, education, computer science, healthcare, renewable energy, and innovation technology, to name only a few. The university has more than 40 organizations and academic clubs, Greek life, a robust athletics program, and even a nationally renowned marching band, named number one in Division II among HBCUs by ESPN. In fall 2022, FMU welcomed its largest freshman class in 15 years.

By reimagining the future, FMU now stands in a position of great promise, and continues ascending to excellence. Here is just some of the major progress that has been made these past few years at FMU.

STUDENT SUCCESS

- The ROAR marching band ranked number one band among Division II HBCUs in the nation.
- Students continue to receive prestigious scholarships, including The White House's 2022 HBCU Scholar Recognition Program, the C. Alfred Anderson Scholarship/Internship for Aviation, and ASPA South Florida's Dewey W. Knight Jr. Scholarship.
- FMU football relaunched and celebrated its first victory in more than 63 years in October 2021.
- Inaugural seasons of competition for Women's Flag Football, Co-ed Competitive Cheer, and Women's Softball.
- Men's Basketball was crowned 2022 Sun Conference Tournament Champions.
- Baseball participated in the Black College World Series and played in the semifinal game.
- Men's Track & Field had qualifiers for the NAIA Indoor Track & Field Championship.
- Sophomore Christian Edgerson was named to the NAIA All-American team for Indoor Track & Field.
- Women's Track & Field had qualifiers for both the NAIA Indoor and Outdoor Track & Field Championships.
- Flag Football participated in the NAIA Invitational tournament.
- The Athletic department welcomed nearly 400 student-athletes (a modern era record number of students).

- ✓ Opened the Center for Teaching and Learning for faculty Development.
- ✓ The second-floor breezeway of the FIU/FMU Building has been transformed into a multifunctional space for tutoring, meetings, and relaxation for students, faculty, and staff by a generous donation from El Dorado Furniture.
- ✓ Named a National Center of Academic Excellence and Cyber Defense.
- ✓ Received multiyear funding of \$750,000 in partnership with American Airlines for Aviation Program support and scholarships.
- ✓ Congresswoman Fredricka Wilson announced that FMU will receive significant funding to support aviation, science, technology, engineering, and mathematics programs.

FINANCIAL SOLVENCY



- ✓ Fall 2022, FMU welcomed its largest freshman class in 15 years, after experiencing a 306% increase in enrollment commitments over the previous year. Currently, commitments are tracking 12% ahead of last year's numbers.
- ✓ The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021 passed, resulting in FMU's approximately \$42 million in long-term debt was forgiven.
- ✓ Substantial funding received through several available programs, including the Payroll Protection Program (\$4.878 million), the CARES act, and Higher Education Emergency Relief Funding.
- ✓ Steadily increasing donor base and giving programs by 30 percent year over year, include the launch of the five-year, \$25 million Momentum Fund Campaign to support scholarships, raising more than \$1.2 million so far during the campaign's silent phase.
- ✓ Secured \$2.4 million for Aviation and Science renovations.
- ✓ Secured more than \$12 million in private and government funding, including \$7 million from the State of Florida.
- ✓ Raised more than \$183,000 on FMU's Third Annual Giving Day.
- ✓ Secured over \$100,000 in startup funds for the Center for Entrepreneurship.

OPERATIONAL EXCELLENCE

- ✓ The Puryear Administration Building, Admissions and Financial Aid offices saw a complete renovation.
- ✓ The Nathan W. Collier Library was transformed to a state-of-the-art study facility with learning pods, updated technology, fresh paint and flooring, a revamped Presidents Wall, and the newly added Center for Teaching and Learning.
- ✓ The Science Building received a brand new roof and air conditioning system, and the university's electrical loop was replaced to provide a more reliable power source campus-wide with fewer disruptions, at approximately 50 percent of budget.
- ✓ Completed campus-wide beautification projects include painting, landscaping, updated branding and signage, 100 percent exterior LED lighting, and renovation of the fountain at the main gate.
- ✓ A complete overhaul of campus Wi-Fi gave students improved connectivity and a stronger network, with reliable high-speed access, fewer disruptions, and digital teaching and learning opportunities.
- ✓ Created marketing videos to better publicize and promote university happenings and initiatives.
- ✓ Created program slicks and marketing materials for each school.
- ✓ Created branded logos for each department and school.
- ✓ Revamped FMU website

- ✓ Unveiled the Barbara J. Jordan Commissioner of Excellence Collection at the Nathan W. Collier Library, in honor of a longtime friend to FMU.
- ✓ Received \$100,000 from Related Urban to support the launching of the Center for Entrepreneurship.
- ✓ In 2023, President Joe Biden visited FMU. His visit was in partnership with Florida Grassroots.
- ✓ In 2023, named a participating school in Venture Miami's STEM Scholarship Program.
- ✓ In 2023, awarded a grant via University of Miami's Institute for Data Science and Computing's AIM-AHEAD program.
- ✓ Received federal funding for Engaged Community Schools to establish partnerships with three Miami-Dade County Public Schools.

FMU ESPORTS STUDENT WINS \$15,000 HBCU SCHOLARSHIP



On October 23, FMU Esports and Gaming student Ricardo Alvarez De Lugo placed third out of all the schools and students competing in Brag House's Black & Positively Golden® Gamers tournament. Presented in partnership with McDonald's and Coca-Cola, the tournament, featuring the Fortnite game, was for current HBCU College student gamers across the country.

The online tournament hosted 100 different HBCU student gamers in each of our four qualifying rounds, on a first come, first served basis. They entered private battle royales created by Brag House, which means only gamers with a private invitation were allowed into the tournament matches.

The top 25 student gamers of each qualifier day advanced to the Grand Finale, with Ricardo placing in the top three! In addition to a \$15,000 scholarship, Ricardo also received a Black & Positively Golden® Gamers 2022 trophy, a spot on the McDonald's Fortnite Esports League for 2023, and was honored at the Celebration Bowl at HBCU Atlanta. PROFESSOR EBONY HICKS

Professor Ebony Hicks serves as the lead of FMU's internship courses for Social Work and Psychology students. She has been instrumental in placing students in agencies throughout the Miami-Dade area in the fields of family intervention, youth case management, and community mental health. She also works with several agencies in the community dealing with mental health and emotional well-being. Most notably, she actively volunteers with Liberty City Elementary School and is in the process of returning to school to obtain her Doctorate of Social Work.



DR. TYFFANY WHITE

Tyffany White joined the Pride in 2021 as Director of Teacher Education and Graduate Studies, and immediately created the report that led to the School of Education's continued State Approved Programs status by Florida's Department of Education. Dr. White leads community engagement initiatives, including the Environmental Education Teacher Institute, which resulted in grant funding for 2022 and 2023, as well as Engaged Community Schools. She has been instrumental in developing and implementing Professional Development Seminars designed to provide valuable research-based instruction to students pursuing the field of education. She also helped spearhead "Lions For A Day," a school-wide recruitment effort with 150 high schoolers coming to FMU to engage in a full day of strategically planned activities to increase enrollment in the School of Education and the department of Social Sciences. Dr. White currently teaches five education courses while maintaining her director responsibilities.

DR. TIKIYÀ HENRY

Dr. Tikiy`a Henry is a native of Fort Lauderdale, Florida. She attended Stranahan High where she found her love for cheerleading and dance. After graduating in 2008, she enrolled at FMU, where she was very involved in making the cheerleading team and becoming Miss Freshman, all within her first year in college. She didn't stop there and was an active student leader, taking on roles in Student Government, Miss United Negro College Fund, and the NAACP. After graduating with her bachelor's degree in Communications/Television Broadcasting in 2012, she furthered her education at Florida International University, studying Higher Education Administration and graduating in 2013.

Dr. Henry's higher education career started at Broward College, where she took on many roles as a Success Coach, College Advisor, and Enrollment Services officer. Her career took off as she served her beloved Alma Mater, FMU, as the Admissions Transfer Counselor. It was in this position that she found her passion for higher education, HBCUs, and ensuring students have a welcoming college experience.

Since then, she has had the pleasure of helping students with their college matriculation at institutions such as Lincoln University, Florida International University, and currently Florida Atlantic University as the Associate Director of Student Activities and Involvement, advising Student Government and the Black Student Union.

Recently graduating in June 2022, with her Doctorate in Education from Nova Southeastern University, Dr. Henry completed her dissertation topic on *Surviving or Thriving: Examining Issues Surrounding Enrollment Declining at Historically Black Colleges and Universities*. She also is a leader in the community, serving as the Director of College Readiness for Ignite Empowerment Community Center. Her philosophy is to "always walk into a room and OWN IT, no matter who is there!"



DR. ELICEL SIMILIEN

Born and raised in Miami, Florida, as the youngest of four siblings, Dr. Elicel Similien thought that having parents with limited education, and reading and writing skills meant he was at a disadvantage to his peers. His realization that education was an essential foundation that any human can have comes from having to read and translate information for his parents at such an early age. Therefore, he pushed himself to succeed academically throughout his entire K-12 educational career.



Dr. Similien earned a full academic scholarship to Florida Memorial University, obtaining a bachelor's degree in Elementary Education and a master's in Reading K-12. While at FMU, Dr. Similien joined the Delta Psi Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. He was actively involved with the student government association and the FMU pre-alumni council. He felt his calling to be a teacher when he began mentoring and tutoring elementary students during his sophomore year, along with his fraternity brothers. Teaching and working with urban youth has always been his passion and hidden talent.

Dr. Similien seeks to break every stereotype and expectation set for a young Black man in society to show his students that everything they want in life is attainable. His goal is to change the outlook of a successful Black man in the eyes of young men at Miami Norland Senior High School and our surrounding community. His sole purpose is to instill the message that we all are illimitable with the power of education. Students must understand that their educational talents are just as valuable as physical ones. For this reason, he decided to further his education by obtaining his doctorate from Nova Southeastern University in Organizational Leadership in 2022.

Educating and mentoring is not only his profession but is now his hobby and a part of his lifestyle. In October 2018, he founded the Kings of Glory Foundation Inc., a nonprofit organization to provide more scholarship opportunities, college exposure, and positive activities for young men striving to make a progressive change in their lives. With five years of leading this mentoring program, he has maintained 100 percent graduation rates and at least a 90 percent retention rate of members once they have joined the program. Dr. Similien also serves as the site director for 5000 Role Models of Excellence and Empowering Youth Inc., providing tutoring sessions, financial literacy workshops, college readiness, and social-emotional learning sessions.

He dedicates all he has achieved as an educator to every student and mentee he has encountered. In 2019, Dr. Similien was selected as the Miami-Dade County Public Schools North Region Rookie Teacher of the Year and was one of the top four finalists in the district. He is currently Miami Norland's Senior High School Teacher of the Year for 2022-2023. Dr. Similien refers to all of his students as "scholars." Society already does a great job of placing negative labels on urban students, so he uses his platform to speak life into each student he encounters. By not allowing titles to dictate their growth, he strives to prepare his students for life after high school, providing them with valuable skills, strategies, and knowledge to help them navigate college and beyond.

Florida Trend Names Yolanda Cash Jackson a Floridian of the Year

Florida Trend magazine, a leading statewide business publication, has named attorney and lobbyist Yolanda Cash Jackson a Floridian of the Year. Dubbed "The Advocate," Cash Jackson was recognized for her work creating pathways of opportunity for others, particularly young people.

AIM-AHEAD Grant

Black patients with kidney disease experience a vast disparity in both care and transplant priority. In response to this issue, the National Institutes of Health (NIH) began the Artificial Intelligence/Machine Learning Consortium to Advance Health Equity and Researcher Diversity program, or AIM-AHEAD. The goal of AIM-AHEAD is to reduce these health disparities by creating new algorithms and health care databases that more accurately reflect the diverse U.S. population.

They selected the University of Miami's Institute for Data Science and Computing (IDSC) as one of the institutions to spearhead the program's infrastructure core, which is one of four pillars of the program. The others are partnerships, research, and data science training. Through this partnership, grants are being awarded to minority serving institutions across Florida to improve their access to artificial intelligence tools and help them to do more efficient health equity research.

A \$362,000 grant will help IDSC leaders create a pilot program with FMU and Miami-Dade College to train 40 existing faculty members and students to use artificial intelligence and machine-learning techniques in their clinical practice, research, and curriculum. In this program, IDSC leaders will also build upon another program they created to attract and foster the careers of underrepresented minorities in science, especially in the burgeoning field of data science.
