
Artist Statement:



Artist Statement:

Ohio Star block is my inspiration for this block I call ZigZag Star, used in Sunset Galaxy. A photo of the sunset and my love for this time of day, became the inspiration/source for the colours. Adding a zipper effect in the centre of the block created the innovative aspect for the block. I used my EQ8 software to draw up the block and work out the layout of the quilt.

The overall design is intended to be slightly surreal. The eyes and mouth are painted using acrylic paints mixed with textile medium. The rest is all machine applique.
