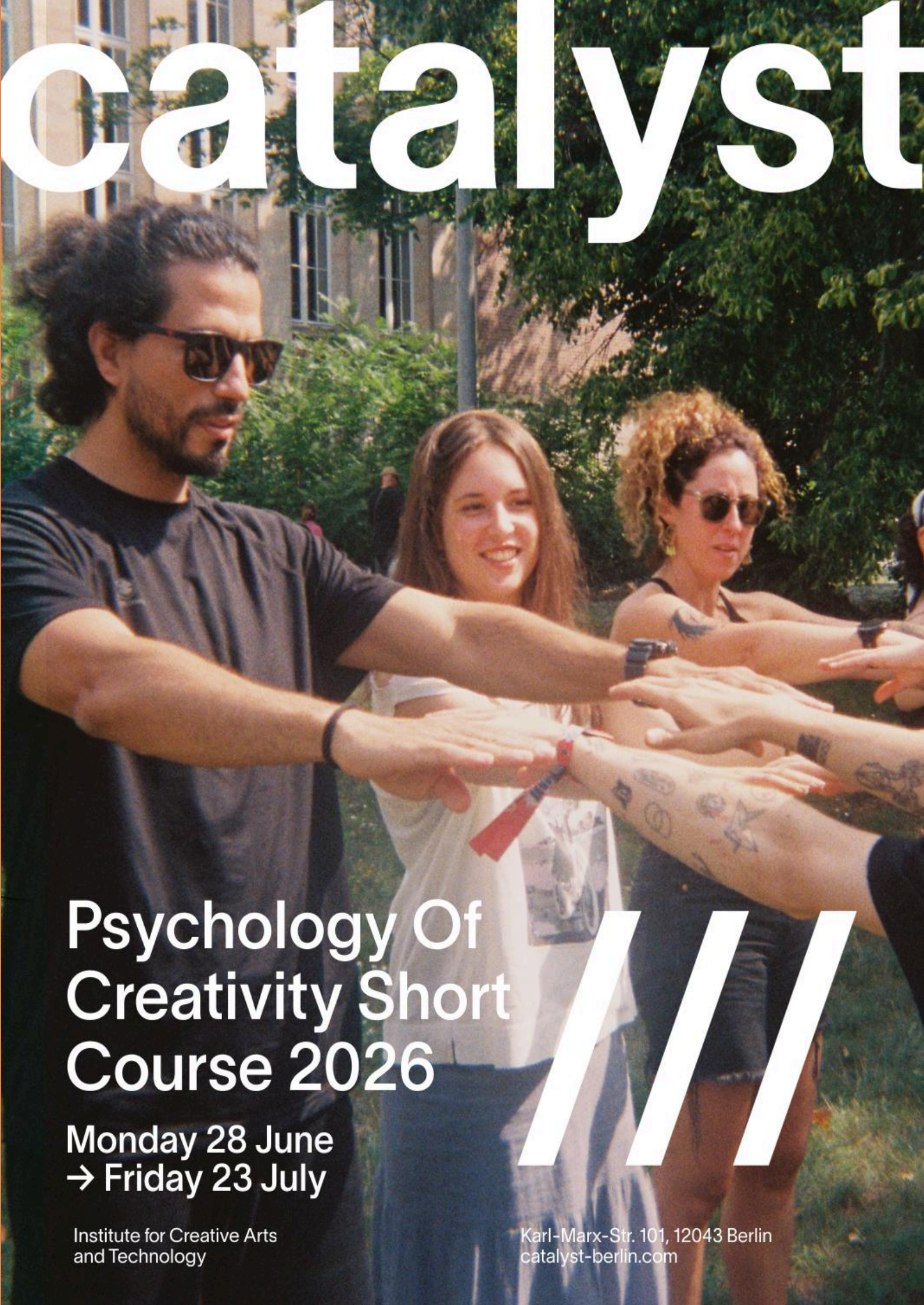

Build skills, confidence and momentum on our range of Summer short courses. Our intensive short courses are led by industry experts and prioritise hands-on learning. That means you'll learn by making, experimenting, receiving feedback and iterating. You'll be practicing real-world creative skills while connecting with an international community of artists, at our iconic campus in Europe's creative capital.

The Psychology of Creativity – Short Course sits within our School for Creative Human Development, but at Catalyst the four schools share a campus and a culture. You will also meet students exploring one of eleven specialist subjects within our School for Music & Sound, School for Film & Visual Media and School for Acting. Everyone is here for the same reason, and come ready to learn new skills and meet like-minded makers. The creative industries don't operate in isolation and we reflect that reality.

Learn from practicing artists and researchers

Your tutors are working professionals: researchers, coaches, artists and facilitators actively navigating the creative field. They bring lived experience into every session and a genuine passion for passing it on. Programme Lead Cordele Glass holds a BA in Applied Developmental Psychology from UCLA and an MA in Positive Developmental Psychology from Claremont Graduate University, and is an award-winning experimental electronic producer. You will be studying alongside students from over 70 countries, all at Catalyst because they take their creative development seriously. On a campus buzzing with every kind of artist, the conversations and connections you make here may be as formative as the coursework itself. This is not a lecture course. Every psychological framework is put to work in your own creative practice. You will leave with a portfolio of real projects, a reflection practice you can take forward and a clearer understanding of how and why you work the way you do.

/// The Psychology of Creativity

Psychology explores the workings of the mind, human behaviour and how we engage with the world around us. Within this broad field, Creativity Psychology has emerged as a dynamic area of study, with decades of scientific research, dedicated labs, academic journals and major conferences worldwide.

This course delves into the developmental roots of creativity and how to nurture it throughout life. We explore the factors that cultivate creative skills and examine the conditions that enhance the joy and fulfilment of the creative process. We investigate the mechanisms linking creativity with our mental and physical health. And we adopt a socio-cultural perspective to explore how creativity influences communities and shapes the world around us.

Staying true to the Catalyst approach, this course goes beyond lectures and exams. Together, we engage with contemporary research and literature through seminar-style discussions. In hands-on workshops, you gain practical, experiential understanding of each topic and work toward applying science-based strategies to enhance your own creative practice.

This course is right for you if:

- ✓ You are a creative practitioner curious about the psychology behind your process
- ✓ You are a coach wanting evidence-based frameworks for supporting creative clients
- ✓ You want to understand flow, play and how creativity develops across lifespans
- ✓ You prefer experiential learning over traditional lectures
- ✓ You are ready to apply psychological insights directly to your creative practice
- ✓ You have no previous experience with psychology and want to start from the beginning

Course Outcomes

Course Structure

The course alternates between workshop days and application days. On workshop days, you reflect on your progress, engage with new topics and plan your own creative applications. On application days, you create in your own way, experimenting with the approaches introduced the day before. This rhythm of learning and doing is what defines the summer.

Workshop days run 10:00 to 12:30 and 14:00 to 16:30. Application days follow a freeform schedule, with campus facilities available for independent use from 10:00 until 19:45.

Week 1

Creative Lifespan
Development

Developmental systems theories, big-picture creativity, the creative brain and developmental neuroscience, stages of creative development across the lifespan from early foundations to sustainable mastery, and where change happens in developmental contexts.

Week 2

Optimal Experience
& Peak Performance

Play, curiosity and imagination, flow states and the zone, mindfulness and attention, emotions and artistic expression, the creative process and productivity, deliberate practice and expert performance, professional creativity and burnout prevention.

Week 3

Expressive Arts,
Health & Wellbeing

Mindfulness, eco-art and self-care, neuroaesthetics, nature-based art, compassion and artistic mindsets, colour psychology and emotions, sound and health, creative writing for self-discovery, movement and embodied expression.

Week 4

Creative Leadership
& Global Impact

Psychological safety and emotional intelligence, trust and communication, feedback and iteration, leadership and followership styles, group problem solving, group flow, cross-cultural collaboration, values, purpose and storytelling.

Topics Covered

- Creativity across the lifespan
- Neuroscience of creativity
- Emotional and psychological aspects of the creative process
- Mindfulness and its role in creativity
- Development of creative skills and expertise
- Artistic expression and mental health
- Productivity and professional creativity
- Collaborative creativity and group dynamics
- Cultural influences on creativity
- Creativity, wellbeing, and nature
- Leadership, communication, and feedback in creative environments
- Creativity and storytelling for personal and collective meaning

Projects and Assessment

Summer Portfolio You will design and develop a creative portfolio across the four weeks. Each application day is spent applying the previous workshop topic to your portfolio work. You may choose any medium or creative direction that is personally relevant and feasible with your resources.

Reflection Notebook You will reflect on your development through journaling. Time is devoted to intentional learning and taking in the experiences and questions raised in workshops.

Progression

Whether you want to spend four weeks expanding your creative potential, or you are preparing to advance to one of our longer HE Certificate, BA or MA programmes, this short course will equip you with practical tools and insights for your creative practice.

The course also provides skills in demand across the creative industries. You will develop and receive feedback on projects relevant for those looking to work as: artists, creative directors, arts facilitators, arts educators, creativity coaches, artist managers or arts therapists.

If you are drawn to a deeper study of applied creative psychology, the course serves as direct preparation for our [Applied Creative Psychology MA](#).

You won't be studying alone

When you join the Psychology of Creativity summer course, you are joining a whole campus of creatives. Catalyst's four schools share the same campus, which means your classmates in the seminar room are surrounded by musicians, filmmakers, sound designers, screenwriters, actors and photographers all here for the same reason: to develop their practice at a serious level.

The creative industries don't operate in isolation, and Catalyst reflects that reality. Collaboration between disciplines happens naturally in the shared spaces, communal studios and closing showcase. The connections you make here go beyond your own subject area.

Summer Short Courses running at the same time

During the same four weeks, our campus will be brimming with students on ten other specialist short courses across music, film, video games and acting. These are the courses to choose from:

MUSIC & SOUND

Electronic Music Production

Transform creative ideas into finished tracks using Ableton Live, hardware synthesisers and drum machines. Beginner level.

MUSIC & SOUND

Studio Recording

Learn professional recording and engineering in a real studio environment. Explore Pro Tools, microphones and signal flow. Beginner level.

MUSIC & SOUND

Music & Sound for Experimental Gaming

Explore new approaches to music, sound design and storytelling in games and hybrid media. Beginner/Intermediate.

MUSIC & SOUND

Mixing & Mastering Electronic Music

Elevate your mixes with professional depth, clarity and warmth. For producers ready to take the next step. Intermediate/Advanced.

MUSIC & SOUND

Advanced Sound Design

Develop a stronger sonic identity through modular synthesis, granular processing and experimental techniques. Intermediate/Advanced.

ACTING

Screen Acting

Develop your on-camera presence and technique in a working studio environment, led by professional actors. Beginner level.

FILM & VISUAL MEDIA

Filmmaking

Develop your craft across stages of production; from pre-production and cinematography to editing and sound. Beginner level.

FILM & VISUAL MEDIA

Screenwriting

Write original scripts through structured workshops, peer feedback and industry-informed storytelling techniques. Beginner level.

FILM & VISUAL MEDIA

Unreal Engine & Environment Design

Build immersive real-time environments for games, film and digital art using Unreal Engine. Beginner level.

FILM & VISUAL MEDIA

Documentary Photography

Develop a documentary photography practice and storytelling instincts through intensive fieldwork in Berlin. Beginner level.

All eleven summer courses culminate in a shared closing showcase. Expect performances, screenings, DJ sets, photo exhibitions and installations from students across every discipline. You leave with new output, new skills and an international network built across a month of shared creative work.

Entry Requirements and How to Apply

Course cost

All Summer Short Courses cost €2,005 + €495 enrolment fee.

Course dates

Monday 28 June – Friday 23 July 2027

Entry Requirements: Age

We don't have an upper age limit, but we do have a minimum age: 18. To join us you must be 18 years old by the first day of your study programme.

Entry Requirements: Language

All our courses are taught in English and applicants must demonstrate a level equal to IELTS 6. We do not ask for official exam results, but we will assess the standard of English in your application and support materials. We do not require German language skills.

Entry Requirements: Education

No education requirement – only relevant experience for the intermediate and advanced courses.

Admissions Timeline

Summer Short Course applications are normally processed within 2 weeks.

Final deadline

31 March 2027 - early enrolment deadline (150€ discount)

21 May 2027 - final deadline (subject to availability)

Multi-Course Discount

Enrol in both a Summer Short Course and a degree course with us within two years, and receive a discount of €500 off the total tuition fee.

Application Form

The Summer Short Course application form is just one page. You must submit your personal and contact details, as well as a short statement of motivation (250-300 words). If you're applying for one of our intermediate or advanced level summer courses, be sure to tell us about your previous experience with the subject and related software, if relevant.
