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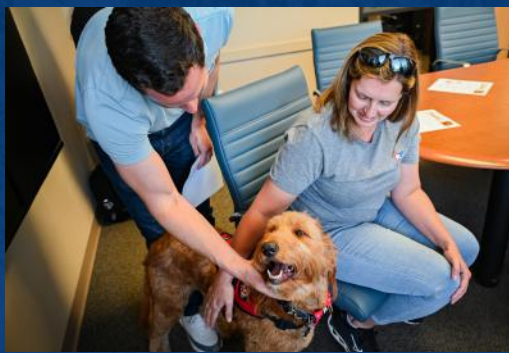

SAFETY tips



KEEP YOUR INFORMATION SECURE

Locking your screen when you leave your desk is a simple way to **keep your information secure**. Keeping your screen unlocked can be dangerous for a number of reasons. Many computers are set up to automatically activate a screensaver after being inactive for a certain amount of time. Unfortunately, not all screensavers are password-protected, which leaves your workstation vulnerable. **Easy to do but often overlooked, locking your screen when you leave your desk** can prevent you from ending up in a bad situation. Use the directions below to get into the habit of locking your screen.

Mac

On your keyboard, press the **Ctrl + Command + Q** keys at the same time to lock your screen, or select the Apple icon from the Mac menu bar and select **Lock Screen**.

Alternatively, you can set up hot corners to lock your screen. A hot corner is a shortcut feature that allows you to move your cursor to a certain corner of your screen to lock the computer. Hot corners can be set up by going to **System Settings > Desktop & Dock** and then choosing **Hot Corners**.

Windows

On your keyboard, press the **Windows key** and the **L key** at the same time to lock your screen.

Alternatively, you can press the **Control, Alt and Delete (Ctrl+Alt+Del) keys** at the same time to open a menu. From the menu, select **Lock**.



IT'S HOT OUTSIDE, Y'ALL

In Texas, with summer months come 100-degree temperatures, drawing attention to the need to stay aware of the heat and its effect on those outdoors for work or play.

Temperatures in Round Rock reached 100 degrees on 22 days last year. That was relatively low compared to the record 90 days of 100-degree heat experienced in 2011. The area on average experiences its first 100-degree date on June 29.

Consider the following tips when spending time outdoors this summer:

- Drink plenty of fluids when off duty to allow your body to absorb the fluids.
- Drink eight ounces of water or sports drinks ever 15-20 minutes during the day.
- Stay away from caffeinated and sugary drinks.
- Wear loose-fitting clothing whenever possible.
- Wear a wide-brimmed hat instead of a ball cap.
- High effort job duties should be done in the morning when possible.
