

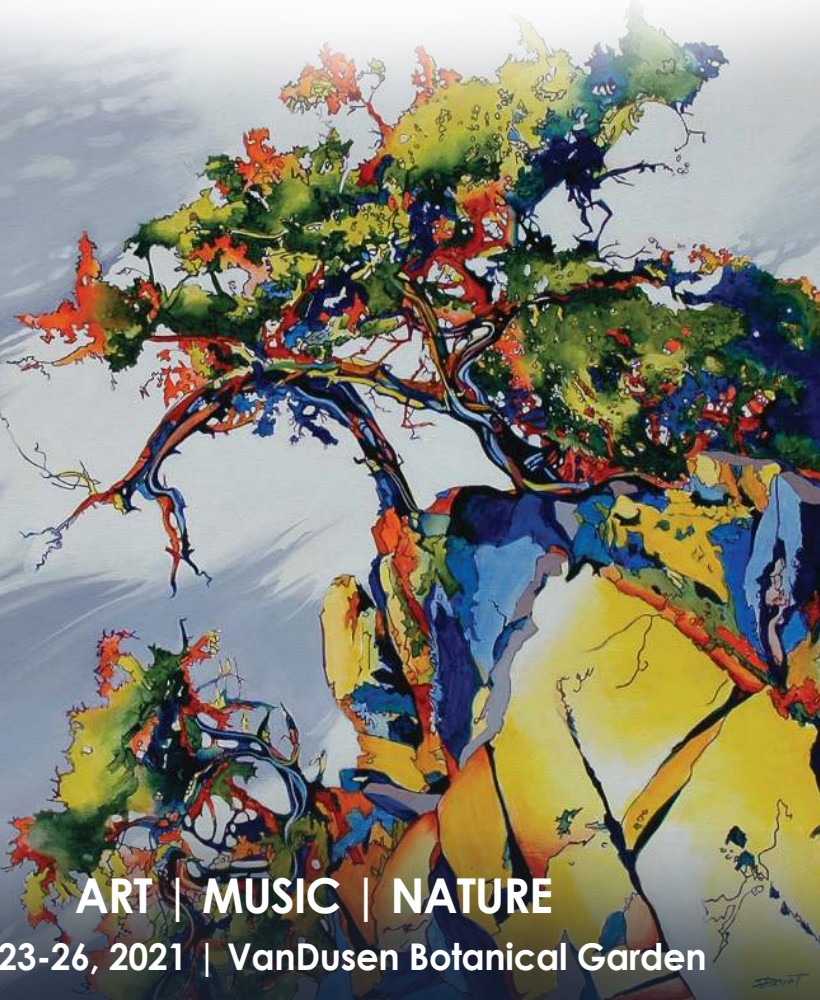

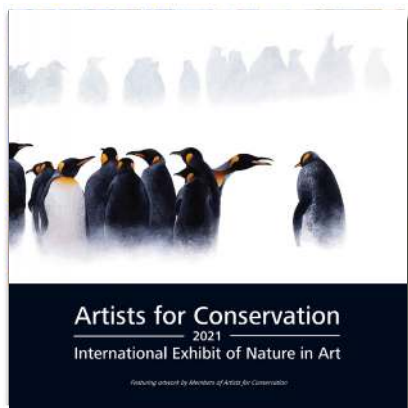

Artist Demos

Patricia Banks

Best known for her detailed oil and acrylic paintings, Patricia travels widely and is inspired by the splendor of the natural environment. She has exhibited across North America, and has won several awards for her work.

Alejandro Bertolo

Alejandro developed a personal painting style, having studied classical Japanese painting and calligraphy. He paints wildlife, particularly those species threatened with extinction in their natural habitats.

Bryan Coombes

"We are here for the experience of life. Most people get that on some level. It's my belief that this experience is the only thing we leave with. So make and build things, enjoy the planet, get away from your computer screens and get wet, tired and dirty."

Vicky Earle

Nature at its core evokes hope and renewal. Vicky's work invites people to slow down, look a little closer, and be surprised by the nature all around us.

Mark Hobson

Mark paints in Tofino, B.C. on the rugged west coast of Vancouver Island. Mark's does much of his painting on a floating studio, surrounded by wilderness.

Emily Lozeron

Emily's main subject matter is wildlife and portraits in both pencil and acrylics on prepared baltic birch. Her goal is to achieve an accurate likeness and maintain the character of whatever she paints.

McComb-Turbitt, Sarah

Growing up and always dreaming about the sea, Sarah has been an avid painter since she was young. A marine biologist specializing in animal behavior, Sarah researched whales and cultivated her skills as a wildlife photographer on the ocean.

Ken Nash

Inspired by nature, Ken started painting at eight years old. His work can now be described in the genre of photorealism and is an excellent conduit to reflect the beauty of BC's wilderness, and around the world.

Robin Roberts

Robin Roberts is a contemporary aboriginal artist based in Vancouver, who works in a variety of mediums including woodcarving, painting and drawing.

Cherie Sibley Wasyliw

For Cherie, conservation of Habitat and Wildlife is key to our very survival. "I use my artistic gifts to remind people of the magic that dwells all around us and what we stand to lose without taking measures to protect it".

Joyce Trygg

Joyce's paintings reflect her love and empathy for domestic animals and the awe of the magnificent wildlife she feels privileged to see. In 2010, Joyce was selected as the B.C. Wildlife Federation's Artist of the Year.

360° Nature Art Walk



This year, in response to a need to expand virtual programming due to the COVID-19 pandemic, a 360 virtual nature art walk was produced, based in North Vancouver’s Maplewood Flats Conservancy area. The “proof-of-concept” virtual walk features the art of local chapter members of Artists for Conservation. Most photos on the tour were taken in August, 2020, during the peak of the forest fires across western North America. Smoke originating hundreds of miles to the south of North Vancouver shrouded the area and resulted in ghostly light effects during the day.

The exhibit features the art by local members of Artists for Conservation, including: Patricia Banks, Bryan Coombes, Rob Butler, Vicky Earle, James Harry, Mark Hobson, Joseph Koensgen, Laura Levitsky, Anita McComas, Ken Nash, Dorset Norwich-Young, Ashley Roll, Ronald Straight and Joyce Trygg.

The tour was produced in partnership with the Wild Bird Trust of BC, and with the support of the North Vancouver Recreation & Culture Commission, the City and District of North Vancouver, BC Arts Council and Heritage Canada.

This is Your Ocean: Sharks - Part 2: Three artists take you to a shark sanctuary in the Bahamas, to meet Emma, a 14-foot Tiger Shark you’ll never forget.

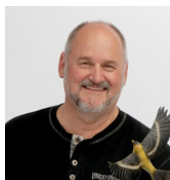
