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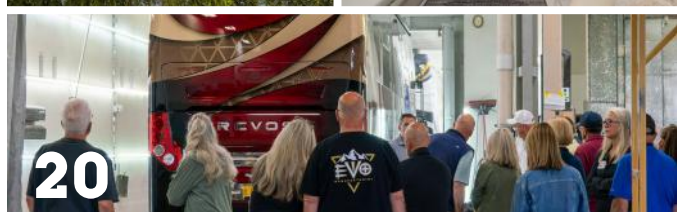
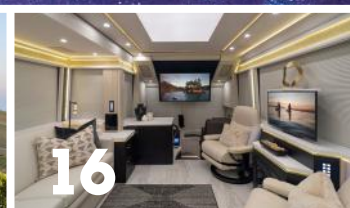
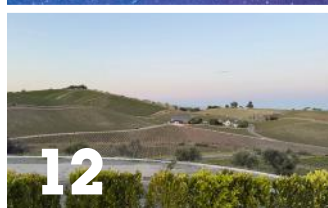
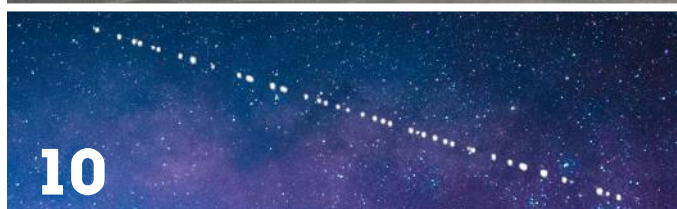
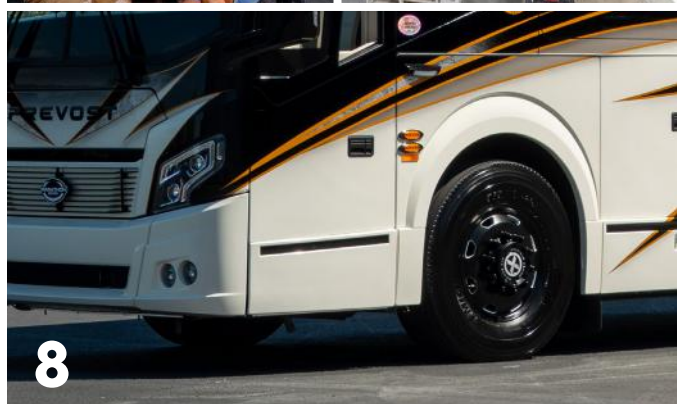
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President's Farewell Letter

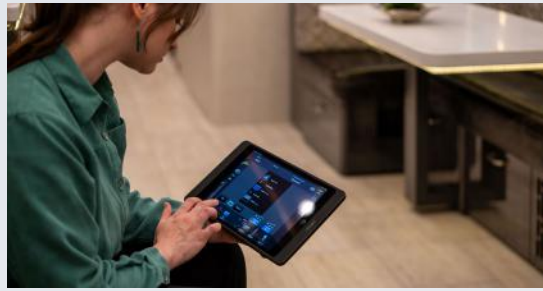

Whether you're spending a week on the Oregon coast, crossing the Southwest, or parked at a favorite resort, reliable internet has become part of everyday life. From checking email and joining video meetings to streaming movies and staying in touch with family, connectivity is expected no matter where you travel.

That's where Marathon's Starlink Upgrade comes in.

Designed for travelers who need dependable internet away from traditional networks, Starlink uses a network of low-Earth orbit satellites to provide high-speed service across much of North America. The result is a connection that works in many places where cellular coverage can be limited or inconsistent.

Marathon's installation includes a roof-mounted Starlink system positioned for optimal signal reception and strong Wi-Fi coverage throughout the coach. Whether you're working from the dinette, streaming in the salon, or

catching up on the news outside under the awning, you'll have access to the same network throughout the coach.

For owners who work remotely, Starlink makes it easier to stay productive while traveling. For everyone else, it means uninterrupted access to the entertainment, communication, and online services we rely on every day.

Installation is performed by Marathon's experienced service team and typically takes about two days to complete. Parts are stocked and readily available, helping minimize downtime during your visit. Owners establish their own Starlink service account and can choose whether to keep or remove an existing satellite internet system.

REVIEW

Among the many incredible sights and fun interactive experiences Kathy Fields has enjoyed over the course of about 10 Marathon Coach Club rallies, she says one thing that stands out as the most remarkable is that “They just keep getting better and better.”

So it was that the club’s most recent gathering, April 12-18 in Paso Robles, Calif., became her newest most favorite rally since the New York resident and her husband, Mark, started attending them shortly after the Covid shutdown had ended.

“I didn’t believe the balloon rally in Albuquerque (held last October) could be beaten, but Lydia and the whole rally planning team did it again,” says Kathy, referring to Marathon Coach Club’s administrator and event coordinator Lydia Admire. “This was the best we’ve been to. It more

than met our expectations.”

That is music to the ears of Lydia, the primary planner of the club’s two rallies each year, and the dedicated team members, mostly volunteer, who help her make them a success. For the club’s most recent adventure, the owners of 35 Marathon Coaches converged on the rally headquarters of Sun Outdoors Rest Park in Paso Robles on the central coast of California, about 30 miles north of San Luis Obispo. Among the 70-plus attendees were seven couples experiencing their first Marathon rally.

“We love having newcomers join us,” Lydia says. “Our first event in Paso Robles was to welcome them with a First-Timer social hour where we did some icebreaking activities and played some games before having a Mexican-themed





dinner and party.”

From there, it was off to the races with a week packed with planned group activities as well as free days when club members could pursue their own activities. Here are some of the highlights of the Marathon Coach Club’s Spring 2026 Rally in Paso Robles:

After getting a chance to reconnect with Club member friends and get to know the first-time rally goers over dinner, everyone got to experience the unique Sensorio Light Garden. Over 15-acres of beautiful rolling hills, thousands of fiber-optic-stemmed spheres create a spectacular light garden of ever-changing colors.

“It was gorgeous,” Lydia says. “Everyone who went said it was pretty unbelievable.”

On their first full day of activities, rally goers

were treated to a tour of historic Hearst Castle, then a stop to view giant elephant seals sunning themselves on their way to Fiscalini Ranch Preserve, a scenic natural preserve stretching inland from the California coast.

“That was incredible,” Lydia says. “They had miles of hiking trails that people could walk on and enjoy a lot of different scenery, from the ocean to grassy inland areas. People really loved it.”

In addition to enjoying lunch at Calesta Winery and tasting their delicious varietals, the group on Tuesday got an education on truffles, including being shown where and how they are found. That evening after dinner, attendees had the chance to take part in a “sound bath,” a form of alternative therapy that involves







listening to and feeling the vibrations produced by instruments such as sound bowls and chimes. Rally goers could choose to enjoy the relaxing, immersive experience on air mattresses in the pool or on dry land around it.

On Wednesday, club members participated in another hands-on education experience, this time focusing on making stained-glass art. From there, they headed off to LXV Winery where they enjoyed an intimate wine and spice pairing highlighting the sensory interplay between food and wine.

After lunch and stops at a few other wineries, they enjoyed dinner at the iconic Modonna Inn.

The busy first three days of the Paso Robles rally gave way to a quieter-paced Thursday and Friday that still featured group opportunities but also gave rally goers the freedom to go their own way.

"The food was fantastic all week, and I didn't have a bad taste of wine all week," Lydia says with a laugh.

While Lydia is now in full swing planning the Marathon Coach Club's next rally, scheduled for this fall in Tennessee, club members like Kathy Fields will be enjoying a lifetime of memories of the Paso Robles rally.

"I love the Marathon Club rallies," says Kathy, the incoming club board president. "The camaraderie is so great, but it's not just that. I love them for the unique experiences they offer that you never would have done, or possibly even have thought of, on your own, like the Sensorio Light Garden and the Sound Bath. Those are just memories you are going to have for the rest of your life."

MARATHON COACH CLUB **RALLY REVIEW**





Among the many destinations Marathon Coach Club members travel together each year, few hold as much meaning as Marathon Coach Headquarters. For six first-time attendees and longtime members, the Mothership Rally was a chance to experience where every Marathon Coach begins while creating friendships that lasted well beyond the week.

"This one really felt like summer camp," says Marathon Coach Club Coordinator Lydia Admire. "Because it was smaller, everyone got to know each other. By the end of the week they weren't just traveling together, they had formed genuine friendships." In fact, the group text Lydia created for the rally was still buzzing with messages days after everyone had departed.

Fourteen coaches gathered in Coburg to kick off the week with a tour through Marathon's 160,000-square-foot headquarters. As owners walked through engineering, cabinetry, paint, systems installation, and service, they experienced the hundreds of skilled craftsmen and individual details that come together to build each Marathon.

"I heard so many people talking about how individualized every coach really is," Lydia says. "You realize these aren't built on an assembly

line. Every coach is unique."

The factory tour naturally led into one of the week's highlights: Driving School with retired Marathon employee Dave Bash. Known throughout the Marathon family for his calm demeanor and exceptional teaching style, Dave helped owners build confidence behind the wheel through backing exercises, campsite maneuvering, and real-world driving techniques.

"They just couldn't stop talking about Dave," Lydia recalls with a laugh. "He's so patient and explains everything so well."

One memorable moment came as a first-time driver carefully backed into a campsite while fellow attendees cheered her on. By the end of the session, several owners who had never driven their coach on the highway felt confident enough to take the wheel for a trip down I-5.

Of course, the week wasn't all learning. Attendees embraced the lighter side of rally life with a tie-dye workshop reflecting Eugene's creative spirit, friendly games around headquarters, and plenty of opportunities to reconnect over great meals.

Friday brought another reminder that Marathon ownership extends well beyond the coach itself. Following service presentations



and remodeling seminars, the group boarded a beautifully restored vintage Crown bus for the drive to Walnut Ridge Vineyard. Complete with open windows, nostalgic charm, and plenty of personality, the classic bus quickly became one of the rally's unexpected highlights.

"We usually have these really fancy Prevost buses," Lydia says. "But everyone absolutely loved the vintage bus. It was just such a fun experience."

After a vineyard tour and dinner overlooking

the vines, guests gathered for live music as the sun settled over the Willamette Valley.

"It was just gorgeous," Lydia remembers. "Everyone was sitting there listening to the music as the sun was setting. It was one of those moments you don't forget."

The fun continued over the weekend with a visit to Kurzhal Family Kickin' Pickles, where members learned the art of canning before enjoying a picnic lunch on the farm. That evening, dinner at Claim 52 turned competitive



as attendees stepped onto the oversized human foosball court.

"I had no idea how competitive some of our members were," Lydia laughs. "Alice Nelson was fierce."

As the rally shifted to the Oregon coast, members settled into Pacific Shores for the final chapter of the week. They participated in a guided glass-blowing class at the Lincoln City Glass Center, creating handcrafted keepsakes, and explored Oregon State University's Hatfield

Marine Science Center to learn about the marine life and research that make the Oregon coast so unique.

The laughter carried into the evenings as well. Rather than simply serving dinner one night, hosts invited everyone to build their own pizzas in an outdoor Blackstone oven. While the pizzas baked, attendees were randomly assigned teams for a Survivor-inspired puzzle challenge that mixed couples with new friends.

"I loved that couples weren't necessarily on





the same team,” Lydia says. “Everyone got to interact with different people, and even those who normally wouldn’t jump into a game ended up having so much fun.”

Finally, on Sunday evening, the group gathered at Newport favorite Pat-E-Mac’s for one last meal together, courtesy of fellow attendee Diana Newman, who generously treated everyone to a barbecue dinner. It was the perfect way to celebrate the week before everyone began the journey home.

For Lydia, the most meaningful moment came just before everyone departed. Rally attendees surprised her with a handwritten poem signed by the entire group—a simple gesture acknowledging the countless hours spent planning every detail.

“It just makes it all worth it,” she says. “You

realize they noticed the effort, and that’s really special.”

As attendees made their way home from Oregon, they took with them more than souvenirs and photos. They returned with new driving confidence, a deeper appreciation for the craftsmanship behind every Marathon Coach, handcrafted glass artwork, and lasting memories from a week well spent.

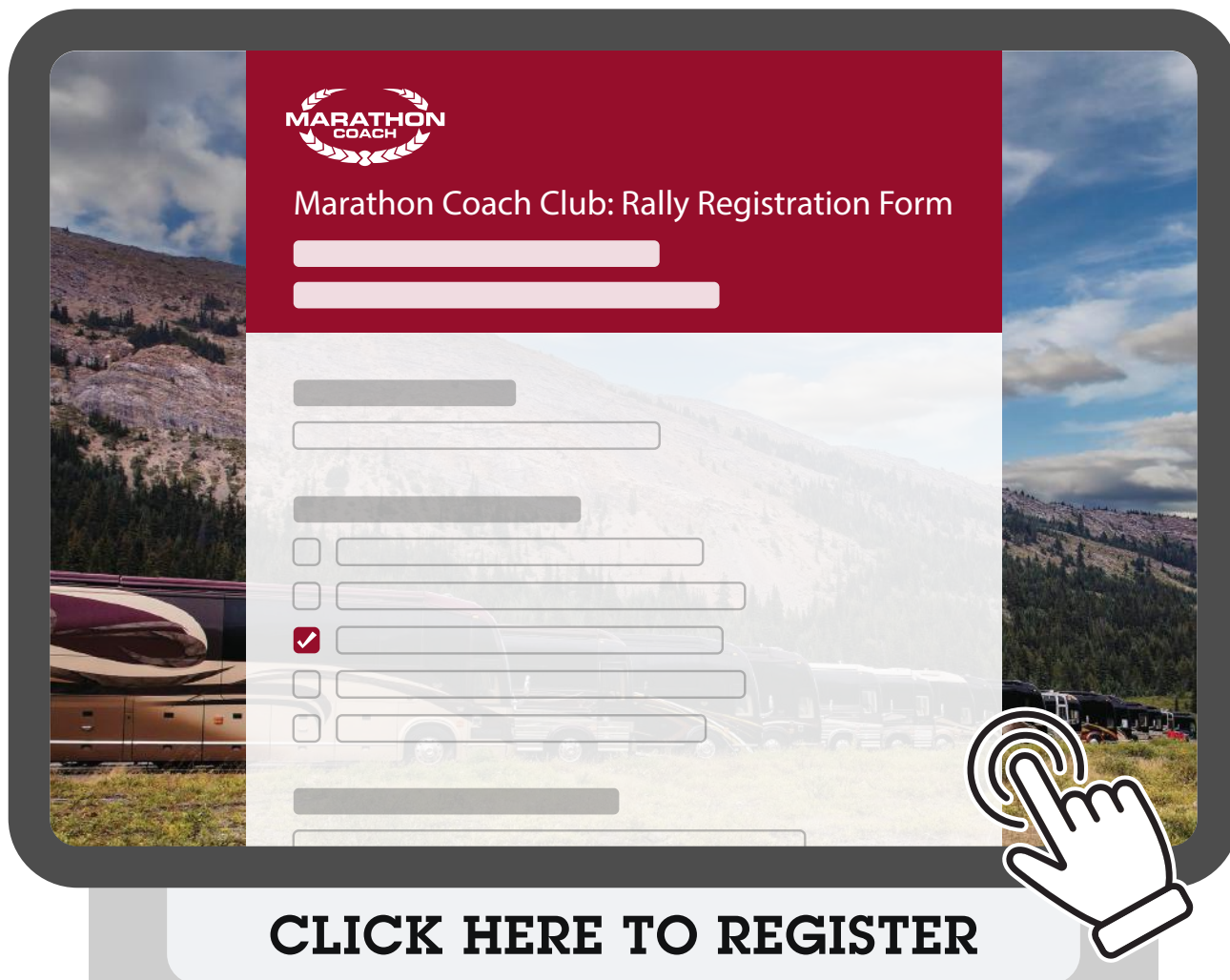

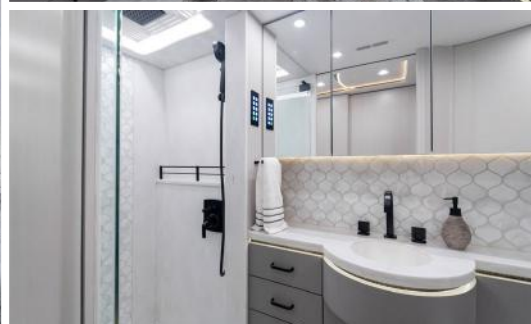
