This period was an extraordinary watershed in our lives. Covid when it arrived was traumatic, cutting us off from the people we loved and dividing us into countries and borders. Lockdowns were so lonely and quiet and seemed to extend forever. At first we were only allowed a one kilometre walk from our houses and we became mindful of how beautiful that small walk was, walking in this glowing landscape of vines and olives along the river side. And then we noticed the silence. No cars. No planes in the sky. The incessant rumble of human life stilled. We heard the birds. We noticed the bees in the fields. Our world became more intimate and connected to its spirit. It



deepened us. Time in our studios became constant, month after month without change or interruption, time to dive deeply into our art, to rediscover the essence of our creativity.



The main character, Major Kovalyov, who has lost his nose, obsesses over his appearance, cleanliness and rank; a behaviour that reflected our covid culture of extreme hygiene and global social privilage.

In bronze, he will have a red coat and a polished Nose.

We must respect where we are and what we are all travelling on. Stop, lay on your back on a dark night and take a walk through the Universe.





These two Guardians embody the sword and the shield, both beautiful evocative forms. They are the protectors. They stand at the entrance way of the mind, of the home, of the heart, shielding from adversity but not afraid to challenge.

The cross on the shield is influenced by an aboriginal cave painting in northern Australia, where guardians at the entrance of the cave have their arms crossed and their hands spread in warning we are in a sacred place and we know not to trespass.



The stories go, that Mary Magdalene, along with the two Saints Mary Salome and Mary of Clopas, arrived miraculously on the shore in the south of France after being set adrift by boat from Alexandria in Egypt.

Over the past two years I have also had time to clean and repair old sculptures. This is one of my favourites. In 1984 we returned from our first trip to Carrara, Italy; Shona had created a beautiful 'Pregnant Girl' in plaster which I made a plaster mould for casting into bronze. I used some of waste mould pices as found objects, some sticks and paint to create 'Headdress', which was also later cast into bronze.
