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# **FIVE YEAR IMPACT**

#### INTEGRATED BRILLIANT EDUCATION

#### **OUR JOURNEY THUS FAR**





In 2020, IBEL celebrated its first 5-Year milestone. IBEL prides itself on being a charity with IRD Section 88, whose mission is being realised via its two EDB registered Education Centers. Holistic Chinese language and educational support is provided daily, six times a week, to the underprivileged non-Chinese Speaking (NCS) students. And we could not have done it without the dedication of our staff members, nor the

continuous support from our sponsor and benefactors.

The biggest credit goes to our students themselves, who have shown remarkable progress these past few years and continue to thrive and exceed expectations. We have observed an increase in attendance, more confidence, improved interaction and involvement from students and a consistent growth rate in students re-enrolling throughout the years.

More than 30% of our 'band 2 or band 3' primary school students successfully enrolled in band 1 secondary schools. Significant academic improvement in school exams is observed from our students and there is an increase of students being awarded for their academic improvements at their schools.

This year, the average scores of Chinese tuition tests among students have improved more than 40%, from 42.96/100 in August to 60.57/100 in November. 65% of students have shown improvement in school tests and dictation and close to 15% of students got more than 90/100 in all subjects of school tests. More than 10% of students got 100/100 in different subjects of school tests in October and November.



#### **OUR CENTERS**

Since 2015, IBEL expanded from one to two Centers and is now widening its footprint in the ethnic minority segment by initiating the process of establishing a fully inclusive full time kindergarten. We are only able to maintain this high-level of sustainable education and curriculum development because of the indispensable team we have been fortunate to work with these years. In a normal year, the level of commitment from our staff is already more than we could have wished for, but in 2020 they truly excelled in their efforts to keep the centers fully operational.

We marked this memorable 5-year milestone by presenting our staff members with a cash reward as a token of our gratitude and we hope to continue to work with them for many more years to come.

# THE YEAR THAT WAS

#### **KEEPING OUR DOORS OPEN**

In the past year, IBEL dealt with the twin challenges of the social unrest and the pandemic by pivoting and dealing with the dynamic, environmental challenges. We transitioned from being a physical interface class room to a hybrid education provider – alternating between face-to-face teaching and online teaching.

Both Education Centers, Jordan and Sham Shui Po, stayed open every day to take care of students who had no care taker at home. The IBEL management and staff worked tirelessly, alongside the students and their parents, to make sure no one fell through the cracks.

The first month of the official closure of schools saw a slight drop in attendance at the Centers. Once the word spread that our doors were open, the numbers quickly went up and currently we have record attendance at both our Centers.


#### **DIGITAL SUPPORT**

Online learning challenges like access to digital devices, Wi-Fi and free data were enormous. While the schools piled on homework on a daily basis, the students were left out in the cold, with no help on how to access it or do it.

Whether through lack of internet connections, no devices to study on or children in a tiny household having to share one phone – learning was made impossible. It was mistakenly assumed that all students would have access to and the financial means to purchase data packages and have digital devices to study online.

#### **SOLUTION**

At IBEL, we invested in and upgraded our IT infrastructure in order to support and help our students continue their schools' online learning. We are grateful to UBS for instantly coming forward to generously provide iPads to our students. Every day, close to 250 students in Jordan and Sham Shui Po Centers benefited enormously as they continued their educational journey digitally.











#### PARENTAL ENGAGEMENT

Due to school shut down, students were deprived of learning opportunities and due to health challenges, many parents kept their children confined at home. The problem was exacerbated, as the parents were putting in long hours of work and were technically challenged.

#### **SOLUTION**

Our teaching staff was available all through the days of social unrest and the Covid pandemic. We increased our parental dialogues to guide them on how best to support their child's educational progress.

The following process was put in place:

- 1. IBEC staff acted as a bridge between the schools and parents to help procure log-in details.
- 2. Parents were trained on how to access the respective schools' online resources.
- 3. Staff would download the homework, print and explain to the parents how it is to be done.
- 4. Parent returned the completed homework the next day to the staff to check, scan and email to respective schools.

Even though the workload multiplied many times over, we are very proud of our staff who have exhibited utmost professionalism and integrity in testing times.

#### **NURTURING MENTAL & PHYSICAL HEALTH**

IBEC Centers implemented a positive interventionist approach to make sure the students were not further isolated or felt abandoned despite months of unrest and uncertainty last year.

#### **SOLUTION**

One-on-one sessions and constant re-engagement with students has continued to build closer bonds among students and the entire IBEC team. In-depth sessions with students were held to motivate them to maintain their learning mindset. The aim was to help them refocus on studies and grades to ultimately get admission in better schools, even as the pandemic was testing their mental resilience. Students were kept occupied with fun activities whenever possible, including a fun-filled sports day.

# **NEWS FROM OUR CENTERS JORDAN**

In 2020, IBEC Centers paid a lot of attention to adapt to the new normal, caused by the twin challenges of social unrest and Covid-19. We provided help and support for students who face difficulties with their academic development during the suspension of schools. Our tutors worked hard in helping the students adapt to online studying. They also spend a lot of time preparing exercises to help the students consolidate, and get ready for the next school year. Apart from taking care of their academic results, we continued to provide holistic support by way of our Social Impact Program.



#### **KINDERGARTEN**

IBEL's goal during the early childhood education is to equip children with skills in Chinese and other subjects in exactly the same manner as native students. Only then do they stand a chance of entering primary school on an equal footing. IBEL employs native Chinese teachers to enhance language tones and introduce strokes.

JORDAN

#### **PRIMARY**

Each child receives personal attention from the teachers to cope with the educational demands of a Chinese as Medium of Instruction (CMI) school – a preferred choice for majority of underprivileged ethnic minority children. The medium of instruction being Chinese, it is imperative that the child is fluent or has high proficiency in Chinese language reading, speaking and writing. Once students have mastered Chinese then clarity in other subjects will naturally follow.



#### **SECONDARY**

Secondary school is a critical period, influencing a child's future course of life. During these years, a holistic approach is required – support on the academic front along with guidance counselling to help students with various choices of educational streams.

#### **SHAM SHUI PO**

In this difficult year, our committed and dedicated tutors and staff provided all round, comprehensive educational services to our students, to educate and empower their knowledge especially in Chinese language without suspending learning.

Parent workshops were held, students were given printouts of their homework, our staff would help them scan and email it to their schools and we stepped up to help each and every child.





#### **KINDERGARTEN**

The IBEC tutors emphasize learning through child's play and create an interactive learning environment full of fun activities like singing, quizzes, and games. This encourages children to learn by doing rather than through rote memorization. Speaking, writing and reading are introduced and foundations laid for extended work in early childhood.

#### **PRIMARY**

The primary years program helps students excel in other subjects beyond Chinese, influencing their performance, grades and encouraging them to move on to tackle higher studies. This also paves the way for getting accepted in the Chinese mainstream society.





#### **SECONDARY**

IBEL provides support in all subjects: Chinese, Liberal Studies, Mathematics, Sciences, Management subjects, English and Arts. This is enhanced by opportunities for work experience allowing students to employ class learning in a practical environment.

#### INNOVATIVE SUSTAINABLE EDUCATION

IBEL continued to review the volatile situation and pivoted its operational delivery to best suit our students. To support EDB's motto of 'suspended classes without suspended learning' a need was identified- for having fun, child-friendly, easy to use learning material

IBEL proactively designed a series of Cantonese vocabulary books, customised to the learning needs of Non Chinese Speaking students.

The books are unique as learning is enhanced with integrated QR-codes, providing phonetic prompts for each word.

#### **UBS FIRESIDE CHAT – LUNCH AND LEARN**



As part of UBS Groups global Covid-19 relief fund UBS is supporting multiple projects across Asia Pacific. In Hong Kong, UBS through its Community Affairs, UBS has chosen IBEL as one of the two Covid-19 response grantees for helping the socially vulnerable groups to bridge the gap of exacerbating social issues.

On 26 November 2020, UBS hosted a Fireside Lunch & Learn sharing session on 'Drive change that matters' with Co-Founders Manoj and Geetanjali Dhar being a part of the panel. Manoj and Geetanjali shared how they redesigned service deliveries and built resilience and how the pandemic changed the way one works and adapts to the new normal.

# IBEL PARTNERS WITH LINGNAN UNIVERSITY ON PIONEERING RESEARCH PROJECT

In June 2019, IBEL was approached by the Department of Sociology and Social Policy at the Lingnan University to partner with them on a pioneering research project. The team had studied IBEL's unique model and were very impressed with its aim to facilitate a genuine and quality nurturing relationship with the students.

The project's delivery involved months of hard work and meticulous planning. Despite the massively disruptive challenges (protests, rioting, Covid pandemic, social distancing etc), and with careful and efficient planning and coordination on both sides, the project went ahead. Lingnan University researchers administered questionnaires and gathered data from approximately 100 IBEL students and 10 IBEL tutors from both our Centers.

In July 2020, the research findings and the manuscript were ready, highlighting the need for better support structures as well as cultural training for teachers (Carvalho 2020). As reported by SCMP: "The research suggested that workshops about different cultures should be regularly conducted for teachers. At the same time, ethnic minority children could be equipped with more knowledge about their native culture, which could boost their positive experiences [and] result in resilience," the report said. Greater involvement from parents and emotional support after school could also enhance resilience, the study found, and the team is now hoping to conduct a larger and more sophisticated study in the near future.

IBEL was honoured to be part of this much needed study and will continue to narrow the gap between the non-Chinese Speaking community and the mainstream Hong Kong society and educational system.



One of our main aspirations for the near future is to set up a mainstream kindergarten where kids are treated in an inclusive environment and exposed to Cantonese from kindergarten level onwards.

#### **COMMUNITY CARE INITIATIVES**

In order to reach out to the wider community, IBEL arranged **Covid-19 Care Kits** for our students and their extended families. IBEL staff held **parent workshops** to enable them to support their childrens academic pursuit.

Kudos to our Board's initiative in launching the **'Keeping the Lights On' Fundraiser**. We were able to raise close to HKD170,000, which supported the education of nearly 150 students.

We were also greatly helped in our efforts to distribute surgical masks to the community by **Dr. Gigi Pang and JunCulture**, while **Dr. Ardyce Yik ND** kindly donated her highly informative 'Covid-19 and You' book to our students!





#### **CHARITY WRAPPED IN DIGNITY**



The founding principle of IBEL has been 'Charity wrapped in Dignity'. Many families were faced with a spectra of unemployment, under employment and were unable to afford even the highly subsidised fees to attend classes at our Centers.

#### **SOLUTION**

To enable the families hardest hit with job losses of both parents, we further subsidised our tuition fees for them initially on a case-by-case basis. Over time, this financial subsidy was extended to all our students for a tenure of two months plus. While this deprived our Education Centers of the monthly school fees, for us it was more important to extend the maximum possible support to our students and families.

# CARING FOR OUR EMPLOYEES

With the economic downturn affecting each and every one of us, we made a conscious decision to not lay off any of our staff members. We redirected our assets, reduced the working hours and bolstered our staff's spirit through incentives and support where and whenever we could. We celebrated our 5-year anniversary with a monetary token of our appreciation and we remained available for our staff members, even outside of office hours in times of need. We provided masks and Covid-care packs to all our members of staff and in the time of the protests we arranged accommodation when some of them were stranded and could not get home.


