Look for L blends like /f/ l/ /a/ /g/.

Decodable Words can be sounded out based on the letter-sound relationships.

High-Frequency Words are the most commonly used words. Your reader will begin to recognize them.

Blends are two adjoining consonants that each make their own sounds like /b/ /l/ in blog.
