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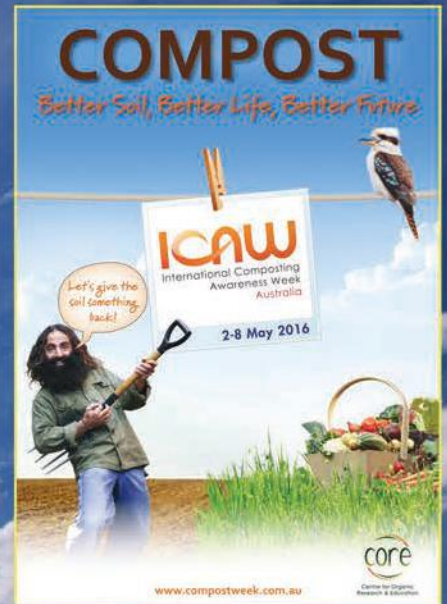

Normanville Tennis Club 2015/2016 Tennis Season Wrap-up

Normanville Tennis Club continues to go to from strength to strength. For the first time in its history we became eligible for the Brian Lienert Shield in the "Large Clubs" category which is awarded to the most successful. Previously, Normanville has won many of these shields (incl last year) in the "Small Clubs" category but as we fielded 7 junior teams of 37 children (second largest junior club in GSTA) and one senior team this put us over the threshold and into the large clubs. So it was with great surprise and joy when Normanville was once again awarded the Brian Lienert Shield having beaten the much larger clubs in the Association of Mt. Compass, Pt. Elliot and Goolwa. Our juniors were outstanding this year in results, sportsmanship and enthusiasm and they are all to be commended with their commitment to their tennis and it is a great pleasure to "work" with them each week.

They won two Grand Finals in Division 4 & 5 as well as coming Runners-up and 3rd in Division 4 and 4th in Division 5. Anika Wollaston won Most Consistent Division 5 player in the GSTA (she also won last year in Div 6) and Rachel Graves was awarded Best Sportsperson for Division 4-6. Both of these girls were part of the Div 5 Grand Final team. William Wescombe won our clubs Top Junior Boy and he was a member of the Division 4 runner-up team. Alicia Wollaston won our inaugural Top Junior Girl and she was also a member of the Div 5 Grand Final team. This trophy was kindly donated by Janice Cooper and is the first time that Normanville has awarded a trophy for girls only. We want to continue to encourage more and more girls to take up tennis and this trophy gives them something to strive

for. Also the Glenda Oats Encouragement Award was won by Serene Page, another member of the Div 5 Grand Final team, for her commitment to playing tennis even though she was unable to compete on many Saturdays. Other highlights included both Bernardo and Gabriel Santos competing in the Country Carnival held at Memorial Drive in January. They represented the Great Southern Tennis Association and came runners-up in their age group, the best result the GSTA has ever had in this group.

Gabriel Santos was also selected to play as part of the World Tennis Challenge in January and played a doubles match on centre court at Memorial Drive in the lead-up to the Team Philippoussis vs Team Ivanisevic matches...what a thrill!

Jeffrey Lapanowski was selected to play in the GSTA Division 2 team against Onkaparinga in February after doing well in the Junior Tournament last November.

Several juniors also competed in a tournament held at Mt. Compass recently and came home with almost all the medals on offer! These included Chloe Howlett, Madi Munro, Keni Lewis-Baida, Brynn Garner, Gabriel Santos and Bernardo Santos.

Leigh Howlett, our assistant coach is about to undertake a 4 day Community Coaching course and will be offering a Hot Shots program for 6-12 year olds who have never before played tennis. This will be held in Term 3, dates yet to be decided and runs for about 6 weeks. So anyone with children who might interested please feel free to contact me. Normanville also has a strong Social Tennis group and anyone interested in playing please come down to the courts

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on Jetty Road on a Thursday morning. Our Senior Doubles team is also on the lookout for any future players and any other people who may wish to start up a second Senior team in any of the other 3 Divisions in this League.

Finally, Normanville Tennis Club is going fundraising this year so any contributions large or small will be

gratefully accepted. We would love to see more and more kids out playing tennis.

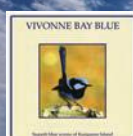

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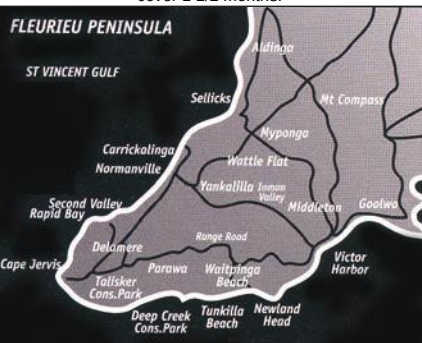

Yankalilla Historical Society

For the first generation of children in this district school attendance was irregular, family survival the first consideration. In order to produce the basic necessities of life children had to do their bit. Boys tended the stock, milked cows, hoed vegetables, chopped the wood and ploughed the land. Girls helped care for younger brothers and sisters, milked cows, made butter, and helped in the house. Most children and some teachers walked to school, some as far as five miles each way. For some children catching yabbies in the creek, or other rural "delights" were opportunities not to be missed. Some never did learn to read and write.

Until the South Australian Board of Education was formed in 1847 and teachers were licensed, there were only private schools. These schools were conducted in private homes and other buildings throughout the area. By 1852 the Council of Education was granting aid towards the erection of schools and the payment of teachers, and parents were expected to contribute to the cost of both. An Inspector of Schools was appointed. Before this, Mr. C.W. Scott, who was the Postmaster and Clerk of the Local Court ran a school at Yankalilla.

Before 1860 private schools operated at Second Valley, Myponga, Wattle Flat and Inman Valley. A private school at Normanville was run by Mrs. Jane Duncan who transferred to a schoolroom built by the Board of Education. By 1859 she was at the Yankalilla school.

The churches throughout the district promoted education by providing accommodation, and engaging teachers. At Dairy Flat a day school was conducted by Rev. Charles Lee who commenced duties in 1857. Lee purchased land near the source of the Yankalilla river where he built a dwelling and a school which he conducted until his death in

1872. The bricks used in building the school, completed in 1859, were donated by Robert Norman, tradesmen gave their labour, and business people came up with the cash for the materials. "We were all supposed to produce a shilling on Monday morning," reported Oscar Herbert, one of the school's first pupils. By June 1865 there were 90 pupils attending the school.

By the 1860s two more schools began operation in Yankalilla, one of them the Christ Church Day School under the auspices of Archdeacon Morse and Mrs. Morse. The first headmistress, Mrs. Puplett, had given her front room for the schoolroom. When a newly built classroom was opened in 1872 Mrs. Puplett's husband, a baker, had his oven in the school yard, the smell of freshly baked bread tormenting the children at their desks. In 1867 Sister Mary Mc Killop, the founder of the Sisters of St. Joseph, a teaching order, established her first Catholic Country School at Yankalilla, with 40 children attending. The classrooms were in the house the Sisters rented.

At this time other schools came into being. Lovely Valley School had 24 pupils, Myponga Beach 28 pupils, Cape Jervis School 18 pupils, Delamere, in 1861, 34 pupils. Silverton started with 40 pupils and had 96 in 1870. There was also a school at Yoho Station built by William Gerrard Snr. for the children of his workers. In 1860 the private school in Bald Hills Congregational Church catered for 24 pupils. Second Valley School was built in 1861. In 1863 there were 29 pupils at the Wattle Flat School which was conducted in a private building and replaced by a permanent building in 1867.

In Myponga, St. Matthias Church was used as a private school until 1876 when the Government Education System took over with an enrolment of

42, the average attendance a mere 15. It was reported that Myponga children were so shy that they ran into the bush whenever they saw a stranger approaching. In 1884 a stone building designed as a school and teacher's dwelling was erected next to the Myponga Uniting Church.

It was not until 1886 that a school was built at Inman Valley.

The Education Act of 1875 brought public schools under the administration of the Council of Education. School attendance became compulsory. Education came under a Minister of the Crown, and Boards of Advice were formed in all public schools. These Boards were superseded by school Committees and, later, School Councils. In 1891 free education was instituted.

The Historical Society is currently working on a reprint (and update) of the book "Schools of the Western Fleurieu Peninsula". However, we are missing a couple of the photographs which were in the first edition. If any one has a copy of these photos and is willing to allow us to scan the photo, we would be very grateful. The photographs are: a photo of Yoho Station (see page 71) and a photo of Yoho Station Homestead (see page 72). We would also appreciate copies of class photos taken at any of the western Fleurieu schools from 1981 onwards.

Now that we are in our winter recess our next meeting will be on Monday, 12th September in the Yankalilla Council Chambers. On Wednesday mornings a member will be in attendance in the Yankalilla Library between 10am and noon. Anyone needing assistance with family research or who would like information on any other matter is welcome to drop in.

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Indonesian Permainan Hari - Game Day

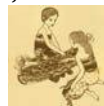
To complete our learning this term on olahraga traditional di Indonesia (traditional sports of Indonesia) we celebrated with a games day in the gym.

The other sports we played included galah asin, sepak takraw (kick volleyball), congklak, which means cowrie shell, rapi bamboo and lompat tali (jump rope played with rubber bands). 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Yankalilla Art

Month of April

Once again we were intrigued by Peter Fitzgerald, our April tutors approach to and philosophy about his art. He is a 'reality-cum-abstract' painter and his thinking in many cases is 'less detail, more impact'. Peter brought a variety of landscape paintings with him to show his approach to art and to illustrate his use of shapes and colours in his interpretation of the world around him. Peter is an avid 'sketcher' and takes the opportunity to make very simple line sketches when out and about often repeating the same scene from different angles. A good example of this was his painting of the buildings at the Talisker Mine. These sketches he uses for his main works in his studio. Peter paints in oils and acrylics on canvas or strong paper, using a large brush and simple but bold shapes. His pallet is varied and often does not run to form ie. Skies are not always blue or grass green. We also discovered during the session that Peter does not like 'green' so many of his trees are simply trunks and branches and this worked very well in his landscapes. His paintings are colourful and alive with 'movement'. His technique, completely new to me, for darkening parts of a work that was too bright was to cut out abstract shapes in paper, paint a chosen colour and then simply press onto the painting in the required area. No need for brushes or shaped edged and it worked. It was good to see so many members attending. In the afternoon Peter helped each member with his or her problem and answered many questions. It proved to be a most informative and active session with a few laughs along the way.

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Parenting Mastery – getting help from the group

In the initial weeks and months of meeting my partner circumstances meant that I needed to make a conscious decision about the relationship. He was a single-parent of a four-year old daughter. I was terrified at what this could really mean for me and for the relationship. Being with him meant being in a family, instantaneously. I eventually decided to attend a workshop on step-parenting. I discovered a group with Relationships Australia (or RASA as they are sometimes referred*). At the first meeting when the facilitator started the group I found myself thinking, 'how effective will this workshop be?'. I recall that she knew first-hand what it meant to be a step-parent from her personal experiences, which turned out to be significant. What I

especially found helpful was listening to the experiences of other couples.

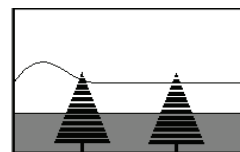
An articulate middle-aged couple expressed well, the ups-and-downs of a blended family. What I remember most was how gently they supported one another and yet equally pulled no punches about the rocky parts of adjusting to a new family dynamic. The main issue was that the step-parent felt like a third-wheel in the family threesome. Other concerns that couples raised in the workshop included parenting method. For example one couple talked about how one partner was more authoritarian than the other. This was not necessarily problematic but clearly was something they needed to unpack.

Vulnerability is a constant companion for parents and step-parents (sometimes exceedingly for the latter). With this in mind I admired the openness shared by many. Sadly I did not attend the final session of the six-week workshop. But it was an experience that gave me reassurance and a sense that the feelings you have as a step-parent are not exclusive to you or your situation. Friends would reassure me that what I was experiencing was no different to biological parents. Perhaps this was their way of telling me everything would be ok. I also sensed a similar wisdom from many of the couples who attended the workshop and in retrospect look back on their attendance as a loving commitment to the well-being of their families.

THE 'ARMY' IS BACK TO HELP WITH CONSERVATION

The Green Army is back in the Fleurieu and this time it has our estuaries and coastal dunes in its sights.

After the great success of the Implementing the Southern Fleurieu Coastal Action Plan project which wound up last September, Council, in partnership with Natural Resources, Adelaide and Mt Lofty Ranges, successfully applied to have another group of young people come down to lend a helping hand.

The Green Army is a Federal Government initiative established to help 17-24 year olds looking for employment to develop skills, undertake training and gain experience in the delivery of conservation.

In our case, a team of nine participants and a supervisor will be in the region for 23 weeks to implement actions in the Southern Fleurieu Coastal Action Plan and Conservation Priority Study and the Hindmarsh and Inman Rivers Estuary Management Plans.

Project manager Corey Jackson, who is Council's Coast, Estuary and Marine Officer, said the team would be involved with erosion management, fencing, fauna surveys, revegetation, seed collection and weed control.

"Priorities include raising community capacity to conserve the estuaries and coastal heritage, monitoring the vulnerable Hooded Plover and continuing restoration programs to improve habitat," he said.

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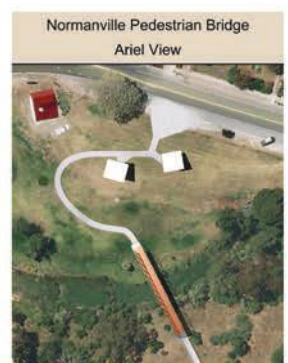


ACKNOWLEDGING OUR VOLUNTEERS

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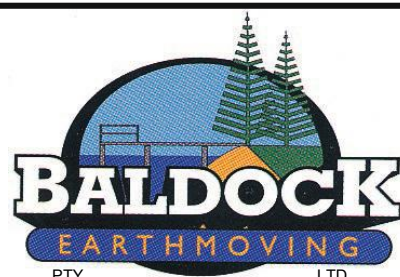

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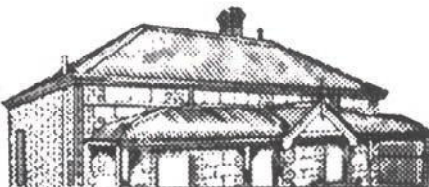

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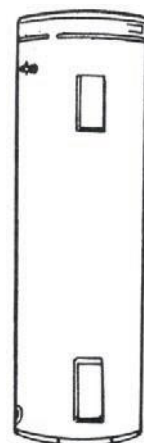

and mulch. The idea is that as they produce fruit anyone can help themselves. At the side of the carpark in front of the centre the council got rid of all the gazanias which are now a declared plant. Gazania is highly invasive in coastal environments, however it also invades agricultural areas and roadsides. It can rapidly outcompete native plants leading to a decline in biodiversity and has the potential to form a monoculture. They spread through:-

- abundant seeds that are spread by wind and water
- dumping of garden waste
- putting out runners which prevent native plants from growing.

They might look pretty but they are bad news, dig them out today – they come out quite easily.

Rain Moths

Did you hear tapping on your window in April the night it rained? If you did you were experiencing the activities of the Rain or Ghost Moth – *Trictena atripalpis*! These moths are members of the moth family Hepialidae and there are about 150 species found in Australia. The Rain Moth found in Southern Australia only live for one day – their only role in life is to mate and, if female, to lay eggs. This very large stout brown moth has flashes of white across its fore wings with a hairy body. The female wingspan is up to 16cm with the male being smaller with a 12cm wingspan. They have the highest recorded egg laying capacity among no-social insects. It is believed that they have the potential to lay over 40,000 eggs in their short life span. The female scatters these eggs while flying near Eucalyptus trees. Older larvae live in tunnels borrowed in the ground and feed on the roots of gum trees. They pupate under the ground in tunnels and the mobile pupae wriggle towards the surface waiting for rain, hence the name Rain Moths. When the adults emerge they leave the empty pupal case sticking out of the ground. Many of these were seen the day after the rain.



Weed Of The Month

From Cape Jervis Coastal Community Group
Burr Medic
(Medicago polymorpha)

This small creeping plant from the pea family can be used as a pasture crop, but it can become a weed in some habitats. It is a prostrate (flat to the ground) annual, though it can climb slightly through nearby plants. The multiple stems are green to slightly red, and can be up to 50cm long. The leaves occur in groups of 3 leaflets at the end of short stalks. The centre leaflet has the longest stalk (an identification key used for distinguishing medics from similar plants). Leaflets can be heart or wedge-shaped, as seen above, with finely toothed margins near the tip. Pea-

like yellow flowers appear in spring, to be followed by the fruits. These are like little coiled pods, disc or barrel-shaped, 3-4mm wide, with hooked spines (see second photo) all over.



Recycling Batteries

Unfortunately we are now unable to recycle single use batteries at the centre as presently there are no facilities for recycling them in SA. Currently the only option is for them to go into landfill. We have contacted Zero Waste and they say that it will be possible to recycle them again in the near future. So please hang on to your batteries at home, don't drop them off at the centre, don't put them in your rubbish and we will let you know when we are collecting them again.

Book Of The Month The Coral Battleground

Judith Wright - Angus & Robertson.

The story of the groundbreaking campaign to save the Great Barrier Reef, by Australia's foremost poet – Judith Wright.

Teeming with life, Australia's Great Barrier Reef region covers 350,000 square kilometres. That it still survives is a legacy of activists, such as poet Judith Wright, who in 1967 were branded as 'cranks' and 'anti-progressive visionaries'.

What began as a small group of dedicated conservationists in Queensland, battling to save the Ellison Reef from coral-limestone mining and the Swain Reefs from oil exploration, swelled to encompass scientists, trade unionists and politicians throughout Australia, and led in 1976 to the establishment of a guardian body: the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority.

'There are not many success stories in the attempts we make to save especially important elements of the natural world from our own greeds and needs. Here at the end of the twentieth century, we have lost or destroyed a great deal already, and we know that much more is likely to vanish. But the story of the rescue of the Great Barrier Reef still throws a light on the present and gives hope for the future', Judith Wright.

Wicking beds water plants from below rather than above. They're basically containers with water reservoirs at the base - like a giant self-watering pot. Moisture is drawn up through the soil via a process called capillary action or wicking. 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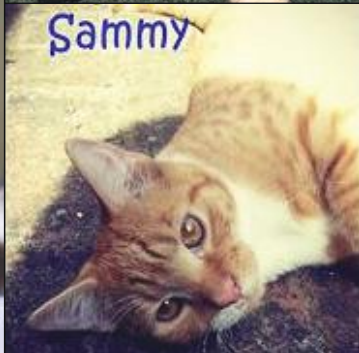
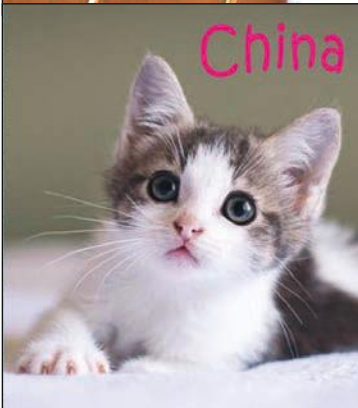
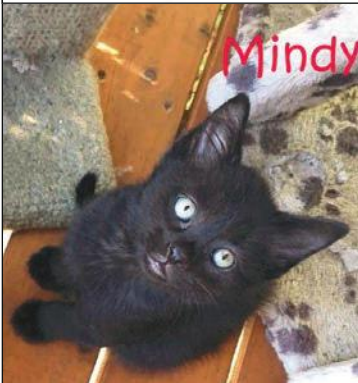
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Tiny Tails Adoption Day

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New Developments at the Yankalilla Football Club

Over the past 12 months many volunteers and Committee members have been hard at work updating and renovating the Yankalilla Football Club.

The Yankalilla Sporting Clubrooms were previously maintained by an energetic band of volunteers who organised the building of a modern, functional building opened in 1986. For nearly 30 years many volunteers from the Netball, Cricket, Tennis and Football clubs worked hard to raise funds to make the loan repayments and renovate the building. In particular those people on the Sporting Club Auxiliary worked tirelessly to keep the funding ticking along. Once the loan repayment had been made the various clubs have felt more inclined to concentrate on the maintenance and development of their own facilities and so the Sporting Club was dissolved. The Yankalilla Football Club took over the maintenance of the building and running the bar and the kitchen.

Even with the best intentions, the Football Club has taken a while to recognise all that running and maintaining such a valuable asset

involves. Fortunately, over the past few years, the Football Club has been able to rely on the significant input of George True who has worked long hours to keep up fundraising in the kitchen, downstairs bar and food stalls at events and with cleaning the building.

Early in 2015 the Yankalilla Football Club Committee decided it was time to update both the building and the running of the Club facilities to bring them forward 30 years. Fortunately the Club had received a kick start to this process from the dissolving of the Sporting Club Auxiliary when they were able purchase new tables, chairs and blinds for the dining area. The first effort made by the many Football Club volunteers was to update the interior of the dining and bar areas. In April 2015 a privacy wall in front of the toilet doors was built, the interior walls were painted and the Honour Boards and photo boards were relocated. The boards are now at eye height and well lit by new down lights. The photo board is now easily visible to patrons seated in the dining area.

In response to the more stringent health and safety rules for food preparation the Committee then decided the kitchen

needed to be updated. With the significant help of Rick Rodrigues from the Peninsula Bar and Restaurant the Football Club were able to secure a loan to install new stoves, stainless steel work benches and new fridges in the bar in January. The kitchen renovations have been continued recently with a new floor going down in March. Thank you to the members and players who came along on each occasion to clear out the kitchen and then reinstate it. The dining and bar areas are now looking very smart with new menu boards, new bar stools, thanks to Rick Rodrigues and new bar tables, thanks to Jeff Prior. To complement these big improvements the Football Club has been very fortunate in securing the services of Paul Bilney as Bar Manager and Kerry Wilson as Cook and Kitchen Manager. Meals are available from 6pm on Thursday Nights and Saturday Nights on home games.

Meanwhile, a new, more accessible scorer's box was built by many volunteers at the beginning of the 2015 season. Since the end of the last season a band of committed players, led by Matt Wilson, have been working very hard on upgrading the change rooms and office. They have renovated a vastly improved Visitor's change room, better access to and from the downstairs areas and by the time this article is published we are hopeful of having a new office. This work has been complemented by an extensive Working Bee in early April. Thank you to all the players, parents, supporters and committee members who came along to complete painting, cleaning and general repairs.

These developments and the running of the Football Club are only possible through the generous donation of time by volunteers to the Committee which includes: - Scott Bevan, President, Ashley Bond, Vice-President, Lachlan Nancarrow, Secretary and Bill Hosking, Treasurer. Peter Johns has spent many, many hours talking to and gaining the generous support of local business people with sponsorship. Gary Hogben has taken on the role of Junior Development officer and has worked tirelessly over the pre-season to fill coaching positions, team managers, trainers and umpires. Thanks to those parents and friends who are supporting the young people in our community by taking on these very valuable roles. Any other parents who would like to help out please speak to Gary. All parents and guardians can support the growth of the Club and help with the maintenance of the building by volunteering to go onto the Canteen and Kitchen rosters several times. Fortunately Kirsty Killen has put up her hand to run the Canteen this season. The success of the Canteen is very dependent on the help of parents/guardians in volunteering time and even donating cake or soup for sale.

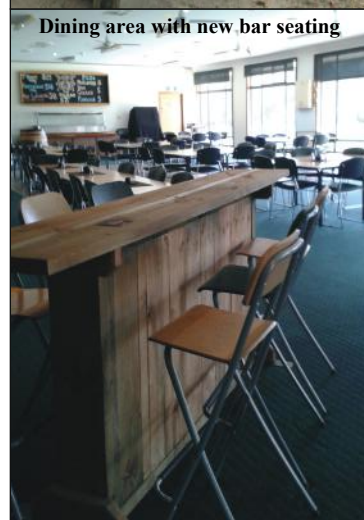

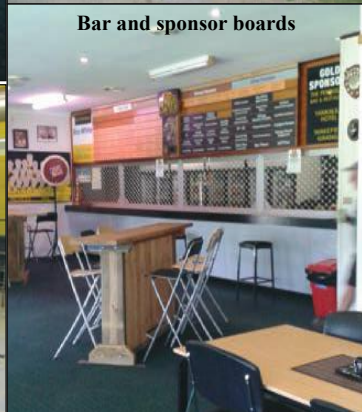

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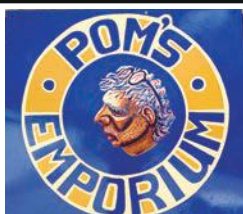
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
