Digraph Fun

- Wh digraphs are usually in the beginning of a word.
- Here are some words with wh digraphs: when, whack, and whip.
- With digraphs, there are fewer sounds than letters. For example, whisk has five letters but only four sounds /wh/ /i/ /s/ /k/. The wh is the digraph.

Decodable Words can be sounded out based on the letter-sound relationships.

High-Frequency Words are the most commonly used words. Your reader will begin to recognize them.

Digraphs are the combination of two letters to represent one sound, as in /sh/ in ship.
