



The library welcomed over 72,000 first-time and repeat visitors between January and April 2022.



What happens when you need information that our library happens to not have access to? You place an interlibrary loan request with Sarah White, Library Technician. Since the beginning of 2022, she has filled over 900 article requests -93% were filled within a day and 37% were filled within an hour!

Jaime Ortiz, Library Technician, oversees Courses Reserves; that is, assigned class readings and other materials put on reserve by faculty members so that all students have access to the materials; some in print, some in digital form. 




