AWARDING A RECORD-BREAKING AMOUNT OF \$90,000 IN SCHOLARSHIPS DURING OUR 90TH YEAR

The Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club Scholarship Program offers our young leaders the opportunity to earn college tuition funds beginning in 8th grade. Since its inception in 1984, the NBGC Scholarship Program has awarded more than \$1,300,000 in scholarship money.

This year is our biggest year yet, with an increase in scholarship money awarded of 46% and an increase in number of recipients of 19% from last year. Our scholars have earned a record high amount of \$90,000 in scholarship dollars this year.

Scholarship applicants must be in the NBGC Leader Program, submit an application, essay, grades, letters of recommendation and undergo a performance review of their NBGC leadership skills and accomplishments. Scholars are also interviewed by a committee of past recipients and community members prior to selection. Returning scholars must complete 40 hours of service towards NBGC initiatives to be considered for the Leader of the Future Scholarship.




Jahayra Gutierrez
