he 2020 Ice season has been interesting to say the least, poor weather, unreasonably warm temperatures and heavy wet snow had postponed or canceled several major ice racing events here and across the united states.

High Voltage's Ron Brefka a shovelhead loving metal shaping cancer survivor was not one to give up and after several attempts and solid cold weather that netted 16" of hard ice, Ron and his staff were able to pull off the AMA Ice Grand Championships in Wisconsin.

Several Michigan racers made the 8 hour trek to the frozen half mile. And for some the trip paid off big.

Trever Wahr won top honors for Ice racer of the year, winning the 250, 450, Open and Kold Kutter classes beating some very solid talent such as AFT Expert Brock Swartzenbacker.

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

New revised 2020 D14 Membership forms were distributed at the D14 Annual Meeting in December. Clubs/Promoters: Contact Taylor Carpenter at d14secretary@gmail.com if more forms are needed.

D14 Membership is required for all riders participating in D14 events receiving points. ALL MICHIGAN RIDERS MUST HAVE A CURRENT MEMBER-SHIP – no exceptions. Out-of-state riders attending a one-time D14 event may be exempt and will not receive points.

Memberships can be purchased/renewed online with immediate confirmation at www.ama-d14.org, on paper forms at any D14 event, or by mailing the membership form cut from the D14 Paper.

Proof of membership must be shown at every event:

- Showing current D14 Membership card or photo of card
- Showing receipt of membership purchase (email or hard copy)
- The participant may log into www.ama-d14.org and their membership status will be verified.

MEMBERSHIP TYPES

• Regular Membership (\$15) – The vast majority need the Regular Membership.

• Family Memberships (\$13) – A "Family Membership" does not cover a family; it provides a discount for additional family members. It knocks off \$2 and they don't get additional copies of the D14 Paper. Please use care with these memberships, they are often misunderstood. ONE FAMILY MEMBER MUST HAVE A "REGULAR" MEMBERSHIP, then additional family members can get the discount. A separate online profile must be created or separate form at the event for each person must be filled out.

• Canadian Memberships (\$15) – See "Regular Membership". Same thing, but the member won't get the D14 Paper due to prohibitive postage costs. Be sure you are using current forms please! Pricing of the Canadian membership may be inaccurate on outdated forms.

Wahr stated that he did not come to the event and even expect to win. Earlier this winter the Johnson family approached Wahr offering support with the use of their motorcycles. The Johnson's seen potential for Trever to come out on top and he exceeded expectations!

Wahr swept all his heats (MX guys they are called heats, not motos) and after that he treated it just like a Sunday ride. It was very obvious that Wahr outclassed his competitors on a track that favored the dirt track racer; Whar is an accomplished motocrosser. After the event Wahr said the hardest part was wrestling around the 450's; it sure didn't look like he had a hard time at all!

Blake Bradish swept the 50, 65 and 85 classes making him the youth Ice Racer of the year. His toughest competition was in the 85 class, a hungry Dom Huey makes for a threat at any event but Bradish was able to come out on top. Blake's grandfather Greg is a former D14 and National Champion and his father Mike is not a slouch himself! Keep an eye out for Bradish in the future.

Event sponsor GG&R sent 7 sets of non studded tires over to Wisconsin to help grow the non studded class there. Sadly after multiple date changes only a handful of riders made it but these were the country's top Non Studded racers! Joe Stoppleworth of Fan Du Lac Wisconsin nearly won his heat on a champion yz490 but Dustin Cook was able to pick Joe off later in the race. The main event was dominated by the GG&R faktory squad of Trevor Gatlin, and Dustin & Dillon Cook. Dustin Cook Pulled Gatlin with him to the front but started to pull away late in the race, Gatlin pulled away from the pack and Dillon led the pack. At the end of the event Dustin Cook minted the championship, with Gatlin in 2nd and Dillon in 3rd, a clean Podium sweep! Goon Glass & Rubber has been able to score every non studded Ice race national title since 2015; the 2018 3-peat and this year's sweep only added to a fine list of accomplishments currently unmatched in the Rubber tire world and he is not ashamed to let others know what accomplishments the GG&R team has made. One things for certain, they walk the walk!

Other Michigan racers Including Wyatt Vaughn 3rd, Dave Tyo 3rd, and Avery Dix 2nd, did extremely well getting on the podium and getting National Honors.

Michigan continues to prove to the country that they are Ice Racing's top dogs and that it really is the hard water that makes them so fast!



This goes for your AMA membership also. Again take a picture of it.

Now where is that AMA and District card? Now it's time to go stand in line at sign up, you have your helmet, for transponder scoring events, you have a wad of cash to offer up to race.... but where did I put those cards?!

Again take picture of your cards with expiration dates visible. You may not remember where your cards are, but everyone now a days has their phone on them everywhere. Save your cards on the home screen and present to the person checking memberships.

When all else fails, remember these cards are YOUR RESPONSIBILITY and the club is only protecting themselves in the event you cannot find them.

If there is internet access you can look it up on your phone for both AMA and District, but I wouldn't count on it and Clubs cannot access the membership database. If you must buy them again at the track the AMA and District will add them to the end of your membership date.

Lesson learned and racing continued!

District 14's non studded Ice racers have been pretty active in the past month. With extremely poor ice conditions, only a few venues were able to pull off events for the 2020 season.

ICE INDOOR INVITE:

The 12 man race did not disappoint and early on the O'Boyle clan dominated their heat races, in particular Eric O'Boyle who's smooth riding style was a massive advantage on the slick wet ice. The Main event saw a massive change in track conditions and also a huge hole shot for Robby Knapp... who cleaned off the Ice in turn 3. Eric O'Boyle took the lead and was putting some distance on the field until a crash mid race took him out of the hunt. William Harrington had a poor start off the back row and admitted to having an all around bad day, until the main. A high line had developed and Harrington managed to find it and use it as a weapon against the field. Harrington won the race, and the money! A \$500 purse was gathered for the top 4 racers! The win puts Barnes Built Bikes 3 for 3 at indoor events.

BIG BEND 1:

Poor Ice conditions eventually postponed the event. However nearly 30 bikes showed up to race that night. GG&R Faktory racer Trevor Gatlin smoke checked the B class. The legendary O'Boyle clan wrapped up the 3 heats for the A class. Results were based off the heats and Colton Eddy was the nights winner in the A class.

BIG BEND 2:

Trevor Gatlin and Dillon Cook had a big night after the A & B Events were combined. GG&R Faktory racer Dillon Cook and Steel O'Boyle battled for the lead in one of the early heats while Trevor Gatlin dusted teammate Dustin Cook. The mains were interesting to say the least. Colton Eddy blew his undefeated outdoor streak, Styrker O'Boyle moved out front with Gatlin and the Cook Brothers in tow. O'Boyle took the win but, Gatlin who was a B rider took second. This put the Cook Brothers 2 & 3 on paper. Gatlin made the move to step into the A Class for the rest of the season.

D14 SANFORD LAKE:

Team CDI racing was the only D14 organizer to pull off an event for 2020. And the Open Rubber A was stacked! This race saw the return of the Mystery Machine, no one knows much about it, except it wins races. Both Corey Desrosiers and Dom Marcangelo put on dominating performances in the A & B Classes proving they both still got it. The Team of Todd Bartz and Launce Sulaty pulled off wins and national titles in both the light and middleweight sidecar Classes and Ron Forrestner won the open rubber quad making him the national champion as well!

The GG&R faktory race team swept the podium with Dillon Cook 3rd, Trevor Gatlin 2nd and Dustin Cook 1st. Interestingly enough a Goon Glass & Rubber supported racer has won every solo rubber bike national title since 2015 an impressive feat that team Manager Kevin Lambert Jr. feels will come to an end soon. "We all know it's gonna be one of them O'Boyles or Bob Knapp, maybe Billy Ross but who knows the class is stacked... anyone can win on any day, we have just drawn the right cards from the deck ya know" said Lambert.

BIG BEND 3:

This late season race presented a challenge with no practice and no chewed up ice throwing a curve ball in the mix. The first heat had GG&R racer Dillon

2020 AMA/D14 Flat Track Rules

1. The rules are a supplement to the AMA Amateur, Semi-Pro & Youth Competition Rulebook/Online Copy. Please pay attention to these rules they will be strongly enforced for our 2020 D14 Dirt Track Series. Online copy will be correct copy to follow. Any changes to rules after rule books are printed will always be posted online.

2. Classes recognized by AMA/D14 Dirt track & for which points may be earned are as follows: 1. 0-51cc- Pee Wee Shaft Drive/ Multi-Speed 4-8 yrs. (Multi-Speed Shifters must be removed); 2. 0-51cc Senior - Chain 7-8 yrs; 3. 52-65cc 6-11 yrs; 4. 66-85cc 7-15 yrs; 5. 86-250cc Open; 6. 251cc+ Open Single; 7. 251-505cc Amateur; 8. 251cc + Open Twin 17+ yrs; 9. Veteran 35+ yrs; 10. Senior 60+ yrs; 11. Vintage 0-400cc (Air Cooled 1988 and older); 12. 401 Open Vintage 1988 or older (17+ yrs on 400CC+ Twin); 13.Wildcat 80-200cc (Air Cooled 4 Stroke, 12yrs older and up).

3. A promoter or club, at their discretion, may run classes in addition to those listed, but the riders will not earn points in these "additional" or "optional" classes Combo and Buddy. If promoter chooses to run a Buddy class it must be separated as Youth (ages 7-15) and Adult (age 16+). AMA/D14 points will be earned in those classes as listed above 1-13 only.

4. Six (6) bikes constitute a class. If less than six bikes sign up for a class, that class need not be run and bikes may be moved up to the next higher class and/or class equivalent. In classes which cannot be combined, the promoter or club may elect not to run any class with three (3) bikes or less. With classes with four (4) bikes but less than six (6), the club or promoter may elect to run only a final race and no heat race.

5. Points will be figured out as follows: 1st-20pts, 2nd-15pts, 3rd-10pts, 4th-8pts,

5th-6pts, 6th-5pts, 7th-4pts, 8th-3pts, 9th-2pts, 10th-1pt. DNS 0pts DNF 0-1pt-please see rule 22.

6. 0-65cc classes will not be allowed to start a final race after 10pm. The promoter / club to plan accordingly to schedule these races earlier in the program. In the event that no finals start prior to 10 pm, at the referee's discretion, he/she may ask for a unanimous vote amongst guardians to continue to race the final or use the results of the heat/qualifier races for scoring.

7. To receive Amateur AMA/D14 points a rider must:

A. Use the last two digits of their D14 or AMA number with the first letter of their last name (letter optional. Example: John Doe's D14 or AMA number is 1234; John Doe will run the number 34D.). If both riders in the same class are using the same number (one using the last 2 digits of his AMA and the other D14), the rider having had their number the longest shall use that number. The other rider will add the first letter of their last name to their number.

B. Use the number they earned in AMA/ D14 competition.

C. Use the number they earned in AMA National Competition with an "N" after it. D. All machines must be equipped with three number plates: white in color with black numbers and letters (optional colors for licensed professionals.)

8. Riding numbers 1 through 10 will be assigned to the top 10 riders in AMA/D14 Dirt Track Competition according to overall points earned the previous year. NO RID-ER IS ALLOWED TO USE #1 UNLESS THEY EARNED IT THE PREVIOUS YEAR.

9. Number Plates:

A. Bike must be equipped with 3 plates of uniform size shape and must be black numbers on white background (except for licensed professionals.)

B. Numbers must be at least 5-inch high standard block letters; numbers must NOT be shaded or outlined.

1. Lettering must have a professional appearance

2. AMA national numbers will take precedence in all events, and will be designated by a 3-inch letter N (such as 1N)

3. 50cc classes may use 3 inch high numbers to maintain a neat appearance.

C. Four Wheeler's must be equipped with vertical number plates on rear grab bar of quad.

10. A referee cannot referee a class that an underage family member is participating in. An assistant referee will be appointed for that class. A club member / promoter cannot set the heat / qualifying race lineups (when more than one is required) of a class in which a family member is participating. The referee or a District 14 representative must be present when the heat/ qualifier race line-ups are set.

11. Only one event in each type of competition, short track, half mile or TT will be designated the District 14 State Championship event of the year. It is not necessary to have a State Championship in each event.

12. An event that is designated the District 14 State Championship event of the year, must run all of the AMA/D14 designated classes.

13. A promoter or club who is awarded a D14 Championship event must advertise it in order to inform every D14 rider and to get maximum spectator attendance. All advertisements are subject to D14 rules.

14. D14 RACE POINTS WILL BE AWARDED FOR D14 EVENTS ONLY. The only exception is if the Flat Track & TT Scramble Amateur Grand National Championship and/or Regional National races are run on the same date as a District 14 race of same type of event, then and only then, will the Na-

tional/Regional event count for District 14 points. It will be counted from the actual finishing spot. However, it is up to the rider to keep track of the position he finished, then it must be submitted within 3 weeks after the event. The chairperson will have it certified from the hosting club/or promoter that it is accurate.

15. At State Championship races the minimum places that will receive awards will be up to 6th place unless otherwise stated.

16. Each club and promoter will pay the sum of three dollars (\$3.00) per rider signed up in each class at each of any D14 points paying event and all half mile, short track, and TT will be qualifiers and the sum of three dollars and fifty cents (\$3.50) per rider signed up in each class at the State Championships. These should be collected and sent to the D14 Flat Track Chairperson, with their D14 referees report and race results report no later than 2 weeks after each event. Race results must be legible, identify the D14 recognized classes, include the rider name per D14 membership and include at least the last 4 digits of D14 membership number; results must be sent to the D14 Points Keeper and AMA within 7 days of the race event.

17. State Championship Races – The top 6 riders in points in each class will be locked into the front row starting position. The 7th-12th riders will have to qualify for a back row position if there are more than 12 riders. Points will still determine line pick for your semi.

18. Any entrant removing a race track banner without authorization of track officials, shall be penalized a minimum of 20 District points and up to complete removal of all D14 points for the entire season, penalty determined by the D-14 board.

19. Unless otherwise advertised, practice will start two hours before race time and go through two complete sessions. It then stops and a riders meeting conducted, and time permitting, late practices will be given. In case of lost time or delay by some unforeseen reason, the referee may shorten practice.

20. Any rider abusing the practice system by taking more than two practice sessions per bike/quad (not class), unless approved by the referee, shall start from the penalty line in all races for that day.

21. A rider who makes the final and crashes or does not finish the race will receive one point as a DNF. However in the event where there are more than 10 riders zero points will be awarded if a riders crashed or does not finish the race.

22. Any rider holding a current professional racing license shall not be permitted to enter an age class (Vet 35+ and 60+) at amateur competition. Licensed riders may not enter the 251-505 Open Single class.

23. At a D14 race, the head starter/referee/club-promoter, before practice/riders meeting, will go over what every flag and what its colors mean. The head starter/referee/club-promoter shall have schooling or instructions for corner flagmen. This is to make flagmen familiar with all the flags and their meaning and to be supplied with appropriate flags and means of communicating with the head starter and/or referee. In addition, they shall coordinate with emergency personnel, at the appropriate times, for emergency vehicles to enter the racetrack

24. The District 14 State Championships will be at least 10 laps with no more than 15 laps, unless other circumstances come about such as darkness, accidents, weather, etc. and then laps will be determined by rider rep, referee, and club/promoter.

25. NOTE: Combo Class (non-points paying) 250cc+, MINIMUM OF 15 YEARS +, and must be an A rider, Pro-sport, Pro-Expert or GNC rider. A minimum pay out of 75% of sign-up and pay 50% of the riders in the Main Event (non-points paying money class) shall be given.

26. 401 Open Vintage 1988 or older, 401-600CC Air Cooled Single Cylinder 2 or 4 valve, 401-750CC Air Cooled Twin Cylinder 2 or 4 valve. Air Cooled 2 stroke. Must be period correct, twin shock frame, or period correct single shock frame. (Note: See 2019/2020 AMA Rule Book for 1980's Vintage 750 CC for proper single shock frame type.) Must be a minimum of 17 years old to ride a 400+cc twin.

27. Tie-Break: In the event of a tie for the Points Championship, the winner will be determined based on the number of main event wins in the series. Should it still be a tie, finishes of second, third, etc. will be tallied until the tie is broken. If a tie remains, the best finish in the last race will determine the champion.

28. A number 1 plate will be given to each high point rider in each class of each division (Short Track, Half Mile and TT) at the end of the season. An overall number 1 plate will be given to a rider who has earned the most points in that class that include all divisions (Short Track, Half Mile, TT). A rider must compete in a minimum of 50% of the races to be eligible for overall year-end awards only. In order for awards to be given more than 2 races for the season must be ran.

29. The Overall Champion in each class will be the ONLY rider allowed to use the #1 on the bike in the same class for the next year. 30. In the case of a rider falling during practice or a race, ONLY TRACK OFFICIALS AND EMERGENCY PERSONNEL ARE ALLOWED ON THE TRACK. When it is determined safe to enter the track, a track official can give authorization for entry. Any person not adhering to this rule may be removed from the premises and that rider may be disqualified for the day. Repeated noncompliance to this rule may lead to expulsion for the year pending decision by District 14 and AMA.

31. It is mandatory that all promoters/ clubs verify District 14 and AMA cards are present and in current standing, prior to allowing signing up for any class. Any rider not

in possession of a current District 14 card or proof of membership will be required to sign-up again. No points will be earned for any race that the rider competed in where the membership was not current, NO EX-CEPTIONS.

32. If running a bike in the buddy class, kickstands must be removed.

33. Number of bikes on track for race is at track discretion.

34. Any open weekend from May til Oct maybe ran as a rain date.

35. A CRF150 will be placed in the 86-250 Open class and the rider must be a minimum of 12 years old.

36. Mini Electric motorcycles may be run as an exhibition class. If the referee chooses, they can combine with the 0-51cc Chain class, but must be scored separately.

37. No racer under the age of 16 will be allowed to race or passenger any sidecar. All age to displacement rules will still apply.38. Quad classes may be run as exhibition classes only.

39. 0-51cc class may consist of shaft or multi-speed bikes. In the event of a multi-speed shifters must be removed. In both 0-51cc classes, modifications may be made, but must be kept to a 50cc displacement.


- CJ CLUTTER

• In my soon-to-be-written book of handy phrases – under the dirt bike racing section – this one will feature prominently ... "You can go to a race with anybody, but to guarantee it's an adventure you have to go with Zach Parks." Our recent trip to Sumter included having the race van towed away on a flatbed the night before the race and the rental of a U-Haul at an extensions and weaves shop on Sunday afternoon.

• Under the heading "Well That Didn't Last Long" ... Ryan Dungey is no longer a part owner of the Geico Honda team. It's said that Ryan is either 'all in' or he's 'all out', and I guess in this case he's 'all out'. • 'Beast Mode' is real! Eli Tomac didn't get the best start at the recent, and 50th, running of the Daytona Supercross, and it looked for a long time like Ken Roczen was going to take his first Daytona victory ahead of Cooper Webb and Jason Anderson. In the end though Tomac swept past Anderson and Webb and forced the German Honda rider into a mistake with a couple minutes left in the race. Roczen was game and kept the pressure on until the checked, finishing about five bike lengths back of the big green #3. The win puts Tomac back in sole possession of the series' leader's red plate.

• Tomac's Daytona victory was his fourth, tying him with supercross greats Ryan Villipoto and Jeff Stanton. Only track designer Ricky Carmichael has more wins at the storied venue ... one more.

• KTM's off-road management must have walked in front of a black cat while passing under a ladder and looking in a

cracked mirror. Both Josh Toth and Ben Kelley are out with injury, as are Husqvarna-mounted Thad DuVall and Trevor Bollinger. If I was Tyler Vore I wouldn't get too far away from a phone.

• GasGas posted its' best ever/first ever result in MXGP when Glenn Coldenhoff took an eighth place finish at the Matterly Basin opener. If the MC450F looked remarkably like a KTM with better graphics, that's because it was.

• In related news, Spanish manufacturer Rieju has bought the rights (and presumably the tooling) to the 'old GasGas' enduro bikes. KTM will field red-clad bikes in motocross and off-road events, having already carried Laia Sanz to 25th overall in the Dakar Rally.

• Speaking of Dakar, Honda's Ricky Brabec piloted his Honda to an overdue victory in the prestigious two-week long rally, breaking KTM's stranglehold and becoming the first American to hoist the overall trophy. 2020 marked the first time the race was held in Saudi Arabia.

• Congratulations to the Toledo Trail Riders – not only do they host a top-notch hare scrambles (when they manage to make it on the schedule) but they have also doubled the length of the single-track at the Maumee State Forest, giving racers and non-racers alike some great trail to ride just south of the border.

• Sherco's investment in the US racing scene appears to be returning early gains. The Baylor brothers, Steward and Grant, finished second and third at Sumter, while Cody Webb won King of Motos after KTM's Matti Lettenbichler missed a trail marker and was docked ONE HOUR.

Then we went into all the awards and door prizes and were done just in time to watch the supercross on the big screens. A ton of door prizes and gift bags were given out by some awesome sponsors.




