NINE DAY COUNTDOWN TO KICK-OFF

With just nine days remaining until the new Step 5 and Step 6 season gets under way, clubs across South Yorkshire stepped up their preparations with a packed programme of pre-season friendlies led by Sheffield FC's victory over Hallam in the world's oldest football derby.

The headline occasion came at the Home of Football Stadium where Sheffield claimed a 2-0 success over Hallam to lift the Alan Cooper Memorial Trophy.

In the latest staging of the Rules Derby, recognised as the oldest football derby in the world, Marcus McKernan gave Sheffield the lead five minutes before half-time. Hallam remained in the contest throughout, but Alex Asaba wrapped up victory in the second minute of stoppage time.

The fixture brought together Sheffield FC, the world's oldest football club, and neighbours Hallam FC, who play at Sandygate, the world's oldest football ground. More than 160 years after the clubs first met, local pride was once again at stake as two of football's most historic names renewed a rivalry unlike any other in the game.

The victory gave Club supporters plenty to cheer about before attention turned to Monday night's trip to Bradford (Park Avenue). Sheffield were beaten 2-1 at Horsfall Stadium despite Ryan Cook finding the net for the visitors after first-half goals from Ben Andreucci and Robbie Fox had put the Avenue in control.

Hallam bounced back from the derby defeat by holding a Sheffield Wednesday XI to a goalless draw at Sandygate on Tuesday evening as preparations for the new season continued (photo special on page 7).

Doncaster City enjoyed another productive week. After drawing 1-1 with Boston United Under-23s, City followed up with a 4-0 win at Rossington before producing another impressive attacking display in a 6-2 success against Denaby Main on Tuesday night.

Club Thorne Colliery claimed arguably the result of the week with a 3-1 victory over National League North visitors Halifax Town, while Armthorpe Welfare added to a positive pre-season by defeating a Doncaster Rovers XI 2-1.

Athersley Recreation were involved in one of the most

entertaining encounters, edging out a Chesterfield XI 5-4, while Handsworth produced the biggest winning margin among the region's clubs with an emphatic 8-1 victory over Swallownest.

Worsbrough Bridge Athletic enjoyed a 3-1 success at Crowle Colts and North Ferriby edged out Rossington Main 2-1, while Kinsley Boys were narrowly beaten 3-2 by Athersley Recreation.

Penistone Church opened the period with an encouraging 3-1 success at Shelley before drawing 1-1 with Route One Rovers. Church then suffered a narrow 2-1 defeat against Stocksbridge Park Steels as both sides continued building towards the new campaign.

Parkgate faced difficult opposition, losing narrowly to a Rotherham United XI before suffering a 3-0 defeat against Goole. Wombwell Town drew 1-1 with Ossett United before taking on higher-ranked Thackley AFC, while Dearne & District followed a 3-1 win over Field Olympic with a sterner test against Pontefract Collieries.

Elsewhere, Dronfield Town and AFC Mansfield played out a goalless draw, Rossington Main suffered a 2-0 defeat to Cleethorpes Town and Swallownest responded to their heavy loss at Handsworth by securing a 1-0 victory at Hepworth United.

With the start of the competitive season now firmly on

the horizon, managers across South Yorkshire will soon switch their focus from fitness work and experimentation to finalising teams and tactics. But before league points are on offer, Sheffield have already secured one trophy,

with goals from Marcus McKernan and Alex Asaba earning local bragging rights in football's oldest derby and providing one of the highlights of the final stages of pre-season.

BIG WEEKEND AS SEASON LOOMS

With just over a week remaining before the new Step 5 and Step 6 season gets under way, South Yorkshire clubs face another busy programme of friendlies as preparations enter their final and most important stage.

The action begins to-night with an intriguing local derby as Athersley Recreation entertain Worsbrough Bridge Athletic. Recreation have already shown their attacking capabilities during pre-season and will be looking to continue that momentum against a Bridge side eager to build consistency before the big kick-off.

Maltby Main also return to action on Thursday when they meet Club Thorne Colliery at Yorkshire Main. Thorne have enjoyed a productive summer so far, including an impressive victory over Halifax Town, and will provide another stern test for Main.

Friday night brings one of the strongest programmes of the pre-season period.

Penistone Church welcome Northern Premier League neighbours Emley to the Memorial Ground in what promises to be a competitive occasion. Joint managers Brett Lovell and John Whitehead will see the fixture as another valuable benchmark as Church continue preparations for the new NCEL Premier Division campaign.

Sheffield FC face a Sheffield United XI at the Home of Football Stadium. Having recently lifted the Alan Cooper Memorial Trophy with victory over Hallam in the Rules Derby, Club continue their preparations against what is expected to be a talented young Blades side.

Hallam make the trip to Ilkeston Town's ground for a meeting with Heanor Town. The Countrymen followed their defeat in the world's oldest derby with an encouraging goalless draw against a Sheffield Wednesday XI and will be keen to maintain that momentum as they prepare for another season in the Northern Premier League East Division.

Elsewhere, Parkgate

host local rivals Dinnington Town while Dearne & District welcome Brigg Town.

Saturday's programme includes several attractive fixtures involving local clubs.

Handsworth entertain AFC Mansfield in an early afternoon kick-off and will be aiming to build on some encouraging pre-season performances. Doncaster City continue their preparations with a trip to Ilkley Town, while Armthorpe Welfare visit Bottesford Town after showing promising signs during recent outings.

Maltby Main are back in action when they host Rossington Main in another local encounter, while Crowle Colts welcome Rossington and Wombwell Town entertain Silkstone United.

Club Thorne Colliery face a demanding few days as they travel to Hornsea Town for their second fixture in less than 48 hours.

The following week begins on Monday when Dronfield Town host Stocksbridge Park Steels. Jordan Lemon's side continue their build-up to the new campaign and will view the game as another important opportunity to fine-tune preparations.

Parkgate are also in action against their own reserve side.

Tuesday provides another packed evening of football across the region.

Hallam welcome a Sheffield United XI to Sandygate in one of the standout fixtures of the night, while Club Thorne Colliery face one of their toughest challenges of the summer against Northern Premier League outfit Cleethorpes Town.

Athersley Recreation host a Barnsley FC XI, Harworth Colliery take on Maltby Main and Worsbrough Bridge Athletic face Wombwell Main.

The week's programme concludes on Wednesday with one of the most eye-catching fixtures of the summer as Handsworth entertain Sheffield FC.

The corresponding

league fixture between the sides attracted a crowd of more than 800 supporters last season, with Sheffield claiming a narrow 1-0 victory. The game carries added significance this year as Sheffield's lateral transfer means the clubs will not meet in league competition during the forthcoming campaign, making this friendly a rare chance for supporters to watch two of the area's leading non-league sides go head-to-head.

Penistone Church also round off their preparations with the visit of a Barnsley FC XI to the Memorial Ground.

With league football now firmly on the horizon, managers across South Yorkshire are increasingly likely to move away from experimentation and focus on finalising their strongest starting elevens. Results remain welcome, but fitness, momentum and avoiding injuries will be the priorities as the countdown to the new season enters its final week.

County Senior League Line-Up Confirmed

The Sheffield & Hallamshire County Senior League has confirmed its divisional constitution for the 2026/27 season after a series of late changes to the original proposals.

A number of withdrawals and additional entries led to alterations before the final make-up of the league was ratified.

The Premier Division will feature 16 clubs, with 14 teams in Division One and 11 in Division Two.

Champions Hemsworth Miners Welfare have moved up to the Northern Counties East League after securing

promotion from the County Senior League.

Dropping into the competition are Nostell Miners Welfare following their relegation from NCEL Division One.

Three clubs have earned promotion into the Premier Division from Division One.

Champions Ecclesfield Red Rose return to the top flight after a three-season absence.

The Sheffield side were relegated from the Premier Division at the end of the 2022/23 campaign but bounced back by winning the Division One title last season.

They are joined by runners-up Swinton

Athletic and third-placed Thorncliffe Villa.

Jubilee Sports are the only club relegated from the Premier Division and will compete in Division One this season as the league increases the size of its top division.

The final structure leaves Division One with 14 clubs and Division Two with 11 teams.

Three new clubs will begin life in Division Two.

Dodworth Miners Welfare Reserves and Dronfield Town Reserves have both been admitted to the league, while Treeton Terriers step up from the Shef-

field & District Fair Play League.

The changes complete the league's preparations for the new season, with clubs across South Yorkshire, north Derbyshire and surrounding areas now knowing their divisional opponents for 2026/27.

Barnsley Face Derby Test In Opener

The 2026-27 season fixtures for the FA Women's National League were announced yesterday and there is a local derby on the opening day when Barnsley Women host newly promoted Chesterfield at the Steel City Stadium on the opening day, Sunday 16th August.

Elsewhere in Division One Midlands Sheffield FC begin with a trip to Kidderminster Harriers.

Barnsley's midweek pairings are home and away against Wythenshawe who have been moved laterally from Division One North.

The group stages of the League Cup show Barnsley in a four team group with Derby County (Northern Premier Division), Stockport County (Division One North) and Manchester United PGA.

Barnsley have been the most informative as regards local teams announcing details of players re-signing and also new arrivals. They finished fourth in Division One Midlands last term and can be ex-

pected to mount a serious title challenge in the months ahead, especially as last season's top two were promoted - Peterborough United as champions and Boldmere St Michaels as runners up via a one-off play-off.

Initial thoughts are that their jigsaw is well on its way to completion, but one of the key "missing" pieces is arguably an out and out scorer, though like last season, Barnsley look strong defensively. In

the past week Barnsley have unveiled the signing of defender Nicole Kemp who has experience of playing in the second tier.

News from Sheffield FC Women has been fairly limited so far. They announced a parting of the ways with manager Graeme Abercrombie shortly after last season ended and that was followed by unveiling Dan O'Hearne and Martin Powell as joint managers in mid-June. Known player

movements are Becky Kendell and Lauren Winter, both of whom have joined Rotherham United who have, like Barnsley Women, not been shy on making public their squad ahead of 2026-27.

Fixtures for the Regional and County Leagues, which have a September start, are expected to be announced by early August.

Pre-season friendlies have started.

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Interview with Megan Wilson

A rising star in the world of refereeing who has been receiving the plaudits

“My dad started a Sunday League side in Doncaster, and I went down to watch them play every weekend. Some of his lads ran the line, and then they were knackered going onto the pitch afterwards.”

For those involved in non-league football, our latest guest needs little introduction.

Megan Wilson has built an impressive reputation in the National League System (NLS) of English football. Her performances in the 25/26 campaign have only enhanced the reputation of an official who is destined to be involved in the game at a higher level in the coming years.

And yet, her story starts from such humble beginnings.

“My dad started a Sunday League side in Doncaster, and I went down to watch them play every weekend,” Megan said. “Some of his lads ran the line, and then they were knackered going onto the pitch afterwards.

“When I was about 12, he said, ‘Oh, will you run the line?’ I’d been involved in football for quite some time, so I knew the laws of the game and said, ‘Yeah, I’ll be fine.’ I did that for a few years, then one of the referees said, ‘You should go on your course.’

“I had to wait until I was 14 for my best friend and me to go on our referee course, which was funded by the club I was playing for at the time, Doncaster Belles. I never looked back from that point.”

Megan’s journey from that point has been pretty remarkable. From that chance talk with a referee to becoming a qualified match official, her career has been on a positive trajectory ever since.

However, no pathway is ever complete without its peaks and troughs. For the South Yorkshire-based official, her toughest moments came from an issue you would typically associate with someone playing the game, rather than officiating it.

“I had a serious injury that put me out for six months two seasons ago. I was a bit blindsided by it because I didn’t really know what to do, as I’d never spent that long off the field.

“Coming back from that and getting fit again, it was probably the hardest time mentally that I’ve had when it comes to refereeing.”

Perhaps the pinnacle of her officiating career so far, Megan was involved in the Adobe Women’s FA Cup Final between Chelsea and Manchester United in May 2025 as Fourth Official. She was one of three referees representing Sheffield & Hallamshire County FA (SHCFA) in all the FA Competition Finals, though Wilson’s selection came as a surprise, even to her.

“It was massive; I really didn’t expect it. At the start of that season, I was out injured, and I didn’t come back



from that until January. I officiated upwards of 15 games in such a short space of time.

“When I got the phone call to say that I was going to be part of the match officiating team on the day, I was like, ‘Are you kidding?’

“But I was massively proud. It just shows how far and how much work I’ve put into match officiating over the past few years. It’s one of those days that will stay in my memory forever, because it’s once in a lifetime.

“You can’t beat officiating at Wembley. I don’t think there’s anything better than that.”

Similarly, she received further excellent news last month. Megan has been promoted from a Supply League Referee (level four) to a Contributory League Referee (level three). This allows her to referee at a higher level in the NLS, with the potential for experience in the profes-

sional game as an assistant.

Under a post by SHCFA on X congratulating Wilson on her promotion, several positive comments showed their appreciation for her officiating. Two of those were from interviewees for South Yorkshire Sport this year, Alan Biggs and Ian Jones, showing the reach that her skills have had on the people involved in the game.

Despite this, Wilson remained grounded when speaking about her latest achievement.

“I didn't expect it. I knew I'd had a good season in the men's pathway, but I'm quite humble.

“When I got the call that said I'd got a promotion on the men's pathway to level three, I was obviously buzzing. It shows how much work I've put in over the past three seasons at level four. I can't wait to be involved!”

It's very important to highlight the role of women's football in Megan's rise to this stage of her career. A former player herself, she has seen the game progress to a level many thought would be impossible in the not-too-distant past.

“I was in the era when women's professional football was just taking off, but then it came through so quickly. I managed to see the big jump. These teams were training two to three times a week when I was there, whereas now, it's every day. It's so professional, and there's an expectation, as a match official, that we are just like them.

“The opportunities now are huge for any female who's involved in sport, given how successful the women's teams have been.”

That last line rings so true. The Lionesses are back-to-back European Champions, while they also reached the World Cup Final in 2023. Their route to Brazil 2027 will require two rounds of play-off games later this year, but the game remains in a healthy position.

That is reflected by the continued rising attendances in the Women's Super League. With the sport in general in a much better place, that can only be a positive for the next generation.

“I think there are so many opportunities and avenues in football now that young people can go down,” Wilson said. “Whether that's playing, refereeing, coaching, that wasn't there when I was 13/14, or they were few and far between.

“Most of the games that I played in were officiated by men. Now, it's predominantly women who are in the professional game, with men as assistants or sometimes referees. It just shows how far the game has come, and that the investment that's been made has been massive in boosting the numbers across the board.

“Women's football is so professional now, and I get opportunities in all these massive stadiums. But I think the atmosphere that the men's side of the game brings and the speed of play is higher, and I look forward to putting those skills to the test.

“I love the women's game and I also love officiating the men's game. I look forward to seeing where it takes me.”
