Land Acknowledgement

Downtown London is situated on the traditional lands of the Anishinaabek (AUh-nish-in-ah-bek), Haudenosaunee (Ho-den-no-show-nee), Lūnaapéewak (Len-ah-pay-wuk) and Attawandaron (Add-a-won-da-run). We honour and respect the history, languages and culture of the diverse Indigenous people who have called this territory home for more than 13,000 years. The City of London is currently home to many First Nations, Metis and Inuit people today. As we mark the 200th anniversary of the establishment of London, we are grateful to have the opportunity to work and live in this territory.



The Bicentennial marks 200 years since the establishment of London in 1826. The bicentennial celebrates the community's history, culture, people, and growth while recognizing the diverse communities and Indigenous histories that shaped the region long before its official establishment.

Throughout 2026, the city will host community events, cultural programs, historical exhibits, festivals, and legacy projects designed to bring residents and visitors together. The celebration highlights London's evolution from a small settlement at the Forks of the Deshkaan-ziiibi / Thames into Southwestern Ontario's major urban centres, known for its education, healthcare, arts, green spaces, and innovation.

The bicentennial is both a reflection on the past and a vision for the future – honouring 200 years of stories, achievements, and community spirit while inspiring the next generation of Londoners.

Forest City Facts

Forest City Facts is an initiative created in partnership by the City of London, the London and Middlesex Historical Society, and Western University Public History. This team of dedicated historians is working to develop 200 facts about the city we call home.

Forest City Facts



O-Pee-Chee: The Sweet Smell of Gum

London's O-Pee-Chee Company was Canada's leading candy, chewing gum and trading card manufacturer during the 20th century. Founded by brothers J.K. & D.H. McDermid in 1911, the company's name derived from their Grand Bend cottage.



Original brands Gipsy, Crackley Nut and Thrills gum were immensely popular, as were licensed products Bazooka gum, Fun Dip, SweetARTS, and Nerds. Also successful were its trading cards, including sets of the Beatles, Star Wars and Wacky Packages, plus baseball and hockey cards. Though it sold the confectionary business to Nestle Canada in 1996, its sports card brand continues today under the Upper Deck banner.

DUNDAS PLACE



Dundas Place

Dundas Place is a destination for shopping, dining, art, and celebration. From Wellington to Ridout Streets, Dundas Place is a flexible street shared by pedestrians, cyclists, and motorists. With extra-wide sidewalks and no curbs, parking spaces can easily transform into patios, be used for sidewalk sales, or by street performers. Dundas Place can be closed to vehicles for special events and programming, to offer more space for pedestrians and cyclists. Dundas Place includes Library Block, Marquee Block, Fanshawe Block, and Event Block.



New Art on Dundas Place



Dundas Place is excited to be featuring four artists whose works explore connection, place, and shared experience. Each of the 4 blocks will feature a different artist who worked with the block's theme to create beautiful imagery displayed on lamppost banners, planters, and information kiosks. This is a part of the City of London's Public Art and Monument program.

Katie Wilhelm's The Living Street on Library Block reflects relationships between people, land, and urban space, weaving together local history, architecture, and Indigenous perspectives to highlight learning, inclusion, and the continuity of community.

Amsa Yaro's In The Rhythm on Marquee Block celebrates the unifying power of music through vibrant characters and instruments that guide audiences into collective moments of joy, energy, and memory.

Jamelie Hassan's Birds and Books in Flight on Fanshawe Block combines imagery of Canada geese and open books, merging nature and knowledge to symbolize movement, learning, and cultural exchange. The luminous, mosaic-inspired designs emphasize both the everyday presence of wildlife and the enduring importance of storytelling and education.

Emily Schuyler's KA̱ tho i:ke'hse on Event Block adjacent to the river examines seasonal cycles along the Thames River, foregrounding Indigenous teachings and the resilience of land, plants, and animals within the urban landscape.

Together, these works form a layered narrative of rhythm, learning, ecology, and identity, inviting viewers to reflect on their relationships with each other, the city, and the land.

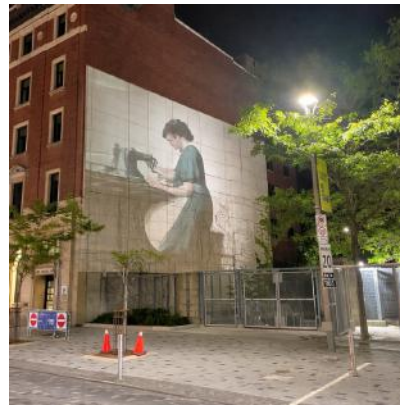

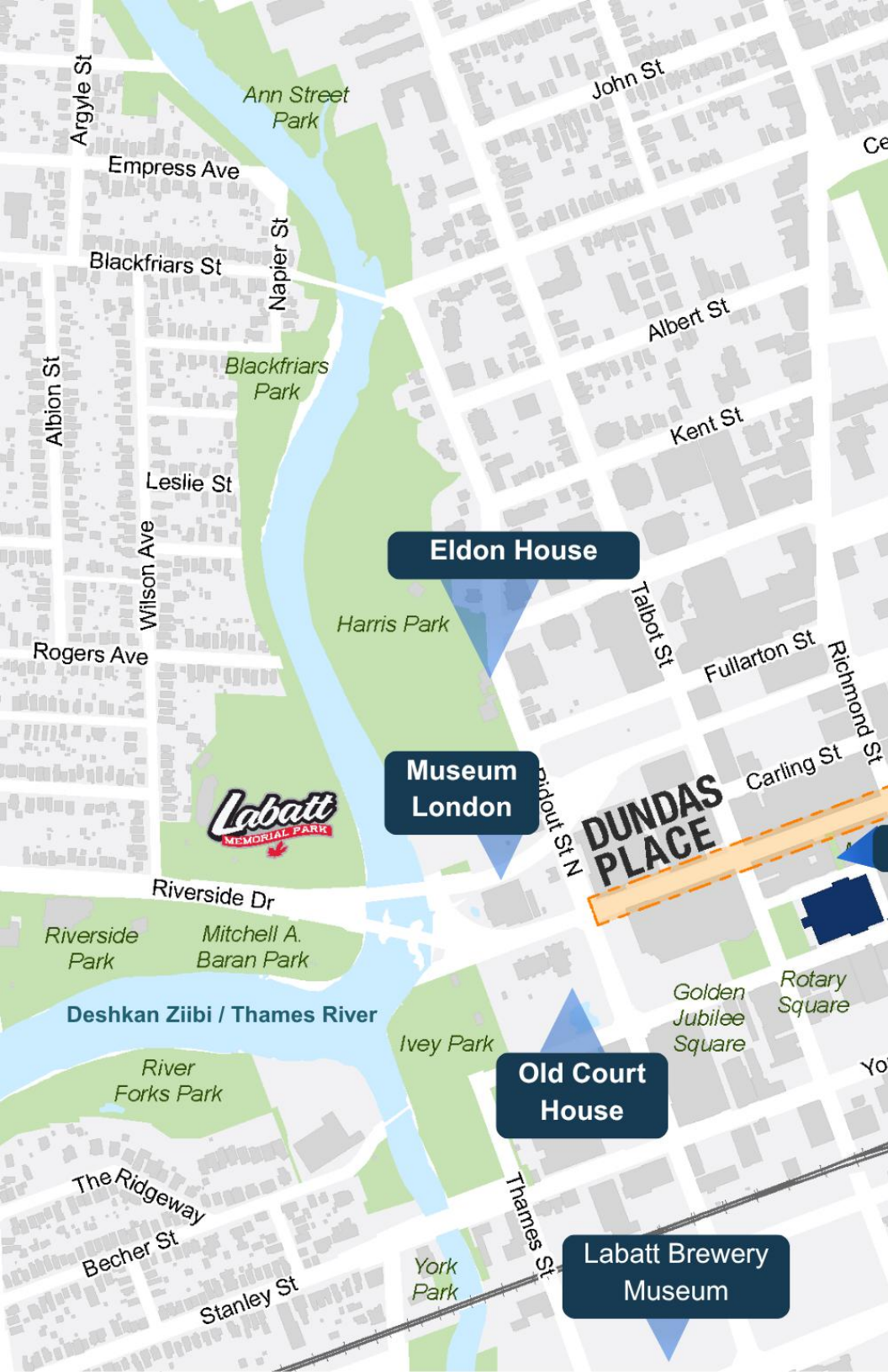

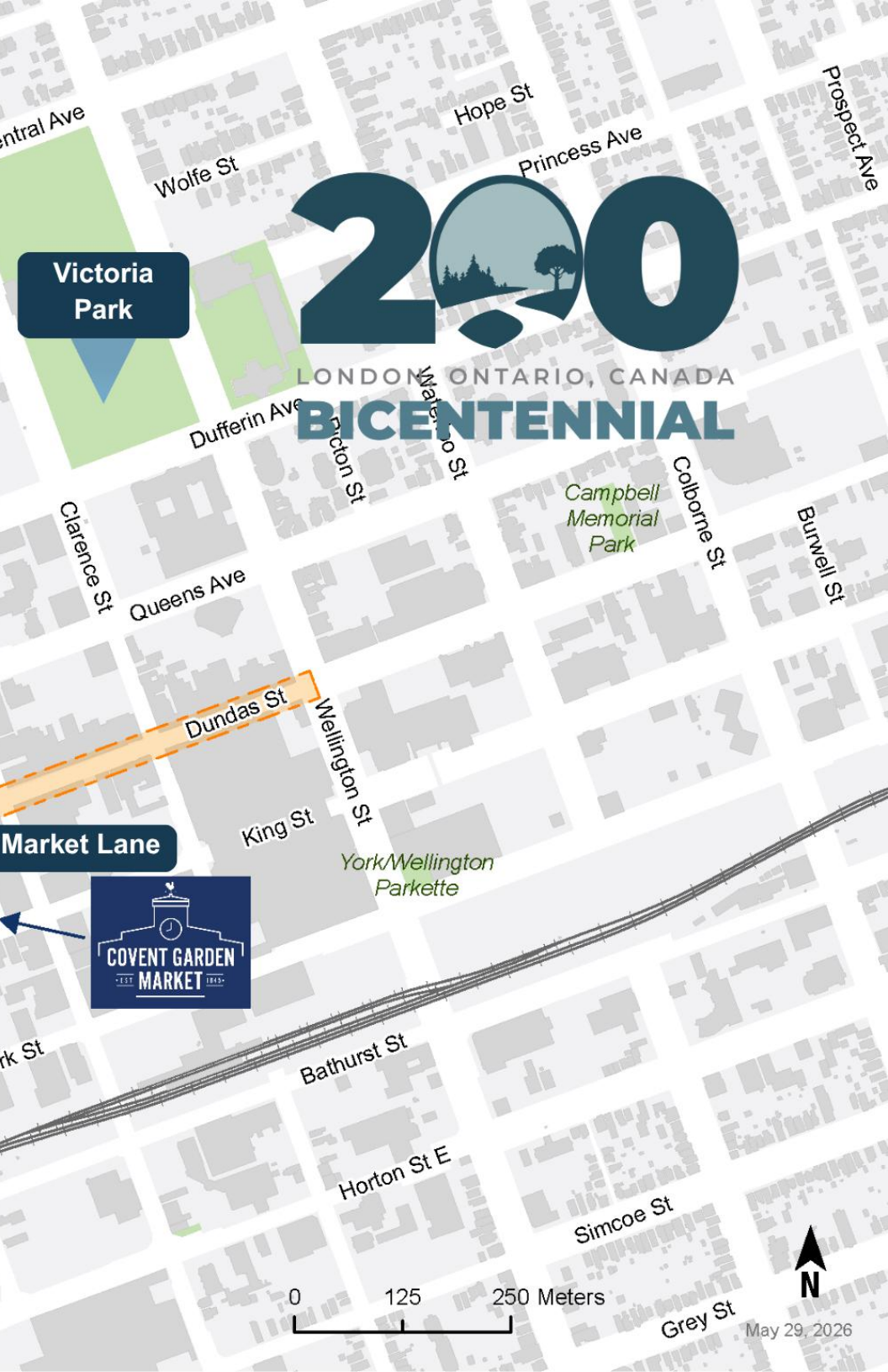
