



BOLTON SCHOOL ANNUAL GIVING REPORT 2024-25

The Bolton School Foundation – A Legacy of Philanthropy

During the 2024-25 academic year, the Bolton School Foundation, the charitable foundation which incorporates the Primary, Girls' and Boys' Divisions of Bolton School, enjoyed another 12 months of success and achievement and has continued to thrive.

In August, Year 11 and Year 13 students celebrated two tremendous sets of public examination results, unlocking choice and opportunity for each of those pupils as they move onto the next stages of their futures. In September, the two new Year 7 cohorts joining the Boys' and Girls' Divisions were the biggest ever recruited to the Senior Schools, testament to their families' confidence in our long-term commitment to ensuring Bolton School remains both affordable and worth affording, despite the testing economic climate in which we operate.

I am delighted to report that, during the 2024-25 academic year, the School has once again enjoyed the sustained philanthropic support of its community. During that period, an exceptional £1.77 million was donated to support the School's bursary scheme, with a further £91,500 gifted to support hardship funding for fee-paying families and an additional £420,838 gifted to support a host of other projects and activities, including capital developments, prizes and scholarships, and extra-curricular funding for bursary pupils. Every gift we receive supports the School's success, and I am grateful to each of our donors for the support that they have offered this year.



The past 12 months has also seen the School benefit richly from voluntary support received from across its community, with 294 individuals giving their time, energy and expertise to support the School's continued development, many of whom also choose to support the School philanthropically. From my fellow Governors and Trustees, to the many individuals who serve our Alumni and Parent Associations, to those who offer careers inspiration and mentoring guidance to current pupils and recent leavers: I offer my sincere thanks to everyone who has volunteered during the past year.



In May this year, the Bolton School Foundation commemorated the life of Lord Leverhulme on the centenary anniversary of his death. Lord Leverhulme was a powerful advocate for the transformational power of a first-class education, and was determined that such an education should be accessible to every child of his hometown who would benefit from it, regardless of their gender or family's means.

Lord Leverhulme's enduring commitment to social mobility through education remains fundamental to the School's ethos today. His legacy provides a model of philanthropy and benefaction which successive generations of Alumni and other members of the School community have striven both to replicate and honour. The current Governing Body is wholeheartedly committed to upholding that legacy, most significantly through the continued growth of the School's bursary scheme to support, eventually, one in three students at the School.

The Open Futures Bursary Campaign, launched at those commemorations, aims to harness the continued support of the School community to achieve that ambition, and has already enjoyed early success, as you can read overleaf. Our bursary scheme is sector-leading, a national beacon of excellence both in terms of the large number of pupils it funds and the bespoke support it offers those

children and their families. I am thankful to everyone who has already offered their support to the Open Futures Campaign, to help expand its reach even further.

As the Governors' staunch commitment to safeguard the future growth of the bursary scheme is made possible in large part through the philanthropic giving of the School's supporters, so too is their commitment to maintaining and improving the School estate. During the past academic year, enabled by the receipt of a generous legacy from an Old Boy, initial planning commenced for the development of additional indoor sports facilities. In May, the Leverhulme Woodlands – a dedicated outdoor learning space within the School grounds – were officially opened, made possible thanks to a generous gift received from a charitable trust in the previous academic year.

Whilst there are undoubtedly strong financial headwinds currently impacting the independent schools' sector, you may feel confident that Bolton School is riding the storm. The Governors' careful financial and strategic planning, combined with the Heads' confident leadership and the generous support of our community, will ensure that Bolton School continues to thrive in the years ahead. Thank you, sincerely, for the support you have offered in contribution to that success: your generosity is greatly appreciated by all of us who lead the School.

The Bolton School Bursary Foundation - A Commitment to Social Mobility

The Bolton School Bursary Foundation (BSBF), the charity through which the School's bursary funds are raised, held and granted, continues to deliver its founding aim – to maintain and expand the support offered by the Bolton School bursary scheme – as set out by the Governors when they established it in 2022.

During the 2024-25 academic year, £1.74m was donated to BSBF to benefit the School's bursary scheme. This outstanding sum was in addition to two other major gifts made to BSBF during the past 12 months, which have already been directly invested by the Trustees to the same end.

This significant philanthropic support came from across the School community, given through a variety of methods – including new and continuing regular donors, individual supporters making one-off gifts, charitable trusts offering their continued commitment and bequests received from individuals who remembered the bursary scheme in their wills.

However that support was shaped, it was borne from a shared desire to ensure a Bolton School education can be enjoyed by every child who would both benefit positively from it and contribute to the School's ongoing success in their turn. My fellow Trustees and I share that passion for social mobility wholeheartedly, and we are exceptionally grateful for the support BSBF has received this year. Thank you.

During last year's admissions processes, the School received 238 applications for bursary support to join Year 7 and a further 84 bursary applications to join the Sixth Forms, but was only able to offer funding to 83 of

those young people – illustrating the scale of the demand to enable further social mobility in Bolton and beyond, a need which we are determined to address.

In May 2025, the School launched the Open Futures Bursary Campaign, of which you can read more on the opposite page, in order to meet that funding gap and ensure future generations of Bolton School students might join us, regardless of their family circumstances.

If you believe in the positive impact of a Bolton School education and have not yet offered your support to the bursary scheme, please consider doing so now. That support has never been more vital.

With your continued generosity, combined with that of other Alumni, staff, parents and friends, the Open Futures Campaign's goal – to increase the bursary funding available at the School to support one in three students – will be achieved.

The Open Futures Bursary Campaign

For generations, a Bolton School education has given bright young people from all backgrounds the opportunity to transform the trajectory of their lives forever. With your continued support, we are intent upon ensuring that the School's founding ethos of social mobility is perpetuated throughout the next century and beyond.

In recent years, the Governing Body has had to make decisive financial choices in response to the various legislative changes affecting the independent schools' sector, to ensure that the School remains as affordable as possible.

Before that point, the future growth of our bursary programme was on target to ensure that, by 2030, one in three pupils in the Senior Schools would have begun to receive a funded place.

Instead, without substantial further funding, by the end of this decade, 100 children who otherwise would have joined the School will be denied the opportunities that a bursary would have made available to them.

In May 2025, the School launched the Open Futures Bursary Campaign, calling upon the philanthropic support of the entire School community in order to restore that growth trajectory as promptly as possible.

The initial response was extremely positive. In its first four months, the campaign raised just over £500,000 in new donations and pledges, gifted by Alumni, current and former staff, current and former parents, Governors and other friends of the School, including 24 new regular donors who committed their support to the Campaign into the future.

But there is much further to go. We are determined that the continued growth of our bursary scheme to reach one in three pupils – changing the lives of up to 250 more bursary children than are in the School presently – must be assured. We are honoured by the response the Open Futures Campaign has already received since its launch, and are grateful to every donor who gave the School their support and endorsement during the last academic year.

Your Support

During the 2024-25 academic year, the School community gave donations totalling £2.28 million to support the School and its pupils.

This tremendous total included £1.77m given to BSBF and the School to safeguard the future growth of the bursary scheme, £91,500 given to provide hardship funding for fee-paying families experiencing financial difficulties and just over £420,800 donated to support a wide range of other projects and activities benefiting the School and its Alumni.

A Lasting Legacy

£649,205 was gifted by 11 Alumni and friends of the School who had chosen to remember the School in their wills. Over half of the legacies received were bequeathed to support the growth of the School's bursary funds, collectively providing in-year funding for 25 Sixth Form bursaries; whilst others supported the development of the School's sporting facilities and academic prizes in the Senior Schools.

A Departing Gift

Just over £57,500 was donated to the bursary scheme by 239 families of the Class of 2024, who gifted their child's deposit back to the School in order to pay forward to the next generation of students the same opportunities from which their child had benefited.

A Transformational Impact

The impact of your generous support was exceptional.

During the 2024-25 academic year, the School spent £3.7m on means-tested bursary funding, enabling 379 children – one in five students in the two Senior Schools – who would otherwise have been unable to join us to benefit from all that a Bolton School education has to offer.

In addition, thanks to your generous gifts:

- 113 grants were made to bursary students, drawing from funds specifically established by donors, enabling them to take part in extra-curricular trips and activities alongside their classmates;

- 22 fee-paying pupils were granted hardship funding, alleviating financial pressures upon their families during challenging times;
- 25 young Alumni received either a Leverhulme Centenary Scholarship, a Warburton Scholarship or a Popplewell Scholarship to support their university studies; and
- 117 Boys' and Girls' Division pupils received 171 separate prizes, recognising their academic performance and commitment to the wider life of the School.

Furthermore, your collective philanthropy supported the continued work of the Clifford Ingham Fund, which enables Senior School pupils from both Divisions to take part in adventure learning activities; funded the enhancement and development of the School's facilities and buildings, including at Patterdale Hall; subsidised the cost of attending Alumni Dinners for recent leavers; funded prizes and opportunities for academic enrichment in the two Divisions, including the annual Platt Fisher Lecture; supported the development of the School's planned indoor sports dome; funded uniform and other costs for a number of bursary students; enabled the continued operation of the School's Community Cricket Hub, which provides coaching for young female cricketers across the borough; and sponsored branded kits for the School's senior sports teams.

The School's sustained success and achievements are made possible by your generosity. Thank you.

The Power of a Bursary Place

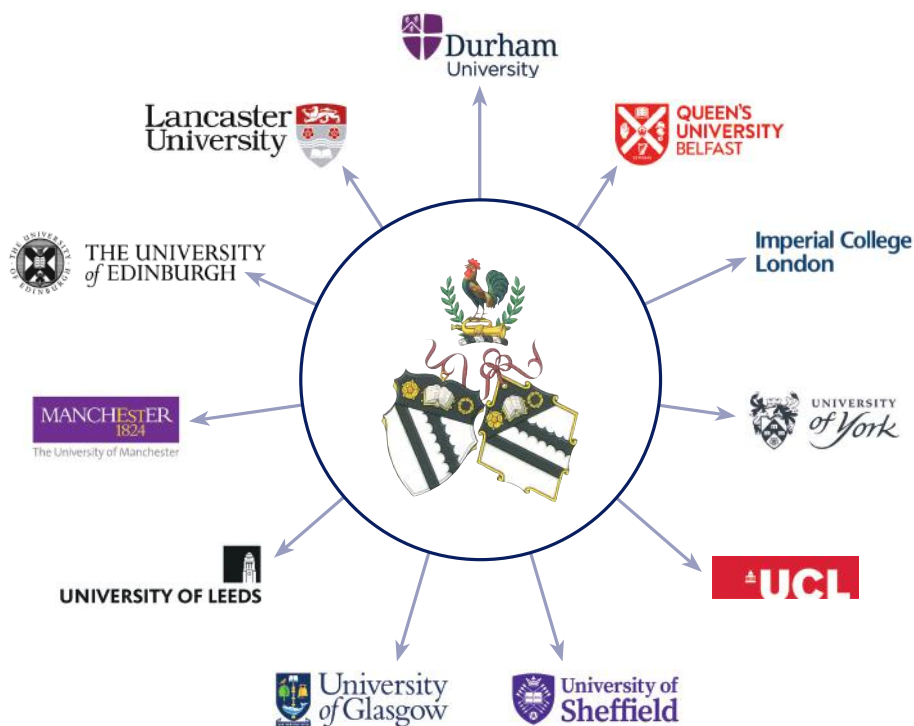
A Bolton School education can change a child's life forever.

Thanks to your support, during the 2024-25 academic year 44 members of the Class of 2025 benefited from the transformational opportunities that a bursary place provides.

In the A Level results published in the summer, 55% of those bursary recipients achieved A*-B grades. 29 of them left Bolton School to take up a place at university, including 16 who secured places at the prestigious Russell Group universities, studying subjects as diverse as Mathematics, French and Philosophy, Biomedicine and Mechanical Engineering. In addition, a further eight students secured places on competitive Degree Apprenticeship programmes with employers including The Bank of England, whilst others entered employment.

Most importantly, each of those students left us having developed the values and behaviours that will serve them best during their adult life, including – in their own words – “resilience”, “determination” and “helping others”.

Thanks to your generosity, the Class of 2025 left us well-prepared to step confidently into their futures, having enriched our School community for the better.

The Gift of Time

During the 2024-25 academic year 294 Alumni, Current Parents, Former Parents, Friends, Governors, Trustees and other members of the School community volunteered their time to support the Bolton School Foundation and its pupils, past and present.

The name of every volunteer who gave their time to the School last year can be found in the Roll of Honour overleaf. It includes:

- 185 volunteers who gave their time and expertise to support the School's careers and enrichment programme, which benefits students at the School and young people in the wider community. Activities and events supported by volunteers included the virtual bi-monthly World of Work and Women of Work careers sessions; the MedSoc meetings and mock MMI event for aspiring medics; the Sixth Form Entrepreneurship mentoring scheme; the monthly A-Z of Careers lunchtime talks; the annual Tillotson, Platt Fisher and Hulton Lectures; the annual International Women's Day careers event; the annual Sixth Form Interview Skills evenings; and the annual Careers Carousels for Junior and Senior School pupils, plus many others besides;
- 52 Old Boys and Old Girls who gave their time voluntarily to mentor younger Alumni, through the Old Boltonians' Association's Find Your Path mentoring scheme and the Old Girls' Association's Steps to Success mentoring scheme;
- 36 Alumni who supported their fellow Alumni and the work of the School, through their service on the committees of the Old Boltonians' Association and the Old Girls' Association;

- 15 individuals who served as members of the Bolton School Foundation Governing Body, and six Trustees of the Bolton School Bursary Foundation, all of whom dedicated their time, energy and expertise to ensure the continued good governance of the School and to safeguard the growth of the School's bursary funds; and
- The officers, committee members and volunteers of the Friends of Bolton School, which combines the Parents' Associations of the three Primary Division schools, the Parent Forums of the Boys' Division and Girls' Division and other former parents and friends; all of whom volunteer their time and energy to support School activities and events, as well as raising funds to enhance the experience of each pupil in the Foundation.



Using Your Donations Responsibly

We are honoured to receive the philanthropic support of so many members of the Bolton School community and take our responsibilities in the stewardship of their gifts incredibly seriously:

- Every donation received is used to support the bursary scheme or for the purpose directed by the donor: the operational costs of the Development Office are paid for by the School;
- Outside the School day, our buildings and facilities are used to generate income, with the annual profits from the School's trading arm, BSSL, and the School's Nursery gifted back to the School to support the bursary scheme;
- The management of the invested funds held by the School and by BSBF is overseen with care by the two charities' respective Investment Committees, whose shared objective is delivering sustainable growth in the School's bursary provision whilst preserving the real value of the capital invested;
- Each year the Trustees of BSBF determine the level of grant to be made to the School for bursary support, in order to preserve and grow the real value of the bursary funds in an endowment style and thus ensure financial support remains available to both current and future pupils. Once that grant is received the School's Governors then determine the total funds available to spend on bursaries in the following academic year; and
- All bursaries are entirely means-tested, awarded via a transparent and rigorous allocations process designed to ensure that financial support reaches those who are the most deserving of it. This allocations process, which includes detailed financial checks and individual interviews, is reviewed annually, with every bursary award then being renewed entirely at the end of Year 11 before a child's admission to the Sixth Form.

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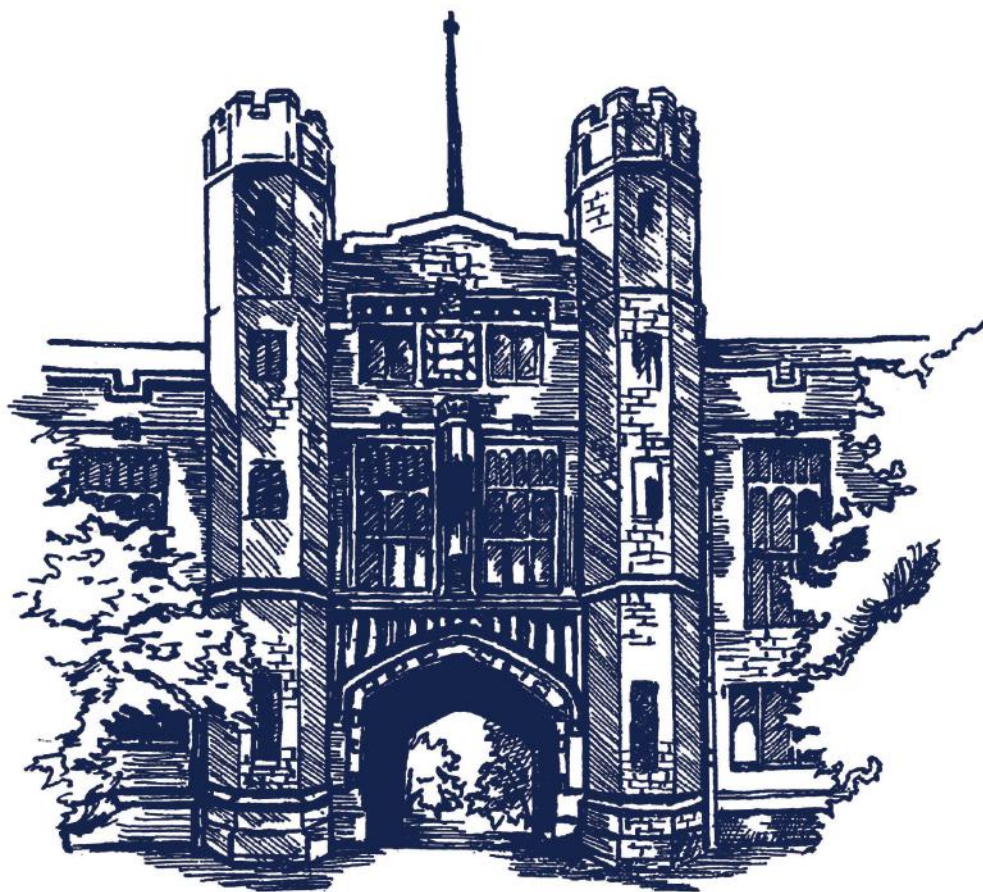
