



JA History

In 1959, Junior Achievement of South Florida was created by members of the Fort Lauderdale Rotary Club. In its first year, the organization served 373 high school students. Over the next 49 years, JA increased its reach to include more than 13,000 students a year. In 2009, JA World Huizenga Center at the Lillian S. Wells Pavilion, located on the north campus of Broward College, opened its doors and the organization's impact grew significantly to more than 50,000 students a year.

At 60,000 square feet, JA World is the single largest JA educational facility of only 36 in the world. The project was spearheaded by the late Marti and Wayne Huizenga, who made the lead gift to the capital campaign and the late JA President Melissa Aiello who helped bring other community leaders together to support the project. The land was generously donated by Broward College. Through a partnership with Broward County Public Schools, it was agreed that every 5th and 8th grade student would participate in the JA BizTown and JA Finance Park programs, including classroom instruction and a simulation at JA World.

Today, JA programs span grades K-12 across Broward and south Palm Beach counties, with age appropriate curriculum that heightens the academic experience.

When guests walk into JA BizTown they stop in awe as they witness 5th grade students' ability to grasp business and financial concepts at such a young age. Over 51% of millennials say they feel their level of financial knowledge keeps them from making financial progress.

Instilling this confidence begins with teaching personal and business finance at a young age.

The JA BizTown program starts in the classroom and culminates with a day trip to JA World, where students are employees, consumers and citizens of a simulated, hands-on city with real storefronts featuring businesses in South Florida.





Today, many families aren't financially prepared to deal with a \$400 emergency. They have nothing saved for retirement, and their children don't know where to start. Also 43% of Americans are financially illiterate.

Reversing this trend is critical for the next generation's prosperity!

At the Patten Family Foundation JA Finance Park, 8th graders learn how financial decisions will impact their lives. These decisions include spending on family health care, real estate and home improvements, automobiles, insurance, entertainment, education, and purchasing items such as clothing, furniture and groceries. After some classroom instruction, students visit JA Finance Park and put what they learned into action while discovering potential career pathways.


















Preparing Future Leaders - JA Career Bound.

Bridging the Skills Gap: Summer Youth Employment Program

Student graduates have a hard time finding jobs in their field of study due to a lack of relevant experience. Research shows that completing an internship increases job offers by 16 percent. JA's Summer Youth Employment Program gives students an advantage by providing them with a summer internship opportunity.

Employers need to hire qualified, talented young professionals who are well-trained for an always evolving workforce.

In the program, students not only gain experience, connections, and skills, but they also gain exposure to different career paths. We work with local businesses to deliver a four-week paid internship where the student works 20-30 hours per week and is paid at least minimum wage. JA was the only organization to offer this program during COVID-19.
