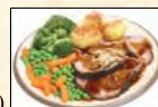


### AGM and Planning Day

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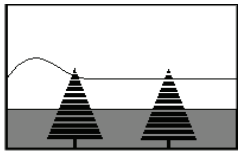


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## Yankalilla Mens Probus Club

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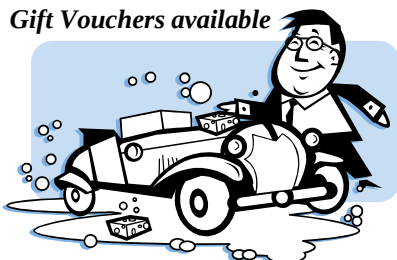
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## Yankalilla Historical Society

**A**mong the early colonists to arrive in this district in the 1850s were those from Ireland. John Clarke arrived from Killarney on board the "Tam-o'-Shanter on 27th November, 1836. Settling at Wattle Flat he married Catherine Taggart (from Cork, Ireland) in 1840. They lived at Wattle Flat for the rest of their lives, and had seven sons and four daughters. A well educated man, he was the first Justice of the Peace in the district and became a member of the District Council.

The first settler to take up land in Yankalilla was Henry Kemmis, in 1842. Born in Ireland of landed gentry he arrived in South Australia with his wife and children in 1839 and eventually lived at Manna Farm. Colourful people, the Irish were hardworking and at times pious and humble, then gay with rollicking good humour. Paddy Lawless and his family, of Second Valley, rode to Sunday Mass on horseback, the horse refusing to budge when overloaded with the older children who were supposed to walk. Many families walked the ten miles from beyond Second Valley and Wattle Flat, young parents carrying their toddlers on their backs there and back.

Many Irish women were among the single females brought out by the shipload to relieve the overcrowded

orphanages and work-houses in the wake of the famine. These girls were to work as domestics or on farms for the equivalent of 25c a week.

St. Patrick's Day, which falls on the 17th of March, was a time of great jubilation. A grand sports meeting was organised, the whole town invited. There were foot races and horse races. Rafferty's rules were the order of the day. The big marquee was erected just north of Fergusson's Mill. There would be buckets of hot mashed potatoes, vegetables and meats and salads, and a copper full of hot plum puddings. At night there was the grand St. Patrick's Ball. Everyone would be "a'wearing of the green", singing the old Irish songs and some of them dancing all night.

In 1867 the first Catholic Country School was established by Sister Mary McKillop in Yankalilla, with forty children attending. The Sisters lived in a rented house using some of the rooms as classrooms. John Clark's four daughters were accomplished pianists and skilled embroiderers, having been taught by the Sisters. John had not wanted his daughters doing menial tasks so he employed two Irish girls as servants. As it turned out his daughters had to work as hard as any farmer's wife when they married, and the servant girls married his two sons.

School attendance was irregular for the first generation of children, family survival being the first consideration - to produce the necessities of life the children had to do their bit. Boys learned to tend the stock, milk cows, hoe vegetables, chop wood, and help plough the land. Girls cared for younger brothers and sisters, milked cows, learnt to make butter, and helped in the home. Most children, and some teachers, walked to school, some as far as five miles each way. The paths the first children trod often became the district roads.

**T**he Yankalilla Historical Society meets on the second Monday of each month. Our next meeting will be on Monday, 10th October in the Yankalilla Council Chambers. On Wednesday mornings a member of this society will be in attendance at the Yankalilla Library between 10am and noon. Anyone wanting assistance with family research or who would like information on any other matter is welcome to drop in.

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## Early Detection Is Saving Lives

**N**ew data released during September has shown that the mortality rate from some of South Australia's most common cancers, including colon, lung and prostate cancer, is declining.

Senior Medical Oncologist at the Royal Adelaide Hospital Cancer Centre Professor Dorothy Keefe said that the Cancer in South Australia 2013 report highlights that the rates of colon cancer and lung cancer in both men and women, as well as prostate cancer in men, are reducing. "Early detection tests that can identify cancer at an early stage, as well as advancements in treatments, are contributing to the reduced mortality rates," Professor Keefe said.

"The report demonstrates that many South Australians are taking heed of the messages that early detection can greatly increase the chance of successful treatment for some of our most common cancers.

"The report also shows early signs of a decline in newly diagnosed lung cancer cases in women for the first time in over 30 years, indicating that initiatives to reduce smoking in South Australia are working.

"It is encouraging that many of our targeted campaigns to reduce common cancers are having a positive effect."

The Cancer in South Australia reports are released annually to describe trends in cancer, as well as project incidence and mortality rates into the future.

While the 2013 report shows that mortality rates of some of South Australia's most common cancers declined, there were a total of 22 more deaths from cancer in 2013 than in 2012.

In 2013 more South Australians were also diagnosed with cancer, with figures increasing from 9,486 diagnoses in 2012 up to 9,717 in 2013.

"The reports give us a good indication of the impact cancer is having on the lives of South

Australians," Professor Keefe said.

"As the population ages we are detecting more incidences of cancer and while sixty per cent of cancer in 2013 affected those aged 65 and over, the report is a good reminder to all South Australians that they should not be complacent towards cancer.

"Cancer often has no specific symptoms so it is important to limit risk factors and utilise appropriate screening programs.

"Measures like not smoking, avoiding the sun and keeping healthy can assist in cancer prevention, while utilising screening programs can improve early detection and survival rates."

The South Australian Cancer Registry has been collecting data since 1977 to evaluate the impact of testing and screening programs, as well as to enable research into cancer risk factors, unusual trends in cancer diagnoses and exceptional cancer risks.

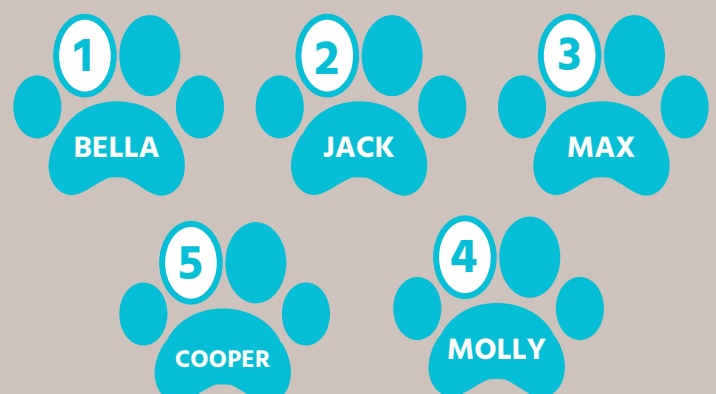

# FIRE PREVENTION: ADVANCE NOTICE

## Fire Prevention: Advance Notice to Property Owners in the District of Yankalilla.

As the state dries off ahead of Summer, property owners are being advised to turn their attention to fire prevention. All property owners are required under law to undertake the following fire prevention measures:

- Reduce all grass, pest plants and undergrowth within 20 metres of any building to a maximum height of 100mm.
- Reduce all grass, pest plants and undergrowth of a vacant block under half a hectare to a maximum height of 100mm over the whole block.

- Establish and maintain a fire break as close to the perimeter as practically possible if the land of a vacant block is over half a hectare in area.

All fire prevention measures must be in place by the start of the official 2016-17 Fire Danger Season (to be announced this month) and be maintained throughout. For more information contact the Council's Fire Prevention Officer.

## ROBERT NORMAN

**It's a story that's got a bit of everything – cannons, prosthetic hands, the Governor and, of course, the Fleurieu Peninsula.**

This story begins as all good stories do – a long, long time ago... It was 1844 when dental surgeon Robert Hasting Norman arrived in Adelaide with his wife, young son and mother and established the colony's first dental practice in Wright Street in the CBD.

A learned gentleman, Robert Norman also carved objects from ivory and bone, exploring mechanical applications with his craft. The then Governor George Grey was a fan of Dr Norman's work and paid him to make a prosthetic hand for Corporal John Coles, who lost his four left fingers while preparing a cannon for a celebratory firing, in honour of the birth of the Duke of Cornwall.

The prosthetic hand was reported as being made from "sea-cow", intricately carved to copy details of fingers and nails. Catgut pulleys were interlinked with small spools, carefully worked into the knuckle joints, and were manoeuvred by the thumb.

The prosthetic hand, which is believed to be amongst the first developed, was described as 'beautiful in its mechanism and (so) accurate in

its working that Corporal Coles could pick up a button or a sixpence with pleasing facility' (Health Museum of South Australia). 131 years later, Dr Norman's creation continues to impress, inspiring production of the world's first 3D-printed body-powered prosthetic hand in 2015, by US mechanical designer Ivan Owen.

Robert of course is better known to the District with his announcement in the Register Newspaper on 2nd June 1849 that he intended forming a township to be named "Normanville" on his property on the Bungala River. **For more history like this, please head to the Visitor Information Centre and Museum, open seven days a week.**

# NBN IMPROVING OUR CONNECTIVITY

Residents and tourists alike are now experiencing the benefits of free Wi-Fi in the district, with the service being further rolled out in both Yankalilla and Normanville.

Building on the introduction of the NBN and the successful pilot in Normanville's main street which has been up and running since June, the second stage of Council's initiative, includes the Yankalilla shopping precinct in Main Street and Main South Road, as well as the Normanville foreshore and Jetty Caravan Park.

With free Wi-Fi available at many of the district's most popular eateries and cafes, businesses are giving strong feedback about the success of the program. Business owners are reporting that people are staying longer, able to login and access social media and do their work.

Following this rollout, Council will look to Year Three of the plan for 2017-18 and consider additional options for extending the service elsewhere in the district.

The NBN has also gone live at Second Valley after overcoming some technical hurdles. The service is now officially up and running and residents can now contact their internet service provider to access higher speed internet.

## It's the arithmetic stupid or are we stupid? It just doesn't add up.

**M**y annual bleat. Consider two properties, both in semi rural settings, both of the same rated values, both on sealed roads with no footpaths. The former though has streetlights, twice monthly green waste and recycling collections and even street sweeping. The latter has no green waste collection, no street lights, once a month recycling and a street sweeper has never been sighted. The latter's council rates are now 163% above the former. They went up 4.1% this year. The former's increased by only 1.8%. The former increased by just \$34.33 this year, the latter's by five and a half times more, an increase of \$188.51 when that council already had \$1,100 more each year to do less.

So when is enough, enough for the ratepayers of Yankalilla? Is it only when that disparity reaches 200%? On the arithmetic that wont take long when you have a head start of 65%? And when will our council give a cogent justification of why such a huge disparity exists?

## Response From Yankalilla Council Re: Previous Letter

**I**t is difficult to compare one Council to another as each have their own unique characteristics, for example our district also covers over 750 square kilometres and 544 kilometres with only 5400 rate payers where as other Council have less area and roads and more ratepayers to share the rates but may provide additional services. Our small rate base for the large area is often the very reason people move to our beautiful district. Our rates this year went up on average 2.7% so there must be other factors that contributed to an increase of 4.1%. I would love an opportunity to give a "cogent justification" of the different in rates and encourage Andrew and/or any other ratepayer with similar concerns to make an appointment with me so over coffee we can look at all the figures and I can try and explain.

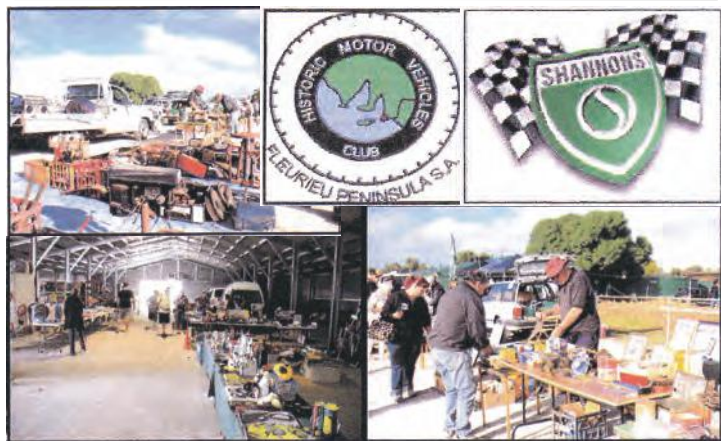
Washing aids the shredding of any old hair. **Open 8am to 6pm.**

## Commemoration of the Centenary of the WWI Monument, Second Valley

**O**n a fine Saturday afternoon in September 1917 a granite column was unveiled near Second Valley School to honour the members of local families from the then Rapid Bay District Council area who enlisted to serve in the Great War. The column was funded by private subscription (a sum of £113 was raised). According to local newspaper reports, approximately 250 people attended the unveiling ceremony, at which the local school children saluted the flag and sang the national anthem before refreshments were taken.

Thirty six names were inscribed on the column, including those of two nurses. At the time, four had paid the supreme sacrifice. As the war continued, another four names were added to the monument and seven more lost their lives.

On 23 September 2017 the Second Valley Progress Association (SVPA) is planning to hold a commemorative event to mark the centenary of the unveiling of the column. A re-enactment of the 1917 ceremony is proposed at the site of the monument. The SVPA would like to locate

relatives and descendants of those who are named on the column to invite them to attend the event next year. We would be very glad to hear from anyone who is a relative or who knows of any relatives of the following so that we can make contact with them.

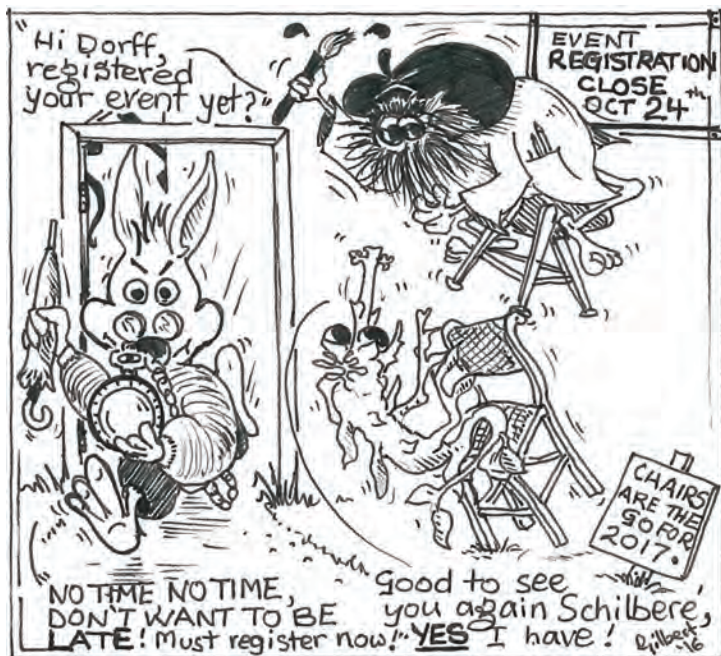

### Plover Appreciation Day

What a lovely way to start the day with Mayor Glen Rowlands unveiling the new Hooded Plover display at the front of the Normanville Natural Resource Centre (NNRC) followed by a celebratory champagne. NNRC volunteer George Reeves used his creative talents to help promote the plight of the Hooded Plovers on the Fleurieu, by creating this exhibit. Another volunteer, Esther Ratner provided the colourful back drop making this a very eye catching display.

Hooded Plovers are now starting to breed again on our local beaches, they make their nests on the sand between the high-water mark and the sand dunes. The sea washes up seagrasses and algae and other 'beachwrack' the insects, sand-hoppers and other small critters feed on. Living and nesting right on the beach, the plovers and their chicks don't have far to go for a feast.

Hoodies lay up to 3 eggs directly on the sand in a simple, shallow nest scrape. Both parents help look after the nest and keep watch for predators for 28 days until the eggs hatch. Then the fluffy, flightless chicks hatch and need to feed themselves to grow full size in 35 days. Young Hoodies can fly after five weeks. When disturbed the chicks stay still and hide.

Being well camouflaged and not moving means people, dogs, vehicles or horses on the beach can step, drive or ride right on the eggs or chicks. If people or dogs stay near the nest they can keep the parents away from the nest. That means the eggs are left in the sun to bake or are at risk of being taken by natural predators such as gulls, ravens and kestrels. If the chicks are always running away or hiding they won't be feeding and may starve.

### Don't Let The Numbat Go The Way Of The Dodo

When Europeans first arrived in Australia, Numbats (*Myrmecobius fasciatus*) were found across the southern part of the continent. Now there are less than 1500 individuals left; mostly as a result of fox predation and habitat destruction. The area around Adelaide would have had its share of these striped marsupials, but they are now locally extinct and on the Red List of Threatened Species put together by the International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN).

Numbats are easily recognised by their distinctive stripes, which helps explain why they are sometimes known as Banded Ant-eaters; though they don't eat ants, instead preferring to munch around 20,000 termites a day!

This taste for termites results in Numbats being diurnal, which means they are active during the day. They have to collect termites when temperatures are warm and the insects are out foraging, not hiding in tough-walled mounds. Being diurnal makes Numbats much more vulnerable than their nocturnal marsupial cousins, as many predators such as foxes, birds of prey and snakes are also active during the day.

The only places to see Numbats in the wild are two areas not far from Perth, though there are a number of captive populations that have been reintroduced to areas previously inhabited by Numbats - safely behind

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protective fences.

One of these sanctuaries is at Yookamurra, just two hours from Adelaide, where they have an education program and school camps. September 7th was Threatened Species Day, a good time to think about the creatures most at risk of disappearing forever if we don't act to save them. ## Weed Of The Month From Cape Jervis Coastal Community Group Hottentot Fig (*Carpobrotus edulis*)

At first glance, you might think this groundcover is our native pigface, Karkalla. There is that triangular cross-section of the succulent leaves, but this one has 'teeth', or a rough edge, to the sharper side, whereas Karkalla is smooth. Its large yellow flowers are the biggest giveaway to its identification though. Unlike our local pink-flowered pigface, this is an invasive introduced species ...in fact, it is so invasive it is listed in the Invasive Species Database for 24 countries! Unfortunately, the plant hybridizes with the local pigfaces, where they come into close proximity, and this leads to other problems e.g.



swamping local species genetically. One particular concern is that Karkalla is a food source. Although the hottentot fig is also edible, what happens with the hybrids?

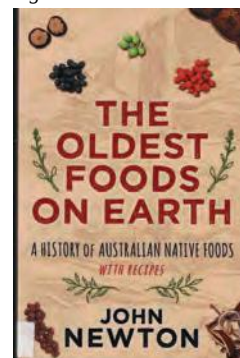

## Defibrillators

Over a year ago I began writing this article and researching the topic of community defibrillators. It has been a long, difficult, stressful journey. It seems that we are at last seeing light at the end of the tunnel. First, an introduction to the defibrillator machine.

A DEFIBRILLATOR or Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) gives a shock to the heart and combined with effective CPR provides the best chance of survival for those experiencing cardiac arrest. The AED delivers measured electric shocks to attempt to restore the heart to a normal rhythm.

Each minute before an AED is used decreases a casualty's chance of survival.

There are defib machines at the Delamere Store, at the Cape Jervis Community Club, Sealink Terminal and Second Valley shop/camping ground. They can be used by untrained people as the calm voice guides the user through each step and, as time is critical, it is better for an untrained person to use it rather than wait for someone who is trained.

For help with either the defib or with CPR a call to 000 will enable a St John's officer to talk you through the process.

Below are some contact numbers. Keep them in your phone, on the fridge or in your purse or wallet.

### A suggested strategy:

- Begin CPR (if untrained phone 000 for ambos to talk you through the process)

- Phone for ambulance
- Organise the Defib machine.

REMEMBER these numbers are to be used only in a health emergency requiring the defibrillator.

We hope these machines will never be used but if you were the patient, or loved one of the patient consider how you would feel if no-one was prepared to take action, did not have contact details for a defib machine or a strategy for dealing with such an event or, in fact, as at the Cape, a machine is not accessible.

### A Community Defibrillator/AED

A small group of Cape locals has decided to do some fundraising in order to purchase another machine for the Cape, one which will be accessible twenty four hours a day. To this end a fund has been started with several hundred dollars contributed already. A 'thermometer' or such will be at the Tavern, tracking progress.

About the end of October there will be a community event designed to have some fun and raise more funds, perhaps through raffles and other means.

Watch for notices and fliers and further updates through the *Cape Jervis Courier* page.

In the meantime if you can contribute some small change or a larger amount it will help to reach the goal. If you are able to contribute goods or services for raffle prizes and /or an auction, please let us know.

It is anticipated that there will be an unveiling of the machine when in place.

## Keeping Fit: Lateral Shoulder Raise

The Shoulder Joint has a vast array of possible movements which also makes it vulnerable to injuries and bursa impingement. Exercises which 'open up' the joint can help increase the shoulders function and stability.

- In good posture, stand with you arms by your side and thumbs pointing upwards (palms facing forward).
- keeping your arms straight, slowly raise them till almost making a 'T shape' with your body (about 85 degrees).
- Importantly your thumbs are still pointing upwards and your shoulders don't shrug upwards during the action.
- With control, lower arms back to the starting position. Repeat 10-15 times, if you can.
- If too easy, fill two 500ml milk

- bottles and use as weights.
- Exhale your breath as you lift your arms each time.

As always what has been suggested is general information and doesn't take into account an individuals limitations or needs. Seek a medical opinion to see if this exercise is appropriate for you.

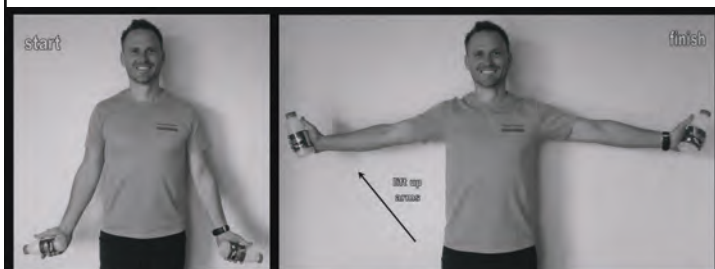
