FLAG FOOTBALL

On September 3, 2025 a group of Mahomet-Seymour girls blazed new trails and made history as they became the first team in school history to play an official IHSA flag football game that took place in Kankakee, IL.

Although they lost the first game, they would avenge that loss to Kankakee when the Bulldogs won their home opener a week later.

As the team marched through the short season improvement was made each and every game. An exciting time for these girls, the community, and girls sports as a whole.

1,000 POINTS

Senior Jackson Bohm scored his 1,000th point on December 23, 2025 in a game against Romeoville at the State Farm Classic held in Normal, IL. A significant milestone for Bohm early in the season. Bohm would go on to have a stellar senior season leading the Bulldogs. Bohm earned all-conference, all-area, and all-state honors this season. He was also named The News-Gazette's Boys' Basketball Player of the Year. He will continue his basketball career at Illinois Wesleyan University.

3-Peat

Mady Marx's dominant track career ended in dominant fashion. Marx first won a state title her sophomore year in the 400m dash. It was a title she wouldn't relinquish the rest of her prep career. She capped off the three-peat her senior season winning the 400m dash state title with a time of 55.17. Marx capped one of the greatest careers in school history and will continue at Ball State.

Marco Casillas

Sophomore, Marco Casillas placed second at the IHSA 2A 190-pound state finals. This coming off of a third place finish his freshman year in the 175-pound class. Expectations will be high going forward, but Casillas will be up for the challenge.

Girls Wrestling Makes History

The Mahomet-Seymour girls' wrestling squad won the program's first team regional title in February.

400 WINS

Mahomet-Seymour varsity baseball coach, Nic DiFilippo reached his 400th career varsity win on May 7, 2026 in the Bulldogs 5-3 win at Charleston.

One Swing - One Defining Moment

Northern Illinois Huskies, Ivan Dahlberg, walked-off a Friday conference win over Miami (OH) in dramatic fashion in March. With the bases loaded in extra innings, the senior catcher blasted a ball over the right field fence to win what would be the first of a three game sweep over the Red Hawks that weekend.

At the time, it was just another swing. Looking back, it was the moment that launched one of the most memorable seasons in program history, ending with a MAC Tournament title and the school's first NCAA Regional appearance since 1972.





A Season Like No Other

2026 NIU Huskie Baseball Makes History

The Huskies captured the program's first Mid-American Conference Tournament championship, going 4-0 and defeating Toledo 5-1 in the title game. NIU outscored its opponents 32-9 during the tournament, trailed just once, and rode a dominant pitching staff that posted a 1.80 ERA while holding opponents to a .193 batting average.

The championship sent the Huskies to the NCAA Baseball Championship for the first time since 1972.

History continued in Tallahassee as NIU earned the first NCAA Tournament victory in program history, defeating Coastal Carolina 12-10 in the NCAA Regional at Mike Martin Field at Dick Howser Stadium. The Huskies also became the first Mid-American

Conference team to win a regional game since Central Michigan in 2022.

Head Coach, Ryan Copeland, has turned the Huskies baseball program around in just three short years. The season prior to Copeland's arrival, the Huskies posted a 10-43 record during the 2023 season. Copeland's first two seasons (2024 and 2025) the Huskies posted a record of 21-33 each season.

Northern Illinois finished the 2026 season 36-19 overall and 21-12 in MAC play, capping one of the most memorable seasons in program history.

Affordable

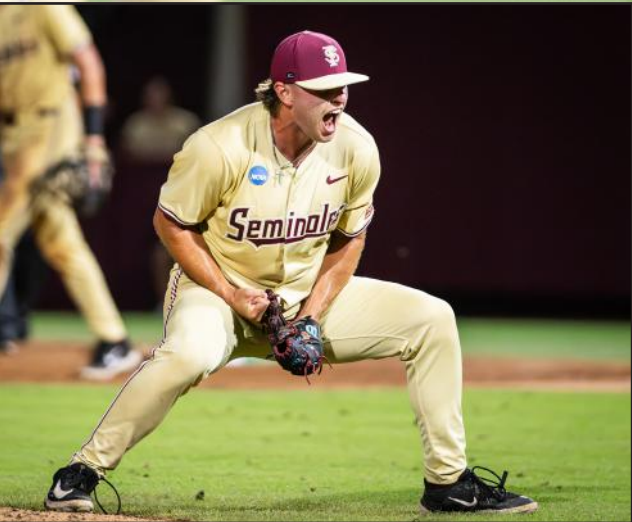
With each media day, the athletes pay a session fee upfront which includes a coupon to use towards photo purchases.

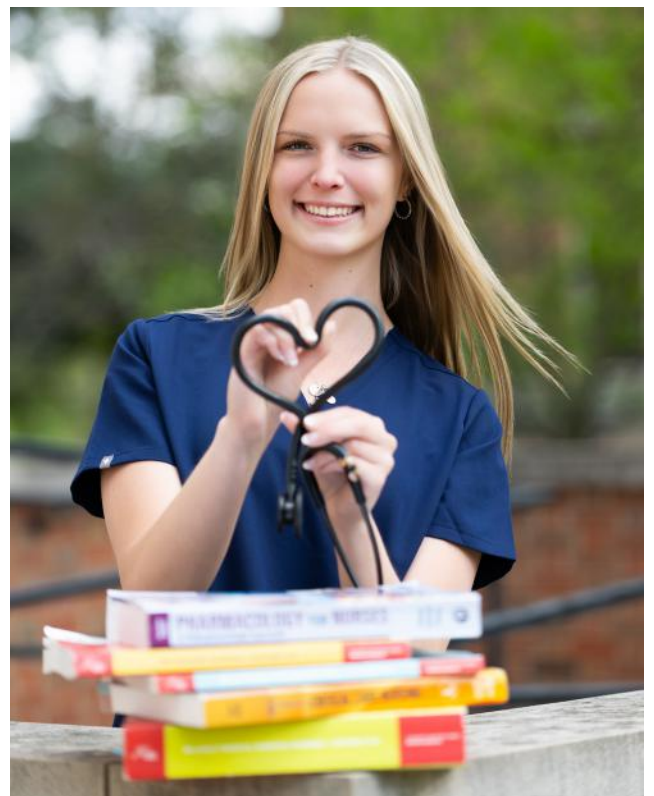
Beyond the Game

Two Inaugural Seasons In One

It was a privilege to capture the first-ever Mahomet-Seymour High School flag football game in the fall of 2025. At the time, I had no idea the journey would continue just a few months later with another historic opportunity.

In the spring of 2026, the Illinois College Lady Blues became the first downstate college in Illinois to field an official

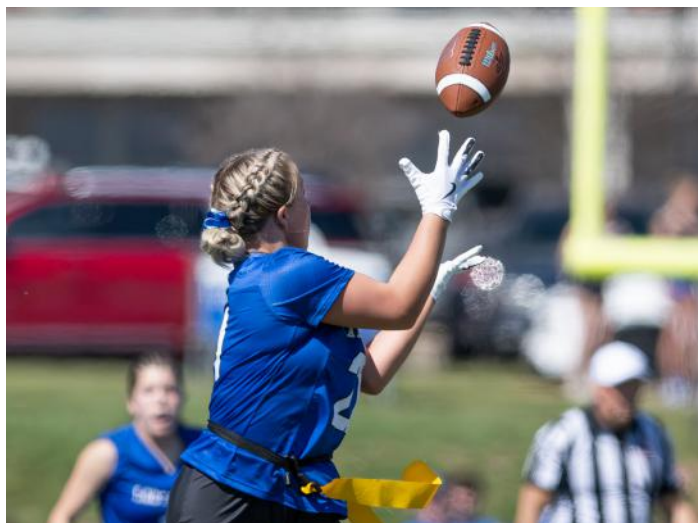
women's flag football team. That opportunity took me to Chicago and the Chicago Bears practice facility, where the Lady Blues opened their inaugural season



alongside other programs helping usher in a new era of collegiate flag football.

What began with a historic night in Mahomet came full circle on a much larger stage. Being able to document two inaugural seasons in the same year was a reminder that some of the most memorable moments aren't championships or records, but simply the beginning of something new.
