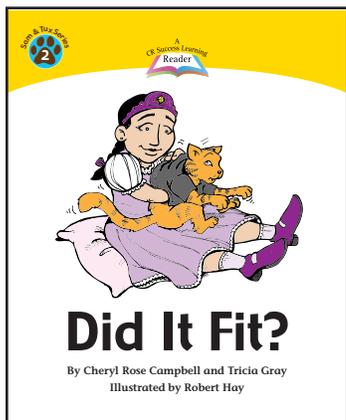


The Book Lesson for *Did It Fit?*



Book Summary: Jim and Liz like to dress up their pets. They try a cap, a hat, and a top. All of the items fit, but the pets either don't like them, or they fall off. Eventually, Jim and Liz put tags on the pets' collars and everyone is happy.

Analysis of Skills:

Vocabulary:

T.R.I.C.K.y Words: New: *for, said, put, you, from*
Review: *a, like, the, look, I, we*

Tense: Past

Syntax: Sentence/question (Did it fit? It did fit.)

Pronouns: *you, it, we*

Punctuation: period, question mark, exclamation mark, quotation marks

Vocabulary: *tuxedo, tux*

Comprehension Focus: Setting

Book Lesson

Before Reading	Book Introduction	Read the back blurb: Jim and Liz love to dress up their pets. But what do Sam and Tux think?
	Personal Connection	Ask: Have you ever seen a pet dressed in clothes?
	Oral Language	Discuss <i>tuxedo</i> , tags for pets. Ask students if they know where people can buy pet tags. Discuss the change from the question, <i>Did it fit?</i> to the answer, <i>It did fit</i> .
	Vocabulary T.R.I.C.K.y Words Focus Word	Read <i>for, said, put, you, from</i> on page 27. Point out the underlined words in the phrases. Echo read phrases with students. Point out the word <i>fit</i> on page 26. Follow the Focus Word procedure. Possible examples and non-examples: My new dress fits perfectly. The top fit even though it was too big. I can fit an elephant into a little box. Mom sewed a skirt to fit me. Say: Turn to a partner and discuss something you have had that doesn't fit.
	Four-Step Vocabulary	Have students look at page 26. 1. Choral Read 2. Teacher says, students point and read 3. Teacher gives definition, students point and read 4. Teacher randomly points, student reads.
