Significant tree trimming works - Winchelsea Lions Park



To help promote regeneration and for public safety reasons, significant tree trimming works will be carried out on 10 Elm trees at Winchelsea Lions Park, next to the highway.

Arborists have determined that the trees' deadwood needs to be removed to reduce the crowns back to live wood, so that they can continue to grow from these points.

The deadwood in the tree canopies has increased a lot in the last few years, which is largely due to corellas stripping the upper canopy branches. We had hoped that natural regeneration would occur, but unfortunately the damage has been too significant.

When: The tree works are expected to take place 30 - 31 August, weather permitting. Access to the park will be maintained during the works.

Moriac Primary School 100 Year Celebration



Moriac Primary School has been in operation for 101 years. Unfortunately we were not able to celebrate our centenary last year due to Covid. Moriac Primary School was established in 1922, built by the Mori Progress Association on land donated by the Deppeler Family.

The Deppeler brothers, who owned "Ravenswood" and "Merrijij", decided, in spite of an unenthusiastic Education Department, to go ahead with the erection of a tiny school.

Apparently, the Department must have had a change of heart because the new school, a timber building on the present site, was officially opened in 1922 then Minister of Education, Sir Alexander Peacock.

Actually the building was rented from the Deppelers at the time, but was later purchased outright.

The opening attendance was said to be 27 pupils under the charge of Joseph M Cahill.

From these humble beginnings Mori Primary School has grown into an integral part of the wider Mori community.

We now have an enrolment of over 200 students and we have a strong sense of community and the school.

National Karate Tournament 2022



Last weekend 13th and 14th of August, Winchelsea Kyokushin Karate Club sent seven students up to Sydney as part of the Victorian Team to compete at the 2022 National Championships.

In the Non-Contact on Saturday:

In the 6 & 7 YO we had 3 competitors, all fighting with great skill. Raina D'Agostino and Cooper Winn did not get to the finals but Rune D'Agostino placed equal 3rd in what was one of the biggest division of the weekend.

In the 13 - 15 YO Division we had Charlie Wilson and Taylor Holmes (Colac) in the final against each other with Charlie taking the honours but the day was not finished for these 2 girls as both were fighting again in the padded contact.

In the padded knockdown section Cooper Winn went absolutely bananas to win the Australian Championship of the Male 8-9 Lightweight. Cooper had to



fight 3 different opponents, in which he beat with head kicks and fast, heavy punches.

In the 13 YO middleweight, Summah Wilson also took equal 3rd in her division with a strong performance.

After Saturday, Cooper Winn and Charlie Wilson had become Australian Champions, one of many for both of them who are now both State & National Champions for 2022.

When we came into the Sunday we were all full of anticipation and the fighters did not let us down.

Shelley Wilson (Charlie & Summah's Mum) won the female veteran heavyweight (Full Contact) with a very

strong performance. Shelley fought the one opponent over 2 rounds and won after stopping her opponent several times in round 2.

Next up was Jess Winn who was in the Open Middleweight (Full Contact), and won her opening fight quickly with a knockout win about some heavy punches and kicks. Jess then faced old Dojo partner and long time friend Lily Shields (Bellarine) in the final. Both girls put on a great show with what many people classed as the fight of the day with Lily taking the win.

- 3rd Places x 2

Unreal effort from our little dojo in Winchelsea! I'm very proud of everyone who not only competed in Sydney, but helped the guys prepare for the event over the last couple of months.

Winchelsea Shire Hall Kitchen Renovations Planned

While the main hall of the magnificent former Winchelsea Shire Hall underwent a fabulous renovation courtesy of Surf Coast Shire at the end of last year, the project did not extend to its kitchen.

That kitchen is usable, but in need of its own modernisation to meet current catering expectations. Plans are now

under way to reinvigorate the kitchen to provide suitable facilities for events and activities requiring food and drink at scale.

The main priorities at this point are a commercial dishwasher (who likes to do stacks of dishes by hand!), a commercial fridge, a coffee machine and its accoutrements, and things like a commercial sandwich press and pie-warmer. There's also all the basics such as pots and pans to obtain. Various benchtops and cupboards could use a refresh, too.



As you would expect, anything with the word "commercial" in it is not cheap. Accordingly, Winch House is seeking funding to enable the kitchen renovation. We have been successful in a grant application to the Foundation for Rural & Regional Renewal (FRRR), under their "Strengthening Rural Communities" program. We are very grateful to The William Buckland Foundation and Equity Trustees who have provided \$9,000 towards the kitchen project, and the FRRR for seeing the value in having a catering-friendly kitchen for community use.

Further grants and donations are being sought to cover the considerable equipment costs plus installation where required. We'd like to think that we'll have a modern, efficient and well-resourced commercial-quality kitchen by the end of this year. This will open up opportunities for events such as weddings, community-group dinners, family celebrations and corporate conferences where a meal is desired. Winch House, of course, won't be providing catering (not just yet, anyway), so the kitchen will be available for third-party use, for example the footy-netball club. We're also looking into providing related local courses and training such as barista, food preparation and handling, and hospitality.

Remember, the Shire Hall is now being managed by Winch House and must be financially self-sustaining in the near future - Surf Coast Shire are covering the position of community development coordinator, Jill, only for 3 years, and by then the space will have to generate enough income to cover all of its energy, cleaning, operating and staffing costs. It's quite a challenge, but we have plenty of ideas, and a wonderful person pushing them forward in Jill. Watch this space, as they say!

Soldier Settlement schemes in Victoria.

Sunday Series talk: Sunday 28 August 2022

After WW1 the Victorian Government introduced a scheme to settle returned soldiers on the land. The scheme continued a tradition of placing settlers on blocks of land that were too small for viable farming. The scheme proved to be disastrous for many settlers and a huge financial cost to the state. In salvaging the scheme a voluminous archival record was created. This talk will briefly survey the Soldier Settlement scheme and describe what can be learned by researching from the records deposited in the Public Record Office.

Charles Fahey taught history at Latrobe University. His research interests are the Victorian goldfields, the history of rural settlement and farming in Victoria, and the history of the labour market. He was recently a joint author of *Mallee Country, People, History, Place*. (Monash 2020). He is presently writing a history of the Sunshine Harvester Works and work in the Agricultural Implement Industry.

This talk is part of the Geelong Museum Association's monthly 'Sunday Series' of talks. Details may be found on the Geelong Museum Association Inc. Facebook page.

Introducing our newest staff member Justine, who will be offering one-on-one counselling for adult members of our community. Justine can support you with challenges that you face in your day-to-day life.

Counselling can be effective for:

Appointments are charged at a flat rate of \$10 for a 50 minute session, which will be invoiced monthly. Up to six sessions are offered before a plan review.

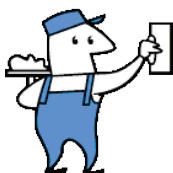

Homelessness

'I'm homeless,' a friend said to me recently.

I looked at her, astonished. I had visited her in her unit not long before and admired the way she had set up her home and the beauty she had brought to the garden.

'Yes,' she went on. 'The landlord put the rent up and I can't afford it. I've looked everywhere and can't find anything I can afford.'

'Where are you staying now?' I asked, thinking she might be sleeping in her car.

'I'm house-sitting for a friend, but it won't last long.'

'You can stay in my little spare room if you are desperate,' I told her, but knew that was not a permanent solution.

What to do??

I was outraged that such a thing could happen in our beautiful, wealthy country. No-one should be homeless, least of all someone who has for years contributed so much to the community all her life, particularly through volunteering in various ways.

We know that homelessness is increasing, particularly among older women. My friend is about seventy. Getting work is not an option.

It should not have been my friend's situation, for me, so in-your-face, that stirred my concern into passion.

Homelessness is so unjust, for anyone. It is not God's will!

Everywhere I look in the Bible lately has been reminding me that justice, righteousness and generosity are core to God's desire for the world. Amos said:

'Let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream.'

Isaiah said: 'Stop doing wrong, learn to do what is right. Seek justice, encourage the oppressed. Defend the cause of the fatherless, plead the case of the widow.'

Jesus said: 'What you have done for the least of these, you have done to me.'

Paul said: 'God loves a cheerful giver.'

And many other sayings.

I have been saying to God: 'What should I do? What should I do?'

I have been looking, and seeking advice. I have come across wise people knowledgeable in this area.

I have discovered that a man called Alexander Miller, a committed Christian, a Methodist who lived in Geelong and died in 1914, began providing homes for the poor. He left a legacy that continues to this day, now administered by Wintringham Homes. I had never heard of this before!

More than seventy beautiful little homes are provided in Geelong for those who need them most, some in East Geelong, in Belmont, Highton and Manifold Heights, and many others across Victoria. They are all occupied, of course, and more are to be built soon near Waurin Ponds. They still won't meet the need.

Yesterday, I heard that my friend has found a place at last. But the issue, and my question, remains. What should I do?

The question is for us all, on this and many other issues. What should WE do?

Leave it to the government? That's disinterest. Pressure the government? Probably.

Follow Alexander Miller's example and do something ourselves? How? Let us pray, think and work together.
