

- If you miss a day, don't worry. You can catch up, skip ahead or do whatever you choose. Don't let missing a day (or two or more) stop you from following along. The goal is not perfection.

We look forward to hearing how God speaks to you over the next three weeks through the Bible, the stories of his people and prayers as you learn, apply, and are encouraged by the characteristics of God reflected in his many names.

DAY ONE: THE LORD OUR SAVIOR

T'sidkenu comes from two Hebrew words. T'sedik, is translated as rightness, which means to be straight or stiff. The word T'sidkenu added to Jehovah shows that God deals with mankind in righteousness and justice. Or the right way of doing things.

Israel was not known for righteousness. The reason for its lack of righteousness is the same for us; failing to follow the Word of God in obedience. In the life of Abraham, we see a man who followed God in obedience. As he did this, God counted his obedience to him as righteousness! Wow. Ecstatic praise pours out of my mouth until everyone hears how God has set me free. Many will see his miracles; they'll stand in awe of God and fall in love with him!" Psalms 40:1-3 TPT

The Bible is full of stories of deliverance. Some of my favorites are Moses and the children of Israel. Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego in the fiery furnace. Daniel in the lion's den. Samson. DAY EIGHT: THE LORD IS MY COUNSELOR

Christ is our Wonderful Counselor before God. He comforts, consoles and counsels us as our Mediator and Intercessor. As our Advocate before God, He defends us like a lawyer before the bar of God's justice, offering Himself as a payment for our crimes.

I cannot count how many times the Lord has comforted me and has allowed me to be a comfort to someone. It's important for us to understand that being comforted can also mean receiving strength, encouragement, and hope to deal with our troubles. 2 Corinthians 1: 3-4 reads, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God."

A yoke is a heavy wooden harness that fits over the shoulders of an ox or oxen. A person may be carrying heavy burdens of sin, excessive demands of leaders, oppression or persecution. Jesus frees people from all these burdens and he comforts us. The rest that Jesus promises is love, healing and peace with God, not the end of all labor. A relationship with God changes meaningless, worrisome toil into spiritual productivity and purpose.

Matthew 11:28–30 reads, "Come to Me, all of you who work and have heavy loads. I will give you rest. Follow my teachings and learn from me. I am gentle and do not have pride. You will have rest for your souls. For my way of carrying a load is easy and my load is not heavy."

PRAYER

Lord, we thank you for comforting us in our times of doubt, worry, lonesomeness, and in seasons where we question what's next for us. We trust in you during those difficult times and ask that you take us by the hand and lead us into victory.
