“Wait! What just happened? Why can’t I see anything on my TV? It worked yesterday.”

These were the words that came out of my mouth when I sat down to watch TV and instead I got an error message stating the signal had been lost. I tried all the channels and none of them worked. I then reset the system because I knew this would be the first answer support would give me. The system still did not work. Next, I went outside and checked the receiver and everything looked good. Then I turned around and noticed that the tree I had planted four or five years ago had grown. I thought it could be the issue. I went inside and called support and after numerous questions, the tech support finally said, “You need to cut down the tree or you could move the receiver, but I think you need to get rid of the tree.” I politely ended the conversation.



After trying to make it work on my own and having no success, I called the company back and asked them to send out a technician. Something was going to have to change. As soon as the technician arrived, he saw the tree and said there is your problem. Isn't it funny how others can see your issues more clearly than you sometimes? And sometimes it takes the right voice for you to hear the issue. The technician said we can get rid of the tree or move the receiver. He quickly acknowledged that getting rid of the tree was not a real answer and so he found a new place to put the receiver and did the work. Once everything was moved and hooked up, the technician came into the house to check the signal. All was good and there was a signal to the TV again.

You may be tempted to say, “What does this have to do with me or Jesus?” One moment, life is good and you feel connected to Jesus and all is well. Then suddenly you feel like you have lost your connection and you wonder “where is God”. Often in life, there are things that seem to grow in our lives that end up blocking our connection with God. Sometimes it arises quickly and other times it comes slowly. Maybe it is brokenness in a relationship with a family member or close friend. Maybe it is grieving the loss of someone close or a pet. Maybe it's an illness or a change in health or your job. Or maybe it is some other issue that has severed your relationship with God. We don't always know where it comes from initially, we just know when we have lost the signal.

The temptation is to think we can handle our issues on our own or it's not a big deal. The truth is, the issue is probably having a bigger drain on our lives than we imagine. The truth is also, we need others in our lives to help guide us, support us, give us wisdom, and just love us. Proverbs 27:17 states *"as iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another"*. It takes the interaction with another human to help us grow and become stronger and wiser. Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 declares, *"Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. For if they fall, one will lift up his fellow. But woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up! Again, if two lie together, they keep warm, but how can one keep warm alone? And though a man might prevail against one who is alone, two will withstand him—a threefold cord is not quickly broken."*

Both of these verses stress the importance of having others involved in your life who know you well and will be able to help you move through difficult times. Others may see what we cannot see, or know what we do not know, or may state the obvious that we just don't want to deal with. They may also help us figure out a way around the barrier to help restore God's signal.

Sharing our hurts or brokenness with others is not always easy as we don't like to reveal our struggles, and we are not always certain how they may respond. We believe God can take care of our issue and He can, but often God works through others to help bring healing and restore our connection to the Almighty. As we seek to be treated and cared for, so we must do the same for others (Matthew 22:39). Please note that sometimes it might require the help of a trained counselor to help us as God has equipped them with the gifts of wisdom and healing to re-connect us with God. I remind you, Jesus helped his disciples improve their connection with God by showing them the obstacles and helping them to remove them.

So how is your signal with Jesus? Is there something in the way? Have you asked another to journey with you? Have they helped you see the obstacles you need to move or do you need to change how you receive the message? Having a good connection with Jesus will impact every other area of your life, so work on your connection issues. Involve another or others you trust and begin to see more clearly who God is and who he has made you to be. We journey with Jesus to be like Jesus because it is the only way to clearly see God.

The Chosen

Have you seen it yet? The Chosen is a video series about the life of Jesus. The series is based off the stories of Jesus captured in the Bible. The writers have used some creative interpretation to build some scenarios to put some context. The result is an experience of encountering Jesus in a way that may challenge or refresh you, depending on where you are in your journey.

We have already watched Season 1, so let's meet to watch Season 2. We will plan to meet after worship on Sunday and plan to start the video around 10:45am. We will plan to watch the video and then have a time of discussion afterwards. All are invited to participate. If you have young children, we will have someone to watch those in preschool and nursery. Children older than this will be encouraged to sit with their parents and encounter Jesus. Because of previous obligations, we will plan to meet on an every other week schedule (**Sept 12 and 26, Oct 10 and 24, Nov 7 and 21 and Dec 5 and 19**) and allow us to finish just before Christmas.

One idea is we could share a food/snack during or after the video. This option has some complications:

- With the increase in Covid numbers, will we be able to even meet together?
- If we are able to meet, can we even have food?
- How do we prepare food when we don't know the number of people who will be attending?

Obviously these are days we have to "pivot." If we can have food, I would like for someone to help coordinate and plan the snack/food for each week. If you have any suggestion or would be willing to help, please contact Pastor Marc by September 6th so we have a week to prepare before the first meeting.

Know the real food will be the video and the conversation afterwards. It will be great to Journey with Jesus to be like Jesus through these videos to help prepare our heart for his birth.

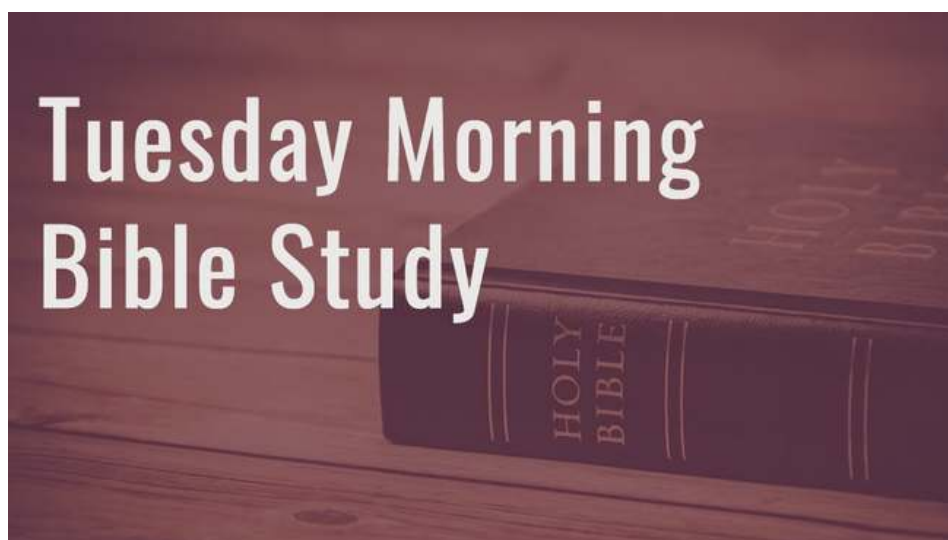

From Bill Erickson (International Friendship, Inc.)...

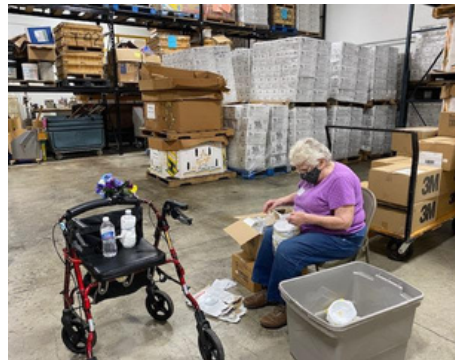
Thank you for asking about how things are going with International Friendships' outreach, and thank you, Savoy UMC, for your very encouraging support of what IFI is doing to connect international students with our Christian community. Here is the tip of the iceberg, as far as what has been happening:

After a very fast start by IFI, in connecting scores of international students in friendship with Christians in the community in the fall of 2019, the pandemic brought an unexpected challenge. However, a determined group of willing volunteers continued to maintain friendships with students throughout 2019 and 2020 by facilitating zoom groups, responding to pressing everyday needs of students, and hosting small gatherings as health recommendations allowed. In the spring of 2021, as conditions improved on campus, IFI made more and more events available to students. These enjoyable activities were greatly appreciated by them after being isolated for such a long time. Friendships continued to deepen, and our numbers actually grew during this time, mainly by word of mouth. All through the past two years, dozens of trusting relationships have been steadily built by demonstrating genuine care and this has fostered many opportunities to share the truth of Christ.

With the school year beginning in August, please pray that we can remobilize many friendship families and individuals who will again reach out to befriend some students. We are also looking for volunteers to help with a welcoming picnic for new internationals on August 29th, from 3:00-7:30 at Hessel Park. Pray that regular Bible discovery groups will again be possible in the homes of area volunteers this fall. Ask the Lord to supply more volunteers who will help facilitate fun events, prepare food, offer English conversation for students or their spouses, provide transportation, or lend a truck or a hand moving furniture. Lastly, pray for the addition of key volunteers, team members, and associate staff for IFI, in order to impact more of the lives of the thousands of international students passing through our community every year. May God richly bless your congregation this fall!

MIDWEST MISSION

On Thursday, August 12 there were eight of us "missionaries" who fellowshiped at lunch and worked for a few hours at Midwest Mission Distribution Center. We all had a great time together! Our group packed cleaning supplies in buckets and hammered on the lids. These supplies will be used by UMCOR to help with disaster clean-up. We filled 55 buckets with detergents, clothesline & clothespins, trash bags, gloves and sponges. 52 pounds of in-kind donations were given from our church. We later received word that the clean supplies buckets we filled were sent to Gibson City. We never know how God will use our seemingly small tasks to help others in a huge way. We plan to do this again in the coming months, so if you were unable to make it this time, watch for future notices. MMDC has many jobs for all skill, stamina and strength levels.

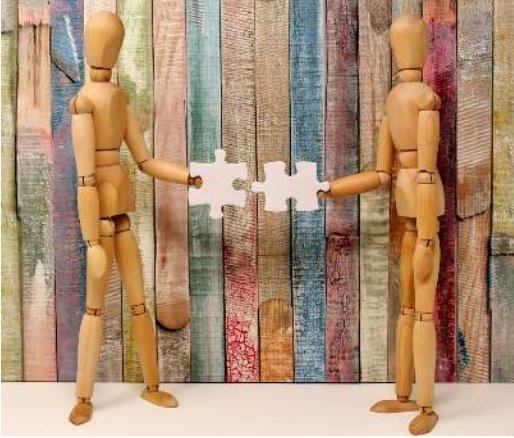
United Methodist Women
