Winter Waterfalls

In winter, Kalamunda in the Perth Hills comes alive. Seasonal rains transform dry streams into flowing creek beds and waterfalls, bringing movement, mist and a renewed energy to the landscape. It's a time to discover and the best time to see the waterfalls in full flow. Let's explore!

Lesmurdie Falls, Lesmurdie

Perched along the Darling Range escarpment within Mundy Regional Park, Lesmurdie Falls is one of the Perth Hills' standout winter experiences. Seasonal rains bring the 50-metre waterfall to life, tumbling over granite rock faces and sending mist through the valley below.

A short drive from Perth, the Falls can be accessed from Forrestfield or Lesmurdie. From the upper car park on Falls Road, a short stroll beside a babbling stream leads to sweeping views across the Swan Coastal Plain towards the Perth CBD, with two viewing platforms offering elevated vantage points, with one directly over the top of the drop! At the base, accessed via Palm Terrace, the experience becomes more immersive. After rain, the bushland changes from dry to lush, birds are singing, and muddy puddles line the track - gumboots are well worth packing! The reward is a close-up view of the falls in full flow, be prepared to get splashed! A favourite for photographers, walkers and nature lovers.

Lesmurdie Falls

Whistlepipe Gully, Forrestfield

Also located within Mundy Regional Park, Whistlepipe Gully might be less dramatic but it's equally as beautiful. After a few days of rain, the gully comes alive. The stream fills with a series of small waterfalls, cascades and flowing rapids as water moves over granite rocks and settles into rock pools. Sections of the gully take on a cool, almost temperate rainforest feel, with ferns thriving in the damp, shaded conditions, a juxtaposition against the native landscape.

The best way to experience Whistlepipe Gully is to follow the stream up one side of the valley and back along the other, offering changing perspectives and sweeping views across the Swan Coastal Plain. Along the way, the remains of Wallace Greenham's 1960s stone home sit quietly beside the water, perched on the granite outcrop, a subtle reminder of the area's past.

Rocky Pool, Piesse Brook

Rocky Pool is a favourite winter spot for locals and visitors. After the first rains, the brook transforms from a dry bed into a lively stream, rushing over granite rocks and cascading into the pool below. Located within Kalamunda National Park off Schipp Road in Piesse Brook, the 1.7km walk along the Piesse Brook Interpretive Trail is part of the appeal. Winding through jarrah and marri forest, the track includes water crossings after heavy rains and the occasional steep climb to keep things interesting. Granite outcrops offer spectacular valley views and interpretive signage along the way shares insights into local flora, fauna and history.

The trail opens to Rocky Pool, nestled in the valley among granite boulders. Water gushes over rock ledges creating a cascading waterfall into the pool. Climb down for a closer look, dip your toes in, or if you're up for it, the clear, cold water offers a refreshing swim – not quite an ice plunge, but enough to awaken the senses and leave you invigorated! It's also an ideal place to pause, with plenty of spots to sit on the rocks, enjoy a picnic and spend some time in nature.

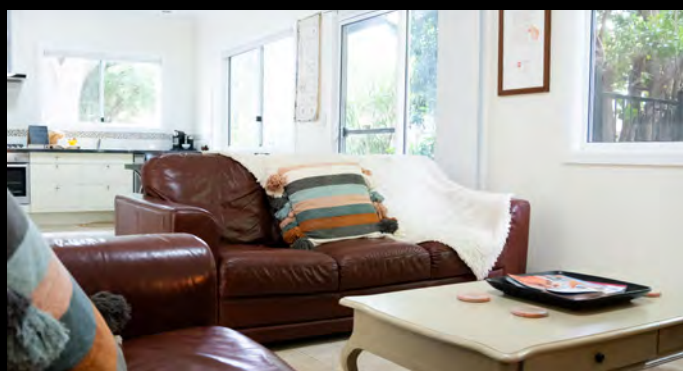

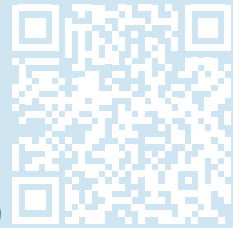

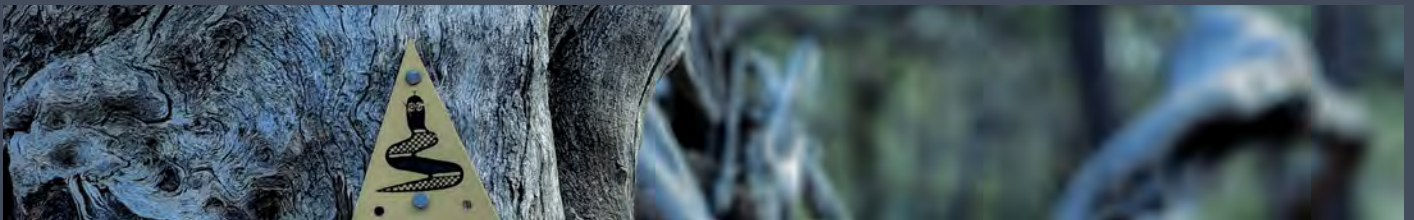


Just lacing up your boots is one thing but elevating your hiking experience entirely is another.

Trails

TO DISCOVER THIS WINTER

1. Lesmurdie Brook Cultural Trail

1.5km Loop • 1hr • Dogs Allowed on Lead
Start Point: Falls Road, Lesmurdie

There is a lot to enjoy on this easy loop walk that follows Lesmurdie Brook in Mundy Regional Park. Beautifully handcrafted bridges and seats are located along the trail providing plenty of opportunities to watch the brook meander and cascade down towards the spectacular Lesmurdie Falls. The trail is at its best in winter and spring when water is plentiful, and wildflowers are abundant. The trail also features six interpretive signs that tell stories about Aboriginal life, culture, and use of plants.

2. Victoria Reservoir

6km Loop • 2-4hrs • Dogs Prohibited
Start point: Korung Road, Carmel

The Victoria Reservoir Trail in Carmel is a moderately challenging hike through a historic pocket of the Perth Hills. Starting in Korung National Park, the track passes a settler's grave and winds through jarrah forest to the new Victoria Dam, with the ruins of the original 1891 dam below. Interpretive signage shares the site's history, while a picnic area beneath the dam offers a quiet place to pause. The trail continues to a historic timber bridge before looping back uphill.

3. Hill Street

2.4km Loop • 1hr • Dogs Prohibited
Start point: Hill Street, Gooseberry Hill

The Hill Street Walk is an easy trail through native bushland in Kalamunda National Park, Gooseberry Hill. Peaceful and family-friendly, it winds through jarrah and redgum forest, with views across the Helena Valley. Keep your eye out for Black Cockatoos! Wildflowers brighten the track from August.

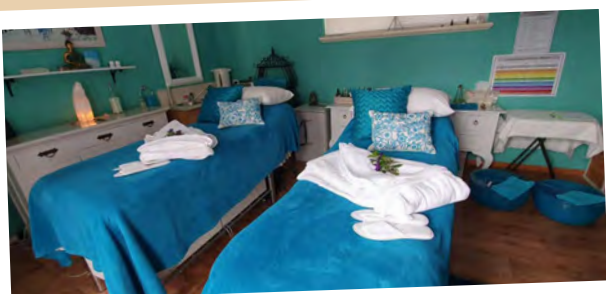

The Kalamunda Hotel

Local distiller Hilton, owner of HHH Spirits, is bringing something special to the table this winter: a small-batch single malt whisky crafted for slow sipping and savouring through the colder months. Alongside his established gin and vodka range, this latest release marks another step forward in his distilling journey. We caught up with Hilton during last years' Experience Winter Kalamunda, where he shared his passion for the craft and the story behind pursuing his dream of creating handcrafted spirits from scratch.

Following the success of his first single malt whisky batch which won the 2024 Beer and Spirit Awards Best Spirit in WA, Hilton has now produced a second release, one designed to warm the soul on even the chilliest of days.

TACO MARÍA

Tacos, Tequila and a Whole Lot of Heart

Located in the centre of Kalamunda, Taco Maria brings a vibrant burst of colour, flavour and personality to the local dining scene. Family-friendly and full of energy, this much-loved restaurant has carved out a reputation for delivering Mexican cuisine that is both playful and of exceptional quality.

The story behind Taco Maria is as personal as it is delicious. Built on a genuine love of Mexican food, the concept grew from a desire to introduce something fresh to the Hills. "We are just personally massive fans of Mexican food and wanted to bring a cuisine that was fresh and delicious but also healthy to the Kalamunda dining scene," the team explains. Even the name carries a story; Chef's wife, Maria, providing both inspiration and identity.

At its core, the menu celebrates traditional techniques with a modern, approachable edge. Described as "an array of handmade, slow cooked, Mexican masterpieces using traditional smoked chillis and spices," each dish is balanced with vibrant, house-made salsas and guacamole prepared daily. The standout? The Grandes Plate - a generous, flavour-packed offering that showcases everything Taco Maria does well, from 16-hour refried beans to spiced barbecue corn and crisp tortillas.

Regulars, however, often find themselves returning as much for the drinks as the food.

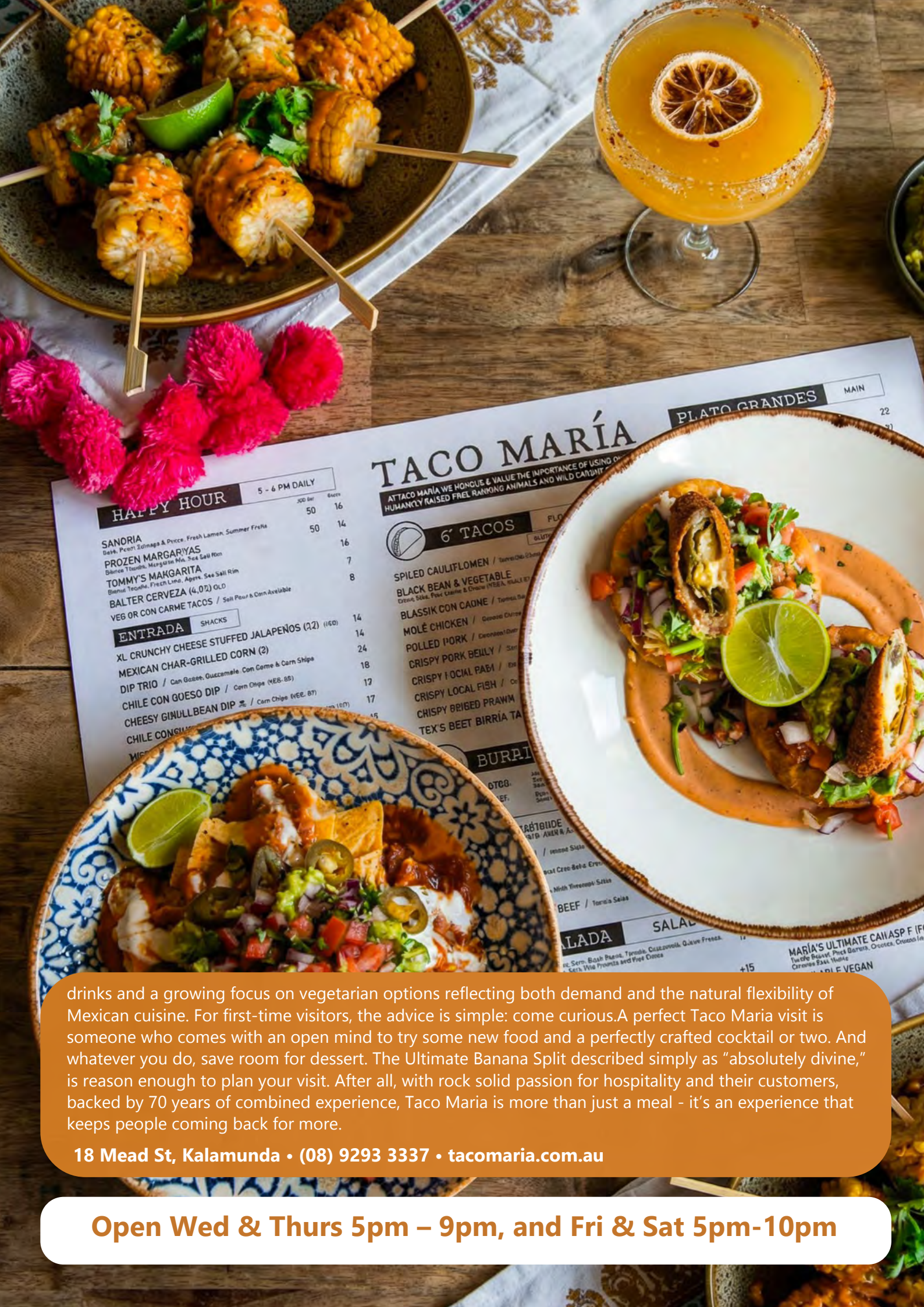


The Tommy margaritas, crafted with local organic lemons and 100 per cent agave tequila, are a particular favourite so much so they can almost pass as a health tonic! Step inside and the atmosphere is immediately inviting. Warm, colourful and unmistakably lively, Taco Maria leans into its sense of fun, with music playing a key role in shaping the experience. That same personality extends to its online presence, where a light-hearted tone keeps customers engaged and entertained. "We like to make it fun and light hearted so people hopefully have a laugh." Says owner, Maria.

Beyond the food and ambience, there is a strong connection to community. Having called Kalamunda home for more than two decades, the owners have long been part of the local fabric, consistently focused on bringing quality offerings to the area. That connection is reciprocated by diners, many of whom travel considerable distances to eat their food. Like many in hospitality, the journey has not been without its challenges. One of the more surprising has been reshaping perceptions around spice! Educating customers that the menu is not full of chilli has been key, with most dishes sitting comfortably at a low to medium heat, while house-made sauces cater to those who prefer a spicier kick. Behind the scenes, Taco Maria is also a place of growth. The team is largely made up of young staff, and watching their development has become one of the most rewarding aspects of the business.

"Teenagers today seem to get a bad rap, but we get great satisfaction watching their confidence blossom... we always pull together as a team and it is a beautiful thing." Looking ahead, the menu continues to evolve with seasonal specials, new...

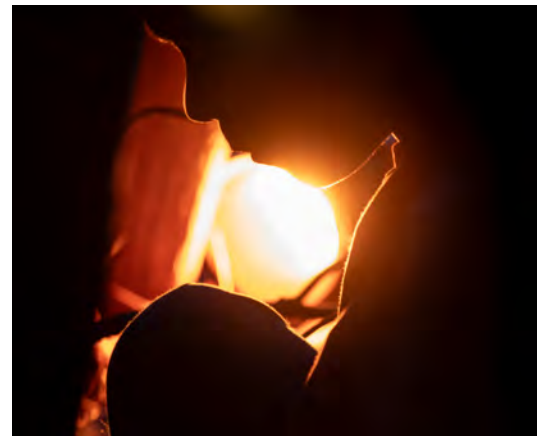

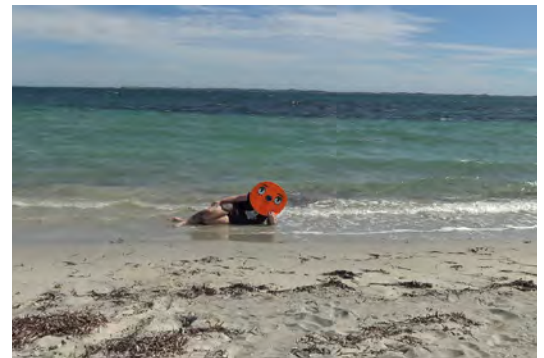
