Election Update

The City of Lawndale will hold its General Municipal Election on Tuesday, November 3, 2026.

Key Dates to Know

- **October 19, 2026**, is the last day to register to vote in the election.
- **Early October 2026**: Vote-by-mail ballots mailed to registered voters.
- **October 22 – November 3, 2026**: Same-day voter registration available at any Los Angeles County Vote Center.
- **November 3, 2026 (Election Day)**: Voting is from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm.

How to register to vote

If you have recently moved, are new to Los Angeles County, or are voting for the first time, you must register by October 19, 2026, to receive a vote-by-mail ballot.

City Announces Recruitment for New City Manager

The City of Lawndale officially began its recruitment efforts in search of a new City Manager in April 2026.

Following the resignation of City Manager, Sean Moore, the City Council engaged Bob Murray and Associates (BMA), an executive recruiting firm, to begin a thorough and comprehensive search designed to attract highly qualified candidates to fill this critical role for the City. Under the City Council-City Manager form of government, the City Manager is responsible for overseeing the day-to-day City operations, implementing City Council policies, and managing municipal services.

In April 2026, Lawndale residents and stakeholders were invited to provide input during the community townhall meeting. Over the coming months, the City anticipates reviewing applications, with the final selection expected by the late Summer of 2026.

New Building & Safety Services from Willdan Engineering

Since 1964, the Los Angeles County Public Works Department, Building & Safety Division, has provided the City of Lawndale with building inspections, plan check, permit issuance, and other building related services. As of June 30, 2026, LA County will no longer be providing these services to the City of Lawndale.

Earlier this year, the City of Lawndale released a request for proposals seeking a new firm to replace the County for Building & Safety services. On April 20, 2026, the City Council approved a service agreement with Willdan Engineering to be the City's new provider of Building & Safety services, effective July 1, 2026.

Between April 2026 to June 30, 2026, the City of Lawndale will be transitioning from LA County to Willdan for Building & Safety services. To find out how services will be impacted during the transition contact the Community Development Department at (310) 973-3230.

Seniors, Take Advantage of the Lawndale Special Transit!

The Lawndale Special Transit Program is a door-to-door service which operates Monday through Friday from 7:30 am to 3:00 pm and provides FREE transportation to Lawndale seniors at least 60 years of age. All rides must originate within the geographical boundaries of Lawndale, and all riders must live within City of Lawndale geographical boundaries. Rides are available for essential appointments such as medical, dental, laboratory, pharmacy or grocery shopping. Transportation is available for other purposes such as visits to the beauty salon, bank, post office, barber or others; however, medical and dental transportation takes precedent over all others. The Special Transit's medical service area includes rides to the incorporated cities of Lawndale, Hawthorne, Gardena, Torrance, Manhattan Beach and Redondo Beach. The designated transportation boundaries are as follows:



- Imperial Highway – Northern Boundary
- Torrance Boulevard – Southern Boundary
- Western Avenue – Eastern Boundary
- Sepulveda Boulevard – Western Boundary

To make a reservation for a ride, please call our 24-hour voicemail at (310) 973-3287 no less than 48 hours in advance and leave a message if the call is not answered. Calls will be prioritized on a first come, first served basis. Medical and dental appointments take priority over all others and will be scheduled first.

Senior Destinations

Meals on Wheels

The City of Lawndale, in partnership with the Salvation Army, Redondo Beach, offers daily home delivered meals to Lawndale residents. The meals are delivered to Lawndale elderly residents 60 years of age or older who are unable to prepare their own meals due to illness, physical handicap, or condition. Meals are delivered to resident homes Monday through Friday, between 10:00 am and 12:00 pm, no meals delivered on weekends or holidays. The cost of meals is \$5.50 per day per meal, and participants will be billed monthly.

Capital Improvement Program Update

Catch Basin Retrofit Project

A catch basin retrofit project scope of work involves improving stormwater quality and quantity by installing trash screen devices, modifying structures, or changing basin landscaping to filter pollutants, slow water flow, and enhance groundwater recharge. The scope typically includes surveying and site assessment, device fabrication and installation (e.g., trash screens), structural modifications (e.g., modifying outlet controls) to help reduce trash entering the catch basin system. Location is every catch basin within the city.

Youth Development Center

Youth Development Center / Municipal Services Building is planned to replace the existing building at Burin Avenue and De Oro Lane.

Lawndale Southern Revitalization Feasibility Study Project

The proposed stormwater capture project at a median area from 171st St. to Redondo Beach Blvd. will help the City of Lawndale in achieving its stormwater capture goals while providing multiple benefits to the neighborhood and surrounding environment. The project is an opportunity to incorporate dry wells that would capture and treat stormwater runoff from the nearby storm drain that would otherwise enter and pollute the region's waterways. The proposed green alley will incorporate bioretention, permeable pavement, trees, and native, drought tolerant plants. The project will help to address the City's municipal stormwater permit while also aligning with the goals of the Los Angeles County's Safe, Clean Water (SCW) Program. Proposed location is Alley north of Redondo Beach Blvd./Artesia Blvd., west of Hawthorne Blvd. and south of 172nd St. from Firmona Ave. to 172nd St. for Green Alley. 172nd St. from Grevillea Ave. to Hawthorne Blvd. for wet wells.

Redondo Beach Blvd. Metro Active Transport Project

Installation of bike lanes on the south side of Redondo Beach Blvd. from Artesia Blvd. to Prairie Ave. Currently in concept design.

4700 Block 161st Culvert

Rebuilding an existing collapsed culvert on 161st St. to enable proper water flow along the street.

2025 Pavement Management Program

The Pavement Management Program is updated every three years and was used to:

- Determine the current Pavement Condition Index (PCI) of the City's entire roadway network on a segment-by-segment basis.
- Identify feasible rehabilitation alternatives for each street segment and estimate the associated costs.
- Prepare a ten-year rehabilitation program for street segments requiring improvements in accordance with the City's budget.
- Forecast future pavement performance for each street segment throughout the City of Lawndale.

CDBG 602719-24 Sidewalk & ADA Ramp Project

The City's annual Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program provides continual preventative maintenance to repair existing damaged Lawndale sidewalks and ADA curb ramps. CDBG 602487-22 Sidewalk & ADA Ramp Project

The City's annual Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program provides continual preventative maintenance to repair existing damaged Lawndale sidewalks and ADA curb ramps. The annual CDBG Sidewalk & ADA Ramp project consists of removal and replacement of repairing damaged sidewalks, driveway approaches, ADA curb ramps, and curbs & gutters. The improvements occurred on the following street segments:

- Mansel Avenue (147th Street to 145th Street)
- 153rd Street (Hawthorne Boulevard to Freeman Avenue)
- 154th Street (Hawthorne Boulevard to Larch Avenue)
- Grevillea Avenue (Manhattan Beach Boulevard to 159th Street)
- 159th Street (Grevillea Avenue to Hawthorne Boulevard)
- Driveway Approach at 4321 W. 159th Street
- Driveway Approach at 15436 Mansel Avenue

The project was funded through Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds. The project was scheduled to begin in late April and was completed by mid-May 2025.

At-Home Composting

Did you know?

The City of Lawndale provides residents with Food Waste Bins. As a result of the passing of Senate Bill 1383 the City has received grant funds to purchase food waste bins that can help decrease the amount of organic material in the landfills. These food waste bins are FREE for Lawndale residents. Proof of residency is required and there is a limit of one (1) bin per household as supplies are limited.



Did you also know?

The City of Lawndale provides Backyard Composting Bins for residents that want to create their own compost. These compost bins, like the one pictured to the right, are FREE for Lawndale residents. Proof of residency is required and there is a limit of one (1) bin per household as supplies are limited.

Household Battery Disposal

Battery disposal is easy in Lawndale! Simply place your used household batteries in a sealed bag and set the bag on top of your blue recycling cart on your regular collection day. Republic Services will pick them up. If you live in an apartment or condo and do not have a curbside recycling cart, just place your batteries in a sealed bag and bring them to any City Facility and place the battery in the brown container on the public counters or bring them to the Public Works Department. You will see a brown battery container right outside the front office door where you can drop them off. It's quick, easy, and a great way to protect our community. Never put batteries in the trash or recycle carts!



SHARPS Mail-in Collection Program

Republic Services offers the residents of Lawndale, at no additional charge, the collection of used Sharps. Within one week of request, a Sharps container will be delivered to each requestor for proper disposal. Simply call Republic Services at (800) 299-4898 to request a Sharps container.



Do your part to keep Lawndale clean! BULKY ITEM PICKUP SERVICE

Guidelines and Instructions

- Single family homes get 6 free pickups per year. Multi-family residents get one bulky item pickup per year per unit.
- Republic Services will pick up 6 items at a time at no extra cost.
- Place items where trash and recycling are picked up.
- Items placed on private property will not be collected.
- Lawndale Municipal Code states that materials cannot be placed for collection earlier than 3 pm the day before the scheduled collection.



Prohibited Items

- Construction Materials: wood, concrete, bricks, dirt, wall-to-wall carpeting.
- Auto parts: Car seats, batteries, doors, fenders, motors, gas tanks, tires.
- Items that cannot be safely handled by two persons: Spas, hot tubs, pianos, pool tables.
- Household Hazardous Waste.

Single family and multi-family dwellings that exceed the number of pickups or place more than 6 items out per pickup, or do not schedule their pickup in advance with Republic Services, will be charged a fee of \$29.45 for each additional item collected (rate subject to change in 2026).

To schedule a bulky item pickup, simply call Republic Services at least 24 hours in advance of your regular trash collection day at (800) 299-4898.

Used Motor Oil & Filter Collection Program

Do you change the motor oil from your car, truck, motorcycle, boat, or lawn mower? Did you know that recycling used motor oil conserves energy and natural resources. Oil can be re-refined for reuse as motor oil or as fuel for ships. Oil filters, which are up to 80% steel, can also be recycled into useful products. It's up to you to make sure used oil and oil filters are properly discarded. Republic Services provides a free pickup service for residents to discard their non-contaminated used motor oil and filters. The Public Works Department provides supplies such as oil collection containers for the used oil and filters, funnels, and shop rags to make changing your own motor oil easy. Public Works is located at 4722 Manhattan Beach Blvd.

Municipal Services Department News

The Municipal Services Department is located at 14616 Grevillea Avenue. Office hours for the Code Enforcement and Animal Control divisions are Monday through Thursday from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Staff is also available seven days a week by calling (310) 973-3220 between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.



Public Safety Officer

The ever-increasing costs associated with law enforcement, and the shrinking number of academy's graduating new recruits in California, has created a gap of available police officers available for hire by cities. This, coupled with a growing population in Southern California, has led to the need for innovative policing ideas. With much

of police work being specialized and high-risk, there is no wonder as to why policing agencies are finding it hard to fill positions.

As a result, many cities have turned to citizen-based policing practices. Currently, about half of all reports taken by police officers are either "non-workable" (such as vandalism, hit-n-run traffic collisions, etc.) or "non-criminal" (such as lost property reports or traffic accidents). While both non-criminal and non-workable reports still require a police report, many agencies are discovering that these reports can be taken by civilian officers.

These Public Safety Officers, or PSO's, are city employees that wear uniforms and are trained in report writing, police communication codes, and radio protocols. As civilian officers they will not be trained in aggressive combat or fighting techniques and they are not armed officers. PSO's are dispatched to handle calls just as regular deputies are but they are dispatched exclusively to handle non-emergency calls.

By sending these civilian employees to handle non-emergency calls, this frees up the availability of sworn deputies to handle the more dangerous and more emergent life-threatening calls, such as active robberies and life endangering calls such as fires, domestic disturbances, or medical emergencies.

The City of Lawndale will begin its pilot program for the Public Safety Officer position beginning in the summer of 2026.

Everbridge Mass Notification System

The City of Lawndale utilizes the Everbridge Mass Notifications System to broadcast real-time alerts and critical information to government employees, partner agencies, and the public across multiple channels.

Some of the key features of the Everbridge system are that it allows for Multi-Channel messaging, Targeted Audience messaging, Two-way communication, and pre-configured messaging.



Data collection through Everbridge is also possible, which allows for gathering analytics and data to give insight into response rates, message delivery and after-action reports to improve future emergency responses.

The Everbridge Mass Notification System is an opt-in system that requires residents to provide City Service Providers with personal information such as cell phone numbers, email addresses, and any other information that they wish to provide so that they can receive alerts in the event of an emergency.

The Beautification Committee members have been recruiting local artists from Lawndale to design and create images for the utility boxes throughout the City. The Committee met with many artists, both amateur and professional, and selected projects and art pieces that were whimsical, and with plenty of color and movement, to reflect the spirit of the community. Currently there are fifteen electrical boxes that have been decorated and displayed throughout the City with plans to create at least a dozen more.



También es posible la recopilación de datos a través de Everbridge, lo que permite reunir análisis y datos para obtener información sobre la frecuencia de respuesta, la entrega de mensajes y los informes posteriores a la acción, con el fin de mejorar las respuestas de emergencia en el futuro.

El Sistema de Notificación en Masa de Everbridge es un sistema de suscripción voluntaria que requiere que los residentes proporcionen a los proveedores de servicios de la ciudad información personal, como números de teléfono celular, direcciones de correo electrónico y cualquier otra información que deseen proporcionar, para que puedan recibir alertas en caso de una emergencia.
