SENIOR PASTOR MESSAGE



Dear friends,

In the summer of 2017, two longtime commercial fishermen—John Aldridge and Anthony Sosinski—set out to fish from Montauk, Long Island. About forty miles offshore, Anthony was sleeping below deck while John started to get things ready for the catch they’d soon haul in. As Anthony pulled on a handle with all of his might, it snapped and sent him sprawling backward off the back of the boat. Because the boat was on autopilot, it continued propelling forward. John, resurfacing from under the water, began screaming for help even though he knew there was no way Anthony would ever hear him. And he was right, Anthony didn’t.

John watched the boat go up and over the crest of a wave, and then it was gone. He was alone, treading water in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean without a life vest, thinking this was the way he was going to die. Can you imagine what that must have felt like? If there’s ever been a hopeless situation, that’s got to be it. Or is it?

While John was trying to calm down, quiet his thoughts of certain death and stay afloat, he realized his boots were buoyant. And he got an idea! He took one off, emptied it out and plunged it back into the water to create an air pocket. It did. And it floated. So John stuck his boots under his arms as flotation devices. At least he could stay afloat. A flicker of hope.

Four hours later, Anthony woke up and realized John was gone. He called the Coast Guard and they began search procedures, even though the commander admitted he didn’t have much hope of finding John in the open water. Morning came and John tried to keep his hope alive—but there was still no sign of help. Finally, he spotted a fishing buoy and was able to climb onto it. This was a new surge of hope.

Less than one hour later, a Coast Guard helicopter flew by and spotted John waving and splashing. They pulled him up to safety. “We’ve been looking for you for nine hours today,” the Coast Guard rescue diver told John. “Well, I’ve been looking for you for twelve,” John answered. Miraculously, John Aldridge survived. His hope had kept him alive!

What’s keeping your hope alive? The writer of Hebrews was inspired by God to pen these words for you and me:

Let us hold tightly without wavering to the hope we affirm, for God can be trusted to keep his promise. Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works. And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near.

–Hebrews 10:23-25

We have more than a pair of boots to hang onto—we have Jesus! It’s our hope in Jesus that keeps us from drowning in a cultural sea of despair and discouragement. As we continue to grapple with the pandemic, political chaos, social unrest and moral confusion, we cling to our eternal hope that God is sovereign and in control.

Over the past year I’ve seen our congregation stay focused on Jesus, keeping hope alive. Through the ministries of Wooddale Church here, near and far, many who were once drowning in despair have found hope in the Gospel of Jesus Christ—because of you! I’m proud of you for staying the course and I encourage you in Christ Jesus to continue trusting in the Lord and His Word.

You and I have the hope this world needs. Let us look toward this next year of ministry as an opportunity to begin building a Legacy of Hope that will never fade until Christ comes!

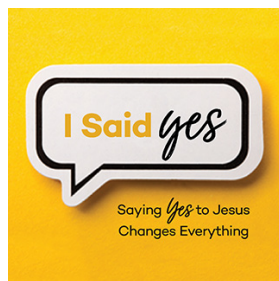

We come alongside our local and global partners serving in our region to reach people with the hope of Jesus.



#WEAREFOR

This is a love mission. Every day, we have opportunities to share hope with those in need. Whether it's feeding the hungry, donating school supplies, providing winter boots or Christmas gifts, or helping to save lives through donating blood, we want our neighbors to know we're here for them. Through your effort, thousands were shown the hope and love of Jesus!





- **Food Drive:** Through our fall and spring food drives, we donated the equivalent of 50,081 pounds of food to 7 local food shelves.
- **Boot Drive:** We collected more than 30 pairs of boots for Involve MN. In addition, many boots were ordered from their Amazon Wish List and delivered directly to Involve MN.
- **School Supply Drive:** More than 17,500 items were gathered, providing supplies for more than 770 students.
- **Angel Tree:** We provided Christmas gifts to 24 children who have a parent who is incarcerated.
- **Blood Drive:** Sixty-five people signed up to donate blood through two blood drives, saving up to 195 lives.
- We supported **Source Ministries' Lake Street Food Giveaway** with funds and volunteers. They have given away over 700 tons of food this year, with more than 800 recipients of food each month.

PARTNERSHIP WITH FOUNDATIONS CHURCH

RACIAL RECONCILIATION Wooddale Church has forged a partnership with Foundations Church in Minneapolis. Our two congregations are serving together and learning with and from each other as we share the hope of the Gospel across the Twin Cities.

Wooddale Loring Park campus has done at least four outreach events with Foundations Church and Pastor Jordan in our communities together.

WOODDALE ADVANCE

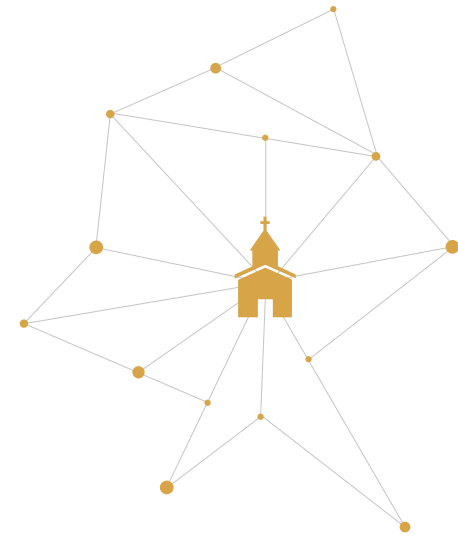
Wooddale Church is committed to resourcing congregations around the world. For over three decades, leadership has believed God's blessings on the church must be shared broadly. And today, we call this ministry Wooddale Advance.

The goal of Wooddale Advance is to help established congregations experience Gospel transformation and again be healthy, which leads to growth in making new disciples for Jesus Christ. Over the past year, Wooddale Advance has begun ministering in a digital context by resourcing congregations virtually. Three digital seminars have been created and also offer virtual coaching and consulting. Since launching in June 2021 more than 75 seminars have been purchased, serving congregations of all sizes in various contexts across North America.



MICROCHURCHES

Wooddale is committed to multiplying the Kingdom through church planting in homes, neighborhoods and workplaces. This year, our first microchurch training center launched under the leadership of Pastor Dale and Pastor Luke. Ten people are being trained on how to make disciples who make disciples by planting microchurches in the Twin Cities.

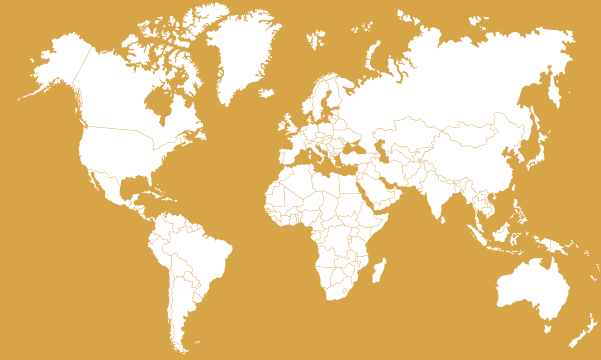


BACKYARD BAPTISM

To date, as part of Vision '22 through Wooddale's partnership with The Timothy Initiative (TTI), **8,727 churches have been planted** (from 2015 through June 2021) with a goal of 12,000+ being planted by the end of 2022!

Naren's life fell apart after the death of his parents. Because Jesus was never a part of his family, he had no hope for the present, future or eternity. As the eldest child, he needed to provide for his family. He began working whenever and wherever he could, which exposed him to COVID-19. As Naren lay in the hospital bed, he remembered the verse Cha, his friend who was a TTI church planter, had told him as she shared Jesus with him during a meal together: "In the day of trouble, I will call upon You, for You will answer me." (Psalm 87:7) Tears started rolling down his cheek. He pleaded with God to save him. Miraculously, his body started responding to the medication and he was healed, being discharged from the hospital after 19 days. Naren accepted Jesus, was baptized and is part of a local church—and now his family has the hope of Jesus!

WHAT THEY DO

The Board of Elders at Wooddale Church serves three functional roles: legal, cultural and relational. The legal role is to govern Wooddale Church in accordance with its mission, constitution, strategy, policies and objectives. The cultural role is to maintain Biblical integrity, spiritual accountability and excellence in serving as Christ's church. The relational role is to represent the congregation in leadership and to support the congregation and staff in prayer.

The Board meets monthly to pray and review measures of spiritual, financial and leadership health. It shares perspectives and supports Wooddale's plans for future ministry.

Elders are elected by the congregation for a term of two years and may stand for ratification for additional terms, with a limit of ten consecutive years. Elder qualifications include Biblical directives, belief in Wooddale's Statement of Faith, spiritual maturity and commitment to Wooddale. Elder candidates must have demonstrated ministry leadership.
