Decodable Words can be sounded out based on the letter-sound relationships.

Blends are two adjoining consonants that each make their own sounds like /ft/ in left.

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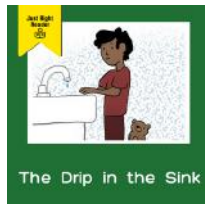
