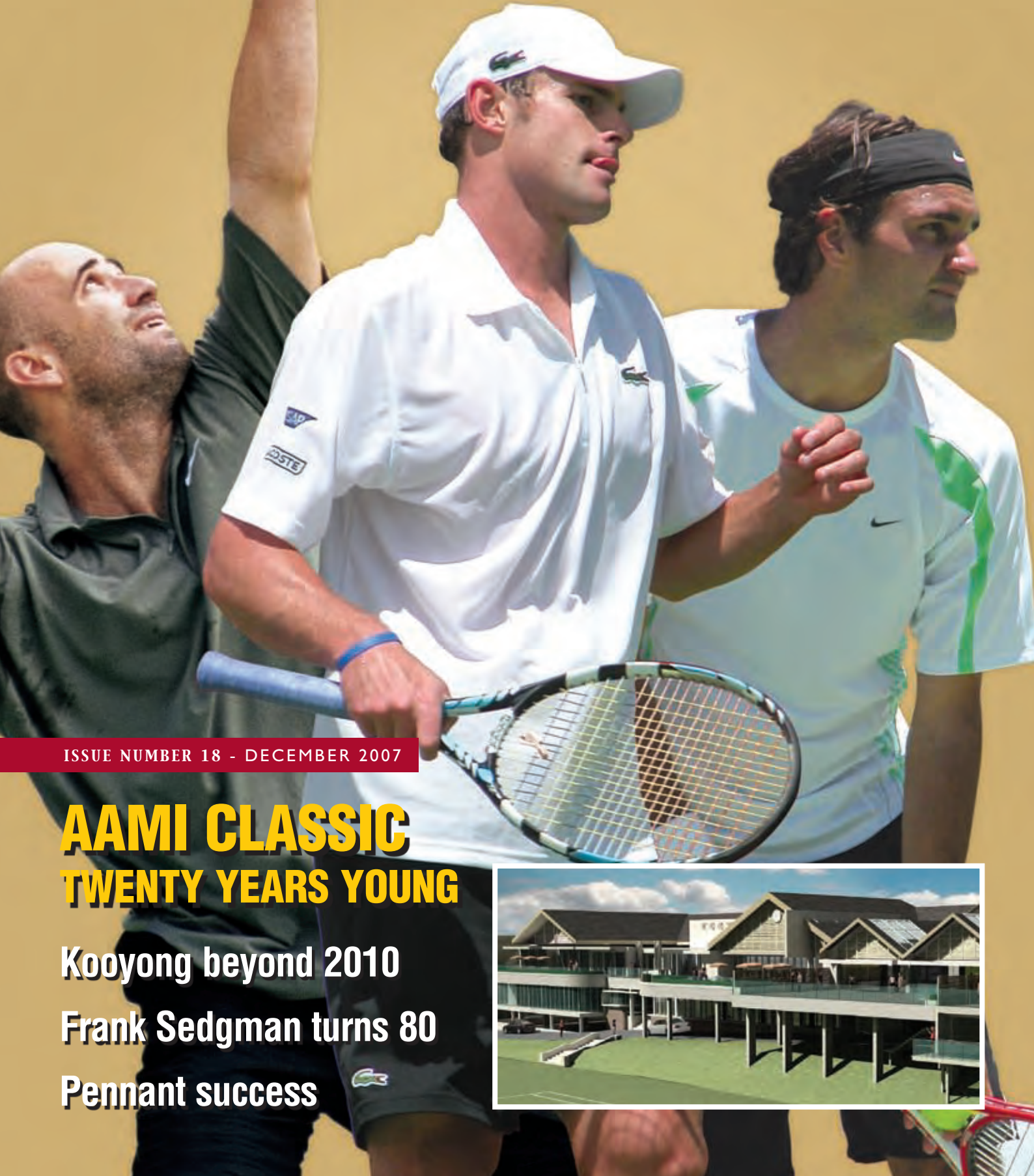

Kooyong's Sally Peers and Mark Verryth help Australia to historic wins

It's been quite some time since Australia has had much to cheer about on the world tennis stage but two Kooyong members have played major roles in changing all of that.

Sally Peers and Mark Verryth have helped Australia achieve a momentous double in 2007 and are two of the brightest lights in Australian tennis.

The pair helped guide Australia to the Junior Davis Cup/ Fed Cup double in a huge performance that will no doubt put Australian tennis back on the map.

Sally, 16, who has been a scholarship member of the Club since 2002, continues to fly up the international junior rankings with some fantastic performances this year.

Her performances in the Optus Australian Junior Fed Cup team were nothing short of spectacular as she went through the week undefeated to lead the country to victory in the final doubles against Poland.

Sally defeated Poland's Sandra Zaniewska 6-1 6-2 and then teamed with long time doubles partner Isabella Holland to win the title 6/2 7/6.

"I knew we had a chance. I mean every person who walks on the court has a chance of winning. We were just taking it one day at a time, we just went for it, and we enjoyed every day on the court, every moment we had, and we played so well," said Sally.

The Optus Australian Junior Davis Cup team were even more clinical than the girls with a 2-zip win against Argentina in the final.

Kooyong's Mark Verryth defeated Argentina's Guido Andreozzi 6-3 6-3, with teen sensation Bernard Tomic sealing the win, overcoming Kevin Konfederak 6-4 6-3.

"We're pretty happy with that (defeating Argentina). I think they actually beat the main Australian Davis Cup boys, the big boys, this year, so it's a good win. They probably grow up (playing) on clay, so it's nice," Mark said.

The win has catapulted Kooyong's two young stars to prominence on the world stage and we

look forward to them both continuing this form into their senior careers in the years to come.

Australia last reached the final of the boys event in 2000, when it was known as the World Youth Cup, and Ryan Henry, Todd Reid and Raphael Durek brought the trophy home with a win over Austria.

The last win for the girls was in 1993, when former Kooyong player Annabel Ellwood, Siobhan Drake-Brockman and Jodi Richardson defeated the USA.

This time of year also signals the arrival of the AAMI Classic and we look forward to celebrating the 20th Anniversary of what has become established as the major lead up event to the Australian Open.

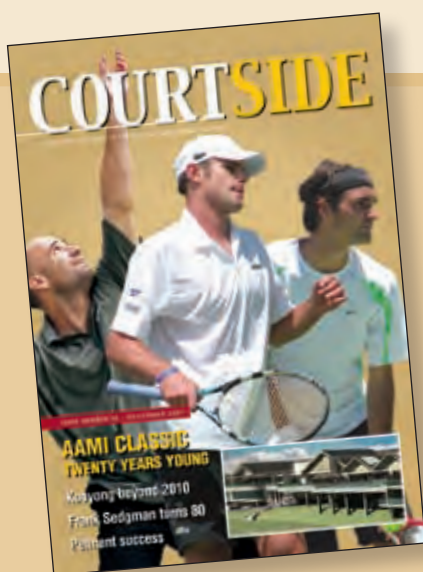

President's Report



BUILDING WORKS

Following the recent well attended Member Information Presentation, Members were sent information outlining the proposed clubhouse development.

The \$12 million development will address the limitations of the existing clubhouse whilst adding significant improvements to member areas such as the bar/bistro, Racquet Club, balconies and the gymnasium.

The work is scheduled to start in February 2009 with a December 2009 targeted completion date. The project to be delivered without a member levy, increased membership levels nor abnormal increases in annual subs will deliver members with a world-class facility.

AAMI CLASSIC

Kooyong's long connection with international tennis continues in January when the world's leading male players including Roger Federer and Andy Roddick compete in the AAMI Classic.

The eight man invitational, a major lead up event to the Australian Open, starts January 9th and concludes Saturday 12th.

2008 marks the 20th anniversary of this event that has seen record crowd numbers in recent years including a last day sell out in 2007.

I encourage you to take advantage of the special member ticketing and seating arrangements, see the best tennis players in the world and soak up the atmosphere over the four day event.

AGM

At the recent Club election members endorsed the nominations of Peter Carew,

Andrew Sutherland and Cam Dickinson and elected these gentlemen to the Council for three years. Peter, Andrew and Cam provide a mix of business experience and passion for the club that compliments the skills of the existing Council members.

I'd also like to thank retiring Council member Linda Dohnt for her contribution during her time on Council.

To many the changing face of the committee represents a significant generational shift at Kooyong.

Whilst it is true that the average age of Kooyong's Council and overall membership has dropped in recent years the Club continues to cater for a wide spectrum of activities by members of all ages that contributes to the health and vibrancy of the Club.

The strength of our Club is built upon our member's acceptance of the Clubs membership diversity, with Clubs Victoria recognizing this endearing Club trait and in doing so awarding Kooyong Club of the Year honours in various categories over the past three years.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP

It gave me great pleasure at the Club's 116th Annual General Meeting to propose immediate past president of Kooyong, Mr. Peter Quinn, for life membership of Kooyong Lawn Tennis Club.

Peter's contribution to the Club over nearly 20 years as a Council member, Treasurer and President has been significant. The Club delivered a raft of projects to improve member amenities and services under Peter's leadership that all members now enjoy. Fittingly Peter's nomination for life membership was unanimously accepted at the AGM.

COURT MAINTENANCE

Coinciding with the opening of the lawn courts, the Club has accelerated the hard court maintenance program. The Council appreciates that playing conditions during winter have been less than ideal.

The commissioning of water tanks between courts 45 and 46 to store water collected from Gardiners Creek, bore water and site run off coupled with a new distribution line to the hard courts should lead to improved playing conditions over summer.

Alternate playing surfaces to the existing en tout cas, that do not require watering, remain a consideration, however given the popularity of the en tout cas courts and a number of other contributing factors our efforts remain focussed on securing sufficient non potable water sources for traditional court watering practices.

The recent change in surface for the Australian Open left the Club and AAMI tournament partner Colin Stubs Enterprises with no choice but to replace the Rebound Ace surface with Plexi Cushion. The Blue coloured Plexi Cushion courts will be available for member use following the AAMI Classic.

STATE GRADE WIN

Kooyong enjoyed success in this year's State Grade Pennant competition with both our men's state grade teams reaching the semi finals and Kooyong No 1 team lead by Paul Arber going on to win only our second State Grade flag having beaten M.C.C. Our women's State Grade team also enjoyed a successful season reaching the State Grade final against eventual winners, the M.C.C.

SEASON'S GREETINGS

As a wrap up for 2007 I am pleased to report to members that the administration of Kooyong Lawn Tennis Club lead by CEO Chris Brown has expertly dealt with the many challenges faced by the Club during the year including water restrictions, the freeway expansion, and the on going challenge of delivering a consistently good level of service and quality facilities to members and their guests.

On behalf of the committee I wish all club members a Merry Christmas and a happy new year.

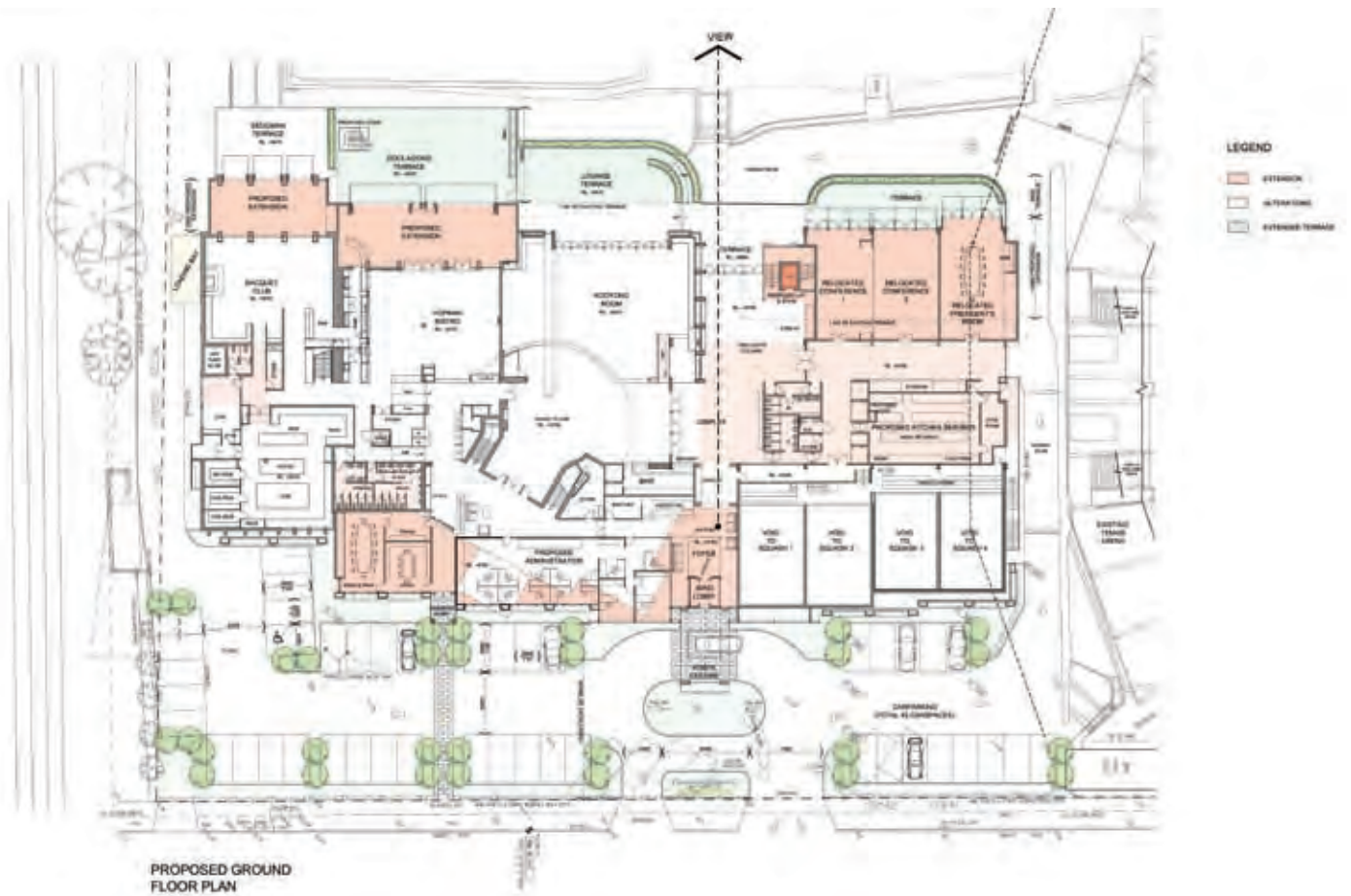

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Kooyong is one of the most successful and prestigious sporting clubs in Australia, and the future of the Club is strong thanks to its long history of leadership and innovation.

The Kooyong Lawn Tennis Club Council is committed to providing the highest level of service and value to its Members. Over recent years a working group was appointed by Council to undertake a comprehensive review of the Club's operations and facilities to identify improvements needed for Council to deliver on this commitment.

The working group - which consisted of Councillors and selected Members chosen for their relevant industry expertise - developed a detailed plan, with very carefully estimated costs, of suggested improvements to Club services and facilities.

The outcome has been the development of Kooyong - Beyond 2010, a blueprint for an extensive \$12 million development of our Club's facilities and services.

Most importantly, the project will be delivered without the need to impose levies or vary membership subscriptions in excess of normal adjustments. The \$12 million project has adequate contingency allowances for design and construction variations and will be funded by bank debt, to be repaid comfortably out of the strong cashflow of the Club.

More than two years in the planning, Kooyong - Beyond 2010 will ensure we continue to be a leading provider of tennis and other sporting and recreational opportunities, while providing a new and exciting space to showcase the rich history of the Club through the development of a 'living' museum complete with extensive exhibition areas.

Prepared in consultation with Bruce Henderson Architects, Kooyong - Beyond 2010 represents a new era for the Club that will even better service the needs of existing and future Members.

Following is an overview of the key features of the proposed development:

- **A stylish clubhouse which combines all elements as a single unit**
- **A feature entry and reception appropriate to Kooyong's stature**
- **A 'living' museum with various exhibition areas to showcase the Club's history and traditions**
- **A new clubhouse entry from the courts, incorporating a lift**
- **A new, larger gymnasium**
- **Defined Member and guest areas within the clubhouse**
- **Improved Member dining in the extended Racquet Club and Bar/Bistro**
- **Creation of a meeting room and library**
- **Increased terrace areas for the enjoyment and comfort of Members**
- **Establishment of a studio for lifestyle activities**
- **Environmental considerations, including low energy light fittings, energy efficient air-conditioning, rainwater tanks and shading screens on western façade**
- **Improved traffic entry and exit to Glenferrie Road**
- **Improved parking and traffic flow at the front of the clubhouse**
- **A new undercover car park**
- **New and upgraded airconditioning throughout the clubhouse**
- **Improved access points to eliminate services vehicles from blocking driveways**
- **New kitchen facilities adjacent to the function areas**
- **New toilets adjacent to the function areas and upgrade of the ground floor toilets**
- **Modern administration and interview offices to better serve Members**

Subject to approval by the City of Stonnington and Members, construction is planned to commence in February 2009 and finish by December 2009. During this development period, the clubhouse will continue to operate, with every endeavour being made by the Club to ensure Members continue to enjoy access to existing, and some changed services, with minimal disruption.

The long lead up to the construction stage is a deliberate decision by Council to provide sufficient time to carefully plan and manage the most successful project and ensure minimal Member inconvenience.

Kooyong - Beyond 2010 is a significant investment in the future of the Club to ensure it continues to be a leading provider of tennis and other sporting, recreational and leisure opportunities.

DESIGN DEVELOPMENT

Council has been pleased with the response from Members to date. All suggestions will be considered during the normal comprehensive design development stage.

These include:

- **Revising the design of the Clubhouse façade**
- **Increasing the space in the ladies change room**
- **Improving the light in the pool area by including north facing windows and reducing dark surfaces**
- **Improving acoustic quality in new and existing areas.**

Information regarding finalisation of the design development will be communicated to Members by regular bulletins.

AAMI CLASSIC



2008 will mark the twentieth anniversary of the Kooyong Classic and it is sure to be celebrated in style with the world's top players again converging on Kooyong, the traditional home of tennis in Australia.

The upcoming AAMI Classic will feature the greats of the game along with a star of the future as Roger Federer, Andy Roddick, Marat Safin, Tommy Haas, Ivan Ljubicic and Fernando Gonzalez take on young gun Andy Murray for the title.

The eighth spot in the field remains open at this stage.

The 2008 event will also be played on the new plexicushion surface which is to feature for the first time at the upcoming Australian Open.

Roger Federer is again the big drawcard having come off another amazing season, which netted him 3 Grand Slam titles and being runner up at the French Open again.

The Swiss star has been number 1 in the world since February 2002 and his continued dominance of the sport has him on the cusp

of becoming the greatest player of the Open era as he sits just two Grand Slam wins behind Pete Sampras who has 14 Grand Slam singles wins to his name.

2008 could be a record breaking year for Federer and he will play at Kooyong for the fifth time in the hope of winning his fourth Australian Open title and 13th Grand Slam title.

Andy Roddick also returns to Kooyong for a fifth visit and he is the two time defending champion of the event having defeated Federer in a high class final last year and he also defeated Tommy Haas back in 2006.

Having started 2007 with a semi final finish in the Australian Open, Roddick went on to win titles at Queens Club and Washington as well as reaching the final in Memphis and will be keen to start 2008 in a similar fashion.

Another to begin well in 2007 was Chilean Fernando Gonzalez who made it to the final of the Australian Open before winning Beijing and making the final in Rome in May.

Currently ranked 6 in the world, Gonzalez will be hoping to continue his good form into the Australian Open as he did after playing at Kooyong this year.

Tommy Haas and Marat Safin will also return to Kooyong in 2008 and both are always popular amongst Melbourne's tennis loving public.

Croatian star Ivan Ljubicic also returns for a fourth visit to prepare for the Australian Open and continues to show consistent form on tour with wins in Doha & Hertogenbosch and was a finalist in Zagreb and Rotterdam. He also made the semis in Masters Series Miami and Beijing.

Young gun Andy Murray rounds out the field so far and is one of several stars rising through the tennis ranks and appears set to challenge the top players in the not too distant future.

Despite his year being interrupted by injury Murray missed Wimbledon but earlier this year took out the San Jose title. He was also a finalist in Doha and Metz and semi-finalist in Memphis, Masters Series Miami and Indian Wells.

TWENTY YEARS YOUNG



First held in December 1988, following discussions between Joe Devereux and Colin Stubs (Kooyong President and Australian Open Tournament Director respectively at the time), the aim of the Kooyong Classic was to perpetuate international, grasscourt tennis at the Kooyong stadium, after the Australian Open moved to Melbourne Park.

Various changes to dates, formats and player fields occurred from 1988 to 1994. In 1995 the player-driven event settled into the week before the Open with an eight-man promotion/relegation format, allowing each participant to play three matches over four days in Australian Open conditions - a winning formula that has become more successful each year.

First participants included Boris Becker, Pete Sampras, Stefan Edberg, Michael Chang and Michael Stich. Andre Agassi and Jim Courier soon followed, Agassi going on to compete nine times before his retirement last year.

Colonial was taken over by the Commonwealth Bank in 2001, resulting in

a name change to Commonwealth Bank International (2002-4). In 2006 leading Australian car and home insurer, AAMI, assumed a major sponsorship role, thus re-securing the Classic's future.

With the future secured we now look forward to Kooyong and the AAMI Classic staging more memorable moments from the world's greatest players on centre court as it has for more than eighty years.

WATER MANAGEMENT

The Club's commitment to improve water efficiency and importantly protect our courts against the effects of water restrictions will receive a major boost with the installation of water management systems totalling \$160,000. The work includes water extraction equipment, a huge storage tank and reticulation lines to service the en-tous-cas and grass tennis courts.

The lengthy and at times frustrating process which required us to obtain mandatory approvals from authorities including the City Of Stonnington and Melbourne Water, has been successfully concluded and work to install water lines will be completed shortly.

The opening of the grass courts will ease the burden on the en-tous-cas courts and enable the necessary court closures to allow excavation and establishment of water

lines. The tank will be assembled on site to complete the work.

The storage tank with a capacity of 370,000 litres will draw water from several sources including Gardiners Creek, a bore, reclaimed stormwater, recycled water and potable supply where appropriate.

Courts will have separate feed lines ensuring continuity of water supply from either potable lines or alternatively the storage tank.

The installation of the storage tank will also enable the Club to continue the successful laser levelling and returfing grass court program with the backup water supply offering a safeguard against any adverse impact of water restrictions.

The Club is also trialling several court treatments which are designed to suppress

dust and retain water in the en-tous-cas courts. Due however to ongoing debate about both the effectiveness and impact of these treatments, the approach being taken is a cautious one to ensure there is no adverse impact on the courts.

These initiatives will both protect our precious assets and reduce the dust and difficult playing conditions that have endured under water restrictions.

Thanks goes to all Foundation members and supporters, particularly the 50-year club members and our corporate sponsors, Yakka, AAMI and GSA.

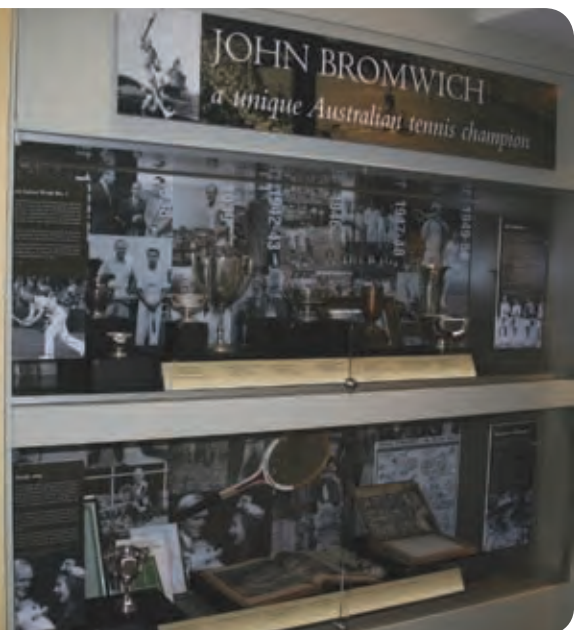
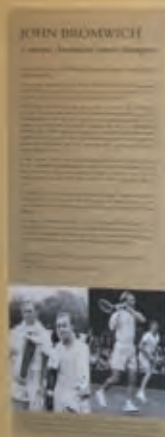

John Fitzgerald - RIP -



Kooyong sadly mourns the passing of 50 year member John Fitzgerald, former editor of the Herald and Weekly Times newspaper and great supporter of the Kooyong Foundation.

John, 76, had vigorously fought a two-year battle with cancer, was editor of The Herald - one of the forerunners of the Herald Sun - between 1974 and 1979.

Fitzie, as he was affectionately known, took great pride in being a member of Kooyong and helped establish the Kooyong Foundation and was able to set it on the road to success through his amazing ability to be able to sell an idea to the perfect audience.

He was managing director and chairman of one of Australia's most successful public relations firms, IPR, later Shandwick IPR for more than 15 years.

He was a past president of the sport-based Carbine Club, closely associated with the Sport Australia Hall of Fame and was a consultant to the Australian Olympic Committee and its senior IOC member Kevan Gosper, as well as being one of the forces behind yachtsman John Bertrand's America's Cup campaigns.

An avid tennis player, Fitzie was involved in various projects at any one time and was always so happy to help you in any way he could as so many of his friends will attest to.

Kooyong would like to pass on its condolences to the family and acknowledge the great contribution Fitzie made to this great Club.

Happy 80th Birthday FRANK SEDGMAN

Frank Sedgman turned 80 on the 29th of October 2007 and all of his sporting friends decided it was time to celebrate the achievements of this famous Australian.

Held at the RACV Club with 410 guests representing all aspects of his sporting life including horse racing, golf, tennis, Vingt Cinq and Carbine Clubs enjoyed a luncheon held in his honour.

Unbeknown to Frank, his first employer in professional tennis, Jack Kramer, had made the long trip out to be the surprise guest speaker.

Much reminiscing took place as Jack recalled the early days of setting up Pro Tennis and what a valuable player (arguably the world's best amateur) Frank had been in establishing the Pro Tour throughout the United States, Europe and Australia.

In fact Jack, in his 1999 autobiography, included Frank in his list of the 21 greatest players of all time.

Just for the record, in a four year span from 1949 to 1952 Frank won 22 Grand Slam titles in singles, doubles and mixed doubles.

Some of these include:

- Australian Championships Singles in 1949, 1950, Men's Doubles in 1951, 1952, Mixed Doubles 1949, 1950.
- The French Championships Doubles in 1951, 1952, Runner up in singles in 1952, Mixed Doubles in 1951, 1952.
- Wimbledon singles in 1952, Men's Doubles in 1948, 1951, 1952, Mixed Doubles in 1951, 1952.
- US Championships Singles 1951, 1952, Men's Doubles in 1950, 1951, Mixed Doubles in 1951, 1952.

Frank also played Davis Cup for Australia in the first three years of its domination of the competition from 1950 to 1967.

Today Frank is a life member of Kooyong, sits on the Kooyong Foundation's Board and has a balcony named after him at the Club.

Kooyong to KOKODA

On 25th August 2007 three members of Kooyong Lawn Tennis Club, Kim Johnson (our team leader), Theresa Carmichael and myself, Rena Alves, plus four other girls set off to walk the Kokoda Trail in Papua New Guinea. Kim's father had served in Kokoda during the war and this was one of the initial reasons for walking the trail but the rest of us also had our own reasons and challenges.

After months of training the day had actually come for us to challenge the 96 km Kokoda Trail. I remember that day well, a day we had been looking forward to for months and now some of us were approaching it with some trepidation and fear for the unknown journey ahead.

During the nine days it took us to complete the trail we walked and climbed in the heart of thick rainforests, jungle, marshy ground and grasslands. We climbed up and down very steep, treacherous mountain passes and walked through mud a quarter the way up our legs.

We also encountered thick tree roots, slippery rocks, 53 river crossings, 94 degrees humidity and two days of torrential rain. At

night we slept in either out tents or open native huts. During heavy rain one night two tents leaked water soaking our sleeping bags and mattresses.

The scenery was magnificent, the villages and people were welcoming and the flora and fauna special. One day, while walking, we came across a beautiful Belladonna tree and soon after a small pool surrounded by dazzling vivid blue butterflies. Thankfully these were captured on camera.

What was truly heartfelt was that as a team we all accomplished our personal achievements, giving us a huge appreciation of the endeavours and sufferings of our forefathers before, and the realization of what these young soldiers went through.

In 1942 the soldiers not only had to pull machinery through mud in torrential rain but also carry the wounded, and with the fear that the enemy may be waiting around the next corner.

More than 3000 Australian soldiers died while defending Kokoda from the Japanese forces intent on capturing Port Moresby. Many also suffered from Malaria and dysentery. What turned the battle was the introduction of 25 pounder guns, which saved Port Moresby from invasion.

We were very fortunate to visit the well kept War Cemetery at Bormana where thousands of Australian and hundreds of English soldiers are laid to rest. It was a very hard trek but not as hard as it was for the soldiers during the war.

We showed ourselves to be a group of very strong and focused women who, at the end of the day, all went about walking the Kokoda Trail with the same determined spirit.

We were the first all girl group to succeed in accomplishing the Kokoda Trail walk.

QUALITY V QUANTITY

Over the last 4 or 5 months we have heard horror stories about the drought and the effect it is having on the poultry, meat and vegetable industries in Australia.

It has noticeably reflected in increased costs for basic food items like bread, milk and dairy products.

Many of the Club's suppliers have increased costs by as much as 20% in the last 3 months. Dairy items have gone through the roof, while fish and lamb in particular are increasing almost weekly.

On a recent visit for dinner to my local restaurant I couldn't believe the impact of cost increases. Not only had prices increased but also portion sizes (and quality) appeared to have fallen.

Perhaps what was highlighted by this was the dilemma faced by many chefs; a question of 'Quality or Quantity'.

Our objective therefore for our Members is challenging; to continue to provide top quality and interesting dishes but also value for the dollar spent.

Inaugural Kooyong v. Royal South Yarra Tennis Club Lightening Risk Snooker Match

The rules of Lightening Risk Snooker were new to all but one of the Kooyong players (who have roughly 250 years of experience playing ordinary snooker between them).

In this game, the player can in essence pot whichever ball he likes, but with the restrictions of potting the same colour not more than three times in a row and only one red in a row.

As well, the yellow is worth a generous 8 points. Safety play is not prominent in this game. Although there are penalties for missing colours, the Kooyong players took an instant liking to the game, and ran in three forty-plus breaks and a 53.

Had I done so five years earlier I have no doubt I would have reached my majority better prepared for life, having happily squandered thousands of hours in pursuit of precision cue-ball control, the art of graceful larceny and the acquisition of the kind of street sense that one can often detect in people who had a misspent youth. As it happened I was shipped off to boarding school at 15 where for three years the closest I came to pool was getting chalk dust under my nails- not from using a cue but from writing Latin sentences on a blackboard."

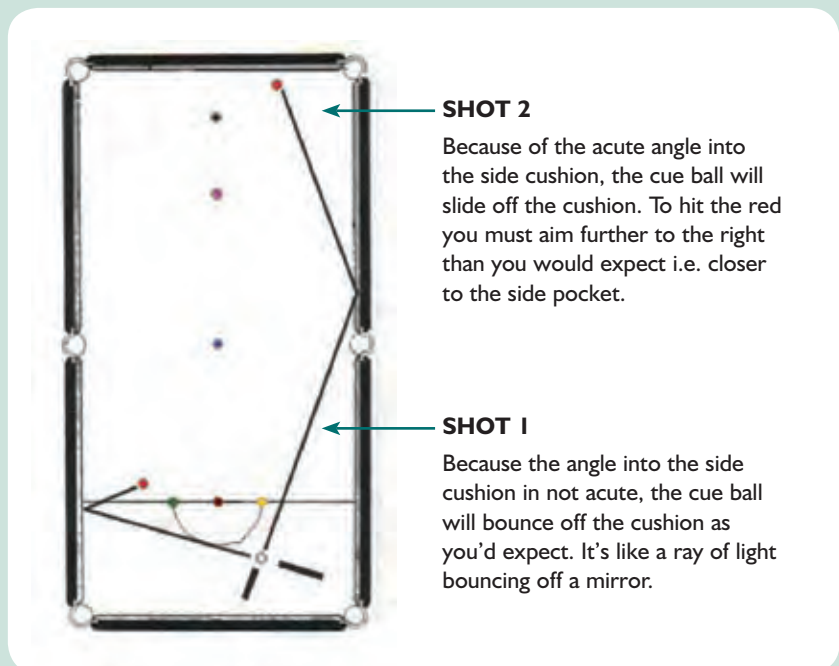
SHOT OF THE MONTH

"Sliding" off cushions

It's important to know how the cue ball will bounce off the cushions in billiards and snooker. For example when you are snookered, you have to "know the angles" to make a successful escape.

Many people assume that the cue ball will bounce off a cushion at the same angle at which it arrived, as a beam of light bounces off a mirror. This is true when the angle is wide and near perpendicular (or 90°) – see Shot 1.

However this is not the case when the angle that the cue ball comes to the cushion is a narrow one. Because the cushions are not perfectly elastic, the cue ball will actually bounce off the cushion at a significantly narrower angle than which it arrived. This phenomenon is called sliding. This is shown in Shot 2.



SHOT 2

Because of the acute angle into the side cushion, the cue ball will slide off the cushion. To hit the red you must aim further to the right than you would expect i.e. closer to the side pocket.

SHOT 1

Because the angle into the side cushion is not acute, the cue ball will bounce off the cushion as you'd expect. It's like a ray of light bouncing off a mirror.
