Our mixed netball team travelled to Ballarat to play in the Greater Western Region Winter Sports Championships.

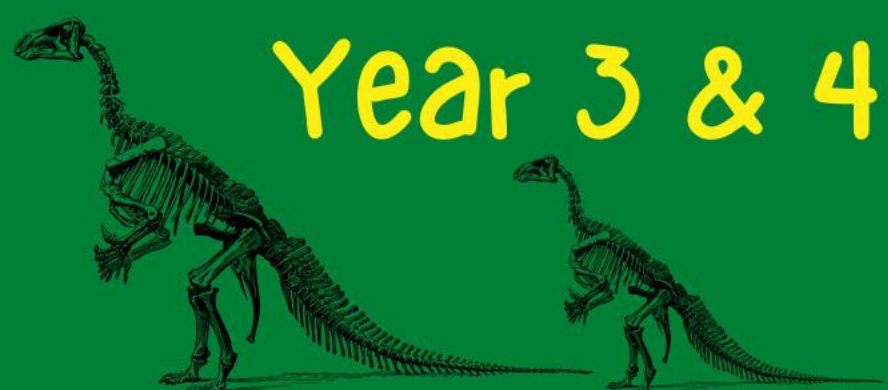

A special thanks to Mrs McLaren for her wonderful coaching, and to our parents for their encouragement and support!

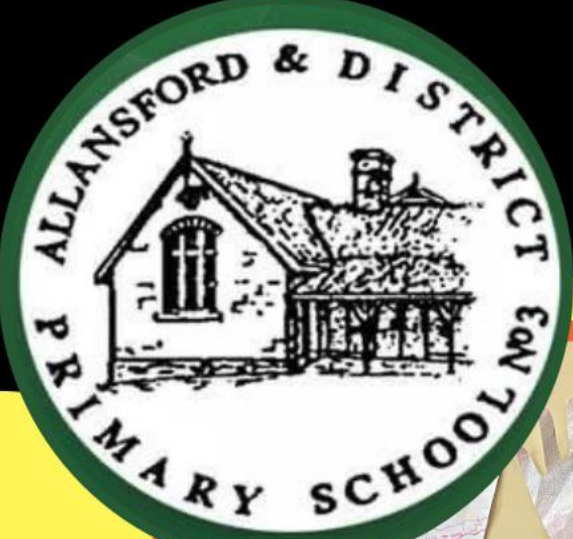

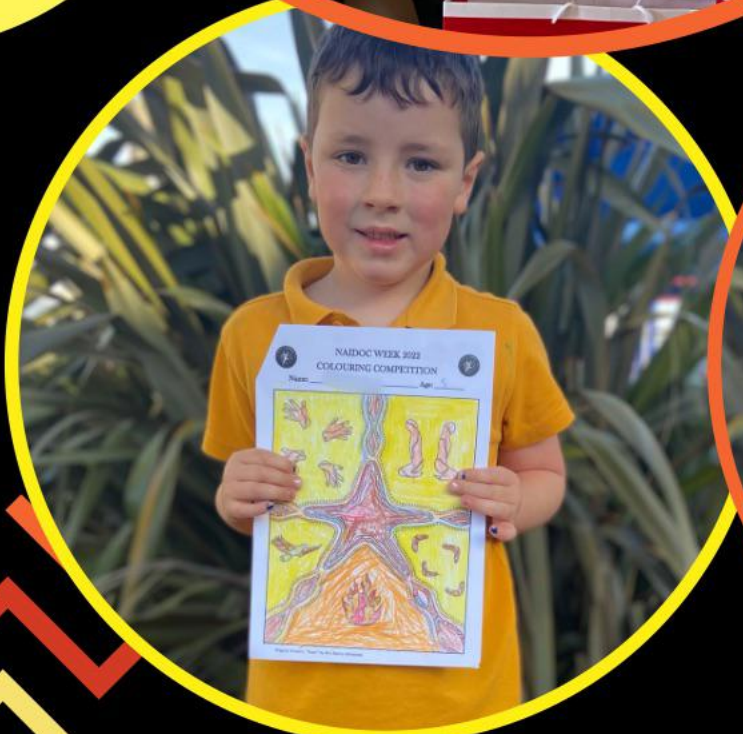
# NAIDOC WEEK

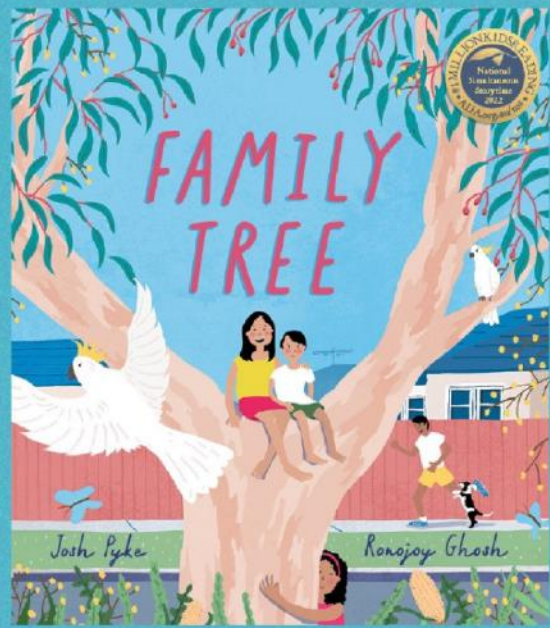




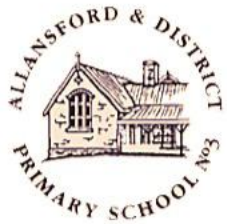

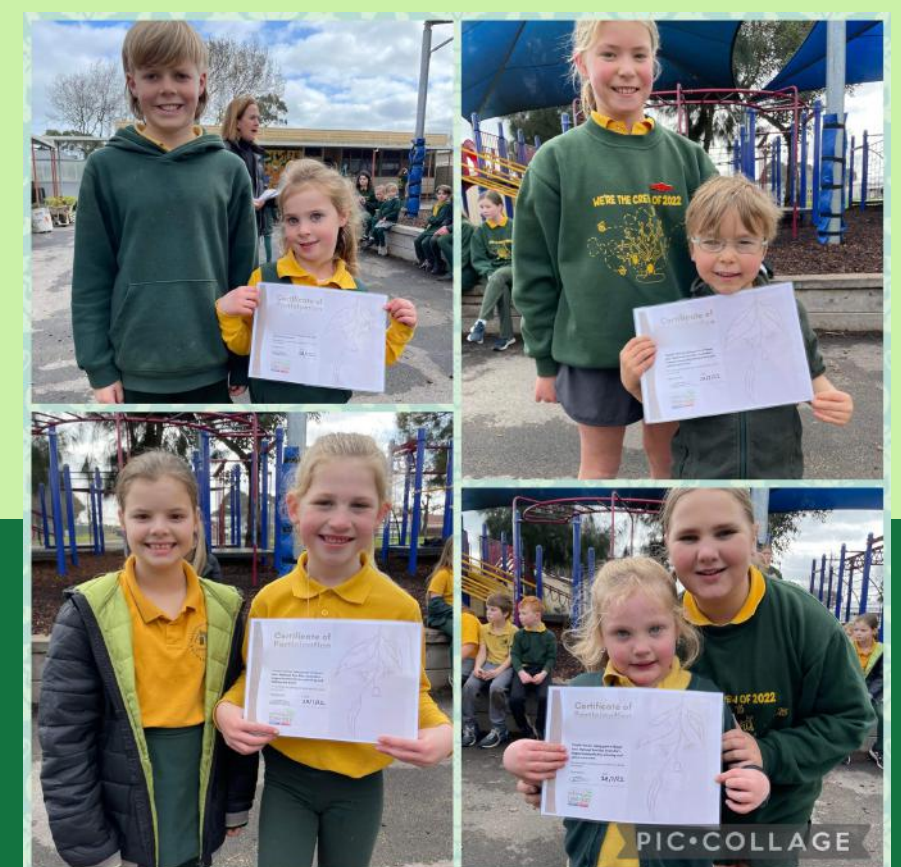
# National Tree Day

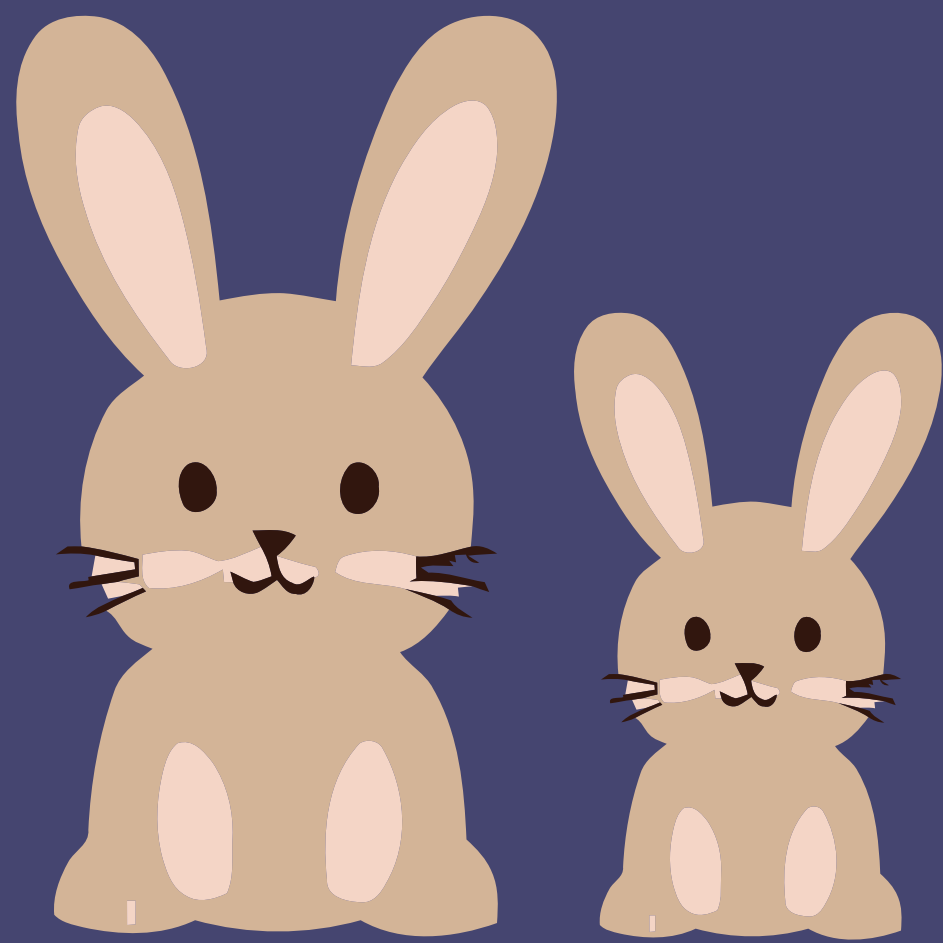
## THANK YOU LETTERS

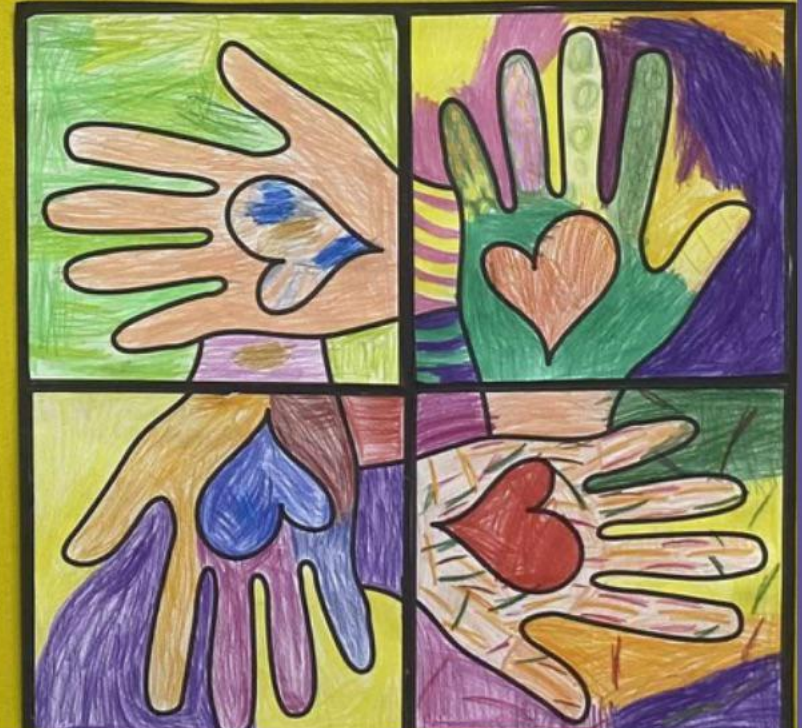
Our Year 3-6 students enjoyed swimming lessons at Jayson Lambs Splash Factory, Warrnambool, and should be proud of their achievements.
