The crew did a fantastic job and I was glad to keep Bulldogs on the schedule for 2020.

The Transition, Historic and Schoolboy classes were all out together again with Colin Cook and Nik Michael trading holeshots. Konnor Visger was on the gas in both moto's and made passes early each time out to take both wins and the overall. Colin kept Konnor honest in both moto's but would have to settle for second. Nik had the better start in moto two as he took advantage of being the only 250 in the class. He rode strong to take a third. Gene Huntoon and Eli Hovorka had a good battle with Gene getting the edge in moto one. Eli was ahead in moto two for nearly the entire race. Then on the last lap, Gene came through ahead to take fourth and fourth overall. Eli had made a small mistake and ended up fifth. William Hawkins was fast in moto one taking the overall holeshot but a late moto bike problem dropped him back to eighth. Jim Jobson led for a few laps until eventual moto winner Tom Claerhout found his groove. Jim settle for second with Shaun Nestor rounding out the podium. Blake Argue had a decent moto one battle with Derek Michael in the top five with Stephen Phillips and Jeff Doneth continuing their season long battle. Tom had an easier time in moto two with the holeshot and cruised to another moto win and overall. Jim was on his rear fender for a little before backing down and crossing in second for second. Shaun tried his best but could only manage a top three. Blake was riding well in the sand and took an easy fourth for fourth overall. Derek was riding good as well until his bike quit towards the end dropping him from his top five. Stephen took over fifth to round out the top five. Jeff was pushing Stephen all moto long and had to, to stay ahead of Michael Sangster. Jeff moved into sixth overall as Derek coasted back to the finish to end the day in seventh. Michael had a tough time with a moto one dnf but muscled his way through to seventh in moto two for eighth overall. William couldn't make the start of moto two which dropped him back to ninth overall. Alexis Argue was unfortunately the only one in her class again but she continues to battle with new people in the bigger bike classes which helps her improve every moto.

The Innovation and Evolution classes were out together for the first time this season. Innovation went first and it was Gene Huntoon grabbing both holeshots. He out in some fast laps but slipped back to just in the top five for both moto's. Tom Claerhout quickly took over the lead both times and rode unchallenged for another 1-1. Nik Michael did his best on the underpowered 125 as he held down second. Bryan Hoeldtke made his return to racing to round out the podium. Dallas Martineau looked great and was keeping up with Bryan in moto one for fourth but an early moto two fall dropped him back to ninth for an eventual sixth overall. Connor Goulet and Gene had a great battle brewing in moto one until Connor got up close with the Bulldogs sand. He would come back to sixth and then battled again with Gene in moto two. They were close all day and would round out the top five overall. Blake Argue was consistent all day in the rough conditions to take two sevenths for seventh overall, along with more bragging rights over his dad Ken. Ken Argue had some slow starts but solid laps and battling with Joe Sangster and Steve Adema for a few laps. Joe had a good start in moto one but stalled early and took a long time to get

Mike went on to an easy win as Santos Berlanga had the best ride of his season taking over second. He held off Shaun Nestor in third while Mark Havalda was on the gas to finish in fourth. Tom Lee wasn't even going to ride but came across in fifth with Ross making it back to sixth. Scott Schmock had a good first moto fight with Tom, Mark and Keir Krassa. Scott held on for seventh followed closely by Jay and Keir. With the holeshot in moto two, Ross was looking for redemption but Mike made the pass for the lead on lap two. Ross was real close until a spectacular crash on lap three dropped him to the back of the pack.
