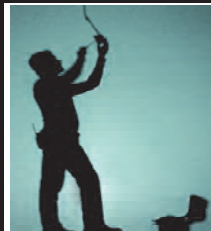

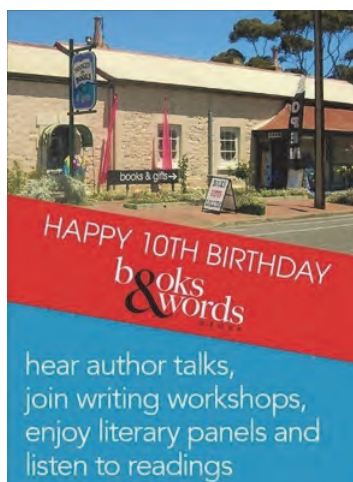

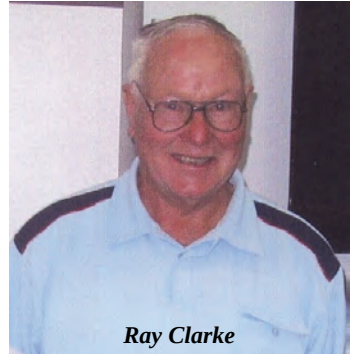

Vale Ray Clarke – a full life well lived!

A descendant of one of the earliest families to settle in the district, Raymond Victor Clarke's life became entwined in the community he loved and where he spent most of his 88 years.

His childhood was spent in Wattle Flat where he lived with his parents Sydney and Alvine (nee Blum) and nine siblings – Hazel, Arthur, Mavis, Merle, Ken, Jeff, Ian, Don and Gwen. He went to Wattle Flat School until he was 14, walking three miles each way from home, the same school where many of his cousins, aunts and uncles also attended.

Ray loved football and played his first game for the Yankalilla Football Club at age 13. He went on to play 199 'A' Grade games, was president in 1985-86, and became a life member.

Following on from school, Ray worked as a hand in a shearing shed, then became a shearer, an occupation he pursued for most of his life as well as being a dairy farmer. In the 1950s, Ray and another local Bob Fairchild did their National Service together, initially at Woodside, then with the Service Corps in transport which took them further afield including to Central Australia.

Back home, Ray had met Heather Llewellyn, a friend of his sister Merle, and they married in 1957 and began their life on a dairy property at Normanville. After raising four children – Graeme, Lynette (dec.), Kym and Glenice – Ray and Heather travelled around Australia with a caravan, later embarking on ocean cruises, always returning to their home and family at Normanville.

Ray also loved fishing and, when age precluded football participation, he took up bowls, winning several pairs championships for the Yankalilla Bowling Club and became a life member. Ray was also a member of Yankalilla Men's Probus Club for 27 years.

Lance Hocking recalled he first met Ray at an event at the Yankalilla Museum. The two struck up a

rapport, 'talking about sheep, shearing, cows, etc. He was always doing bits for his community,' Lance said. This friendship included Ray working around the museum, spraying weeds, and so on.

After Ray entered ACH, his mates visited him regularly until COVID put a stop to it. On one occasion, Lance and another local, Peter Whitford, drove Ray around the district, including visiting his old farm home at Wattle Flat. 'He knew it all,' Lance said. 'For me, he was the epitome of the older style rural man, completely honest and open, happiest talking about those things he knew best.'

Ray was an enthusiastic member of the Yankalilla and District Historical Society Inc. for more than 10 years, and had developed a keen interest in historical photos, inherited from his mother. His daughter Glenice set up his room at ACH, covering the walls with wonderful old photos of the district. Lance is in the process of preserving Ray's wonderful collection progressively scanning and digitising them all to become the 'Ray Clarke Photo Collection'.

It is not surprising that Ray developed an interest in all things historic, given that his great-grandfather John Clarke was the first known white resident of Wattle Flat, having arrived in the colony from Ireland on the *Tam O'Shanter* in November 1836. He purchased a town acre in Adelaide, imported a horse and dray, which cost £35 each from Tasmania, and drove to Wattle Flat in 1838, where he built a house which he called 'Fern Hill'. He then returned to Adelaide in 1840 to meet and marry Catherine Taggart, who had arrived from Cork, Ireland, with her family who intended farming at Morphett Vale. Ray and Catherine returned to Wattle Hills where they lived for the rest of their lives, and where seven sons and four daughters were born. John owned 21 sections at Wattle Flat and, as each of his children were married, they were

given several sections. John Clarke, an educated man, was the first Justice of the Peace in the district, he became a member of the District Council and, before Willunga had a Catholic Church, the priest would ride from Morphett Vale and hold Mass in John and Catherine's home. A hot midday dinner was served to all the congregation. Weddings and christenings were also celebrated in the home. When St Peter's Catholic Church was built in Normanville in 1857, John gave stone and materials and loaned his dray for cartage, and continued to support the church generously. Fittingly, John and Catherine Clarke's plaque at St Peter's Cemetery reads: 'They fed the

hungry and clothed the poor.' Their great-grandson, Ray Clarke (11/05/1933 - 31/08/2021), will also be remembered for his generosity to his community and love for his family. Ray leaves his wife of 64 years, Heather, children Graeme, Kym and Glenice and their partners Janette, Lisa and Bill, grandchildren Michelle, Ashley, Rhiannon and Nikki, and great-grandchildren Freya and Kirby. Rest in peace, Ray!

Volunteering for the Yankalilla Council

In a diminishing pool of volunteers in this district, our council is up against many other organizations vying for volunteer time. A few months ago, I became aware of a need for the

Council to gain more drivers for its community car. As a former Adelaide Ambulance Officer, I felt that my skills and temperament would make me suited to that role.

I contacted the Council and met their coordinator who was most helpful and courteous. He gave me literature to read and sign acknowledging that I understood what my rights and obligations were. On reading the document I discovered to my surprise that if I were to volunteer for the council in any role, I would have to forgo my rights as a citizen and rate payer in being able to criticize the council in any forum. I asked clarification of this as I thought it would only apply to my role in driving the community car. Unfortunately, this was not so. I then decided not to give away my rights and not to volunteer for this role. I was told by the coordinator that they had lost other potential volunteers due to this.

I then wrote to the mayor with the following suggestions. That a volunteer could not criticise the Council whilst actively participating in the volunteer role i.e., driving the community car and talking ill of the council to passengers. That if the volunteer had a problem with the council, they would first write to the council re the issue allowing a reasonable period to resolve the issue and only then exercising their right to legally criticise in a public forum.

After two months I have not even received a letter acknowledging my letter. If the council wishes to stem their dwindling volunteer support, I recommend they adopt this or similar modification to their rules and not treat volunteers the same way as they treat their paid staff.

- in circumstances where the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication, such as to enable communication by or with any patron who is deaf or hard of hearing"*

Surveys, Numbers – Sample Sizes, and Methodology!

I was interested to read the letter from Tony Clifford of Second Valley commenting on my letter in the August YRN. I wrote earlier about his attack on the YRN advertisement, saying NO to aspects of the foreshore development plan, paid and supported by some 160 community members. He nit-picked figures relevant to the cost of cabins but ignored the overall cost of the project and the inherent debit to the community. In this letter, by wading into a discussion on methodology he has once again missed the point.

The key issue of my letter was numbers - relative sample size. If he had attended as many council meetings as I have he might have noticed the tendency of certain Field Ward councillors to fend off criticism on the basis of sample size compared to the total number of rate payers, where the "silent majority" has made no comment. The misguided attempts to present this as overriding support is cynical, unethical and dishonest.

Concerning survey methodology, technically Mr Clifford is right that many surveys are reputed to be random. However a few with whom I have had dealings email me for opinion on a regular basis. This would mean that I am "on their books" which I feel would reduce the claim of random selection. Albeit I cannot claim to have detailed knowledge of the methodology used by all those organizations carrying out surveys reported in the press.

With regard to his comments on what he describes as Ms Trigg's survey, he is disingenuous in his description of how the meeting came together and the outcome. I cannot relate that description to my own experience. My understanding is that the returned questionnaires and the analysis were open to scrutiny by whomever chose. Transparency was written in capital letters. Each returned questionnaire was completed with the name of the respective community member and contact information, hence reflected the views of a real person. The evaluation was presented to council and was also published in the YRN for all to read in detail. I am not certain that Council can claim the same data quality and care for many of their so called community consultations.

Having belittled the work of Ruth Trigg and other community members, Mr Clifford then cynically compares it with a survey on Facebook, with almost zero description of methodology. Facebook?: the murky medium of choice by Trump style fake-news promoters, alternative fact peddlers, QAnon-ers, Anti-Vaxxers, Covid-19 conspiracy theorists, wannabe influencers and community mischief makers. Can those behind the "survey" report on details of the results clearly backed up by the identity of the respondents. Were they all community members or was there possibly the odd out of area troll included? I would not infer for a minute that this is the case, but the question is valid knowing what is reported in the classic media on problems within the different social media platforms.

As for the overall lack of clarity with regard to the numbers of community members FOR or AGAINST the Foreshore project, this remains an on-going issue. Council are still to present a clear set of data to demonstrate the claims that Mr Clifford makes that objections might not be as numerous as the critics claim.

There can be no doubt that the project has its supporters, Mr Clifford and other Field Ward residents are known to be vocally supportive, but it is not certain whether they understand the financial impact or have read the YRN letters of some of our Normanville/Yankalilla residents who have teased the numbers apart leaving the worrying conclusion that in the next decade there will be limited funds from rates available to serve the routine needs of the community without the possibility of further borrowings and more debt. Debt does not seem to concern some Second Valley residents. How fortunate they are.

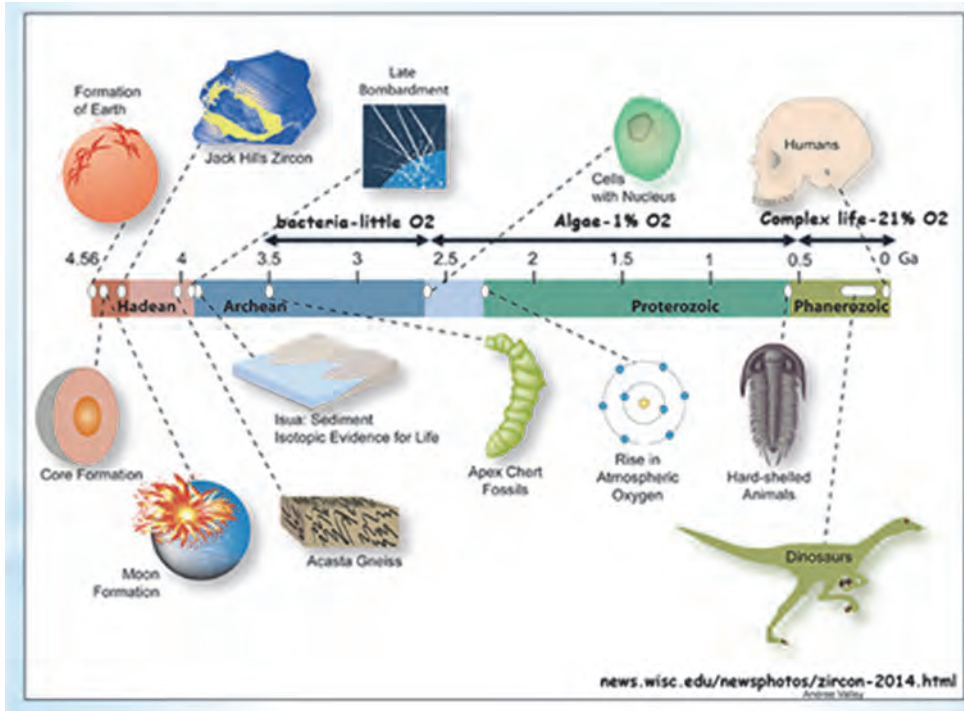

Riches of the Cambrian - Animals



In this story we will look at the Cambrian rocks of the peninsula and Kangaroo Island ("KI"). These contain some of the earliest sophisticated animals on Earth.

Let us first look at when life got started, how old the Earth is, and when oxygen was made - amongst other "minor" issues - Figure 1!

The Earth is around 4.5 billion years old ("4.5 Ga"). The oldest life so far found is around 3.5 Ga-not bad! Our Cambrian life is around 0.53 Ga which is early -there are no land animals, no land plants, no fish and these are the first organisms with hard shells.

On Myponga Beach you can find Cambrian hyolithids - a type of shelled animal, and archaeocyathids - a sponge or maybe a coral - difficult to tell - see Figure 2. These occur in the Sellicks Hill Formation - a limestone that is on the beach to your left when you get there.

At Emu Bay on Kangaroo Island is a world-famous fossil site for these early animals. These are slightly younger than our also-famous Ediacran soft bodied animals. Here we find mostly trilobites - see Figure 3 - that are a bit like an early crab.

I have trilobites that vary from 1cm long to 45cm long.

Along with these they also find well - preserved strange animals that are the same as the very famous Burgess Shale animals. These have their soft body parts preserved.

Figure 4 is an artist's impression (obviously!) of what the sea floor would have looked like here in the Cambrian. Don't these look like an oddball assemblage of beasts!

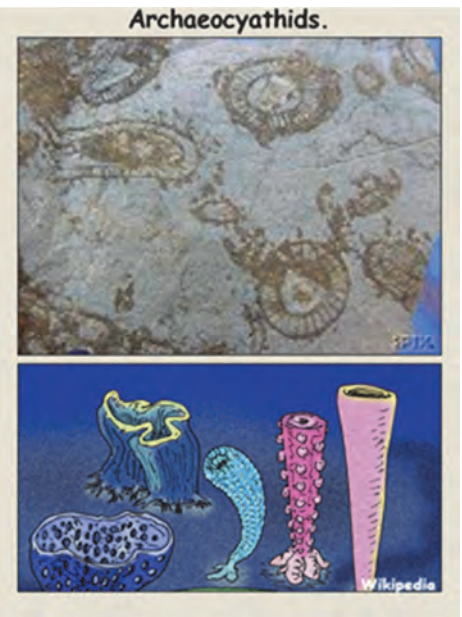
Some of these types of body made it through to our day but many became extinct, so it is a bit like Nature is trying out some prototypes.

It is interesting to contemplate why for some 3 Ga years we only had single celled organisms and then suddenly at the end of the pre-Cambrian (Ediacran) and, as here, middle Cambrian, we get complex animals.

Some scientists feel that something happened to promote new life after Snowball Earth - as we saw in the previous story with the tillite at Wirrina. Life was incredibly lucky to survive this glaciation. There may have been a sudden fertilization of the oceans from all the glaciation-related nutrients in the ocean that fed an algae explosion, once volcanos had helped to melt the ice. This plentiful algae supply then somehow led to our animals evolving.

Keep your eyes open when on beaches as we may find new areas for these fossils. It is useful to get on to the Mines Department web site and see about getting some geology maps to see where the different aged rocks are on the peninsula.

The next story will be about another big chill - when we would have been under gigantic glaciers - if we were here - which we weren't!

Mayor Simon Rothwell said; "Council has been working with the State Government for a solution for the Cape Jervis boat ramp and finger."

"Today it was highly recommended to Council by Department of Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) to remove the finger due to extreme level risk that the finger presents in its current condition and Council has accepted this recommendation."

"Representatives of DIT are in the process of removing the finger at their cost. The boat ramp will remain open."

"Council understands the importance of the finger and will be considering a report at the September Council meeting to seek State Government funding to replace the infrastructure as a priority."

"This is a really important step in building the relationship between Council and DIT to progress the much-needed improvements to the boat launching facilities at Cape Jervis," said Mayor Rothwell.

Update: The removal was reported as completed during the Council meeting on 21 September.



YAS students 'adopt-a-spot'



The students at Yankalilla Area School are doing their bit to help keep Ingalalla Falls in tip-top condition for the 48,000 people who visit each year.

This beautiful spot is located on Kaurna Country, within our Second Valley Forest.

The school will be engaged in care and maintenance around the falls as part of an "adopt-a-spot" project led by ForestrySA staff Jackie and Rachel.

The students recently helped plant 100 native plants, adding to previous revegetation work around the falls area and helping improve habitat along Waterfall Creek. They also learned about the weed threats to the natural values of the site and helped in controlling arum lily, which is a major weed threat along the watercourse.

Pretty Fishes of Yankalilla Bay

In this new feature I will introduce you to some of our local fish. I will only feature colourful species and they must live within Yankalilla Bay. Accordingly all photos are taken in Yankalilla Bay.

The Rainbow Cale

(*Heteroscarus acroptilus*)

Rainbow Cale are common in Yankalilla Bay.

They are shallow dwellers in rock, seagrass and algae-dominated terrain along much of

For scale, Rainbow Cale attain maximum size of 30cm, it was taken in another popular place within Yankalilla Bay (admittedly near the southern limit, cartographic), and even includes a pipi cockle valve (fishers bait or berley).

(NB: *Bluespotted Goatfish is the current preferred common name, according to a peak panel that agrees on common names designed to remove the confusion inherent in the historically different names for the same species from one state to another; representatives include recreational fishers, ichthyologists and others from all Australian states. They are charged with setting agreed national Australian Fishes names. Seems sensible. After all, they are true Goatfishes and are only distantly related to true Mulletts).

Australia's temperate southern coasts.

This is the only member of the *Heteroscarus* genus ('Monotonic genus' in fish geek parlance). Cales, Rock Whittings and Weed Whittings make up a family of fish known as Odacids (Family Odacidae).

Odacids are close relatives of the larger Wrasse group, which includes the better known parrotfishes, found mainly on coral reefs.

But Odacids are essentially a southern Australasian entity, being made up of 6 genera (genuses) with 12 species, of which 5 genera and 10 species are found only in the cooler waters of southern Australia and NZ.

So if you're snorkeling on the GBR you'll probably see lots of colourful Parrotfishes.

And when snorkeling in Yankalilla Bay (or anywhere with similar terrain along the SA

coastline) if you see a 'parrotfish' or 'rock cod' it's actually not a parrotfish, it is almost certainly one of the Weed Whittings, Rock Whittings and Cales.

And, many are surprisingly beautiful and highly photogenic.

All Odacids start life as females and only change into males at maturity, so the biggest ones are usually males, and the males are usually flashier. Like those Superb Fairy-wrens that are so common in the Yankalilla LGA, the males also develop extra richness to their base colours and patterns during the breeding season, which means they look especially easy on the eye in the warmer months.

Rainbow Cale feed mainly on small shells of the gastropod type.

Did you know fishing has a nationally recognised day? "Gone Fishing Day" is now in its sixth year and this year it will be celebrated on Sunday 10th October. The date also coincides with World Mental Health Day, so the event is promoting the benefits of going fishing to improve our mindset. An estimated 3.5 million Australians fish recreationally each year and for many of us, it is a way to reconnect with nature or enjoy a social activity with friends or family. There are several ways to participate in "Gone Fishing Day," you can check them out on their website, Facebook page or download the app for some great ideas and competitions to enter.

Finer Spring weather has allowed more days on the water and Boaties have reported consistent catches of King George Whiting and squid with some also getting Snook, Trevally, Flathead and a few Garfish. **Cape Jervis** jetty is still the place to catch a feed of Tommies and Squid, with **Rapid Bay** jetty starting to become more reliable for Squid, Salmon Trout and small Tommie Ruff. **Second Valley** jetty and rocks

have had Squid caught early morning and evening. Whiting have been caught from **Normanville** beach, while **Carrickalinga** beaches are still seeing Mullet, Bream, Flathead, Silver Whiting and Salmon showing up now and then.

The Fleurieu Opens Its Heart: Response to the Crisis in Afghanistan

There was a call for help from a group called *Free for Refugees and Asylum Seekers in Adelaide and South Australia Now renamed to ADELAIDE REFUGEE SUPPORT*. Over 400 Afghani people aged from babies to adults arrived in Adelaide to be quarantined for two weeks before being offered asylum somewhere in Australia. We put out a call to our community for goods that might be useful if you landed in a strange country with little more than the clothes on your back and even some of your family if luck was on your side.

Considerable thought had been given to what could make a difference for anyone in that position, what might make them feel welcome, comforted or just feeling that a new life might be possible in this strange new land. We set up a drop-off point in Normanville on a wet Saturday morning for an hour or so hoping that some

could respond with a few essentials such as toiletries. We had a drop off point at Port Willunga so that all the donations could then be delivered to Adelaide and sorted into packs for each new arrival.

We were overwhelmed with the generosity of our community. From toothpaste to nappies, handmade beanies, \$240 in cash and culturally appropriate clothing and headgear, it just kept coming. Children had selected from their toy collections; businesses gave generously all sorts of useful gear; individuals had carefully

prepared welcome packs of beautiful and thoughtful goods. It was an amazing and powerful experience. We filled the back seat of the double-cab utility, thinking that we wouldn't need the tray especially as it was raining. Towards the end of the morning, we were offered a trailer as it looked like we



were not going to have enough room for what kept arriving.

On arrival at Port Willunga, our courier took one look at our load and was somewhat shocked as she pondered how our load might fit into her small wagon. She was somewhat relieved when we assured her that we would drive with her to the city and unload at the final drop off point for sorting and distribution. The story will continue of course as we are not aware of how many will eventually stay in Adelaide or where they may go, as there is little transparency about our government's intentions.

And will there be a more compassionate response to what is clearly a minimal response to this tragic situation? But if more are allowed to come to the safety of our country, we feel reassured that the Fleurieu will respond with the generous spirit that has been a strength of our recent history of welcoming people from other cultures. Thank you Fleurieu.

Local Art goes on a Pilgrimage

I safely pulled into the Belicious cafe car park and rang 000.

It was such a relief when friendly faces I knew from our community walked up in their green uniforms, carrying medical gear, and took care of me.

It struck me then how lucky we are to have people in our area who will give up their spare time.

These volunteers do courses and attend weekly training sessions.

They are then rostered on so there is cover for every hour of every day.

SA Ambulance Service (SAAS) is always happy to hear from people keen to volunteer.

A spokesman said, "There are more than 1500 volunteers in regional South Australia in over 80 volunteer teams."

"Ambulance volunteers provide professional emergency ambulance and patient transfer services within their country communities."

SAAS added volunteers attend emergency and non-emergency ambulance calls, as well as other duties as required.

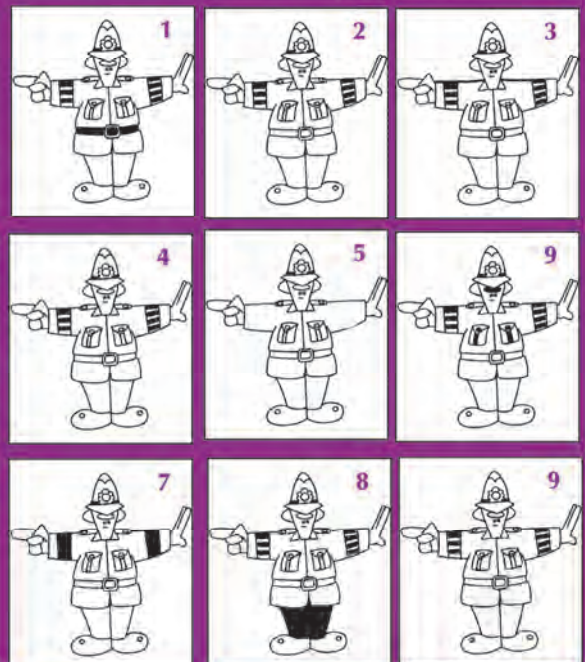

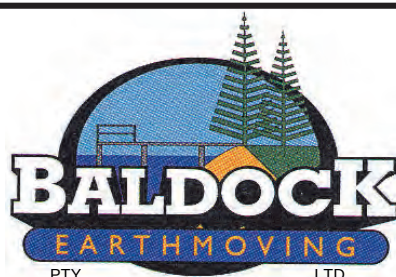

Steady progress is being made on construction of the metal working shop and secretaries office thanks to the efforts of the regular crew that perform these works. Thanks

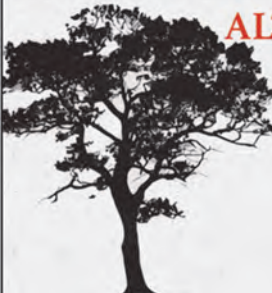

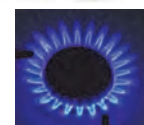

Watch out for chicks on the beach

The Hooded Plover, or hoodie as it is affectionately known, lives its entire life on the beach where it breeds between August and March by laying eggs on the sand just above the high tide mark. The number of Hoodies has been declining across southern Australia and the species is now considered vulnerable to extinction. They have one of the lowest breeding success rates in the world, so the next few months are critical to avoid a further decline in the

population. It is very hard for this species to find a spot on the beach which is not disturbed by visitors, vehicles, or dogs. Every time they are disturbed and leave their nests, the eggs and chicks are vulnerable to predators and extreme temperatures.

BirdLife Australia has developed a list of actions that beachgoers can follow to help hoodies this summer by providing them with enough space to successfully raise a family:

- Look out for temporary signs at access points or on the beach alerting you to the presence of nesting birds, and follow the guideline.
- If you see a Hooded Plover, walk another 100 metres before settling on the sand
- Access the beach via defined paths
- Avoid the dunes and upper beach, walk along the water's edge
- Keep your dog on a leash
- If it must be off-leash, find out which beaches are free of nesting birds and have off-leash access. Always walk your dog on a leash if there are nesting birds
- Don't leave your dog unattended while you are surfing or swimming
- If you ride a horse along the beach, visit at low tide and keep to the wet sand near the water's edge
- If you drive on the beach, only do so at low tide and drive slowly as close to the water's edge as possible.

Last year from Myponga Beach to Lands End, we had 10 nests which was a decrease from previous years with 7 chicks hatching however only 2 of these chicks fledged. We are hoping for a much better success rate this season!!!

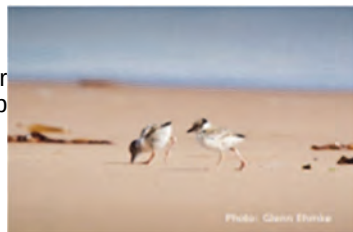

Veg of the Month: CUCUMBER

Originating in the foothills of the Himalayas and ancient India over 4000 years ago where they grew wild, cucumbers were first domesticated during the 2-3 millennia BC and grew greatly in popularity within the Roman Empire.

Cucumbers are generally eaten raw in salads or pickled, however there are many ways to use them in cooking including for sweet or dill pickles, relishes, sauces, and dressings.

In addition to eating, cucumbers were once also widely used as a source of several medicinal remedies. Claimed to treat everything from bad eyesight to scorpion bites.

Cucumbers are low in calories but high in many important vitamins and minerals, including antioxidants and anti-inflammatories. Cucumbers also promote hydration and may have benefits for lowering blood sugar levels.

Many of the varieties of cucumber that we eat today stem from hybrids of the original species. They range from small cucumbers designed for sweet pickles to large cucumbers over 60cm long. Cucumbers are an annual plant, are relatively easy to grow and are adaptable to most growing zones. Between October and December is the best time to plant seeds/seedlings in our cool to temperate climate. They can be grown as a sprawling plant or grown on a trellis in even the smallest garden. Cucumbers are quite thirsty plants and require regular watering throughout the summer months, however they are susceptible to fungal infections and don't like their leaves and fruit to get wet. So, if you're hand watering

try to water the base of the plant rather than the foliage. They also need protection from too much direct sunlight during summer, so depending on how much shade your veggie patch gets it might be worth covering them with some shade cloth on hot days. Depending on the variety they can take between 8-14 weeks to fruit and it's best to keep an eye on them because once they start fruiting, they grow quickly.

Recipes for fresh cucumber

Mix sliced cucumbers, tomatoes, olives, and feta cheese for a Greek-style side dish. Jazz up water by adding mint leaves and cucumber. Slice cucumbers into thick slices and dip them in your favourite hummus. Blend cucumbers alone or with other vegetables, such as carrots and celery, to make a juice. Make gazpacho soup by blending with tomatoes, pimentos, garlic, onions, and breadcrumbs and then chilling. Mix with garlic, mint, and Greek yogurt to accompany a curry.

Bird rescue at the Kindy

THE NIGHT SHIFT

with The Backyard Universe

For those of you who spotted the omission in last month's article, it should have read:

"Decades of speculation about Proxima's movement in relation to the Alpha pair ended in 2016, when Proxima was definitely proven to be in orbit rather than just passing by. It's an enormous orbit, taking about 547 thousand years to complete and never getting closer than about 600 billion km to the Alpha pair."

[Oops - apologies from the editor.]

This month Mercury passes from the evening sky into the morning sky, leaving us with only three bright evening planets to look at. On the 9th & 10th Venus and a crescent Moon are both near the head end of Scorpius (one of the few constellations that actually resembles its namesake). Meanwhile Jupiter and Saturn appear high in the northeast as the evening twilight darkens to night. The Moon passes near Saturn on the 14th and near Jupiter on the 15th.

Continuing our theme of frequently asked questions during tours:

"I'm new to astronomy and I've got \$500 or less to spend on a telescope. Which one should I buy?"

The short answer is "binoculars", because unfortunately many telescopes in the under-\$500 price range are rubbish, and as a newcomer you don't know enough (yet) to recognise them. Which is why so many of them get listed "for sale, almost new" after every Christmas. By comparison for \$500 or less you can buy a good new pair of binoculars, and probably have enough money to also buy a tripod (& adapter) to mount them on. A good pair of binoculars, held steadily, will show quite a lot of things up there and they're good for looking at daytime things too. Which brings us to the next question: which binoculars are good for astronomy? Binoculars and cars have a lot of similarities for a first-time buyer. (1) They're available in a confusing multitude of brand names &

configurations. (2) Every brand & model in existence has its critics and its fans. (3) There are designs optimised for particular uses. And (4) the first binoculars you buy probably won't be the ones you -wish- you could afford. Also like cars, there are "competing" brands with a common origin. For example most Celestron, Saxon, Skywatcher, Orion, Acuter and Tasco binoculars are all manufactured by the same Taiwanese company.

We strongly recommend you buy your astronomical binoculars from an Australian retailer in case there's a problem. Some international warehouses apparently make no distinction between genuine and counterfeit versions of products, and some overseas shops have been known to use their international sales to offload a defective product. We speak from personal (and expensive) experiences! Also note that international retailers may charge very high shipping costs nowadays.

Two important numbers are included in all binocular descriptions; expressed as (Magnification) x (Aperture in mm). For example "8x40" is a binocular that magnifies 8 times and has 40mm aperture front lenses. Also from these two numbers you can calculate another important number for astronomy binoculars, the Exit Pupil size, which is the diameter of the image(s) exiting the eyepiece(s). Exit Pupil size = (Aperture) / (Magnification) thus an 8x40 binocular has an Exit Pupil of 40/8 = 5mm.

Many binocular descriptions mention their field of view too, which is often still quaintly expressed as "(width in Feet) at 1000 Yards". To convert this to degrees, divide (width in feet) by 52.5. A wide field of view makes it easier to aim your binoculars at something of interest, or to follow fast-moving targets such as birds or aircraft. For comparison, the Moon is about 0.5 degrees wide and the height of the Southern Cross is about 6.2 degrees.

For astronomical targets, a larger aperture collects more light and resolves smaller details. Theoretically if you double the aperture you're collecting 4 times more light and also resolving details half as wide. But you need to

consider magnification as well as aperture; because the binoculars' Exit Pupil needs to be small enough to feed all of that collected faint starlight into your eye -- and your eye pupil diameter is affected by your age. The pupil diameter of an average dark-adapted human eyeball ranges from about 7mm (for our teenage readers) down to about 4mm (for their grandparents). So for our example 8x40 binocular, its 5mm Exit Pupil will fit easily into Young Space Nerd's eyeball, will probably fit into Nerd Parents' eyeballs, but won't completely fit into Nerd Grandparents' eyeballs. Consequently the grandparents may (correctly) complain that they can't see as many stars in the 8x40 binocular as they can in a 12x40 binocular, even though both binoculars collect the same amount of starlight.

Personally we're not big fans of variable-magnification "zoom" binoculars in the under-\$500 price range. In our experience either the optics are good but the zoom mechanism is poorly-made; or the zoom mechanism is okay but the optics are dodgy or too small for astronomy. Outback bulldust is not kind to cheap zoom mechanisms either. There are some excellent zoom binoculars suitable for astronomy but you'll be spending a lot more than \$500. If you wear glasses, go for binoculars with (1) fold-down or retractable eyepiece cups, so that you can get your glasses onto the eyepieces to get the full field of view; and (2) a large Eye Relief so that you can focus the view through your glasses. Be aware that rubber eyepiece cups, even when folded, can leave smears on your glasses which may need cleaning off.

A steady support is essential for any binoculars with more than 8x magnification, and desirable at lower magnifications. And use a support that allows the binoculars to look anywhere in the sky. A reclining outdoor chair with armrests for your elbows is surprisingly effective when looking high in the sky. Nearer the horizon try resting your elbows on a car or a fence railing, or brace yourself against a wall. A video camera tripod with a binocular adapter works well (except for things high overhead), and its tilt/pan handle allows easy aiming. Ideal if there's several of you viewing something through your binoculars. Ensure the tripod and adapter are rated to carry the weight of your binoculars.

After using binoculars on a cold damp night, allow them to dry out completely before storing them with their lens caps on. Trapped moisture may promote mould growth that will be impossible to remove.

A couple of things to definitely avoid in astronomical binoculars:

(1) "Ruby coatings" a.k.a. red or orange-tinted lenses. These are intended to suppress daytime glare. Unfortunately they're also quite good at suppressing starlight.

(2) "See up to X miles/km". Translation: "these binoculars are rubbish".

Let's discuss some binoculars in our collection:

10x20: Not bad for spotting the largest craters on the Moon, and watching lunar eclipses, daytime scenery, birds & whales. Not so good on stars because of their small 20mm aperture, plus significant internal light losses due to not having "multi-coated" optical surfaces. But they cost only \$20 as a clearance sale item and they're literally pocket sized.

7x50: Our first astronomy binoculars, from a now-defunct Japanese manufacturer. Multi-coated optics for maximum light transmission. Rigid eyepiece cups and limited Eye Relief, so couldn't be used by anyone while wearing glasses. Almost everyone over 50 years old commented about the "faint" views of star fields. Not quite enough magnification to see the largest Moon craters but good enough to see the four major moons of Jupiter. Also difficult to hand-hold steadily because of their heavy metal body. After 29 years of frequent use these binoculars became a monocular after falling from a balcony onto concrete!

10x60: We bought these about 20 years ago to replace the broken 7x50s and nowadays they're used for our night sky tours. The views are similar to what an early-mid 18th century telescope could produce and our tours include a history element. A rubber-coated fibreglass body and lighter multi-coated optical parts make these binoculars less heavy than the old 7x50s for hand-holding. But the views are much steadier when they're supported by a tripod. Can see the larger Moon craters, the four moons of Jupiter, the largest moon of Saturn, and (barely) the crescent phases of Venus. Saturn's rings can't be seen but the planet image is noticeably elongated by them. Uranus and Neptune are both detectable as "stars" if you know exactly where to look. The Milky Way is seen as a multitude of stars upon a mottled background of even fainter stars + dark nebulae. Some brighter nebulae are visible as small cloudy patches. Many star clusters are revealed too. Omega Centauri and other bright globular clusters are seen as blurry balls. The Magellanic Clouds (more on them next month) both appear as mottled irregular patches of light, with hints of brighter blobs within.

15x70: A larger version of the 10x60s that shows everything they do but brighter and bigger. A few nearby galaxies are also detectable as faint blobs or streaks if you know exactly where to look. Definitely too much magnification to be used without some kind of support, and near the weight limit for our video camera tripod. Our choice whenever we're going to somewhere that has a dark sky, but luggage limits prevent us from taking a telescope there.

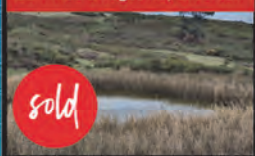
